- San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament for the 15th time in program history.
- San Diego State opened the tournament as the higher seed for the eighth time and is 9-5 in games in which it is the higher seed..
- San Diego State is a single-digit seed for the eighth time.
- San Diego State competed in and won a Regional Final (South Region) the first time in program history.
- San Diego State is playing for a men's basketball national championship for the first time.
- San Diego State has averaged 69.0 point per game in its 10 victories.
- Brian Dutcher** guides his team to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in the last five years that a national champion has been crowned.
- Brian Dutcher** has been part of 19 previous NCAA tournaments; 16 as an assistant coach and three as head coach.
- Brian Dutcher** has coached in four Final Fours and won the National Championship in 1989

## OFF THE BOUNCE

- After defeating Florida Atlantic, for the third time in as many games and for the first time in the Final Four, San Diego State, the 5-seed and South Region Champion, will face 4-seed Connecticut, the West Region Champions, for the national championship on Monday, April 3, at NRG Stadium in Houston, Texas.
- San Diego State continues to make history the past two weeks. Head coach Brian Dutcher won his first NCAA Tournament game. The team defeated the overall No. 1-seed in the tournament and the No. 1-ranked team in the nation in Alabama. The team won its first Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four games and now competes in its first national championship in men's basketball.
- San Diego State is the first Mountain West program to win a game in the Sweet 16, Elite 8 or Final Four.
- The Aztecs are making their 15th appearance in the Division I event, owning a 11-14 all-time record, including five wins in this year's tournament. Head coach Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec sidelines for 22 of the program's 25 all-time tournament games and all 11 of the program's victories, including his first as the program's head coach in the team's first round game against Charleston on March 16.
- This is the fourth NCAA appearance for Brian Dutcher as head coach. The two-time Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, in his sixth season leading the program and had a likely appearance in the 2019-20 event (San Diego State was 30-2 and projected as a No. 1 or No. 2 seed), which was canceled because of the COVID pandemic.
- The Aztecs appearance in the regional final game, the Final Four and now the national title game are their first and the first for a Mountain West program, which began competition in the 1999-00 season.
- This is the program's 10th tournament appearance in the last 13 seasons in which a champion has been crowned. That total does not include the 2019-20 season when SDSU was 30-2 and ranked sixth in the AP poll when the season ended prior to the tournament.
- San Diego State owns the third-best record in the nation, 108-22 (83.1 percent), since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. It trails only Gonzaga's 121-12 (91.0 percent), and Houston's 116-22 (84.1 percent), and is ahead of Baylor's 104-24 (81.3 percent) and Kansas' 111-26 (81.0 percent) records in that time frame.**
- SDSU comes into the national championship game having won 15 of its last 16 (15-1) and 19 of its last 21 (19-2), with its two losses coming on the road at Nevada (14-2 at home) and at Boise State (14-1 at home), both which earned NCAA Tournament bids.
- San Diego State owns the fifth-best record in the nation since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, 364-115 (.760), and is 165-90 (.647) in road and neutral site contests in that time frame which is the sixth best in the nation.**
- San Diego State plays Connecticut in Monday's national championship game. The Huskies are a No. 5-seed and West Regional Champions. SDSU has a 0-1 record against the program, with its loss coming in the Sweet 16 in the 2011 NCAA Tournament.
- The matchup between the 5-seed Aztecs and 4-seed Huskies will be the first time those two seeds have met for the national championship.
- San Diego State was ranked for 13 of the 17 weeks of the regular season and as a ranked team in 2022-23 has a 23-6 record. The Aztecs have won nine straight and 15 of its last 15 as a member of the Associated Press top 25.
- San Diego State has won 32 games this season, the second most in program history. Only the 2010-11 squad led by Kawhi Leonard had more victories (34).

- San Diego State has won nine consecutive games, which is the third-longest active streak in the country.
- San Diego State did not allow a fast break point in the South Regional (vs. [1] Alabama, [6] Creighton) and against [9] Florida Atlantic in the Final Four after allowing 25 in the first two rounds in Orlando (15 vs. College of Charleston and 10 vs. Furman).
- In its first four NCAA Tournament games this season, San Diego State has limited the opposition to 17.0 percent shooting from three-point range (16-for-94).
- San Diego State played in its sixth consecutive Mountain West Tournament title game, defeating Utah State, 62-57. **Matt Bradley**, who averaged 12.3 points and 3.0 rebounds, was named the tournament MVP. **Jaedon LeDee**, who reached double figure-scoring in two of three games and averaged 6.0 rebounds earned inclusion on the all-tournament team. The Aztecs and Aggies have played each other in four of the last five championship games and have a 2-2 split in those contests. Boise State was the interloper in last year's title matchup against San Diego State. Amazingly, SDSU has made the tournament title game in nine of the last 10 years and in 13 of the last 15 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 & 2023).
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, no program in the state of California has more 30-win seasons than San Diego State's four (2010-11, 2013-14, 2019-20 & 2022-23). UCLA has done it twice (2016-17 & 2022-23) and Saint Mary's once (2016-17).
- Senior guard **Matt Bradley** became just the fifth player since at least the start of the 1996-97 season to score 1,000 points for two college programs. He scored 1,289 in three years at California and has totaled 1,025 in two seasons at San Diego State.
- SDSU head coach **Brian Dutcher** is in his sixth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 24th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his five-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, a 151-46 (76.6 percent) overall record and has already been named the national coach of the year and twice named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. Among first time head coaches who started in the 2017-18 season, Dutcher's 151 wins are the most in the nation.
- After snapping College of Charleston's 10-game win streak in the NCAA First Round, Furman's seven-game win streak in the Second Round and No. 1/2 Alabama's five-game win streak in the Sweet 16, SDSU snapped Creighton's three-game win streak in the Elite 8 and on Saturday night ended Florida Atlantic's 11 game win streak.

## QUICK HITS - 2023 NCAA TOURNAMENT

- This is the first time San Diego State has been a No. 5-seed, and is the third highest seed the program has achieved in school history (No. 2 in 2011 and No. 4 in 2014).
- This is the third consecutive year the Aztecs have started the tournament as a higher seed than its opposition.
- San Diego State advances to the NCAA Championship for the first time in program history. Prior to this run in the NCAA Tournament, the Aztecs had made it as far as the Sweet 16 (twice).
- San Diego State completes the third-largest comeback in a NCAA semifinal game and the fifth-largest comeback in any NCAA Final Four game (semifinal plus title game).
- San Diego State comes back from its largest deficit to win this season (14 points), besting a 13-point comeback at New Mexico on Feb. 25, 2023.
- San Diego State becomes just the third team ever to win back-to-back NCAA Tournament games by one point (also Loyola Chicago in 2018 and St. Joseph's in 1981).
- San Diego State wins its ninth consecutive game, which is the second-longest active streak in the country and longest among any team in the NCAA Tournament.
- San Diego State handed Florida Atlantic just its second loss when leading at the half (FAU is now 27-2 when leading at the half).
- San Diego State has played a No. 1-seed three times and is 1-2 in those games (vs. Arizona in the Sweet 16 in Anaheim, Calif., on March 27, 2014, vs. Duke in the third round at Charlotte, N.C. on March 22, 2015 and vs. Alabama in the Sweet 16 in Louisville, Ky, on March 24, 2023).
- Against Alabama, SDSU earned its first Sweet 16 win, its first win over a No. 1-seed and its first victory against the No. 1-ranked team in the country.
- San Diego State held three of its four opponents to less than 60 points and the other to 64 points.
- San Diego State held Creighton, which averaged 77.0 points per game on 47.0 percent shooting from the floor and 35.8 percent from three-point range, to 56 points on 40.0 percent shooting (22-for-55) and 11.8 percent from three-point range (2-for-17).
- The Aztecs shot 41.8 percent (104-of-249) in its first four contests and held its opponents to 34.1 percent (79-of-232) from the field.
- **SDSU limited Charleston, Furman, Alabama and Creighton to a combined 17.0 percent (16-of-94) from the bonus distance.**
- San Diego State's bench outscored its opponent's bench 118-to-50. (+68 points)
- San Diego State outscored its opponents 72-to-49 in second chance points. (+23 points)
- SDSU outscored its opponents 166-to-144 in the paint. (+22 points)
- San Diego State has 54 assists on 129 made baskets.
- The Aztecs outrebounded its opponents 201-to-181. (+20 rebounds).
- **Matt Bradley** became just the seventh Aztec with a 20-point NCAA Tournament game and second this season (Darrion Trammell's 21 vs. Creighton in the Elite Eight) with 21 points vs. Florida Atlantic.
- **Lamont Butler** made his second buzzer beater of the season vs. Florida Atlantic (also Feb. 25 at New Mexico).
- **Lamont Butler** became just the second Aztec in an NCAA Tournament game to record at least 18 points with multiple three-pointers without a miss (Mohamed Abukar vs. Indiana on March 16, 2006).

## SOUTH REGIONAL HONORS

When the dust had settled following the South Region Championship game two Aztecs had earned honors for their play.

- Senior **Darrion Trammell** was named to the All-Region Team as well as the South Region Most Outstanding Player.
- In four games, Trammell led the team with 12.8 points on 19-of-46 shooting (.413), including 8-of-21 (.381) from the bonus distance, with 4.0 rebounds in 27.3 minutes per game.
- Junior **Lamont Butler** was named to the All-Region Team.
- In his four games he shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the floor while averaging 10.3 points, 3.8 assists and 3.5 rebounds.

## FIRSTS KEEP COMING

**Brian Dutcher** and the 2022-23 Aztecs have enjoyed a lot of success this season and several firsts for the program...

- With the Aztecs victory over College of Charleston in its first round game in the South Region, Brian Dutcher earned his first NCAA Tournament victory as a head coach after falling short in his first three games as the top man.
- In the South Regional semifinal the Aztecs defeated Alabama. The victory was the program's first against a No. 1-seed in the event, the first against the No. 1-ranked team in the nation, its first in the Sweet 16.
- Last Sunday, the team won its first Elite 8 contest and advanced to its first Final Four.
- On Saturday night Dutcher won his first Final Four game to advance to the national championship game.

## LEEDIE HOMECOMING

Senior **Jaedon LeDee** is coming home and will compete in his hometown for the national championship.

- In the Final Four he scored 12 points on 5-of-12 (.417) shooting and grabbed 6 rebounds in 14:26.
- LeDee was a four-time all-state and all-conference selection at The Kinkaid School in Houston.
- Averaged 27 points, 15 rebounds and three assists as a senior (2017-18).
- Averaged 15.2 points and eight rebounds per game for Texas Pro in the Adidas Gauntlet Series in 2017.
- Averaged 20 points and 10 rebounds as a junior (2016-17).

## DUTCHER IN THE POSTSEASON

When the Aztecs won their first-round game against College of Charleston, much was made of it being Coach **Brian Dutcher's** first win in the NCAA Tournament after three losses, however...

- While it is true it was his first win in March Madness as a head coach, it was far from the first time he was on the bench for postseason wins, including victories in the NCAA Tournament.
- Dutcher has been on the bench for a total of 59 NCAA Tournament games (28 at Michigan, 25 at San Diego State and six at Illinois) and has a 36-23 record in those contests.
- Dutcher's record at San Diego State is 11-14, at Michigan he was 21-7 and as a grad assistant at Illinois he went 4-2.
- If you add in his 14-6 record on the bench in the NIT, Coach Dutcher's overall record in postseason games in which he was on the bench is 50-29.



## AZTECS IN HOUSTON

San Diego State has played four times in the city of Houston, the most populated city in the state and has yet to suffer a loss.

- The Aztecs have played at Rice on two occasions and come away with a pair of wins (Dec. 14, 1974 - 83-75 & Jan. 24, 1998 - 62-59).
- SDSU has defeated the University of Houston (71-61) on Dec. 21, 2002 on the Cougars home floor.
- San Diego State defeated Florida Atlantic, 72-71 in the Final Four on Saturday night.

## THE SOUTH REGION & THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

San Diego State competed in the South Region for the third time in program history and the first time since the 2015 tournament. The region has delivered positive results for the Scarlet and Black with a 6-2 mark.

San Diego State first played in the South Region in 2013 as a 7-seed against 10-seed Oklahoma at the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia, Pa., and defeated the Sooners 70-55 in its opening game. In its second game, The Aztecs were upset by 15-seed Florida Gulf Coast 71-81.

