## OPENING TIP

- The Spartans are coming off a 77-71 loss to UNLV at the Provident Credit Union Event Center.

- The Spartans 82-73 victory over Wyoming (2/22/25) was the first time in history SJSU won at Wyoming.

- The Spartans fell to Colorado State 72-50 at the Provident Credit Union Event Center earlier this season (12/31/24).

- Colorado State's head coach, Niko Medved, was an assistant coach under **Tim Miles** when **Miles** was the head coach at CSU (2008-12).

- The Spartans' 9.0 threes per game in conference play is tied for second in the Mountain West. SJSU is fourth in the Mountain West in 3pt. percentage in conference play, shooting .362.

- The Spartans have made eight or more threes in 14 of their 18 conference games this season. They have also hit 10 or more threes in eight conference games.

- The Spartans are holding opponents to .338 percent from beyond the arc in conference play which is fourth lowest in the conference.

- SJSU is third in the Mountain West in free throw percentage (.733).

- The Spartans are averaging 3.44 blocks per game in conference play which is fourth in the conference.

- The Spartans' 94 points against Fresno State (2/4/25) was the most points they have scored in a conference game since joining the Mountain West in 2013.

## OPENING TIP CONTINUED

• **Latrell Davis** and **Josh Uduje** each scored 30 points against Fresno State (2/4/25), marking the first time in school history they had two 30 point scorers in a game.

• **Davis** and **Uduje** are just the third duo to score 30+ each in a Mountain West game ever (Nevada vs. Fresno State on Jan. 22, 2014, Deonte Burton - 32 and Coel Huffman - 31, and Fresno State vs. SJSU on March 9, 2019, Braxton Huggins - 34 and Deshon Taylor - 37).

• The Spartans scored 100 points in back-to-back games for the first time in school history (107 vs. Cal Poly & 117 vs. Lincoln).

• The Spartans swept the Ball Dawgs Classic (Nov. 25-27), defeating UTEP, UNCG and Long Beach State.

• The last time the Spartans swept an in-season tournament was at the 2011 Elgin Baylor Classic where they went 2-0 with wins over Coppin State and Seattle.

• The Spartans have used eight different starting lineups this season.

• The Spartans' 47 made field goals and 57 rebounds vs. Lincoln (12/9/24) are tied for the most and the most by any team in the Mountain West in a game this season, respectively.

• The Spartans hit a season-high 15 threes at San Diego State (1/28/25). They also knocked down 14 threes vs. No. 25 Utah State (1/7/25) and at Fresno State (2/4/25).

• The Spartans' 15 made threes at San Diego State (1/28/25) was the most ever made threes against SDSU by any team in a Mountain West Game.

• The Spartans have recorded at least two 20 point scorers in seven games this season.

• The Spartans are 11-1 on the season when they shoot better than their opponent and 9-2 when they out rebound their opponent. They are also 7-0 when scoring 80 points or more.

• The Spartans recorded 10 blocks at home vs. Air Force (2/1/25), setting a new Provident Credit Union Event Center all-time record. The Spartans' 10 blocks is also tied for the most recorded by any team in the Mountain West in a conference game this season.

• The reigning Mountain West Sixth Man of the Year, **Uduje**, currently leads the Spartans with 16.8 points per game which is also good for sixth in the Mountain West.

• **Uduje** has scored 20+ 13 times this year which is tied for the second most of any player in the Mountain West. He has also recorded double-digit points in 22 out of 28 games played this season.

• **Uduje** is the first Spartan to score 25 points in back-to-back games since **Omari Moore** in 2023 (29 vs. Wyoming & 27 vs. UNLV; 2/22-2/25/25). If he scores 25+ against CSU, Uduje will become the first Spartan since **Adrian Oliver** in 2011 to score 25+ in three consecutive games.

• **Uduje** became the first Spartan to score 20+ in five consecutive games since **Adrian Oliver** in 2011. **Uduje** scored 22 at New Mexico, 21 vs. Lincoln, 23 vs. Cal Poly, 22 vs. Kennesaw State and 22 vs. Boise State (12/4 - 12/28/24).

