Notification to Students of Differences between US and UK evaluation systems

Students enrolled in the dual degree program with the University of Roehampton must keep in mind that due to differences between the US and UK educational and evaluation systems and criteria, the course requirements may differ, thus leading to the possibility of different final course grades. Successfully passing the course for one institution, does not guarantee successful completion for the other. University of Roehampton grades are unofficial until validation from the exam board occurs.

Scholarship Update:

COVID-19 Pandemic Scholarship

Effective Date: April 2021

Eligibility:

Schiller International University is offering a limited number of Pandemic Scholarships for Undergraduate and Graduate Applicants.

The Pandemic Scholarship is available to new applicants wishing to enroll in:

- Our programs of bachelor's degree starting on or before November 22, 2021.
- Our Master's degree programs starting on or before November 22, 2021.

This Pandemic Scholarship is designed to help students who want to continue their education in such a difficult period of time.

Documentation:

- Scholarship Application form,

- Scholarship Essay, a 500-word essay in English.
- Proof of Student Acceptance.

- **Undergraduate**
 - Florida Campus Up to \$1,200.00 USD per semester (up to \$100.00 per credit hour).
 - European Campuses: Up to €900 per semester (up to €75,00 per credit hour).
- **Graduate**
 - Full 12 Month Graduate program € 4,770.00 \$ 6,030.00 US dollars
 - Full 15 Month Graduate program € 5,962.50 \$7,537.50 US dollars.

Reapplication:

The COVID-19 Scholarship is awarded for

- A bachelor student's first two semesters only. It is not renewable.
- Full master program. It is not renewable.

How the Covid-19 Scholarship is applied:

Upon award of the Covid-19 Scholarship, the Scholarship will be applied to the student ledger card in the following manner:

- **Undergraduate**
 - This Scholarship will be applied at the beginning of the student's semesters.
- **Graduate**
 - This Scholarship will be applied at the beginning of the student's program.

Students must exhibit and maintain exemplary behavior and sustain academic integrity.

One World-One University Scholarship

Effective Date: April 2021

Eligibility ():**

Application to this scholarship is available to all Schiller International University undergraduate students who are preparing, personally and professionally, for future leadership roles in an international setting.

Applications for the One World-One University Scholarship will only be considered during the enrollment process.

Eligibility will be considered towards:

- Students who demonstrate via application essay, an interest in developing international and cross-cultural competencies.
- Students who demonstrate via application essay, their intent to create strong interaction among people with diverse backgrounds.
- Students have previously demonstrated or who demonstrate via application essay, a propensity and desire to act as leaders of Global Change.
- Students who have previously demonstrated or who demonstrate via application essay, or through actions and/or ideas, their desire to foster and maintain a more sustainable environment while encouraging ideas and/or actions to reduce the overall carbon footprint on the planet.
- Students who hold citizenship from a country that Schiller International University has not enrolled previously.
- Women who enroll in the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) program.

() For the Women in STEM Scholarship, will also be applicable to Graduate applicants.
Women who enroll in the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) program.*

These demonstrations and intentions should be clearly expressed in the Essay that is required to accompany all applications for the One World-One University Scholarship.

Documentation Required:

- Scholarship Application
- Scholarship Essay (500 words)
- Proof of Student Acceptance.

Amount of Scholarship Award:

Programs in Florida Campus: Up to \$2,000.00 USD per semester (up to \$166.67 per credit hour)
Programs in European Campuses: Up to €1,265 per semester (up to €105.33 per credit hour)

Reapplication:

The One World-One Universe Scholarship is awarded for a student's first two semesters only.
It is not renewable.

How the One World-One Universe Scholarship is applied:

Upon award of the One World-One Universe Scholarship, the Scholarship will be applied to the student ledger card in the following manner:

- This Scholarship will be applied at the beginning of the student's semesters.
- Students must exhibit and maintain exemplary behavior and sustain academic integrity.

*(**) Students who have been granted with the EARLY ACCEPTANCE DISCOUNT are not eligible for this scholarship*

Early Acceptance Schiller International University (Undergraduate)

SIU is now accepting PRE-applications from high school seniors.

Students who are in their last year of high school can pre-apply to begin their college career at one of SIU campuses and be eligible for the Early Acceptance.

SIU is now also accepting PRE-applications from graduates of high school after January 2017.

Students who have obtained their high school diploma after January 2017, can pre-apply for to begin their college career at one of SIU campuses and be eligible for the Early Acceptance.

All students who want to reserve a place in advance at Schiller International University to begin their studies in the following months.

Conditional approval will be determined by the designated campus

Who can apply?

All students in their last year of high School (or students who have obtained their high school diploma after January 2017), who want to reserve a place in advance at SCHILLER INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY to begin their studies in the following months.

What are the benefits of early tuition payments?

- Enroll and pay tuition 6 months prior to the expected start of your academic career and receive \$1,500.00 USD/€1,265 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE March 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021
- Enroll and pay tuition 5 months prior to the expected start of your academic career and receive \$1,000 USD/€844 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE April 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021
- Enroll and pay tuition 3 months prior to the expected start of your academic career and receive \$500 USD/422€ toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE June 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021

**Students who are scheduled to receive US Federal Financial Aid must have completed the Financial Aid application process, signed a Financial Aid offer, have met any other required financial obligations to be considered for this program.*

Schiller International University will reserve a place for the student until the expected enrollment start date. Payments are non-refundable. Exceptions may apply if:

- A student does not receive their High School Diploma or GED
- A student does not receive a VISA to enter the country.

Early Acceptance Schiller International University (Graduate)

SIU is now accepting PRE-applications from students who have completed an undergraduate degree.

Students who want to attend a Master 's degree program at Schiller International University can pre-apply to begin their Master's degree at any one of SIU campuses.

Conditional approval will be determined by the designated campus

Who can apply?

All undergraduate students who want to reserve a place in advance at SCHILLER INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY to begin their studies in the following months.

Applicants must pay the entire Master's degree program in advance *

What are the benefits of early tuition payments?

- Enroll and pay tuition 6 months prior to the expected start of your attendance to a MASTER and receive \$1,500.00 USD/€1,265 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE March 2021, and your attendance to a MASTER begins September 2021.
- Enroll and pay tuition 5 months prior to the expected start of your attendance to a MASTER and receive \$1,000 USD/€ 844 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE April 2021, and your attendance to a MASTER begins September 2021.
- Enroll and pay tuition 3 months prior to the expected start of your attendance to a MASTER and receive \$500 USD/€ 422 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE June 2021, and your attendance to a MASTER begins September 2021.

** Students who are scheduled to receive US Federal Financial Aid must have completed the Financial Aid application process, signed a Financial Aid offer and have met any other required financial obligations to be considered for this program.*