SDSU returned to the region two years later, in 2015, as an 8-seed at Charlotte, N.C.'s Time Warner Cable Arena and beat 9-seed St. John's, 76-64 for the right to face 1-seed Duke in the next round. The Aztecs fell to that year's eventual national champions 49-68.

Two weekends ago, San Diego State defeated the College of Charleston 63-57 to climb above the .500 mark all-time in the region and followed that up with a 75-52 dismantling of Furman in the second round to advance to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2014.

Last weekend was the Aztecs' first foray to the city of Louisville for a regular season or NCAA tournament game and took down the No. 1-seed Alabama 71-64 for SDSU's first Sweet 16 win in three tries. Finally, with its 57-56 win over Creighton, the Aztecs earned its first trip to the Final Four.

## MATT BRADLEY IN ELITE COMPANY IN TWO RECORD BOOKS

With senior guard **Matt Bradley's** six points vs. Alabama, he became one of two players who competed in the 2022-23 season to have scored 1,000-plus points at two different institutions.

- Bradley reached the 1,000-point milestone as an Aztec and became the second active player, and only one still competing, to have scored 1,000 points with two different programs.
- Bradley totaled 1,289 points in three years at California (2018-19, 2019-20 & 2020-21).
- Bradley has scored 1,025 points in the past two seasons at San Diego State (2021-22 & 2022-23).
- He joined Penn State's Jalen Pickett (1,139 points at Siena & 1,078 at Penn State) as the only players who competed in 2022-23 to have reached four digits in points at two schools.
- Since at least the start of the 1996-97 campaign, only five players in Division I have scored at least 1,000 points with two programs: Gary Neal (1,041 at La Salle - 2002-03 to 2003-04 and 1,254 at Towson - 2005-06 to 2006-07), Juan'ya Green (1,131 at Niagara - 2011-12 to 2012-13 and 1,186 at Hofstra - 2014-15 to 2015-16), Andrew Rowsey (1,244 at UNC Asheville - 2013-14 to 2014-15 and 1,087 at Marquette - 2016-17 to 2017-18) and the aforementioned Jalen Pickett and now Bradley.

- **San Diego State is No. 4 in adjusted defensive efficiency according to KenPom.**
- San Diego State is No. 3 in 3-point percentage defense according to KenPom and held Alabama & Creighton to 11.3 percent (5-of-44).
- San Diego State is No. 20 in effective field goal percentage defense according to KenPom.
- San Diego State is No. 45 in block percentage according to KenPom and has had at least four blocks in 21 games.
- San Diego State's .409 field goal percentage defense is No. 38 in the nation and it has held each of its last eight of its last nine opponents to or under 40.0 percent shooting from the floor.
- San Diego State has held its opponents to 60 or fewer points 16 times this season.

## SERIES HISTORY VS. CONNECTICUT

- This is the second meeting between San Diego State and Connecticut with the Huskies owning a 1-0 advantage in the series.

"I'm just trying to do the best I can do," said Walker, who scored 12 straight points for UConn in the final minutes. "Whether it's scoring, talking, getting their confidence up or giving an assist, I'm just trying to do whatever is possible to enhance this team."

Freshman Jeremy Lamb added a season-high 24 points and hit a clutch 3-pointer with 1:43 left for the third-seeded Huskies (29-9), who are headed to an NCAA regional final for the 10th time after beating the Aztecs and a building full of hostile fans just 90 minutes from San Diego.

"I've never been in an environment like this," said Lamb, perfect on three 3-pointers. "Kemba hit some big shots, I hit some big shots, and we were able to pull it out. They had a lot of fans. I've never played in a game like it."

The Huskies will meet the winner of Duke's late game against Arizona on Saturday.

UConn has been streaking ever since its regular season ended with four losses in five games. Walker, their fearless playmaker from the Bronx who's generously listed at 6-foot-1, drove them to the Big East tournament title with five wins in five days.

The Huskies then knocked off Bucknell and Cincinnati in the first two NCAA rounds to earn a trip into the backyard of the second-seeded Aztecs (34-3), who hadn't lost to anybody but BYU during the best season in school history.

Walker and his teammates didn't flinch.

"This run has been sensational, and I haven't yet been able to put it in perspective," said Huskies coach Jim Calhoun, who was cited by the NCAA last month for recruiting violations and failing to create an atmosphere of compliance. "I couldn't have asked for a better gift than this team, and then we get this. I don't remember anything quite like this. This is different. This team genuinely believes in themselves and each other."

"I hate to say this, but this is an old-fashioned team."

With a newfangled scoring star who doesn't allow his size of his opponents' defense to stop his feats.

Walker out-dued Aztecs point guard D.J. Gay, who scored 16 points and trimmed UConn's second-half lead to 65-64 on a 3-pointer with 2:53 to play. Lamb replied with his 3, and his emphatic last-second dunk set off a celebration in the section of thoroughly outnumbered UConn fans.

"When your season comes to a screeching halt, like it will for every team with one exception, it hurts," Aztecs coach Steve Fisher said. "It should hurt, regardless of when, where and how. For our team this year, for what they've accomplished, it hurts exponentially more. I could not be more proud of how we competed, how hard we played, and unfortunately we came up a bit short."

Gay scored 16 points for the Aztecs. Kawhi Leonard had 12 points and nine rebounds but never dominated inside, while Billy White added 14 points.

"Both teams fed off each other," Gay said. "When one team threw a punch, the other team threw a punch, back and forth. ... Starting the second half, we were down, and there was a need for me to get more aggressive offensively. We tried to speed the tempo up, get more guys open shots, but it didn't work out."

Thousands of San Diego State fans who sold out every home game on campus this season turned Honda Center into Montezuma Mesa North, singing along to their favorite pep band songs and thoroughly drowning out UConn's cross-country travelers.

But the West Coast vibe suits the Huskies, who also came out of this region during their runs to the 1999 and 2004 national titles, along with their trip to the 2009 Final Four.

Walker scored 14 points in the first half to stake UConn to a 36-27 lead during a 19-5 run. Walker's layup put UConn up 40-32 early in the second half, but the Aztecs finally remembered they're bigger and taller than the Huskies, repeatedly using their advantages to set up open shots while keeping Walker's teammates from getting comfortable.

Back-to-back buckets put San Diego State up 53-49 with 9:19 to play - and that's when Walker's savvy stopped the rally cold.

After Franklin made a steal and fed White for a layup, Franklin and Walker exchanged a little trash talk. On the way back to their benches moments later, Franklin and Walker bumped shoulders - and Walker went crashing to the floor, drawing a technical foul and hitting both free throws.

"The contact was definitely enough to go down," Walker said with a grin.

Leonard had four early points and three rebounds before getting a technical foul after an argument with UConn's Alex Oriakhi. The foul was Leonard's second, sending him to the bench just 3:48 into the first half. The Huskies trailed until Walker led a 10-0 run to take a halftime lead - and he was just getting started.

"My teammates, they want me to take those shots," Walker said. "As long as they have confidence in me, I'm going to take them."

## THE MOUNTAIN WEST AWARDS

- Senior guard **Matt Bradley** earned **first-team all-conference** honors in voting by the league's coaches and media that regularly cover the Mountain West. Bradley averaged 13.0 points, 3.9 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game for the season and led the Aztecs in the regular season in points (390), points per game (13.0), field goal (138), field goal attempts (335), and 3-point field goal attempts (129). He was second in 3-point field goals (48), free throws (66) and free throw attempts (83), as well as third in assists (66) and fourth in steals (22).
- Senior forward **Nathan Mensah** earned his **second straight Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year honor** from the coaches. In addition, he was named an **all-defensive team** member in both the coaches and media polls and was a third-team and honorable mention all-league designee from the coaches and media, respectively. Mensah finished the regular season the No. 2 shot blocker, No. 6 shot blocker and No. 10 rebounder in the league. He has 221 blocks in his career, second in program history and is the No. 10-ranked active shot blocker in Division I.
- Junior guard **Lamont Butler** earned inclusion on the **All-Defensive Team** and was a **third-team all-league honors** as voted on by the conference's coaches. He finished the regular season fourth, 11th and 12th in the league in steals, averaging 1.63 per game, assists-to-turnover ratio at 1.61:1, and 3.27 assists, respectively.
- Senior guard **Darrion Trammell** and senior forward **Aguek Arop**, garnered **honorable mention all-league** honors from the media. Trammell, in his first season as an Aztec, paced the team in assists (63) in conference games, was second in steals (19), and tied for third on the team in scoring (7.8 ppg). In Mountain West Conference games, he ranked No. 4 in assist-to-turnover ratio and No. 10 in assists. Arop was the team's top field goal percentage shooter in Mountain West games (.605), No. 2 in blocks (13), and shot 80.0 percent from the line. What doesn't show up for Arop in any box score or stat sheet is all the little things he does that help the Aztecs win game...diving on the floor for loose balls, keeping plays alive on the glass, and being one of the team's most physical defenders.

## MOUNTAIN WEST TOURNAMENT TITLE AND THE ACCOMPANYING HARDWARE

- San Diego State won its seventh Mountain West tournament title in school history, extending its own Mountain West record. New Mexico has the second-most tournament titles with four.
- The Aztecs are now 7-8 all-time in the championship game of the Mountain West tournament and a record 42-17 overall in the tournament.
- San Diego State and Utah State have met in the championship in four of the last five years, with both teams claiming two titles.
- San Diego State's defense held Utah State to a season-low 57 points and 4-of-24 from 3-point range. In the tournament, SDSU held its opponents to 55.7 points per game.



- San Diego State fulfilled the expectations that were put on it when it was picked to win the league in the coaches and media preseason poll. The Aztecs won the regular season title by two games, its record extending ninth regular season crown, entered the 2023 Mountain West Tournament as the No. 1 seed and swept its way to its record seventh tournament title.
- Senior **Matt Bradley**, by a vote of the media who regularly cover the league, was named tournament MVP and earned inclusion on the all-tournament team after averaging a team-high 12.3 points on 40.6 percent shooting (13-of-32) from the field, including 44.4 percent (4-of-9) from the bonus distance and knocked down 7-of-8 attempts (87.5 percent) from the charity stripe. In addition, the San Bernardino, Calif., native added nine rebounds, three assists and a steal.
- Senior **Jaedon LeDee** earned all-tournament team designation. The Houston native averaged 8.3 points on 8-of-16 shooting (.500) from the field, averaged 6.0 rebounds (10 of his 18 total rebounds were on the offensive glass) and he added five assists, three blocks and a steal.

## HOW WE WIN

- Once again this season, San Diego State is trending as one of the nation's best in defense. After the games of April 1, according to KenPom, the Aztecs are No. 3 in 3-point percentage defense (28.1), No. 20 in effective field goal percentage (46.5), and No. 4 in adjusted defensive efficiency (90.3).
- San Diego State is 75-4 (.949) since March 15, 2019 when it scores at least 60 but less than 70 points.
- San Diego State has won 41 consecutive games when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- San Diego State is 91-7 (.929) in its last 98 games & has won 16 straight when it limits its opponent to 60 points or less.
- San Diego State is 307-39 (.887) in its last 346 when it holds the opposition to 40 percent or less shooting.
- San Diego State is 78-4 (.951) the last 82 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 20 straight games when it attempts more free throws than its opponent.
- San Diego State is 10-2 this season and 31-6 in his career when Adam Seiko hits multiple 3-pointers in a game.
- San Diego State is 21-3 in Keshad Johnson's career when he scores 10 or more points.
- San Diego State is 16-2 in Nathan Mensah's career when he reaches double figures in rebounds.

## SAN DIEGO STATE'S RESUME

Below is a look at some highlights from San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume.

