COVID-19 Scholarship Current Students

Objective:

Schiller International University is offering a limited number of exceptional hardship scholarships to help current students facing financial difficulties due to the COVID-19 crisis. The scholarship is to be used towards tuition.

Conditions:

- This scholarship is applicable to students taking full semesters (12 credits) in 2020. The scholarship cannot be prorated.
- The scholarship is open to students starting PTs in May, June, July, August, September, 2020.
- The scholarship is restricted to students who have previously been in good financial standing
- There is no GPA requirement for this scholarship
- The scholarship will be awarded to a maximum of 1458 (\$1569 in Tampa) euros regardless of whether the student is a graduate or undergraduate.
- The scholarship is awarded for a maximum of 2 terms – ending December 2020 PT.
- The scholarship cannot be added to any other SIU scholarships
- The scholarship is only applicable to current students, not to new students joining after May 2020.
- Each campus has the following maximum amount of funds available for the COVID scholarship.

Florida	10,000 dollars
Paris	15,000 euros
Heidelberg	15,000 euros
Madrid	20,000 euros

Application requires completion of the standard Schiller scholarship application form plus a 500-word essay in English explaining financial need. Documentation proving financial need due to COVID should be provided.

A point system will be used to ensure fairness:

- Loss of job due to COVID (student or parent if parent is paying tuition) (5 points)
- Number of siblings currently attending the University (5 point per sibling)
- Number of siblings who had graduated from Schiller in the past. (2 points per sibling)
- Points will also be awarded for the essay (10 points)

The application, essay and documentation will be reviewed by the Campus Scholarship Committee who will take the final decision whether to award or deny the scholarship based on the points awarded and the essay up to the maximum allocated amount per campus.

COVID-19 Pandemic Waiver:

Proof of High School Graduation (Secondary Education) or GED

Applicants are required to submit their academic transcripts from their high school of graduation, or evidence of having successfully completed the General Education Development (GED) test. Official High School transcripts are those that are received by Schiller that do not state “released to student” or any wording thereof expressing that transcript was released to student. If acceptable proof of High School completion is not received by the first day of class the student will not be allowed to start classes at the University.

However, in view of the COVID-19 Pandemic we realize that you may not be able to obtain Validated Proof of your High School/GED transcripts. Therefore, if you cannot obtain Official proof of your high school/GED we will allow you to start school and provide the proof when high schools or GED agencies re-open.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Applicants must submit full documentation for ALL education, past and present. Only what is mentioned and submitted along with this agreement will be evaluated by SIU. High School validation must be obtained prior to the start date. Documents not mentioned here that are submitted after admission to Schiller will not be accepted or considered for admissions purposes.

Ramifications if student did not give appropriate information:

If documentation that is provided to Schiller International University is not valid the student will be dismissed from the campus. If a student received Title IV funds that monies will be returned to Title IV and the student billed for the monies owed.

COVID-19 Pandemic Scholarship for Graduate Applicants

Eligibility:

Schiller International University is offering a limited number of Pandemic Scholarships for Graduate Applicants. The Pandemic Scholarship is available to new applicants wishing to enroll in our September through June 2021 Master Degree programs. This Pandemic Scholarship is designed to help students who want to further their education with a Masters Degree in such a difficult period of time.

- The scholarship cannot be added to any other SIU scholarships
- The scholarship is only applicable to Graduate Applicants

Documentation:

A standard Schiller Scholarship Application form plus a 500-word essay in English.

Evaluation:

The application and essay will be reviewed by the COVID-19 Pandemic Scholarship Graduate Application Committee.

ONE WORLD-ONE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

One World-One University Undergraduate* Scholarship

Eligibility: Application to this scholarship is available to all Schiller International University undergraduate students who are preparing, personally and professionally, for future leadership roles in an international setting.

Applications for the One World-One University Scholarship will only be considered during the enrollment process.

Eligibility will be considered towards:

- Students who demonstrate via application essay, an interest in developing international and cross-cultural competencies.
- Students who demonstrate via application essay, their intent to create strong interaction among people with diverse backgrounds.
- Students have previously demonstrated or who demonstrate via application essay, a propensity and desire to act as leaders of Global Change.
- Students who have previously demonstrated or who demonstrate via application essay, or through actions and/or ideas, their desire to foster and maintain a more sustainable environment while encouraging ideas and/or actions to reduce the overall carbon footprint on the planet.
- Students who hold citizenship from a country that Schiller International University has not enrolled previously.
- Women who enroll in the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) program.
- ***For the Women in STEM Scholarship, this scholarship will be applicable to Undergraduate and Graduate applicants**
 - The following programs are considered STEM - Bachelor of Science and Digital Business

These demonstrations and intentions should be clearly expressed in the Essay that is required to accompany all applications for the One World-One University Scholarship.

Documentation Required: Scholarship Application, Scholarship Essay, and Proof of Student Acceptance.

EARLY ACCEPTANCE SCHILER INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

SIU is now accepting PRE-applications from high school seniors.

