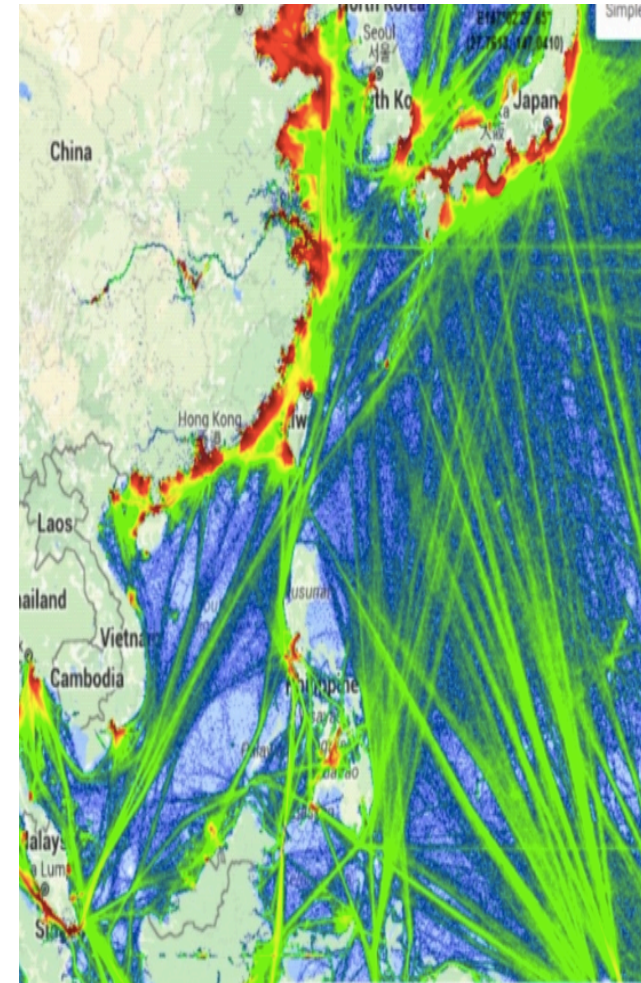

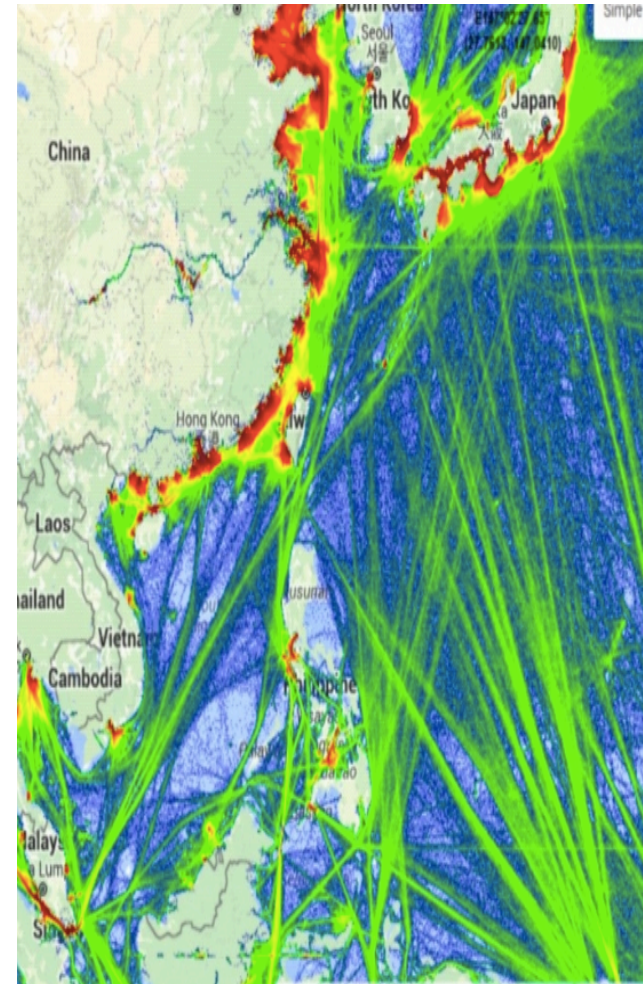

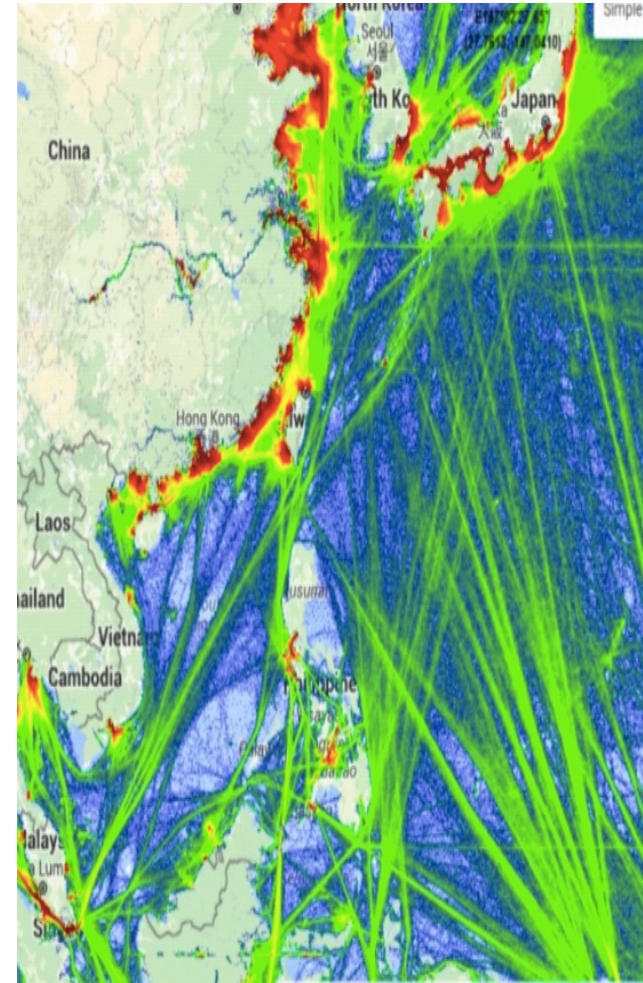

- Anchored heavily on the principle of the DOC
- New provisions on conflict prevention and dispute management
- Stronger commitment to facilitate maritime security cooperation, particularly in maintaining freedom of navigation and over-flight

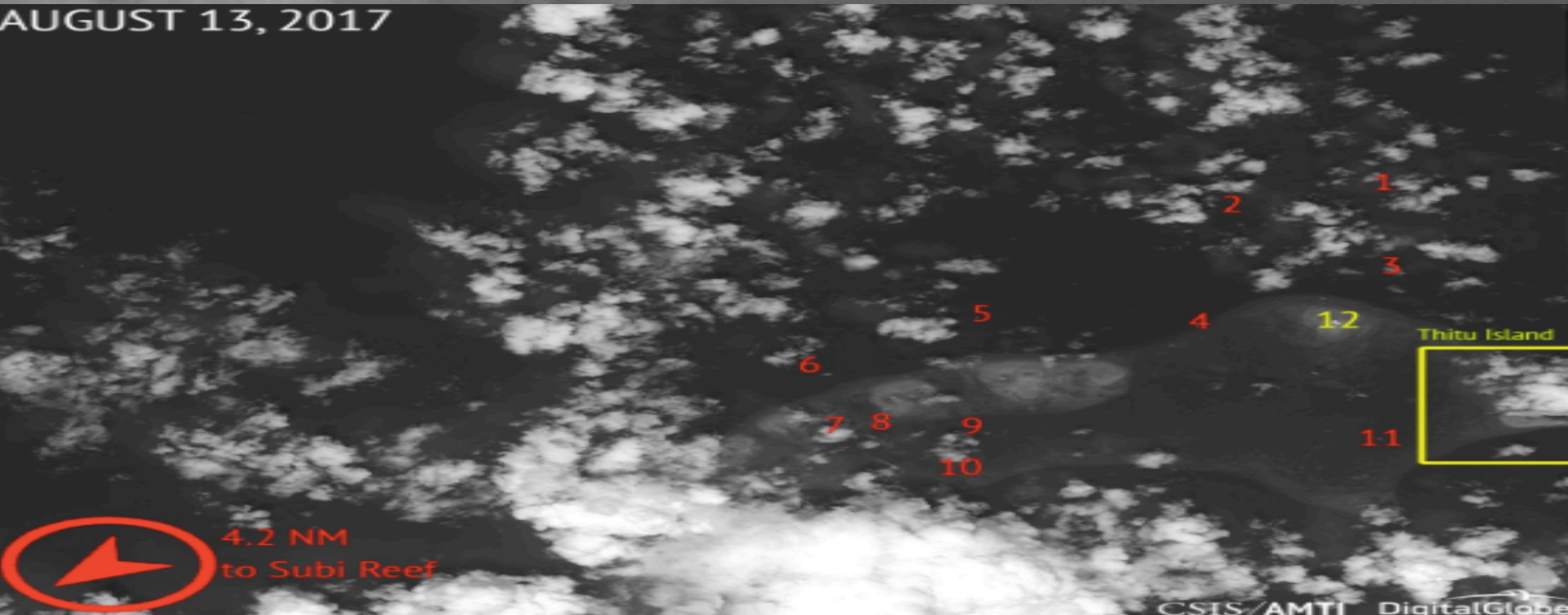

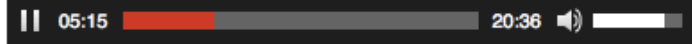

Continuing unilateral actions of claimants:

- Increased maritime patrols
- Incessant infrastructure developments and facilities improvements, especially the planned and actual setting up of maritime surveillance and monitoring posts or coast watch stations in occupied features
- Persistent acquisition of maritime assets for territorial protection and defense
- Growing conduct of military exercises in or near the disputed waters
- Intensified holding of other activities like island tourisms, marine surveys, scientific researches, oil and natural gas explorations, and patriotic visits.