- The Aztecs have impressive metrics, including 14th in the NET, 14th in KenPom, 9th in T-Rank, 15th in Sagarin Rating, and sixth in KPI.
- San Diego State, at the end of the regular season, had played the 11th toughest schedule in the nation based on its opponent's NET ranking.
- San Diego State is playing its best basketball of the season. The Aztecs are 19-2 in their last 21 games with just six-point and nine-point road losses at NET No. 29 Boise State and at NET No. 37 Nevada, respectively.
- In its last three of seven games, San Diego State has held its opponents to their season low in points.
- San Diego State has an 16-6 record in Quad 1 and Quad 2 games this year and has won seven of its last eight Quad I games.
- San Diego State has quality wins, including a 7-point win over No. 2 Alabama (71-64) in the Sweet 16, a one-point victory (72-71) against No. 13 Florida Atlantic in the Final Four, a one-point triumph (57-56) over No. 17 Creighton in the Elite 8, a 20-point win over No. 29 Boise State (72-52), a 9-point win over No. 37 Nevada (74-65), a 10-point home win over No. 18 Utah State (85-75), a 63-61 win at Utah State and a 62-57 win over the Aggies at the Mountain West championship game, a two-point win at No. 54 New Mexico (73-71), an 11-point neutral court win over No. 52 Ohio State (88-77), a pair of wins over No. 91 UNLV - 9-points (76-67) in Las Vegas and an 11-point (82-71) in San Diego, a 7-point win over No. 85 Brigham Young (82-75) and a 6-point victory over No. 51 Charleston in round one of the NCAA tournament.
- San Diego State enters the national title game with a 23-1 record against Quad 2 (8-1), Quad 3 (13-0) and Quad 4 (2-0) games.
- San Diego State tied Arkansas for having played the fewest number of regular-season Quad 4 games, two, in the nation.
- **Overall, the Aztecs are 8-5 in Q1 games, but it is worth noting that only two of those 12 games were played at home.**
- San Diego State has lost only two true road games (NET No. 29 Boise State & No. 37 Nevada) and one home loss (No. 54 New Mexico).
- San Diego State has suffered three losses on a neutral floor (vs. NET No.10 Arizona, NET No. 11 Saint Mary's & NET No. 21 Arkansas).
- All of SDSU's losses have come against teams that are still or were playing in the postseason; five of the Aztecs six losses came against teams that were part of the 68-team field of the NCAA Tournament and one competed in the NIT.

## OFF THE BENCH

San Diego State's bench is pacing at an elite level both nationally and among past Aztec teams.

- **San Diego State's bench scoring (26.6 ppg.) ranks No. 22 in the nation.**
- The Aztecs bench is averaging 26.2 points per game, 3.3 more than the 22.9 of the 2020-21 team's bench, the highest since the start of the 1999-00 season.
- SDSU's 13.3 rebounds from the bench are 1.7 more than the average of the 2015-16 reserves, the best in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- In addition, the 2022-23 bench's, 9.2 defensive rebounds, 9.2 field goals, 4.2 offensive rebounds, and 5.2 free throws are all currently single-season bests for the program, since the inception of the Mountain West (1999-00).
- Its 2.8 three-pointers and 73.1 free throw percentage rank second and 2.2 steals rank third for the bench since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- The Aztec bench has outscored its opponents bench 997-to-584 (26.2-to-15.4 points per game).
- **San Diego State's bench has matched or outscored its opponents bench in 33 of the team's 38 games and in those 33 games, SDSU has come away with 28 wins (28-5).**

## WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 45 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 37 victories.
- San Diego State is 13-1 in its last 14 games at UNLV (games played at Thomas & Mack Center).

## ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State playing its 21st road/neutral contest of the season in its Elite 8 games against Creighton, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State is 101-59 (.631) record in road games is the **fifth best in the nation.**
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State is 165-90 (.647) record in road/neutral games is the **sixth best in the nation.**

## AZTEC HISTORY ACHIEVED

Senior **Nathan Mensah** entered the 2022-23 season on the precipice of Aztec history and at Colorado State (1-18-23) he achieved it.

With two blocked shots he became the second player in program history to amass at least 800 points, 700 rebounds and 200 blocked shots in the course of a career.

At the start of this season, Mensah had 732 points, added 161 more in the first 23 games to surpass the 800 point plateau, and currently sits at 940 career points.

The Accra, Ghana native, has grabbed 197 rebounds during the course of the season and has eclipsed the 700-rebound milestone. He surpassed 700 boards vs. No. 14 Arizona in the Maui Invitational, and currently sits at 864 (No. 3 in program history).

At Colorado State, he swatted three shots to move past 200 blocks as an Aztec and currently sits at 224 for his career (No. 2 in program history).

Mensah joined **Leonard Allen** (1982-85) as the only Aztec to compile those combined numbers in their careers. Allen ranks No. 32 in points (1,019), and No. 8 in rebounds (716) and No. 2 in blocks (214).

- San Diego State is 22-1 this season when it attempts more free throws than its opponent. (SDSU is 235-33 (.877) in the last 268)
- San Diego State is 23-1 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 286-18 (.941) in the last 304)
- San Diego State is 18-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 306-39 (.887) in the last 345)
- San Diego State is 15-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 91-7 (.929) in the last 98)
- San Diego State is 22-3 this season when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent. (SDSU is 149-26 (.851) in the last 175)

## STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON MONDAY

When the Aztecs play in the national title game on Monday here are some of the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 41-game win streak when shooting 50.0 percent or better.
- 26-game win streak in games in which it scores between 80-89 points.
- 20-game win streak when attempting more free throws than its opponent.
- 20-game win streak when it shoots a higher percentage than its opponent.
- 17-game win streak when holding its opponent to shooting 40.0 percent or less.
- 12-game win streak when scoring first.
- 11-game win streak in games in which SDSU holds its opponent to between 50 and 59 points.
- 10-game win streak in games played on Monday.
- 8-game win streak on a neutral court.

## 108 WINS IN LESS THAN FOUR YEARS...AND MORE

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, San Diego State, through the games of April 1, has a 108-22 record.

- The 108 victories are the fifth most in four seasons in program history and its 83.1 percent winning percentage is the best for any Aztec team over a four-year period since the start of its Division I era (1970-71).
- In the five-plus seasons Brian Dutcher has been at the helm of the program, his 151 triumphs are the fourth most in program history and his 76.6-win percentage (151-46), is the best of any head coach in the 102 years of San Diego State basketball and the eighth best in the nation in that time frame.

## DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL BOUNCING ALONG...AND BOUNCING ALONG

Brian Dutcher is on The Mesa in now his 24th season, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 537 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 16 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances, three Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014 & 2023), an Elite 8 game, Final Four triumph and now national title game appearance.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his six years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- **His 151 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season as a first time head coach.**

## A LOOK BACK ON THE LAST 19 GAMES

In its last 19 games beginning against Utah State (1/25) and running through its Final Four game against Florida Atlantic, the Aztecs, known for stifling defense, have shown some offensive fire.

- During the 19 games (17-2), San Diego State has won eight contests by 10 points or more.
- San Diego State has shot 42.8 percent from the field.
- San Diego State has outscored its opponents 1,290-to-1,140 (+150 points), outrebounded then 703-to-626 (+77 rebounds), had more assists 238-to-185 (+53 assists) and more second-chance points 241-to-182 (+59 second-chance points).
- San Diego State never trailed in eight of its last 16 victories and was never behind in the second half in 10 of those 16 wins.

## SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 429-312 vs. current members of the Mountain West Conference.
- **The Aztecs are 98-95 away from home against members of the Mountain West since the start of the 1999-00 season. Of those 98 victories, 50 have come by 10 or more points.**
- On its home floor, the SDSU has a 152-44 (77.6 percent) record against the Mountain West in league games, has won 19 of its last 21 league games and has outscored its opponents by 13.6 points per game in those contests.
- Overall San Diego State has won 57.9 percent (429-312) of its games against the current MW teams (H: 248-91, A: 142-200, N: 39-21).

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the seven-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 199-25 home record, winning 88.8 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2022-23 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 235 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 209-26 mark (88.9 percent), including a 108-12 record (90.0 percent) in its last 120 home games against non-conference competition.

- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 145-30 (82.9 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 154-21 (88.0 percent) at home, including a 67-9 (88.2 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 64-7 (90.1 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 77-11 (87.5 percent) in their last 88 conference home games and 71-9 (88.8 percent) in their last 80 non-conference home games.

## MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 59 home games, San Diego State is 54-5, with an average scoring margin of +14.4 points in those victories. In 46 of those 59 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 13-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 11, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the sixth-longest in school history; a win streak that began on December 16, 2000 and ran to November 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 65-6 in its last 71 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 47-5 in their 50 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on nine occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22 and 2022-23).

## SWEET HOME CALIFORNIA

For the 2022-23 regular season, the Aztecs won 17-of-18 contests in the state of California. Here is how important that is:

- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 217-36 (.858) in games played in the state of California.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 185-24 (.885) in games played in Viejas Arena.
- Since the inception of the Mountain West, San Diego State is 152-44 (.774) in league games played in Viejas Arena, which includes a 4-14 record in its first 18 league home games.

## SEIKO KNOCKS DOWN SEVEN STRAIGHT THREES

Senior Adam Seiko missed the team's game at Air Force on January 21, but came to Viejas ready to go from the moment he stepped on the floor for the Aztecs game against Utah State on January 25.

- He checked into the game with 15:01 on the clock, took 1:06 to get acclimated and then erupted on the Aggies.
- He hit six straight 3-pointers in the first half (6-of-6) and then when he initially entered the game in the second half, knocked down his first attempt. That's a 7-of-7 start from the bonus distance.
- His seven threes equal the program record for a player coming off the bench (also: David Abramowitz, Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) and was one off the program record for a game which has been achieved four times, most recently by Jordan Schakel dropped eight on Colorado State on January 4, 2021.

## SEIKO THE ALL-TIME WINNER AT SAN DIEGO STATE AND IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Senior guard **Adam Seiko** has placed himself in a class of his own when it comes to winning. The Boston, Mass., native, at the end of the 2022-23 regular season, owns the Mountain West Conference record for wins in league games, with 65.

- Seiko won his 56th Mountain West game at Colorado State on January 18, which established a new career high for both San Diego State and the Mountain West, and finished his Mountain West career with 65 victories, which are 10 more than any other player in league and program history.
- San Diego State has seven of the top-10 players on the all-time league games won list.
- Current SDSU players Nathan Mensah (55 wins), Aguek Arop (54 wins) and Keshad Johnson (48 wins) are ranked T-No. 2, No. 5 and T-No. 12 on the league's all-time win list, respectively.
- With the Aztecs' victory in its regular season finale against Wyoming, Seiko matched Jimmer Fredette for the most wins for any player who has competed in the Mountain West at 112 and sits at 120 following the Aztecs run to its record seventh Mountain West Tournament crown and its wins over Charleston, Furman, Alabama, Creighton and Florida Atlantic on the way to the national championship game.

## MENSAH SWATS HIS WAY TO HISTORY

Senior forward **Nathan Mensah**, the two-time reigning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, cemented his place in Aztec history in SDSU's 82-76 overtime victory on Jan. 18, 2023, at Colorado State.

- The Accra, Ghana native reached 200 blocked shots for his career, achieving the final milestone of a three-part record. He became the second Aztec in the 102 years of the program to score at least 800 points, grab at least 700 rebounds and block at least 200 shots. He joined Leonard Allen, who accomplished the triumvirate during his career from 1982-1985, as the only two SDSU players to reach all three milestones.
- Mensah enters the Aztecs' national championship game with 965 career points, 893 rebounds (No. 3 on the program's career list) and 235 blocked shots (No. 2 on the program's career list).

## ALL SCHEDULES AND RECORDS ARE NOT THE SAME

At the conclusion of the regular season, San Diego State, 26-6 in games against Division I opponents, had played the 10th most difficult schedule in the nation, based on its opponent's NET rank.

- Of the 363 schools that are competing at the Division I level, the Aztecs had played just two games (2-0) against Quad 4 opponents. That is tied with Arkansas for the fewest of any team in the nation. SDSU played 5.8 percent of its regular season schedule against Quad 4 teams.
- Of the 13 teams ahead of the Aztecs in the NET, through the games of March 12, there were two that were close to the Aztecs' two (2) Quad 4 games: No. 2 Alabama and No. 9 Kansas which had played three (3-0).
- Houston (31-3), which was No. 1 in the NET, had feasted on Quad 4 teams with a gaudy 9-0 record. Those nine wins accounted for 26.4 percent of the team's Division I games (34).

So all schedules and records are not the same.

## TO 2,000 POINTS...AND BEYOND

Senior **Matt Bradley** emerged from the UNLV game (12/31) the eighth active player in Division I to score 2,000 career points.

- The product of San Bernardino, Calif., enters the team's national title game with 2,314 points, No. 10 among active players, and is one of 16 current players who have reached the 2,000-point milestone.
- Among the group of 16, there are 11 players who stand 6-4 or shorter, Bradley among them. Within that group he reached the milestone in the second fewest field goal attempts (1,716) and overall has grabbed the most rebounds (692).
- **San Diego State will play one more game this season, if he scores at his career average (14.9 points per game) he would complete his college career with 2,329 points.**

## CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 133-35 (.792) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 96 home games against those same 24 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 87-11 (.888).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 467-325 (.590) overall.