• **Uduje** recorded 23 points and 10 rebounds vs. Cal Poly (12/14/24), earning a double-double for the first time in his career. He also recorded a double-double (30 pts., 11 rebs.) at Fresno State (2/4/25).

• **Uduje** went 5-5 from three and scored 25 points at USC (11/20/24). **Uduje** is the only player in the Mountain West to make five three's on 100 percent 3pt. shooting in a game this season.

• **Uduje** is fourth in the conference in field goal percentage at .500 (min. 5 FGM/G average).

• **Davis** is the Spartans' leading scorer off the bench, averaging 11.8 points per game. At 11.8 points per game, **Davis** is the top scoring sixth man in the Mountain West.

• **Davis** is averaging 13.6 points per game in conference play which ranks 12th in the Mountain West. **Davis'** 2.1 threes per game in conference play is fourth in the Mountain West.

• **Davis** leads the Spartans with 46 made threes on .411 percent shooting. Davis is on track to be the first Spartan to shoot over 40 percent from three on the season since **Trey Anderson** and **Omari Moore** in 2022.

• Trailing 70-69 in the closing seconds of regulation vs. New Mexico, **Davis** collected an offensive rebound and put it up and in off the glass to give the Spartans a one point lead with two seconds left in the game (1/14/25).

• **Davis'** 30 points, 11 made field goals and six made threes against Fresno State were all career-highs (2/4/25). **Davis** scored 17 of his 30 points in overtime without missing a shot.

• **Davis** has scored 20 or more points in seven games this season.

• **Davis** hit a shot from half court at the first half buzzer vs. Kennesaw State, earning the No. 10 play of the night on ESPN (12/21/24). He hit another deep three pointer at the first half buzzer against New Mexico (1/14/25).

• **Will McClendon** is second on the team in scoring, averaging 12.0 points per game. He has scored double-figures in 17 out of 24 games played this season.

• **McClendon** recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds against Wyoming (1/25/25).

• **McClendon** has made 45 threes on the season. His 1.88 threes per game is good for seventh in the Mountain West.

• **McClendon** has knocked down four or more threes in five games this season. **McClendon's** three with 30 seconds left against Fresno State (2/4/25) tied the game at 67, forcing OT.

• **McClendon** recorded a career-high 22 points and five made threes against UTEP (11/25/24). McClendon also knocked down five three pointers at Air Force (1/11/25).

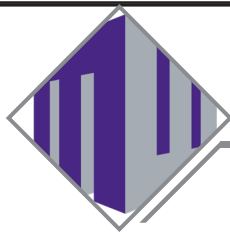
• **McClendon's** free throw percentage of .827 is good for fifth in the Mountain West (min. 2.5 FTM/G average). **Uduje** is 11th at .777.

• **Robert Vaihola** returns to the court after redshirting last season. **Vaihola** was a key contributor in the Spartans' historic 2022-23 season.

**OPENING TIP CONTINUED**

- **Vaihola** leads the team in rebounding with 6.9 boards per game which is also good for fifth in the conference. **Vaihola's** 2.4 offensive rebounds per game also ranks third in the Mountain West.
- **Vaihola** recorded a career-high seven blocks against Air Force (2/1/25). **Vaihola** is the first Spartan to record seven blocks in a game since **Ibrahima Diallo** had eight blocks against Alabama State on Nov. 15, 2022. Seven blocks in a game is also the most recorded by any player in the Mountain West this season.
- **Vaihola's** average of 1.56 blocks per game in conference play is second in the Mountain West.
- **Vaihola** scored a season-high 18 points to go along with nine rebounds and a block against New Mexico (1/14/25).
- **Vaihola** recorded 17 points and a career-high 18 rebounds against Lincoln (12/9/24). It also marked the first time in his career he recorded a double-double in back-to-back games, previously tallying 10 points and 11 rebounds at New Mexico (12/4/24). **Vaihola** also became the first Spartan to grab 18 rebounds in a game since **Chris Cunningham** on Feb. 2, 2013 against Idaho.
- **Sadaidriene Hall** leads the Spartans in steals with 35 recorded on the season. Against UNLV (2/25/25), **Hall** became the first Spartan to record five steals in a game since **Omari Moore** in 2021.
- **Hall** recorded 17 points, a season-high 14 rebounds and a career-high three threes against Kennesaw State (12/21/24).
- **Hall** recorded a career-high 33 points and 14 made field goals in the Spartans' overtime win vs. Cal Poly (12/14/24). He also notched 11 rebounds, giving him his first double-double of the year.
- Trailing 91-88 to Cal Poly, **Yap** tapped a loose ball out to **Hall** who then knocked down the game-tying three with three seconds remaining in regulation, forcing overtime (12/14/24).
- **Hall** is one of two players in the Mountain West to hit 14 field goals in a game this season (Donovan Dent, New Mexico).

