### AZTEC STORYLINES

**VS. THE HUSKIES:** San Diego State welcomes Washington for a Monday afternoon contest at 1:00 p.m. It is the first meeting between the Aztecs and Huskies since 2012, where Washington traveled to San Diego for a season-opening three-game series.

It is the second and final Pac-12 team the Aztecs will face during the 2018 regular season. The Aztecs enter Monday having won four of its last five games against Pac-12 opponents.

**VS. THE DIRTBAGS:** Just a week after the Aztecs defeated Long Beach State on the road, 5-2, the Dirtbags and Aztecs meet for the second time in 2018, this time at Lake Elsinore Diamond, the home of the Lake Elsinore Storm, the Class A affiliate of the San Diego Padres and members of the California League.

Including this year's win over the Dirtbags, the Aztecs are 7-5 against Long Beach State in the last 12 meetings. The Dirtbags defeated SDSU twice in last year's NCAA Regional that was hosted by LBSU, which was ranked No. 9 in the country at the time.

SDSU enters Tuesday 20-6 against Big West teams since the start of the 2017 season.

**IN LAKE ELSINORE:** It is the fourth consecutive season

the Aztecs will play at Lake Elsinore diamond. SDSU defeated UCLA 5-4 in 2017 in Lake Elsinore and dropped a 9-6 decision to San Diego in 2016. SDSU was the No. 4 seed in the Lake Elsinore Regional in 2015, which was hosted by UC Santa Barbara.

In that regional, SDSU defeated No. 1 seeded UCSB and eventual No. 4 overall pick in the 2015 MLB First-Year Player Draft Dillon Tate, who started for the Gauchos and was roughed up for four runs on six hits.

SDSU then played Virginia, the eventual national champions in 2015, and fell 3-1. SDSU's 2015 season ended in Lake Elsinore with a 12-11 loss to No. 15-ranked USC.

**ON THE AIR:** KCR, SDSU's student-run radio station will produce broadcasts for both Monday and Tuesday's games. Links to listen and live stats are available at GoAztecs.com.

**GARRETT HILL, PRETTY GOOD:** SDSU's brightest highlight over the weekend was Garrett Hill's 8.1-inning start against New Mexico that led the way to a 3-2 victory over the Lobos in the series finale. Hill struck out seven and allowed just three hits while striking out seven. No New Mexico runner reached second base during Hill's time on the mound, and the only run Hill was credited with surrendering came via a ninth-inning home run that occurred two pitches after Hill allowed a one-out walk in the top of the ninth.

## AZTEC STORYLINES

The first half of Hill's season ranks as one of the best showings in program history. Hill particularly had a successful month of March, becoming the first SDSU pitcher in recorded history to earn five victories in a single month. He is also the first Aztec pitcher to earn a win in five consecutive outings since current Minnesota Twins reliever Addison Reed did so in 2010.

Hill currently leads the nation with six victories and his 1.28 ERA is the best in the Mountain West.

Below is a comparison between the start of Hill's 2018 season and Stephen Strasburg's 2009 season through seven starts. In 2009, Stephen Strasburg won USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award, recognizing him as the nation's top player and was drafted No. 1 overall by the Washington Nationals.

**RECAP OF NEW MEXICO:** Despite its first series loss of the 2018 season, the Aztecs managed to hold on to second place in the Mountain West after salvaging in series finale win against the Lobos on Saturday. SDSU is a perfect 6-0 in weekend series finales this season and 14-1 in its last 15 games following a loss.

The Aztecs had won all five of its weekend series before Thursday and Friday's setbacks against New Mexico. SDSU has won five of six weekend series in 2018, 11 of its last 14 Mountain West series, and 16 of its last 19 weekend series overall.

Julian Escobedo led the Aztecs with a 5-for-10 showing at the plate in the series. Escobedo also drove in two runs against the Lobos, tied for the team-high with Jacob Maekawa (who hit .444 for the series) and Chase Calabuig.

**MARCH MADNESS:** Despite only having seven of its 18 games in March at home, the Aztecs enjoyed quite a bit of success over its March schedule, owning an 12-6 record for the month.

SDSU posted a .302 team batting average for the month while holding its opponents to a .250 mark. Julian Escobedo led the team with a .424 batting average for the month, going 25-for-59 at the plate. Jordan Verdon led the team with 15 extra-base hits and 24 RBI last month.