San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton and improved to 23-10 against the Titans in the all-time series. The Aztecs won at Stanford, 74-62, to capture its first win against the Cardinal in five tries and downed UC Irvine 72-69. SDSU fell 61-68 to Saint Mary's in the Jerry Colangelo Classic at Phoenix, won 62-46 over UC San Diego, and 72-51 against San Jose State. SDSU won (45-43) at in-state Division I opponents Fresno State on February 15 at the Save Mart Center and dispatched San Jose State again, 64-49, in the Mountain West Tournament semifinal.

# BRIAN DUTCHER

## Head Coach

Sixth Season • 24th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yanni Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games won by Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the corona virus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

- Was the only Aztec true freshman (2020-21) to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah).
- Was the 25th Aztec since the start of the 1999-00 season to finish a game with a 6:1 assists-to-turnover ratio (vs. Cal State Fullerton - 11/7/22) and if you include his 4 steals, he is one of two SDSU players, and the first since Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on 3/1/01.

- Has two game-winning shots at the buzzer (no time left) this season, including at New Mexico on Feb. 25 and in the Final Four vs. Florida Atlantic on April 1.

- In the first seven games, averaged 9.7 points on 45.8 percent shooting (22-of-48), 47.1 percent from distance (8-of-17) and 72.7 percent from the line (16-of-22), 2.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists, before a wrist injury sidelined him for 40 days.
- Led the team and was second in the Mountain West in steals (46).

- The team is 74-19 in games in which he has played, and is 51-13 in his starts.
- In MW games this year, he averaged 8.6 pts. on 56-of-142 (39.4 percent) from the field, 20-of-59 (33.9 percent) from beyond the arc and 23-of-28 (82.1 percent) from the line.
- In games in which he has one or fewer turnovers San Diego State has a 39-7 record & in games in which he has started and recorded one or fewer turnovers, SDSU is 21-5.
- Has 14 games of three or more steals and in those contests San Diego State has an 13-1 record.
- In his first two seasons, 55 total games, had 12 double figure scoring games, versus 13 in 38 games this season.

- Is utilizing the extra year of eligibility offered by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Generally does not practice, to limit wear and tear on his body.**
- In 74-of-134 career games, his defensive boards are fewer than or equal to his offensive rebounds.
- **When he totals more offensive than defensive boards in a game (40 times), SDSU is 33-7 and in games where his offensive rebounds are greater than or equal his defensive numbers (74 times) SDSU is 61-13.**
- Grabbed 95 offensive rebounds in 869 minutes in the previous three seasons, an average of 4.4 offensive boards per 40 minutes played.
- In the previous three years pulled down more offensive (95) than defensive rebounds (83).
- Does all the little things that don't end up in the box score, but are needed to win games.

**SAN DIEGO** - Darrion Trammell hit three 3-pointers during a 29-10 run to open the second half and finished with 18 points for No. 19 San Diego State, which beat Cal State Fullerton 80-57 Monday night to begin one of the most eagerly anticipated seasons in school history.

Fellow newcomer Jaedon LeDee and Lamont Butler scored 11 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 10 for the Aztecs, who won their 10th straight opener and their 17th in 18 seasons.

Vincent Lee scored 11 and Jalen Harris 10 for the Titans, the defending Big West Conference champions.

SDSU was the preseason pick to win the Mountain West Conference and Trammell was selected preseason newcomer of the year.

"I just play basketball," Trammell said. "All the accolades are nice but I came here to win. I have bigger things on my mind, tournament dreams. I'm all about the team."

Trammell made a 3-pointer to open the game. The Titans stayed close throughout the first half and the Aztecs made only two shots in the last five minutes to lead 32-25 at halftime.

But SDSU came to life in the opening minutes of the second half. Trammell hit a 3 and Keshad Johnson and Matt Bradley had slam dunks for a 44-29 lead that prompted the Titans to call a timeout. SDSU continued to pour it on with two more 3-pointers from Trammell and 3s from Butler and Micah Parrish. The Aztecs pushed the lead to 61-35 with 11:25 to go.

"We can wear teams down," Trammell said. "We've got a very deep team. Everyone has their own thing that they do. That's definitely going to carry us deep all year."

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said the Aztecs had too many turnovers in the first half so he called more set plays in the second half to get them into a pattern.

"I don't want to do that. I want to run, I want to play free and I want them to make better decisions on the break," Dutcher said. "I think that will come as the season goes on."

**SAN DIEGO** - Jaedon LeDee scored 26 points and Darrion Trammell added 21 to help No. 19 San Diego State beat rival BYU 82-75 on Friday night.

San Diego State led by two with 2 minutes left when Trammell hit a 3-pointer with the shot clock winding down to almost zero. BYU then respond to get back within two with 83 seconds left.

LeDee sealed the game with a layup that gave the Aztecs a five-point lead.

Spencer Johnson scored 17 points and Rudi Williams added 15 for BYU.

After a lackluster opening half, the Aztecs turned up their offense in the back-and-forth second half, but were unable to solve BYU's aggressive defense until the final minutes.

"I don't know if it was poetry, but it was hard-fought basketball," said Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher. "We've worn teams down in the first couple of games. We continue to play hard, even though we don't play great all the time. We just made enough plays to get a win today."

For BYU, San Diego State proved to be "a different animal" than Idaho State, the Cougars' season-opening opponent last Monday, reflecting Pope's post-game warning to his team after that tight five-point win.

Last Monday, when San Diego State opened its season with a convincing 80-57 win at home over Cal State Fullerton, 14 of its roster players saw action. That wasn't the case against BYU, as Dutcher went with his core starting lineup, with only four subs coming off the bench.

The Aztecs more than lived up to their preseason billing as a Top 20 team, which gave their raucous 2,500-strong student cheering section known as "The Show" plenty to cheer and jeer about.

Despite the loss, the Cougars retain a 50-26 overall advantage against SDSU. A year from now, the two teams are scheduled to meet in a non-conference game after BYU's move to the Big 12, ending 11 seasons in the WCC.

Friday night's first half ended with BYU holding a 4-point lead, 40-36 lead.

**STANFORD, Calif.** — Jaedon LeDee scored 10 of his 14 points in the first half and No. 17 San Diego State beat Stanford for the first time, 74-62 on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (3-0) never trailed to improve to 1-4 in the series. "We play pretty hard against anybody we play," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "I told them that we're on a really hard five-game stretch — BYU at home, Stanford at home and then three in Maui. Let's see how we do, if we're ready for that kind of challenge."

Lamont Butler had 11 points and six assists and Keshad Johnson added 11 points for the Aztecs.

Spencer Jones led Stanford (1-2) with 15 points, six rebounds and three blocks. Harrison Ingram had 11 points.

"We knew coming in it would be a battle and we'd have to play our A game to be able to get there," Stanford coach Jerod Haase said. "I don't think we played our A game but I also think that they certainly deserve a lot of credit for playing really well."

San Diego State had a 10-0 run early to open a 17-5 advantage and led by 17 in the first half.

Stanford closed the half on a 6-0 spurt to cut it to 41-30. The Cardinal later had a 10-2 run to get within six with 10:10 remaining, but the Aztecs answered with a 16-6 surge to put it out of reach.

"We kind of jumped on them in that first half a little bit and then they kind of fought back, as I thought," LeDee said. "We knew that they were going to fight back. They're at home. They're talented. It's just a little adversity for us. But we just kept wearing them down."

San Diego State scored 21 points off 17 Stanford turnovers. The Aztecs shot 51% from the field, making 8 of 21 3-point attempts. "I was most pleased that our point guards had 12 assists and one turnover," Dutcher said. "That kind of play from the point guard position will get you wins."

### BIG PICTURE

The Aztecs were victorious in their first road game of the season, fighting off every Stanford run in the second half. San Diego State displayed its depth and balance offensively, along with its usual tenacious defense. The Aztecs showed why they were picked first in the preseason Mountain West poll.

Sean McNeil scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half for Ohio State (3-1), which was playing away from Columbus for the first time this season. Brice Sensabaugh scored 17 and Bruce Thornton 13.

Ohio State threatened to turn the momentum three times in the final minutes but the Aztecs answered each time.

Tanner Holden made a dunk and was fouled by Bradley, which was determined to be flagrant. He made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 80-72. Sensabaugh made one of two free throws for the Buckeyes before Parrish drained a 3 to give the Aztecs a double-digit lead.

Bradley fouled out with 2:53 left and Thornton made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 83-75.

Darrion Trammell of SDSU then made two free throws with 1:49 left.

In a crazy sequence with more than 13 minutes left, the Buckeyes closed within four points but then saw SDSU extend the lead back to double digits. Sensabaugh made a 3-pointer and there was a foul away from the play allowing the Buckeyes to keep the ball, and McNeil made a jumper to pull OSU to 51-47.

But the Aztecs came back to score eight points in less than a minute to jump ahead 59-47. Parrish had consecutive 3s and Butler had a steal and fed Aguek Arop for a layup. The Aztecs extended the run to 17-5 on a 3-pointer by Seiko.

Bradley made 4 of 6 3-pointers, including one to start the second half for a 40-26 lead. He scored 10 points in the first half, when the Aztecs missed their first eight shots and fell behind 5-0 before Seiko made a jumper about five minutes in to get SDSU on the board. Bradley began to heat up, including hitting two 3-pointers.

Seiko and Lamont Butler also hit big 3s to help the Aztecs to a 37-26 halftime lead.

**LAHAINA, Maui** — Courtney Ramey and Kerr Kriisa scored 21 points apiece and No. 14 Arizona pulled away in the second half to beat 17th-ranked San Diego State 87-70 on Tuesday night in the semifinals of the Maui Invitational.

Arizona (5-0) will play No. 10 Creighton in Wednesday's championship game. San Diego State will take on No. 9 Arkansas in the consolation finals.

Azuola Tubelis had all 14 of his points in the first half and Ramey scored 12 for Arizona. A twisting layup by Tubelis on an alley-oop pass gave the Wildcats a 31-15 lead at 5:06 before intermission. Darrion Trammell hit a 3-pointer for San Diego State and turned two steals into layups to help the Aztecs close out the half on an 18-6 run to get within 37-33.

Keshad Johnson had two rebound baskets and a three-point play dunk and San Diego State used a 9-3 spurt to grab a 42-40 lead just 2:40 into the second half. It was the Aztecs first and only lead of the game.

Pelle Larsson sank a 3-pointer, Trammell missed a 3 and Oumar Ballo followed with a three-point play to put Arizona up 46-42. The Wildcats upped their lead to 10 on a Ballo free throw with 11:43 remaining and pushed it to 71-56 on a Cedric Henderson jumper with 6:58 left to play.

Ramey, a graduate transfer from the University of Texas, hit all five of his 3-point shots in his second game with Arizona. Kerr added five assists. Ballo finished with 12 points and nine rebounds before fouling out. Henderson scored 10.

Trammell topped San Diego State with 21 points. Micah Parrish scored 10.

Arizona, which came in leading the nation shooting 62.9% from the floor, shot 58.6% against the Aztecs and made 9 of 20 from beyond the arc. SDSU shot 38% overall and made only 3 of 19 from distance.

Kamani Johnson's two-handed follow of a missed layup tied the game as time ran out in regulation. A few seconds later, Johnson followed a miss by Black and the game went to overtime.

Bradley scored 23 points, making 9 of 20 shots and grabbing seven rebounds for the Aztecs (4-2). Trammell scored 13 points and Keshad Johnson added 10 points with seven rebounds.

Black finished with 15 points for Arkansas (5-1).

The teams combined to miss their first 17 3-point attempts before Brazile hit one for Arkansas with 19:41 left in the game. Arkansas finished 3 for 17 from distance and San Diego State made 2 of 18.

Despite the rough 3-point shooting, Arkansas managed to shoot 40% from the field and San Diego State finished at 43.5%.

**SAN DIEGO** — Micah Parrish hit a 3-pointer from the left corner with 2.4 seconds left to give host No. 24 San Diego State a come-from-behind 72-69 win over UC Irvine on Tuesday night.

"I knew it was good," Parrish said of his winning shot. "As soon as it left my hand, I looked away. I looked back and I saw it was in."

Nathan Mensah scored 18 points to lead the Aztecs (5-2), who came into the game looking to rebound after consecutive defeats to Arizona and Arkansas at the Maui Invitational last week.