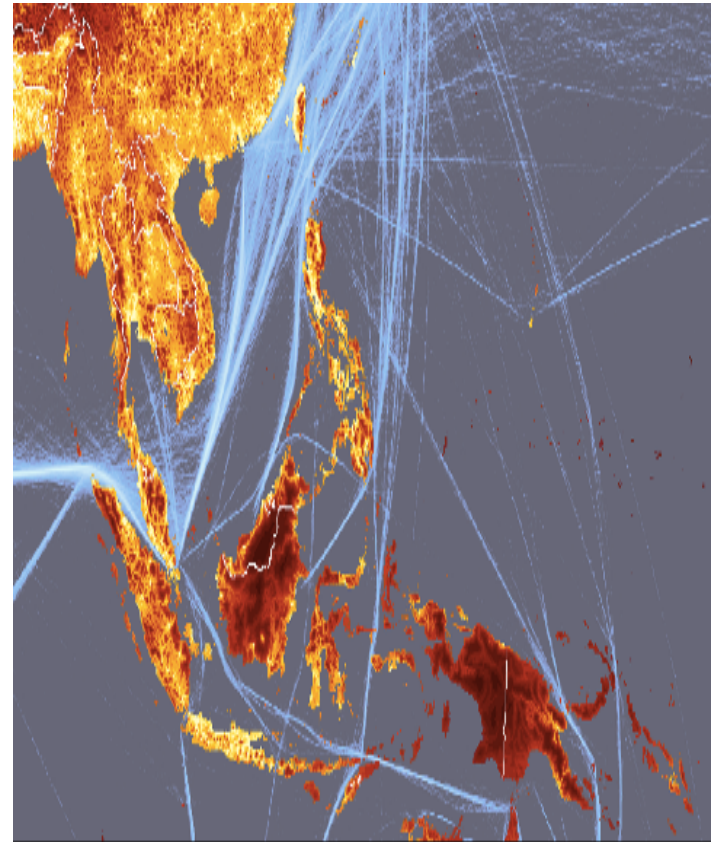

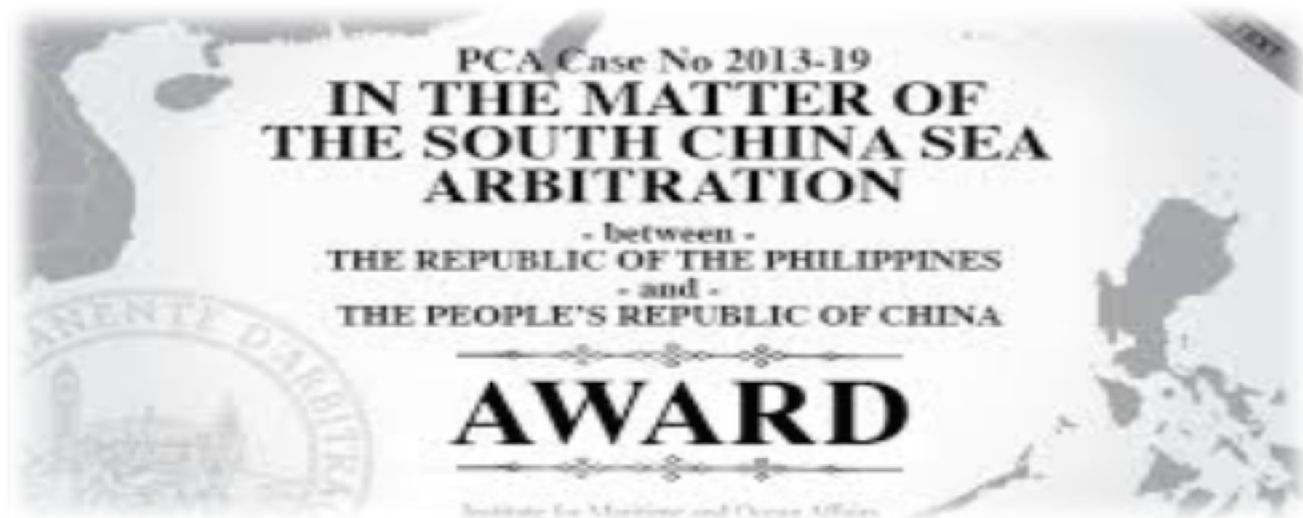

- There is still the lack of clarity on how to implement the DOC
- China and ASEAN members have different levels of political will on the DOC implementation
- China and ASEAN members continues to have different views on how to start and conclude the negotiations on the COC

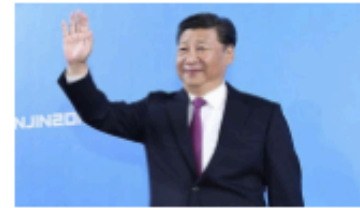