- **Uduje** and **Hall** both surpassed 1,000 career points this season. **Uduje** accomplished the feat against UC Santa Barbara (11/17/24) while **Hall** achieved it against Kennesaw State (12/21/24).
- Against Cal Poly (12/14/24), **Uduje** (23 pts. 10 rebs.) and **Hall** (33 pts. 11 rebs.) each recorded double-doubles, marking the first time that two Spartans had a double-double in the same game since Dec. 9, 2020, when **Richard Washington** (38 pts. 12 rebs.) and **Omari Moore** (15 pts. 12 rebs.) accomplished the feat against Fresno State.
- The Spartans' have recorded nine double-doubles on the season (two by **Vaihola**, two by **Hall**, two by **Sadraque NgaNga**, two by **Uduje** and one by **McClendon**).
- **Yap** scored a season-high 22 points and made a career-high six threes against No. 25 Utah State (1/7/25).
- **Yap** scored 18 points against Long Beach State (11/27/24). **Yap** hit back-to-back-to-back three pointers in the second half, igniting a 17-2 Spartan run.
- **Yap** was named to the Outrigger Rainbow Classic All-Tournament Team. **Yap** hit six threes across the tournament's three games, including three against Hawai'i, one of which was an and-one.
- **NgaNga** tallied 29 points and 12 rebounds on 12-14 shooting against Life Pacific (11/11/24), all of which were career-highs.
- **NgaNga** recorded 11 points and 11 rebounds vs. UNLV (1/4/25), earning his second double-double of the season despite only playing 18 minutes in the game.
- SJSU welcomes seven transfers to the team: **McClendon** (UCLA), **NgaNga** (Seton Hall), **Hall** (Stephen F. Austin), **Yap** (Fresno State), **Chol Marial** (Oregon State), **Ameere Britton** (CSU Monterey Bay) and **Uduje** (Utah State).
- The Spartans also added three freshmen to the squad: **Jermaine Washington**, **Cameron Patterson** and **Ben Roseborough**. **Adrame Diongue**, **Pasha Goodarzi**, **Davis** and **Christian Wise** all return to the Spartans for the 2024-25 season.

## HEIGHT ADVANTAGE

- The Spartans have two player over seven feet in height, Chol Marial (7'2) and Adrame Diongue (7'0).
- SJSU is one of two teams with two seven-footers in the conference (San Diego State)
- At 7'2, Marial is the tallest player in the Mountain West.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

- Josh Uduje played in both of Utah State's NCAA Tournament games against [9] TCU and [1] Purdue, tallying 21 points, three steals, two blocks and two threes across both games.
- Will McClendon played in all three of UCLA's NCAA Tournament games against [15] UNC Asheville, [7] Northwestern and [3] Gonzaga during their 2023 sweet sixteen run. In those three games, McClendon recorded four points, two assists and a steal.
- Chol Marial also made an appearance in the 2021 NCAA for the University Maryland in their game against [2] Alabama. Marial recorded two points in the game.

## PREDEVELOPED CHEMISTRY

- Robert Vaihola and Donovan Yap played together at Fresno State during the 2021-22 season.
- Adrame Diongue, Chol Marial, Sadraque NgaNga and Josh Uduje all played under assistant coach Ed Gipson at AZ Compass Prep. Gipson was head coach of the high school from 2017-2023.
- Will McClendon and Donovan Yap were on the same AAU basketball team growing up.