"Players are just tired from the flight. It is a long trip," Mensah said of the journey back from Hawaii and having to face a tough Anteaters squad. "It was not just a hangover from Maui but also we played good competition in UC Irvine."

DJ Davis scored 28 points to lead the Anteaters (6-2), who had a three-game winning streak snapped.

"UC Irvine's guards are dynamic," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "You go out there to take away the three away, you can't give him (Davis) the three."

Davis was 4-for-6 on threes despite the attempt by the Aztecs defense to limit his perimeter shots.

"He shot so far away I couldn't believe it," Dutcher said of Davis. "So you are going to give him angles. You are guarding him 30 feet from the hoop and he is going to get by you."

It was a tight game throughout, especially in the second half when the lead see-sawed between the teams. San Diego State maintained a small advantage throughout the first half and lead 32-30 at the break.

"The first game after Hawaii is always tough. I have been around long enough to know that. It's super tough when you schedule a team that is 6-1 and playing really good basketball," Dutcher said. "We made a lot of mistakes in the first half. Offensively too careless with the ball."

Matt Bradley had 14 points for the Aztecs and had the crucial assist to Parrish for the game-winner.

"Matt is one of the best passers on the team. I know last year he led the team in assists and he doesn't get enough credit for that," Parrish said. "He is a brilliant passer when he doesn't have a shot." San Diego State shot 6-for-21 for three-point shooting but hit several huge threes in the final minutes, which clinched the win.

**SAN DIEGO** - Matt Bradley scored 19 points and No. 22 San Diego State beat Troy 60-55 on Monday night.

Darrion Trammell made a layup in traffic, converted two free throws and forced a key steal in the final three minutes to seal the win for the Aztecs (7-2).

"Another hard-fought game," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "The schedule has been tough on us, there is no question about that. We knew Troy was good, they had our full attention."

Aamer Muhammad scored 21 points for the Trojans (6-4).

"Muhammad was dynamic," Dutcher said. "He created space and shoots it. Whether we had a guard or a big on him, you weren't doing anything about that."

Both teams had been averaging about 80 points per game. Troy relied on a pesky defense to limit the Aztecs to 4-for-22 shooting on 3-pointers.

"Troy took away all of our entries, they do a great job denying," Dutcher said. "We were 12 of 13 from the line, that is really good free throw shooting in a close game so that was part of the win."

"We are grinding games out -- we have had a hard schedule. We have played a lot of great teams," Trammell said. "But we are a tough group of guys, so it is going to pay off."

The Aztecs won points in the paint versus Troy, 30-16, allowing them to get just enough offense to win.

"We are pulling out a lot of tough games," Bradley said. "It's been tough but I'm happy with our record and where we sit right now."

**PHOENIX** — Aidan Mahaney scored 20 points, Alex Ducas added 17 and Saint Mary's knocked off No. 22 San Diego State 68-61 in the Jerry Colangelo Classic on Saturday.

Two of the nation's best defensive teams got offensive early at the home of the NBA's Phoenix Suns before the Gaels (8-3) tightened up to take a nine-point second-half lead.

The Aztecs (7-3) took their turn clamping down to pull within 59-56, but Saint Mary's quickly pushed the lead back to seven. Saint Mary's hit 7 of 8 free throws down the stretch to knock off the Aztecs a week after playing a close game again top-ranked Houston.

Matt Bradley had 13 points and Keshad Johnson added 12 to lead San Diego State, which shot 3 of 15 from the 3-point arc.

Saint Mary's arrived in the desert No. 8 in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com, and San Diego State was No. 18.

So, of course, the game turned into an offensive showdown.

Ducas scored in a variety of ways, putting up 10 points in the first 7 1/2 minutes and 14 by halftime. Johnson took his turn next, scoring eight quick points, and the Gaels shot 13 of 24 in the first half.

San Diego State made 13 of 26 shots in the first half, the last Micah Parrish's 3-point half-court heave at the buzzer to tie the game at 35-all.

Saint Mary's started clamping down defensively in the second half, holding San Diego State scoreless for more than five minutes to build a five-point lead. The Aztecs finally hit a shot, but went on another scoreless drought of nearly four minutes, falling behind 59-50 on a 3-pointer by Ducas.

San Diego State tried to fight back, but the Gaels pushed them away to pull out a key nonconference win.

**SAN DIEGO** — San Diego State's men's basketball team, led by a game-high 19 points off the bench from Micah Parrish, defeated Kennesaw State 88-54 on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

"Well, it felt great to be back in Viejas, we had a great crowd," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "They brought the energy and that's what I put on the board: we have to bring energy. It feels like we're playing every other night, but we've had a pretty good schedule. It's balanced out. Sometimes it just feels like you're playing every other night and so I was concerned about this game. I knew Kennesaw had a week off before us. We played a tough game against Saint Mary's in Phoenix, [had a] one day prep, but we did a really good job on that one day."

The 34-point loss was the Owls worst since a 35-point loss to No. 9-ranked Creighton in the 2020-21 season.

Parrish's 19 points are a season-high and one off his career-high, 20 points, which he achieved three times at Oakland.

Leading 39-25 at the intermission, SDSU shot 65.2 percent in the second half (15-of-23), finished the game at 50.8 percent (31-of-61) and had 21 assists on their 31 made buckets.

Joining Parrish in double-digits were Darrien Trammell and Jaedon LeDee, who each finished with 14 points. LeDee was 10-for-11 from the free throw line and pulled down seven rebounds.

Up 18-14 with 11:03 to play in the first half, SDSU went on an 11-0 run over the succeeding 3:30 to take its first double digit lead, 29-14 and had at 14-point advantage going into the half.

The Aztecs put together another double-digit scoring run in the second half, 10-0, led by eight points from LeDee. San Diego State pushed its lead to 40 points with 5:11 to play before earning the 34-point win.

SDSU used a size advantage to outscore the Owls 40-to-16 in the paint and 14-2 in second chance points.

SDSU outrebounded the Owls 39-28 with Nathan Mensah pulling down a game-high nine boards and added three blocked shots.

Kennesaw State was led by Kasen Jennings' 17 points.

**SAN DIEGO** — San Diego State wrapped up non-conference play Tuesday with a 62-46 triumph over UC San Diego at Viejas Arena.

With the victory, the Aztecs remain unbeaten in 13 all-time meetings against the Tritons.

Darrien Trammell was the lone player to reach double figures for SDSU (9-3), finishing with 18 points on 6-of-11 from the floor, including a 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while Jaedon LeDee grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds.

However, both teams witnessed their share of offensive struggles, with the Aztecs shooting 36.1 percent from the floor (22-61) compared to the Tritons' 31.6 percent pace (18-57).

SDSU connected on 10-of-24 tries from three-point range (41.7 percent), while UCSD (5-7) was just 5-for-28 (17.9 percent) on its long-range attempts.

In addition, the Scarlet and Black maintained a sizeable 47-31 advantage in rebounds and a 17-10 edge in points off turnovers to help fuel their win.

The Aztecs never trailed, opening a 11-0 lead through the first five-plus minutes, capped by a Keshad Johnson dunk.

SDSU limited the Tritons to 22.2 percent shooting (6-27) in the first half, including draining just 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent).

Conversely, Trammell shouldered much of the Aztecs' offensive burden, nailing triples on three consecutive possessions late in the half to give the hosts a commanding 35-16 lead by intermission.

SDSU missed its first nine shots of the second period; however, UCSD could draw no closer than 13 points after Justin DeGraaf's layup cut the margin to 35-22 with 15 minutes remaining.

Unfazed, the Aztecs responded with a 16-3 blitz to quash any Triton comeback hopes. Nathan Mensah scored all six of his points during the run, including his first trey of the season at the 10:05 mark to give SDSU its largest lead of the night at 51-26.

In addition to Trammell's production, which included four assists, the Aztecs received nine points from Johnson, while Matt Bradley and Micah Parrish pulled down six rebounds apiece, with the latter notching a collegiate best.

After a slow start, UCSD's Bryce Pope scored 16 of his game-high 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting in the second half, while Francis Nwaokorie totaled nine points and seven boards for the Tritons in the loss.

**SAN DIEGO** - Senior guard Matt Bradley scored a season-high 27 points as the San Diego State Aztecs leaned on his strong shooting night to beat Air Force 71-55 on Thursday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The win was SDSU's 15th straight at Steve Fisher Court, the eighth longest streak in program history, and improved to 31-1 in its last 31 games played at home. In addition, the Aztecs have defeated Air Force for the 16th consecutive time in Viejas Arena and overall is 20-3 in the venue against the Falcons.

Bradley finished the game 9-of-12 from the field, including 6-of-7 from the bonus distance and 3-of-5 from the line. He added three rebounds and an assist and a steal without turning the ball over. He the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Of those eight, he played the fewest minutes (31).

The Aztecs (10-3, 1-0 Mountain West) started the game knocking down five of its first six shots to take a 12-2 lead capped off by a Bradley first of a career-high six 3-pointers. With just over 12 minutes left in the half, Bradley continued his hot start when he drove into the lane, beat the first defender, and then acrobatically put the ball in the basket to extend the Aztecs lead to 21-9.

Air Force (9-5, 0-1 Mountain West) would respond with an 11-4 run of its own to cut its deficit to five points with six minutes to go before the half. Bradley would again respond with another triple, his third of the half, to push the Aztecs' advantage to 28-20. After a Jaedon LeDee bucket on the next possession the lead back to double digits, 30-20. Adam Seiko would hit the Aztecs fifth triple of the half, and SDSU took a 36-23 advantage into the break.

Both teams would find buckets hard to come by to begin the second half, but Bradley put the Aztecs offense into high gear again. He sank a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions to push the lead to a game-high 19 points, 44-25, with 15:13 left in the game.

The teams would trade buckets over the next few minutes, and each time Air Force would close the gap, SDSU would respond with a triple. First it was Micah Parrish nailing a corner three, before Seiko re-established the 19-point advantage on his second trey of the night to put the Aztecs up 59-40 with 7:58 remaining.

Bradley would sink his sixth and final three with just over four minutes to play, putting SDSU out front 66-47 and from there the Aztecs finished the game with a 71-55 victory.

**LAS VEGAS** — Matt Bradley surpassed 2,000 career points and the Aztecs had another strong offensive performance on Saturday afternoon, en-route to a 76-67 win over UNLV at the Thomas and Mack Center.

The Aztecs (11-3, 2-0 MW) and Rebels (11-3, 0-2 MW) traded buckets early on, with Bradley and Lamont Butler scoring five early points each, before UNLV used an 8-0 run to take a 17-10 lead with just over 12 minutes to play in the first half.

Aguek Arop ended the Rebels run with a dunk off a nice feed from Darrion Trammell to make it a 17-12 game. Trammell would get on the scoresheet himself a few minutes later, connecting on a tough three pointer, making it a two point UNLV lead, 19-17, with 10 minutes to go in the half.

Arop would tie the game at 21-21 and then give the Aztecs the lead 23-21 when he scored on two straight possessions before Trammell made another three to give the Aztecs a 26-23 lead with 7:02 left in the first half. Bradley then sank his second triple of the game to give the Aztecs a 31-23 lead, which capped a 14-2 San Diego State run to retake control of the game. That three gave Bradley 2,000 career points for his career, making him the eighth active player to reach that milestone.

San Diego State would end the half on a 34-16 run over the final 12 minutes to take a 44-33 lead at the halftime break. Bradley finished the half with 14 points, while Arop was a perfect 5-5 from the field for 10 points.

Both teams would find scoring hard to come by to begin the second half, with only the Rebels able to sink a basket in the opening four minutes of the half. Arop then came through again, for his sixth bucket of the game, this one a monster slam to get the Aztecs on the board in the half, and still lead 48-36.

UNLV would then go on a 7-0 run to make it a 48-43 game with 12:30 left, before Bradley and Trammell would answer with a run of their own, sinking back-to-back threes, extending the Aztecs lead to 57-43.

The Rebels would go on another run to make it a five point game, 59-54, with 4:08 left before Bradley made two free throws to bring the SDSU lead back to seven, 61-54. Trammell would then ice the game with another three with 1:40 to go to make it a 66-57 game. UNLV would result to fouling for the remainder of the game, but the Aztecs made their free throws to secure the 76-67 win.

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** — Lamont Butler scored a career-high 23 points, and the Aztecs played tough at altitude to earn an 80-75 win at Wyoming on Saturday afternoon.