On the mound, SDSU was led by Garrett Hill, who recorded a 0.81 ERA in a 5-0 month. A pair of freshmen led the efforts coming out of the bullpen last month, with Casey Schmitt's 1.08 ERA and Casey O'Sullivan's 1.29 ERA last month being the best on the team. SDSU as a team posted a 3.55 ERA in March.

**AHEAD TO APRIL:** Tony Gwynn Stadium will be quite busy during April, serving host 12 games which includes an eight-game homestand beginning with a April 10th meeting with UC Irvine and concluding with a Sunday series finale with Fresno State on April 22nd. SDSU's only road weekend series is this weekend, when the team visits Air Force for a three-game series beginning on Friday, April 6.

**HALFWAY THROUGH:** SDSU officially reached the halfway point of the regular season after Saturday's series finale with New Mexico. With an 18-9 record through 27 games, SDSU has an identical record to the 2017 team at this point in the season. The first half of

the regular season is tied for SDSU's best first-half start since going 21-6 to start the 2015 season.

**ESCOBEDO & CALABUIG LEADING THE WAY:** Both Julian Escobedo and Chase Calabuig ride 11-game hitting streaks. The two streaks are tied for the longest by an Aztec during the 2018 season.

Escobedo is hitting .524 (22-for-42) with a home run, three doubles and 11 RBIs over that span. Escobedo has recorded five multi-hit games in his last six games played.

Calabuig is hitting .367 over his 11-game hitting streak, which includes eight extra base hits (six doubles, one triple, one home run), and 11 RBIs. Calabuig has reached base in 25 of 27 games this season.

**CHAD BIBLE NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK (MARCH 27):** For the second consecutive week, SDSU brought home Mountain West Player of the Week honors with Chad Bible using a three-home run performance at UNLV to collect the honor. For the week, Bible went 9-for-19 (.474) with three home runs, a double, and seven RBIs.

Bible homered in three consecutive games at UNLV, becoming the first Aztec since May 2015 to do so. Bible posted new career-highs in hits (4) and RBIs (4) in SDSU's 17-8 win over UNLV on Saturday.

Bible leads all players in the conference with five home runs in MW play. He's also fifth in the league with a .457 conference batting average, second in the league with 12 conference RBIs, and second in the league with a .971 conference slugging percentage.

**NATIONAL RANKINGS UPDATE:** San Diego State saw itself in four of the major national ranking polls last Monday morning, including being slotted at No. 23 in the nation by both D1 Baseball and Baseball America. After being at No. 25 for three consecutive weeks by Baseball America, SDSU's series win over UNLV pushed the Aztecs up two spots to No. 23. The Aztecs are also No. 24 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's national top 30 and No. 26 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll.

**HOMEGROWN:** The San Diego State roster features 10 players from San Diego. Collectively, San Diego natives have posted 63.7 percent of SDSU's 2018 hit total (174 of 273)

**EXPERIENCE ON THE DIAMOND:** Despite having a team of 15 freshmen -- the program's largest freshman class since 2011 -- the Aztecs have two of the most experienced players in the nation this year in Chase Calabuig, who is fourth among all DI players with 202 career games played, and Jacob Erickson, who leads all DI pitchers with 103 career pitching appearances. The Aztecs are the only team in the nation to have a player in the top five of both categories. Erickson is two appearances shy of tying the school's all-time pitching appearance record, while Calabuig is 33 games shy from setting the program's career games played record (statistics are as of March 29)

Mark Martinez heads into his fourth season as the head coach at San Diego State, a position he assumed in 2015 after nine years as an Aztec assistant coach under the late Tony Gwynn.

Martinez helped Gwynn transform and build the program into what it is today. He has helped guide the Aztecs to five regional appearances in the past eight years after an 18-year absence from the postseason. Along the way, he has guided the team to Mountain West Championships in four of the past five seasons.

Martinez comes into his fourth year at the helm of the SDSU program after compiling 104 in his first the campaigns since assuming that position. He is the lone coach in program history to record 100 wins in his first three seasons as head coach.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had six of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry and Lance Zawadzki). In addition, Martinez has helped guide 47 Aztecs to All-Mountain West honors and eight Aztecs to All-American accolades.

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans

In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Moun-

tain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals. The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons.

Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well.

During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season, only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State.

In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American.

Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series

of seminars offered each winter and summer.

During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage.

New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title.

Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

The 55-year-old Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88.

Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990.

In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa (18), and a son, Cade (13).
