

### **Community Transport:**

Making transport more inclusive for communities across Scotland



# What is community transport?

Community transport supports
people to live independently, participate
in their communities and access local
services and amenities. Run by charities,
community groups and other notfor-profit entities it offers a reliable
and resilient way to meet transport
needs. Services are person-centred
and targeted towards those most likely
to be underserved or excluded by
mainstream transport, including
people who are less mobile or live in
sparsely populated areas.

## What services does the sector provide?

Demand-responsive journeys enable people to access everyday services, such as the shops or vital health services, whilst scheduled community buses connect and integrate communities with the wider transport network, supporting a modal shift from private cars to shared transport. Yet, many services run on small, short-term grants, fighting to sustain themselves rather than receiving the funding and support that would enable them to plan, thrive and develop.

## Who are the Community Transport Association?

**The Community Transport Association (CTA)** is a national charity supporting charities and community groups across the UK to provide community transport solutions. [CTA has a large presence in Wales, serving approximately 100 CT organisations of which 80 are CTA members.]

### **Prioritise Decarbonisation:**



- Recognise community transport's **contribution** to the low carbon and active travel agenda, as a shared mobility mode that helps achieve a modal shift away from the private car
- **Support community transport to** become an alternative transport **solution** for those penalised by green transport policies, for example low emission zones which penalise rural dwellers who rely on the private car
- **Ensure that green funding and** infrastructure is equally available to the CT sector and responsive to the needs of accessible vehicles

### Champion **Health Transport:**



- **Ensure that CT is included and** integrated into the planning and delivery of health services by introducing transport coordinators to all health boards
- **Evaluate NEPT services** and ensure that ambulance services and CTs are working in an integrated way