The Aztecs (12-3, 3-0 MW) and Cowboys (5-10, 0-3 MW) traded buckets early on, with Butler scoring nine early points and was 3-3 from the three-point line as SDSU took a 14-11 lead early.

Wyoming would respond with a 7-2 run to take a 18-16 lead before Darrion Trammell hit another three for the Aztecs, who took a 19-18 lead with 12:36 left in the first half. San Diego State started the game 5-6 from beyond the arc.

SDSU would stretch the lead to seven, 31-24 with 9:40 remaining in the half when Adam Seiko sank another three. The teams would continue their hot shooting for the rest of the first half, and the Aztecs took a 43-42 lead into the halftime break. In total the Aztecs finished the half 17-29 (58.6%) from the field and 8-14 (57%) from behind the arc.

Wyoming would take an early second half lead, 48-47, with 17 minutes to go before Nathan Mensah made a contested basket at the rim to give SDSU a 49-48 lead. A few possessions later, Seiko picked off a pass and fed Micah Parrish who drilled the triple, giving the Aztecs a 54-50 lead with 15 minutes left in the game.

The Cowboys would respond with a 7-0 run of their own to take a 57-54 lead before Butler sank back-to-back triples, making it a 60-59 Aztecs advantage. Wyoming then took a 69-68 lead with 5:31 remaining before the Aztecs forced their 13th turnover of the game and followed that up with a Jaedon LeDee bucket down low to edge in front, 70-69. On the next possession, Matt Bradley drove to the basket and scored, giving SDSU a 72-69 lead with 3:54 remaining.

Bradley would come up clutch on the next possession to put the game out of reach for the Aztecs when he drained a three to give SDSU a 75-70 lead, and the Aztecs left Laramie with a 80-75 win.

Bradley and Butler finished with a combined 41 points in the win, and the Aztecs made 12 threes on Saturday afternoon.

**SAN DIEGO** — Matt Bradley had 17 points and 10 rebounds and Lamont Butler added 15 points for No. 23 San Diego State, which beat Nevada 74-65 Tuesday night to take sole possession of first place in the Mountain West Conference.

"We've got to hold onto it," Bradley said. "We have a big target on our back now."

The Aztecs (13-3, 4-0 MWC) dominated on both ends of Steve Fisher Court in a showdown between the last two undefeated teams in the conference to extend their winning streak to six games. Keshad Johnson added 11 points for SDSU, which has beaten Nevada nine straight times.

Nick Davidson had 17, Kenan Blackshear 12 and Jarod Lucas 11 or Nevada (14-4, 4-1), whose six-game winning streak was snapped.

SDSU led 65-43 with 9:10 left before Nevada began pressing in the closing minutes, forcing the Aztecs into turnovers and bad shots and allowing the close to single digits. SDSU didn't make a field goal in the final 5:09.

"That was a great performance," coach Brian Dutcher said. "I thanked them after the game for the last three minutes. I said if they'd have played 40 minutes like they did the whole game, then they wouldn't need any coaching. I thanked them because now I get to coach them a little bit again. We'll work on the press offense."

The Aztecs marked their return to The AP Top 25 by dominating from the opening minute. Keshad Johnson had a steal and scored on an alley-oop slam dunk on a pass from Lamont Butler. Johnson and Butler hit consecutive 3-pointers to give the Aztecs a 10-0 lead and force Wolf Pack coach Steve Alford to take a timeout.

Johnson had a steal and slam dunk for a 42-23 lead late in the first half. It was 44-27 at halftime.

SDSU shot 50% while holding Nevada to 39.7%. The Aztecs outrebounded Nevada 33-29 and made 8 of 21 3-pointers.

### BIG PICTURE

**Nevada:** The Wolf Pack committed three early turnovers in falling behind 10-0 and never recovered. They had six turnovers total in the first half and, although they enjoyed a height advantage, were outrebounded 19-13.

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs improved to 11-0 at home against Nevada in the MWC era and to 13-1 all-time at home against the Wolf Pack.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** — Lamont Butler scored a team-high 19 points and Micah Parrish was perfect from the field as the Aztecs earned an 82-76 overtime win at Colorado State.

SDSU (14-4, 5-1 MW) would set the tone early in overtime when Matt Bradley sank two foul shots and then the Aztecs made back-to-back threes. Parrish nailed his third of the game and Butler sank his second to give San Diego State a 75-70 lead with two minutes to play. The Aztecs would take the lead with just over four minutes to go in the half when LeDee scooped up a loose ball in the paint and dunked to give SDSU a 26-25 lead with 4:22 left. However, it was the Rams who would close strong and take a 34-28 lead into the halftime break.

Both teams opened the second half with multiple defensive stops, and then the Aztecs ratcheted up its defense. On back-to-back possessions the Aztecs picked off passes leading to an Adam Seiko triple and another Parrish dunk to cut the deficit to three, 40-37 with 13:59 left in the game.

A few minutes later Parrish drilled a three to give the Aztecs their second lead of the game, 44-43. The teams would trade buckets for the next few minutes as the Rams took a 54-53 lead with six minutes to go.

Parrish would make his basket of the game a few minutes later, this one a triple and the foul to tie the game at 56-56. He then made the following free-throw to give the Aztecs a 57-56 advantage with 4:59 remaining. Matt Bradley scored on a tough drive to the hoop with 2:59 to go to make it a 59-56 lead for SDSU.

The squads would trade baskets down the stretch and the Rams tied the game with five seconds left to force the game to overtime with the score tied at 65-65. The Aztecs then ran out 82-76 winners in overtime.

**SAN DIEGO** — Adam Seiko drained seven three pointers, including six in the first half, and the Aztecs beat Utah State on Wednesday night, 85-75. Seiko finished seven of nine from bonus distance and totaling a career-high 25 points.

Seiko's seven 3-pointers tie David Abramowitz (Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) for the most in a game by an Aztec coming off the bench since at least the 1996-97 season.

In addition to Seiko, it was the Keshad Johnson show early in the game. The junior forward set the tone with a monster block in the opening minute, had five points and three rebounds in the first four minutes, helping the Aztecs (16-4, 7-1 MW) to an early 7-3 lead. He would finish with his second double double in as many games, (11 points & 10 rebounds) and cracked double figure scoring for the fourth time in the last five games.

Up next it was Seiko who took over for the Aztecs. The senior made three straight from bonus distance to give the Aztecs an 18-11 lead with 11:40 remaining in the first half. He then hit his next two to give him five made threes over seven minutes played as the Aztecs lead ballooned to 17, 28-11 with 7:30 left in the opening stanza.

Utah State (16-5, 5-3 MW) would go on a run of their own to close the gap to 12, 39-27 with 1:30 left in the half, before Seiko hit his sixth triple in the first 20 minutes, tying his career-high. He finished the half a perfect 6-6 from deep and the Aztecs took a 42-27 lead into the break.

The Aggies would begin a comeback in the second half, and cut the Aztecs advantage to nine, 64-55 with just under 10 minutes left in the game. Micah Parrish then hit a deep three to give San Diego State a double-digit advantage again, this time 69-55 with 7:28 left in the game.

Utah State would make another run to cut it to six, 72-66, but Darrion Trammell made a basket to put the SDSU back up eight with 3:20 left. A few possessions later, Lamont Butler drilled another three, San Diego State's 12th of the night, putting SDSU up by double digits again, 79-68 with 2:05 remaining.

Down eight with 1:05 left, the Aggies were forced to foul, but the Aztecs knocked down their last six free throw attempts and emerged 85-75 winners.

The victory is the 16th for San Diego State in the last 22 games against the Aggies and in Viejas Arena, SDSU has defeated Utah State in each of its last nine meetings.

**SAN DIEGO** — Keshad Johnson scored 16 points and had eight rebounds, while Matt Bradley added 14 points, as the Aztecs beat San Jose State 72-51 on Saturday evening.

In the opening 12 minutes the Aztecs (17-1, 8-1 MW) limited the Spartans (13-9, 4-5 MW) to 5-17 from the field and 1-8 from deep.

Aguek Arop got the crowd into it with a nice pass to Jaedon LeDee who slammed it home to spark an Aztec run, and SDSU took a 22-13 lead with 6:20 left in the first half. Johnson then had another slam, putting the Aztecs up double digits, 24-13.

On the defensive end both Johnson and Arop had blocks in the first half. Arop's came with just under 3 minutes to go in the half, keeping the Aztec advantage in the double digits, 27-14. Then with 1:48 left in the first half, Darrion Trammell picked up a loose ball on the defensive end, threw it ahead to Micah Parrish, who threw a perfect lob to Johnson for his second slam of the night.

SDSU held the Spartans to 0-14 from the field in the final 10 minutes of the first half, taking a 33-14 lead into the halftime break. The Aztecs held San Jose State to 5-20 (25%) from the field in the first half and finished the first half on a 25-3 run.

San Diego State would open the second half on another run, outscoring the Spartans 13-5 over the opening 4:14 in the half, taking a 46-19 lead. During that span Matt Bradley scored six points, while Nathan Mensah added another dunk for the Aztecs.

San Jose State would then punch back, and go on a 18-4 run of their own, cutting the deficit to 51-37 with 10:40 left in the game. The Spartans would continue to chip away at the lead, and made it a 13 point game with 5:31 to play, 59-48.

A few minutes later, Adam Seiko, fresh off of his career-high 25 points on Thursday, drilled a three to give the Aztecs a 66-48 lead and they never looked back from there. Lamont Butler followed that up with a three on the next possession and put SDSU up 69-48 with 3:00 to play. Between the 6:45 mark and the 3:00 mark the Aztecs did not give up a point, and went on a 13-0 run to reestablish control of the game.

**RENO, Nev.** — Jarod Lucas scored 26 points and Will Baker had 19 points and eight rebounds as Nevada beat No. 22 San Diego State 75-66 on Tuesday night.

Kenan Blackshear added 18 points and seven assists for the Wolf Pack (17-6, 7-3 MW), who won their second consecutive home game against a ranked opponent for the first time in program history. Nevada defeated then-No. 25 New Mexico 97-94 in double overtime last week.

Matt Bradley scored 16 points to lead the Aztecs (17-5, 8-2 MW).

Neither team had more than a three-point lead from the 9:27 mark of the second half until Blackshear made a layup to give Nevada a 67-62 advantage with 1:57 to play.

The Wolf Pack went 6 for 6 from the free throw line in the final 69 seconds to seal it.

Nevada's victory snapped SDSU's nine-game winning streak in the series.

Baker scored five points as Nevada opened the second half with a 14-5 spurt to take a 42-35 lead. But then Lamont Butler drained a 3-pointer and Aguek Arop made a layup as SDSU quickly answered and tied it at 42 with 12:52 to play.

SDSU's Darrion Trammell was assessed a technical foul in the opening minutes when Lucas was knocked down after a whistle in front of the Nevada bench. Some jawing ensued and San Diego State coaches had to restrain some Aztecs players from leaving their bench.

Lucas and Bradley each had 11 points at the 7:23 mark of the first half, more than half their team's total in a 20-20 game.

Lucas, a senior who transferred from Oregon State following the 2021-22 season, scored seven points during a 10-1 Nevada run that erased the Aztecs' 11-4 lead. But neither team had more than a four-point edge the rest of the half and SDSU took a 30-28 advantage into the break.

The combination of SDSU's defense and the absence of Shaver was too much for the Broncos. BSU shot only 33.3% in the first half and was called for a 10-second violation late in the first half. The Aztecs blocked three shots in the first 20 minutes, two by Aguek Arop and one by Mensah.

Mensah blocked a shot with three minutes left that set up a slam dunk by Johnson on an alley-oop pass from Seiko for a 70-50 lead.

Mensah drew 10 fouls and made 9 of 12 free throws.

Darrion Trammell and Parrish made back-to-back 3-pointers to spark a 20-4 run that gave San Diego State a 28-17 lead late in the first half. Seven players scored for the Aztecs during that stretch.

Utah State struggled to find a spark on offense before halftime. After Ashworth hit a 3-pointer to put the Aggies up 13-8, the Aztecs limited Utah State to only three baskets over the final 13 minutes of the first half.

San Diego State increased its lead to 40-25 after Parrish and Johnson combined to score baskets over three straight possessions. Johnson capped the 7-0 spurt with a layup off a steal.

Utah State hit nine of its first 12 shots after halftime and cut a double-digit deficit to 56-51 midway through the second half. Sean Bairstow capped an 8-0 run to make it a two-possession game. Bradley and Parrish halted the run with back-to-back jumpers.

