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#### **Overview**

<u>35%</u> of Scottish citizens feel part of how decisions affecting their community are made

77% would get more involved in their community if it was easier to participate in decisions that affect it

<u>80%</u> said that people should be involved in deciding how money is spent on local services

<u>96%</u> said that people should be involved in making decisions about how local services are planned and run



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### Stage One – Pre-work: Engagement and Governance



- Consultation: outcomes, priorities, process 100+ participants
- Nested Governance: citywide and locality based
- Expressions of interest: rather than 'proposals' or 'applications'
- Needs assessments: based on locality intelligence
- Consultation with expert groups: will discuss below
- Advice rather than recommendations: the choice of participants
- Collaboration as an end in itself: Edinburgh Wellbeing Pact



### **Stage Two: Consensus Building**

STAGE TWO Consensus Building Locality Cooperative Meetings The core of the process, these meetings will agree local or thematic consensus views about what we want to see delivered on the ground. We will stream these to ensure to put people's time to the best use. 1-23 February 2022 – max 3 meetings.

- Consensus building: how to do that effectively in the time?
- Who to include?
- How to balance time with ambition?
- How to strengthen collaboration?
- How to create a holistic 'wrap-around' set of joint activity?



### **Stage Three: Locality Advisory Teams**

STAGE THREE Locality Advisory Teams Locality Advisory Team These meetings will both ratify the decisions made in the previous stage and explore solutions to any areas where consensus could not be made within the locality or theme. 7-15 March 2022

Local/thematic Agreement
 Report to Citywide Advisory
 Team

- Embedded teams from across the system
- A 'guiding mind' to draw out local ambitions
- A 'fall back' position in the event there was no consensus



### **Stage Four: Citywide Advisory Team**



Citywide Advisory Team Ratify decisions of previous groups and explore solutions to the remaining areas where consensus could not be achieved within the locality or theme. 17-22 March 2022

 Finalised agreement about the agreed programme.
 Payment spreadsheet

- Comprised of senior managers from health and social care
- Minority ethnic community and lived experience representation
- The ultimate 'fall back' position: to operate as a grants panel
- Held overall governance and ownership of the processes
- Will own future development

### **Engagement with minority ethnic communities**

• Providing feedback into the wider group:

"There is a need for mental health support that is more sensitive, informed and aware of different cultural and religious understandings and approaches to mental health"

> "Mainstream services should be better informed about minority ethnic organisations and how to better link people in"