## HEAD COACH TIM MILES



Tim Miles returns for his fourth season as Head Coach of San José State men's basketball. Miles was named the head coach of the Spartan program on April 6, 2021, and brought over 24 years of head coaching experience to the South Bay.

In 2022-23, Miles and Spartans achieved feats that had not been seen in program history including having both the Mountain West Player of the Year in Omari Moore and the Coach of the Year in Miles. Coach was also a Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Finalist in recognition of the team's 13-win improvement from the previous season.

In 2023-24, Miles led the Spartans to nine wins on the year. SJSU was second in the conference in three pointers made per game with 8.3. Myron Amey Jr. was named all-conference honorable mention in both the Mountain West Coaches Poll and the Mountain West Media Poll.

The Spartans' success propelled them into postseason play in 2022-23 as the team was invited to play in the Discount Tire CBI. The team went 1-1 at the tournament played at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, Fla. At the tournament, two of Miles' former players were on coaching staffs of participating teams. Aaron Fearnle was then the Associate Head Coach at Charlotte and now Head Coach at Charlotte, while Flynn Clayman was the Associate Head Coach at Southern Utah and is now the Associate Head Coach at High Point University.

In his inaugural season Miles posted eight wins which was the most wins since the 2016-2017 season. The Spartans were third in the conference in 3-point shooting percentage under the guidance of Miles. Under the guidance of Miles, the Spartans had a program record 17 3-pointers against Portland State.

Miles came to San José State after coaching at the University of Nebraska from 2012-19. During his time in Lincoln, Nebraska saw unprecedented success as they were guided to some of their most successful seasons in program history. In 2014, just two seasons after being hired, Miles led the team to their first NCAA Tournament in 16 seasons. He was named the Jim Phelan Award winner for national coach of the year and was also tabbed as the Big Ten Coach of the Year.

That 2013-14 season made Nebraska the talk of college basketball after reaching the tournament despite being selected to finish last in the Big Ten standings in the preseason poll. The Cornhuskers overcame a 1-5 start in conference play by winning 10 out of their last 12 games to finish fourth in the standings with an 11-7 record. Among those wins was a 60-51 victory over No. 9 Michigan State, the program's first road win over a top-10 program since 1997, and a 77-68 defeat of Wisconsin, who would later go on to advance to the 2014 Final Four.

The turnaround at Nebraska began immediately under Miles' wing with the Cornhuskers seeing a three-win improvement from 12 to 15 wins in the 2012-13 year. With just one returning starter, Miles and company defeated three NCAA Tournament teams and finished the year off with a victory over Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament.

After the success of the Huskers' NCAA Tournament appearance in 2013-14, the following season saw more firsts for the Nebraska program as they achieved a national ranking for the first time since 1995.

In 2017-18, Miles led the Cornhuskers to one of their most successful seasons in program history. Nebraska won 22 games, their most since the 1990-91 campaign, with a school record 13 wins in conference play and earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) for their first postseason appearance in four seasons.

In Miles' final season at Nebraska, the Huskers won 19 games and earned another top-25 ranking in the Associated Press poll. They advanced to their second-straight NIT appearance.

In his seven total seasons at the helm of Nebraska men's basketball, Miles guided nine players to All-Big Ten accolades including two-time all-conference pick Terran Petteway, who became the first Husker in program history to win the Big Ten scoring title in 2013-14 with an average of 18.1 points per game.

In addition to being a premier talent at building programs, Miles also demands excellence from his student-athletes in the classroom. He guided 17 Nebraska players to Academic All-Big Ten honors, including a conference-best five selections in 2015. In 2014-15, Shamian Shields became the first player in program history to earn first-team Academic All-American honors.