The Aggies put together another rally in the final five minutes before falling short. Still, Utah State drew several positives from how they fought their way back into the game.

**SAN DIEGO** — Adam Seiko scored all 18 points on 3-pointers and Matt Bradley added 17 points for No. 25 San Diego, the Mountain West Conference front-runner that beat UNLV 82-71 Saturday for its third straight win and seventh in eight games.

The Aztecs (20-5, 11-2 MWC) buried the Runnin' Rebels in a blizzard of 3-pointers and slam dunks, including during a 14-0 run midway through the first half, to sweep the season series and top UNLV the fifth straight time. Keshad Johnson scored 11 of his 14 points in the game's first 6 1/2 minutes and Nathan Mensah had 11 points and 11 rebounds.

SDSU has won 20 games in all six seasons under coach Brian Dutcher and for the 18th time since his predecessor and former boss, Steve Fisher, took over what had been a floundering program in 1999-2000.

Elijah Harkless scored 24 for UNLV (16-9, 5-8) before fouling out with 2:05 to go. Keshon Gilbert added 19 for the Runnin' Rebels, who didn't get their first assist until two minutes into the second half.

SDSU led by 23 points with 7:45 to play before the Rebels cut the gap. The Aztecs made 12 of 28 3-pointers overall and 7 of 19 in the first 20 minutes, when they dominated from the opening tip and led 43-23 at halftime.

SDSU opened the game with alley-oop slam dunks by Mensah and Johnson, with Lamont Butler assisting on both, and then began raining 3s on the Runnin' Rebels.

Seiko and Micah Parrish opened the 14-0 run with 3-pointers before the Aztecs showed a strong inside game with three straight slam dunks by Butler, Mensah - who converted a 3-point play - and Bradley to take a 30-11 lead. Butler grabbed a loose ball and swooped in for his dunk and Bradley had a steal to set up his dunk.

Johnson's early points included a 3-pointer and a steal, after which he went coast-to-coast for a layup. Seiko had three 3-pointers in each half.

The Aztecs had 21 turnovers, including 13 in the second half.

**FRESNO, Calif.** - Matt Bradley scored 10 points and No. 21 San Diego State slipped past Fresno State 45-43 on Wednesday night.

"I told the guys I don't care what anybody says, it was a beautiful win," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "We find a way to win. That's it."

San Diego State (21-5, 12-2 Mountain West Conference) has won four in a row and eight of nine overall, extending its win streak against the Bulldogs to eight games.

Nathan Mensah had eight points, eight rebounds and four blocks for SDSU, and Keshad Johnson added seven points and eight boards.

Isaiah Hill converted a three-point play and Anthony Holland made a 3-pointer before Jemarl Baker Jr. hit a turnaround jumper to cap an 8-0 run that gave Fresno State a 41-40 lead with 4:51 to play.

Darrion Trammell answered with a layup about a minute later and Jaedon LeDee hit one of two free throws to put SDSU ahead by two.

Hill made a layup that tied it 43-all with 2:42 remaining, but Fresno State went 0 for 6 from the field the rest of the way. LeDee sank one of two free throws with 2:07 left to give the Aztecs a 44-43 lead, and Mensah added a foul shot with six seconds to go. Hill missed a shot for the Bulldogs as time expired.

"I couldn't be more proud of our effort, how we hung together," Dutcher said. "Sometimes when things aren't going well, teams will crumble. They'll separate. They'll get frustrated. And we just stay singularly focused on trying to win the game."

Hill led Fresno State (9-16, 5-9) with 16 points and Eduardo Andre had 10 points, nine rebounds, two blocks and two steals.

The Bulldogs shot 31% (17 of 55) from the field and went just 2 of 25 from 3-point range.

Hill scored 11 points and Andre added eight points with five rebounds in the first half as Fresno State took a 25-23 lead into the break despite shooting 1 of 10 from 3-point distance and committing 10 turnovers.

Fresno State shot 6 of 28 (21.4%) from the field and scored just 18 points in the second half.

San Diego State is 9-0 this season when holding its opponent under 60 points.

**SAN DIEGO** — Jaedon LeDee scored 14 points and Matt Bradley scored 10 of his 13 in the first four minutes of the second half for No. 22 San Diego State, which overwhelmed Colorado State 77-58 Tuesday night for its fifth straight win.

Bradley, SDSU's leading scorer, appeared to hurt a finger on his left hand and was subbed out during a timeout with 7:47 left and the Aztecs leading 69-48. He returned with 4:55 to go but didn't play the final two minutes.

Micah Parrish added 12 and Lamont Butler and Darrion Trammell had 11 each for SDSU (22-5, 13-2 Mountain West), which solidified its lead in the conference race. The Aztecs have won nine of their last 10 games dating to an 82-76 overtime win at Colorado State on Jan. 18.

John Tonje scored 18 and Isaiah Rivera 15 for the Rams (12-16, 4-11), who have lost seven of nine.

The Aztecs used their trademark tough defense to take a 41-26 lead at halftime, when Bradley had just three points. But the senior guard got hot right away in the second half, hitting a 3-pointer, a jumper, a layup and another 3-pointer that gave the Aztecs a 52-32 lead and forced the Rams to call timeout.

Bradley's only points in the first half came in a 3-point play less than four minutes in. Lamont Butler also converted a 3-point play and Darrion Trammell hit a 3-pointer to help the Aztecs start to pull away.

But it was the Aztecs' defense that stood out. They forced a shot-clock violation and a 10-second violation early on, and the Rams had 10 turnovers in the first half.

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs have beaten the Rams 10 times in the last 12 games overall and 10 of the last 12 times at Viejas Arena.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** — Lamont Butler's 3-pointer at the buzzer gave No. 22 San Diego State a 73-71 win over New Mexico on Saturday night.

After Jaelen House's steal and end-to-end run for a layup with 5.6 seconds left gave New Mexico a 71-70 lead, Butler unhurriedly brought the ball up court before dropping his shot, giving him 10 points for the Aztecs (23-5, 14-2 Mountain West).

"I got the ball with around 5 seconds to go," Butler said. "I got to half court and I fumbled it a little bit. As soon as I looked up, there were 2 seconds left and I knew I had to let it go. I'm just happy the shot went in."

It appeared Micah Parrish's 3-pointer with 23 seconds left that put San Diego State up 70-66 was going to be enough. But Jamal Mashburn Jr. was fouled on a 3-point attempt with 16.7 seconds remaining and he hit all three free throws - setting the stage for the wild closing sequence.

"I was calm," Butler said. "I knew Dutch (Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher) drew up the play for me, so I knew I had to make a play to win the game. So many hours I put in, I came out today and shot the shot and I'm glad it went in."

Dutcher said the play was actually designed for Butler to take the ball to the basket.

"Obviously, I didn't draw a play up for Lamont to come down and shoot a 3 with 6 seconds," he said. "I said we have six dribbles with 6 seconds. We tried to get him up the sidelines and get him to the rim, try to win it at the rim."

"But he came to the middle, I don't know if they sent him to the middle or he came there, but he had the poise to raise up and knock down a really hard 3-point shot."

Darriin Trammell scored 18 points to lead the Aztecs, while Matt Bradley added 11 as San Diego State won a sixth straight.

Mashburn finished with 20 for New Mexico (20-9, 7-9) and House had 15.

### BIG PICTURE

While the Aztecs' vaunted defense was absent for the first 30 minutes of the game, it clamped down by holding New Mexico without a bucket for more than four minutes late in the second half as they climbed back from a 56-47 deficit. Before forcing seven straight misses, San Diego State was allowing the Lobos to score at almost a 55% clip.

**BOISE, Idaho** - Max Rice scored 26 points and reeled off 12 straight points in a 14-0 run to close out the game and Boise State beat No. 18 San Diego State 66-60 on Tuesday night.

The Broncos (23-7, 13-4 Mountain West Conference) avenged a 20-point loss to San Diego State on Feb. 3 and remained perfect at home in conference play. It was the Broncos' first win over a ranked team this season.

And Boise State coach Leon Rice couldn't have been prouder of his son's sterling performance in the Broncos' biggest win of the season thus far.

San Diego State (23-6, 14-3), which had already claimed a share of the conference crown with its buzzer-beating win over New Mexico on Saturday, failed to hold onto a late nine-point lead.

"We played pretty good for three quarters of the game, but with five minutes to go, Boise stepped their game up," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "Sometimes in basketball you don't get what you deserve, but tonight we got what we deserved. We didn't execute down the stretch. Part of that's on us, but part of that's on Boise State and its well-coached Leon Rice team that came away with a big win today."

With the Aztecs staked to a comfortable 60-52 lead with 4:48 remaining, Max Rice took over.

Playing in what could be his final home game on senior night, Rice hit a free throw before sinking a trio of 3-pointers to give Boise State a 62-60 lead, its first since the 17:01 mark of the second half.

Then on the Aztecs' next possession, Rice stole a pass at mid-court and drove in for a layup, sending the Boise State crowd into a frenzy.

Marcus Shaver Jr., who missed the first meeting between the two teams with a right ankle injury, hit two free throws to push the lead to six in the final minute.

San Diego State couldn't hit a shot over its final two possessions and the Broncos ran out the clock, resulting in the Boise State fans storming the court.

Tyson Degenhart scored 14 for Boise State, while Naje Smith added 10.

Matt Bradley paced San Diego State with 16 points, and Parrish chipped in 11.

San Diego State can still win the regular-season conference title outright with a victory against Mountain West cellar dwellers Wyoming on Saturday.

**SAN DIEGO** - Jaedon LeDee scored 21 points and Adam Seiko 14 for the No. 18 San Diego State Aztecs, who celebrated the outright regular-season Mountain West Conference title with a 67-50 victory against Wyoming on Saturday night.

Matt Bradley added 11 points for the Aztecs (24-6, 15-3 MWC), who clinched the conference championship at halftime, thanks to Boise State's 86-73 loss at Utah State.

The Aztecs had earned a share of the title a week earlier with a buzzer-beating win at New Mexico, but missed taking it outright when they failed to hold a late nine-point lead and lost 66-60 at Boise State on Tuesday night.

But that gave a sellout crowd of 12,414 at Viejas Arena the chance to celebrate and watch the players cut down the nets on Senior Night. It's the third regular-season title in Brian Dutcher's six seasons as coach.

Dutcher did a "trust fall" from a ladder after cutting the final piece of net, falling backward into the arms of his players before heading to a locker room celebration.

SDSU heads to Las Vegas as the No. 1 seed in pursuit of its seventh MWC tournament title and an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament.

The Aztecs have won nine regular-season MWC titles, eight of them outright. Both are records. Coupled with six tournament titles, SDSU has won a record 15 league championships overall. The next closest school is New Mexico with eight.

Jeremiah Oden scored 17 and Xavier DuSell had 16 for last-place Wyoming (9-21, 4-14), which was coming off an impressive win against Nevada but couldn't keep pace with the Aztecs.

SDSU led by one point six minutes into the game before taking control with a 10-0 run. LeDee started it with a slam dunk, Darriin Trammell and Micah Parrish hit 3-pointers and Aguek Arop scored inside for a 19-8 lead.

The Aztecs pushed the lead to 34-15 before Wyoming scored the last seven points of the half.

SDSU had a season-high nine blocked shots, three by Arop.

Bradley hit a step-back corner 3 with 1:57 left, his final shot at home.

**LAS VEGAS** - Lamont Butler scored 16 points and No. 20 San Diego State held on to beat Colorado State 64-61 in the Mountain West Conference Tournament quarterfinals on Thursday.

The top-seeded Aztecs (25-6) never led by more than five points in the second half, and Isaiah Stevens' 3-pointer gave the eighth-seeded Rams (15-18) a 59-58 lead with 1:42 left. Jordan LeDee and Matt Bradley each hit two free throws to give San Diego State a 62-59 lead with 16 seconds remaining.

Stevens made a layup to pull Colorado State back within 62-61, but Nathan Mensah sealed the game with a free throw and a block at the basket to send the Aztecs into the semifinals, where they will play fifth-seeded San Jose State on Friday.

San Diego State beat Colorado State for the third time this season. The Aztecs won at Fort Collins 82-76 in overtime and then blew out the Rams 77-58 in San Diego.

Stevens, the Rams' leading scorer at 18 points per game, scored 16 points on 5-of-20 shooting Thursday.

Bradley had 13 points for the Aztecs. LaDee added 10 points and eight rebounds.

John Tonje led Colorado State with 17 points. Patrick Cartier added 12 and Jalen Lake had 10.