Students in the last year of high school can pre-apply to begin their college career at one of SIU campuses.

Conditional approval will be determined by the designated campus

Who can Apply?

All students in their last year of high School who want to reserve a place in advance at SCHILLER INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY to begin their studies in the following academic year.

What are the benefits of early tuition payments?

- Enroll and pay tuition 6 months prior to the start of your academic career and receive \$1,500 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE March 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021
- Enroll and pay tuition 5 months prior to the start of your academic career and receive \$1,000 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE April 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021
- Enroll and pay tuition 3 months prior to the start of your academic career and receive \$500 toward your tuition.
 - Example: enroll and pay tuition BEFORE June 2021, and your academic career begins September 2021

Schiller will reserve a place for the student until the expected enrollment start date.

Payments are non-refundable. Exceptions may apply if:

Student doesn't get the High School Diploma or GED

Student doesn't get the VISA to go to the campus Country

What are the advantages for SIU?

SCHILLER INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY can organize your classes in a more effective way:

- Knowing how many students will actually make up the class.
- Closing enrollment when, according to our admissions policy, a class is full.
- Preparing the materials to respond to the profiles of the students who are pre-applying
- Scheduling efficiencies – a planned schedule will be offer to the student based on their career path. The schedule will follow a cohort (a group of students) that can take the same classes, maximizing the classroom experience.

French Government CVEC Student Tax 2020/2021

WHAT IS IT?

Students admitted to an institution of higher education in France are subject to a fee known as the CVEC, which helps to improve students' services, especially in the areas of social life, health, culture, and athletics. Programs that enhance the student experience. The Funds raised through the CVEC program will finance whose primary beneficiaries are Students. These will take a variety of forms, among them access to health care, social support, recreational opportunities, and artistic and cultural events. The result will be an overall improvement in student services and support.

COST / PAYMENT

- The amount of this new annual fee for the 2020/2021 academic year is €92.
- The fee is to be paid directly to the French Authorities each year. Schiller International University needs you to show proof of payment before September 1st, 2020 to be eligible for registration beginning with the **October 2020 term: or** for January 2021 for the February term. This applies to all enrolled student and future starts.
- The CVEC may be paid online or in cash (at the post office)

PREPARE THESE DOCUMENTS AS YOU WILL NEED TO UPLOAD THEM:

NEXT STEPS

1. Go to <https://cvec.etudiant.gouv.fr/> (for more information on the CVEC).
 2. Select "OBTENIR MON ATTESTATION" to create your account and obtain your proof of payment. At present the payment platform is only available in French. Attached to this email the **English language instructions from Campus France**.
 3. When asked to select your university (établissement) select: AUTRE
 4. Send your "CVEC attestation"
 - A. For students already registered: the formal attestation should be sent to **Mr. Cyril Nehme:** Cyril.nehme@schiller.edu
 - B. For New accepted students: The formal attestation should be sent to **Mrs. Lala Samba and Mrs. Clemence Pigeon** on lala.samba@schiller.edu and clemence.pigeon@schiller.edu.
- Please ensure the document you send is the formal Attestation PDF; your proof of payment or a screenshot of the page will not be accepted.

Please Note:

- Save your “CVEC attestation” PDF as you will need it when you apply for Social Security in France
- Sending your “CVEC attestation” will allow you to check in for the semester. If you do not check in, you risk your courses being dropped.

Frequently Asked Questions

Does this apply to me as well, as a French citizen?

Yes, absolutely. It applies to all students in France.

I will graduate from Schiller International University at the end of the Fall semester, do I still have to pay this fee?

Yes, you do. This annual fee is due every academic year, even if you do not stay for the whole year.

Schiller International university does not show in the drop-down list of universities. What do I do?

Please select “Autres”

Are there any exemptions from this fee?

Some students are not obliged to pay the CVEC contribution.

They include:

- Students receiving **need-based scholarships managed by CROUS** (recipients of scholarship grants from the ministries of higher education, culture, or agriculture), students receiving French government scholarships and students financed by one of France’s regions to study in paramedical, health, and social programs
- Students who are **refugees**, student aliens who have been granted “**subsidiary protection**” (*protection subsidiaire*), and students **seeking asylum**.

Specifically, **not exempt from the CVEC** are students in the following categories:

- Students receiving foreign government scholarships
- Students receiving grants from private entities (such as a foundation).

Can Schiller International University pay this fee and charge my student account?

No, as per governmental regulations every student must pay themselves and present their payment attestation to their university.

I am only registered into an Internship or a Thesis Extension semester, do I owe CVEC?

Your thesis registration gives you student status; therefore, you owe the CVEC fee.

Payment by Cash at a La Poste office

By choosing this payment method:

- You immediately receive a payment notice to present at any La Poste office. In addition to 92 €, you must pay a postal fee of 5 €.
- Within 2 business days after your payment, you will receive an attestation d'acquittement by e-mail, to be submitted to your establishment.