Prior to his extended stint at Nebraska, Miles made a name for himself at Colorado State where he took the Rams to new heights and laid the foundation for what is now one of the top teams in the Mountain West. In five seasons at the helm, he increased his win total in each season with his best year being the 2011-12 campaign that saw CSU defeat a school-record three ranked teams en route to their first 20-plus win season since 1997-98. The Rams finished with a 20-12 record, put three players on the all-conference team, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in nine years. For his efforts, Miles was named the District VIII Coach of the Year by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

The 2011-12 Colorado State team averaged 70.1 points per game and was the Mountain West leader in field goal percentage (47.1), 3-point percentage (40.0) and free throw percentage (76.8). They also were one of just two programs nationwide to rank in the top 10 in both free throw and 3-point percentage. The Rams' 20-win campaign was just the seventh in program history.

Similar to what he would eventually do at Nebraska, Miles quickly turned the Colorado State program around from his first day on campus. His first two seasons saw the Rams battle through growing pains and injuries while still making strides towards becoming the program that it is today. Colorado State improved their win total in league play in Miles' second season and finished the year off with a key victory over Wyoming in the Mountain West Tournament.

Years three through five were some of the most successful for the Rams in recent history, culminating in CSU's NCAA Tournament bid in 2011-12. In 2009-10, Miles led the Rams to their first postseason appearance in seven years after posting 16 regular-season wins. Colorado State was selected to participate in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI), and Miles was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year by CollegelInsider.com.

The 2010-11 team finished in fourth place in the Mountain West after posting the program's first winning record since 2007. The Rams finished the year 19-13 and earned a berth to the NIT for their second-straight

postseason appearance. Miles and company won nine conference games that year, the most for the Rams since the formation of the Mountain West in 1999-2000, and received votes in the top-25 national poll at year's end for the first time since 2005-06.

Before going to CSU, Miles was the head coach of the Bison of North Dakota State for six seasons, where he guided the program through their transition to Division I. The Bison reached at least 16 wins in each of Miles' final five seasons at the helm. One of their biggest moments came in 2005-06 against 13th ranked Wisconsin. North Dakota State handed the Badgers a 62-55 loss, snapping Wisconsin's 27-game win streak against non-conference opponents. The loss was also just one of 10 non-conference home losses for the Badgers under hall of fame coach Bo Ryan. Miles was awarded the CBS Sportsline Division I Independent Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award.

Miles was also the catalyst for turning around Southwest Minnesota State University, who he guided for four seasons before joining North Dakota State. Prior to Miles' arrival, the Mustangs had just one winning season in the previous decade. Miles changed all of that by posting a 78-39 four-year total, including a program-record 28-win season in 2001. The Mustangs won the 2001 Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Championship as well as the NCAA North Central Regional Championship before advancing to the Division II Elite Eight. Miles was named the NSIC and North Central Region Coach of the Year Awards for his unprecedented success.

Miles made his head coaching debut as the head man at Mayville (N.D.) State University. The program was just 4-44 in the previous two seasons before Miles took over, and in the first of many instances of changing a program's culture, he was able to turn things around and led them to a 35-22 record in three seasons. Miles was inducted into the Mayville State Hall of Fame in 2016.

Before reaching the head coaching ranks, Miles made his coaching debut as an assistant at Northern State. He spent six seasons on staff from 1989-90 to 1994-95, helping lead the program to five NAAI playoff appearances and five regional titles. As the team's recruiting coordinator, he brought in and molded five All-Americans and helped the Wolves advance to the NAAI National Championship in back-to-back seasons.

A native of Doland, S.D., Miles graduated from the University of Mary in Bismarck, N.D., in 1989. He then earned his master's degree in health and physical education from Northern State in 1990. In 2007, he was inducted into the University of Mary Hall of Fame.

Following his stint at Nebraska Miles took a brief two-year pause from coaching, turning in his whistle for a microphone. He began working with the Big Ten Network, Fox Sports and FS1 as an analyst in 2019 and also lent his talents to a podcast called "Inside the Mind of Miles" as part of the "Field of 68" college basketball media network.

Miles has daughter, Ava who graduated from San José State in 2023, and a son, Gabe, who is a student-athlete at North Dakota State. They have a yellow lab, appropriately named Sammy.