Colorado State jumped out to an 8-0 lead and maintained its advantage until Bradley tied it at 20-20 on a 3-pointer with 7:24 left in the first half. It was the first basket of the game for Bradley, a first-team all-conference selection.

San Diego State took its first lead on a three-point-play by Butler that made it 25-24 and the Aztecs edged ahead 27-25 by halftime.

### BIG PICTURE

The Aztecs will be going to the NCAA Tournament regardless of their performance the rest of the way in the conference tourney. But another win or two in Las Vegas could help San Diego State earn a higher NCAA seed.

**LAS VEGAS** - Keshad Johnson and Darrion Trammell each scored 15 points and No. 20 San Diego State beat San Jose State 64-49 in the Mountain West Conference Tournament semifinals on Friday night.

The top-seeded Aztecs (26-6) advanced to the championship game for the sixth consecutive year. They will face the winner of the late semifinal between Utah State and Boise State.

The Aztecs shot 40.7% from the floor, hitting 22 of 54, including 6 of 16 from 3-point range.

Trammell bounced back after missing all five of his shots in Thursday's quarterfinal win over Colorado State.

"My teammates and my coaches, they've been telling me just keep shooting, just keep going, keep going," Trammell said. "They put the ultimate trust in me, so I appreciate that from them."

Tibet Gorener scored 15 points for San Jose State (20-13).

The Aztecs held the Spartans to 19 of 55 shooting (34.5%), including 5 of 19 from 3-point range (26.3%). It was San Jose State's fourth-worst shooting performance of the season.

In two meetings this season, San Diego State held the Spartans to an average of 50 points on 34.6% shooting.

"San Diego State is elite defensively," San Jose State coach Tim Miles said. "We just weren't at our best but they're a big reason for that. They're strong all across the board. Then they're together. They really work hard together. They're connected defensively especially."

After briefly falling behind by one early in the game, the Aztecs erupted for an 18-4 run to take a 25-12 lead with 2:59 left in the first half and weren't threatened from there.

**LAS VEGAS** — Matt Bradley scored 16 points and Jaedon LeDee added 13 to lead No. 20 San Diego State to a 62-57 victory over Utah State in Saturday's Mountain West Tournament championship game.

The Aztecs (27-6) claimed their seventh tournament title, and second in three years. This also was their conference-record 15th appearance in the title game.

San Diego State clinched the conference's bid to the NCAA Tournament, though it was never in doubt the Aztecs would be selected. What kind of seed San Diego State receives remains to be seen.

Utah State (26-8) also figures to be headed to the tournament when the selections are announced Sunday.

This was the fourth time in the last five years the teams have played each other in the Mountain West championship game. Utah State won the 2019 and 2020 title games, and San Diego State went home with the 2021 trophy. Boise State temporarily ended the monopoly last season by beating the Aztecs 53-52.

Neither team shot well Saturday, with San Diego State making 33.3% of its shots compared to 37.1% for the Aggies.

No San Diego State players reached double-figure scoring other than LeDee and Mitchell. For Utah State, Steven Ashworth scored 13 points and Trevin Darius 12.

The Aggies were hot early, however, going on a 12-2 run in the first half to take a 26-15 lead with 6:57 left, but then went cold. They failed to make another field goal until 1:43 into the second half, but somehow didn't fall behind during that stretch.

But the Aztecs got close, and eventually went back and forth with Utah State in the second half. San Diego State nearly put away the game by going up 53-46 with 3:03 left, but the Aggies got back to within three points with 48 seconds remaining and two points with 30.3 seconds to go.

San Diego State closed out the game at the free throw line by making 9 of 10 free throws in the final 43 seconds.

**ORLANDO, Fla.** — Matt Bradley scored 17 points, including two free throws in the final minute, and No. 5 seed San Diego State held on to beat 12th-seeded College of Charleston 63-57 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday.

The victory was a measure of redemption for Bradley, whose turnover in the waning seconds of overtime last year cost the Aztecs in a three-point loss to Creighton.

The senior provided pivotal plays down the stretch in this one, helping the Aztecs (28-6) win their first game in the Big Dance since 2015. They ended a four-game losing streak in the tournament and snapped an 11-game skid for the Mountain West Conference.

The Cougars (31-4) lost for the first time in six weeks and have not won an NCAA tournament game since 1997.

San Diego State advanced to face 13th-seeded Furman in the South Region at the Amway Center on Saturday. The Paladins used a late steal and 3-pointer to stun No. 4 seed Virginia four years to the day since the Cavaliers became the first and only No. 1 seed to lose in the opening round.

Charleston looked to provide another upset in Orlando, but coach Pat Kelsey's scrappy team simply couldn't do enough down the stretch.

San Diego State did.

Bradley scored on a driving layup coming out of a timeout with 2:37 to play, breaking a tie and ending a nearly 3-minute scoring drought for the Aztecs. Micah Parrish followed with a huge 3-pointer, giving them a little breathing room in the final minutes.

Charleston looked like it might be able to rally, but Jaylon Scott was called for a foul as Bradley shot a 3. He hit two of three from the charity stripe to essentially seal it.

Ante Brzovic led Charleston with 12 points and eight rebounds. Ryan Larson added 11 points, and seventh-year senior Dalton Bolton finished his college career with 10 points.

Bradley, one of four senior starters for San Diego State, chipped in seven rebounds and four assists.

### BIG PICTURE

The Aztecs salvaged what looked to be another rough start for the Mountain West. Nevada lost in a play-in game Wednesday night to extend the league's losing skid to double digits, and Utah State made it 11 straight with a loss to Missouri early Thursday. But the conference champs stepped up and got the league back in the win column.

**ORLANDO, Fla.** — San Diego State had little trouble ending the run of March Madness darling Furman, getting 16 points from Micah Parrish to pace a balanced scoring attack and pulling away for a 75-52 win on Saturday in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Darriin Trammell had 13 points, Lamont Butler added 12 and leading scorer Matt Bradley finished with 10 for San Diego State (29-6), which is heading to its first Sweet 16 since 2004.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs have won 11 of their past 13 games and will play top overall seed Alabama next week in the South Region semifinals in Louisville, Kentucky.

San Diego State is the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the Sweet 16 since Nevada in 2018. It'll be the third regional semifinal appearance for the Aztecs and the seventh for the Mountain West overall.

Two days after shrugging off cold shooting and overcoming a 12-point, second-half deficit to shock No. 4 seed Virginia 68-67 on JP Pegues' bracket-busting 3-pointer, Furman was outmuscled and gradually worn down by the much more physical Aztecs.

San Diego State led 39-25 at the half, getting 14 points off the bench from Parrish and limiting Furman to one field goal over the final 11 minutes leading into the break.

The Aztecs took control during a 15-0 run that turned a two-point deficit into a 30-17 lead. Furman missed seven straight shots and turned the ball over four times during a 9:56 field goal drought that dumped the Paladins into the big halftime hole.

Southern Conference player and the year Jalen Slawson picked up his fourth foul with 16:27 remaining and fouled out shortly after returning midway through the second half. The super senior stomped the floor in frustration, drawing a technical foul that gave San Diego State a pair of free throws that put the Aztecs up 60-37.

Mike Bothwell led the 13th-seeded Paladins (28-8) with 15 points. Alex Williams had 11 and Pegues finished with 11 as Furman shot 32%, including 6 of 26 from 3-point range.

**LOUISVILLE, Ky.** - San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher has insisted throughout the NCAA Tournament that if his team plays to its strengths, it doesn't matter what the opposition does.

The Aztecs certainly played the way they wanted to against the top overall seed in March Madness.

Darriin Trammell and San Diego State used a dominant defensive performance to knock Alabama out of the tournament, bottling up All-America freshman Brandon Miller in a 71-64 victory in the Sweet 16.

Trammell scored 21 points while Miller, whose outstanding season was marred by off-the-court complications, was held to nine points on 3-of-19 shooting and had six turnovers.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs (30-6) will face either Creighton or Princeton on Sunday in the West Region final as they seek their first Final Four in program history. Roughly 30 minutes later, the tournament's final remaining No. 1 seed, Houston, lost 89-75 to Miami, leaving March Madness without a single top seed among its final eight teams for the first time since seeding began in 1979. The other top seeds, Purdue and Kansas, lost during the tournament's opening weekend.

San Diego State trailed 48-39 midway through the second half before going on a 12-0 run and controlling the game from there.

The Aztecs finished with eight blocked shots - five by Nathan Mensah - and forced 14 turnovers.

Trammell scored the first eight points of SDSU's big run. He made a 3-pointer, stole the ball from Miller and converted a layup, and then buried another 3.

Mark Sears had 16 points and Jahvon Quinerly and Charles Bediako scored 10 each for Alabama, which shot 32% overall and a miserable 3 of 27 (11.1%) from 3-point range. The Crimson Tide fell short of the second Elite Eight berth in school history.

San Diego State's players knew they had to impose their will on Alabama's deep and gifted roster.

Sears' layup got Alabama within 66-64 with 46 seconds remaining, but Matt Bradley made two free throws and Micah Parrish followed by making three of four attempts, including two with 17 seconds left.

After the final buzzer sounded, Aztecs players and coaches rushed the court and hugged each other in a joyous celebration.

Jaedon LeDee finished with 12 points for the Aztecs.

Lamont Butler scored 18 points and Trammell had 12 for the fifth-seeded Aztecs (31-6), who slowed down the high-scoring, sixth-seeded Bluejays (24-13) and became the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the national semifinals.

The experienced Aztecs, in their sixth season under coach Brian Dutcher, will play the surprising East Region champion, ninth-seeded Florida Atlantic, on Saturday in Houston for a spot in the national title game.

With the game tied at 56-all on San Diego State's final possession, Trammell drove toward the free-throw line, elevated for the shot and was fouled by Creighton's Ryan Nembhard. Trammell missed the first free throw but converted the second.

Creighton's Baylor Scheierman threw the ensuing inbound pass the length of the floor. San Diego State's Aguek Arop and Creighton's Arthur Kaluma both jumped for it and the ball deflected out of bounds. Officials reviewed the play and determined that time had expired, and the celebration was on for the Aztecs.

Scheierman had tied the game at 56-all when he stole an in-bounds pass and converted a layup with 34 seconds remaining.

Ryan Kalkbrenner scored 17 points and Scheierman and Kaluma had 12 apiece for the Bluejays, who went 2 of 17 from 3-point range.

The Aztecs, who got this far thanks to defense and physical play, held the Bluejays to 23 second-half points on 28% shooting as they won for the 14th time in 15 games. Creighton shot 40% overall.

San Diego State shot 38% but got clutch baskets from Nathan Mensah, whose jumper gave the Aztecs a 56-54 lead with 1:37 left, and Arop, who made two straight shots for a 54-50 advantage with 3:03 remaining.

Creighton, which beat San Diego State in overtime in the first round of last year's NCAA Tournament, fell just short of joining Big East rival UConn in the Final Four.

**HOUSTON** - Lamont Butler made a jumper at the buzzer, sending San Diego State to its first national championship game with a 72-71 win over fellow mid-major Florida Atlantic in the Final Four on Saturday night.

"It's unbelievable," Butler said. "This is what I came here to do. I'm glad the shot went in. I'm just happy for my team right now."

The Aztecs (32-6) appeared to be in trouble as the free-flowing Owls (35-4) picked them apart while building a 14-point lead.

San Diego State got back in it, as it always does, with defense.

The Aztecs shut down FAU and pulled within one when Jaedon LeDee hit a short jumper with 36 seconds left. After FAU's Johnell Davis missed a contested layup, the Aztecs didn't call timeout and got the ball to Butler.

The clock ticking down, Butler dribbled to the baseline, found that cut off and circled back. He stepped back to create a little room and hit a jumper that sent the Aztecs racing out onto the floor - and into Monday's championship game against UConn or Miami.

"The plan was just to get downhill," Butler said. "They cut me off a little bit. I looked up, there was two seconds left, so I got to a shot that I'm comfortable with. And I hit it."

San Diego State's defense has played a key role in its run to the final. It clamped down on four straight opponents to open the NCAA Tournament.

The Aztecs had no answer for the swaggy Owls in the first half, allowing them to hit 5 of 11 from 3-point range to build a 40-33 halftime lead.

FAU stretched the lead to 14 midway through the second half.

Then the Aztecs got gritty.

Contesting nearly every shot and pass while pulling down a string of offensive rebounds, San Diego State rallied into a tie at 65. Matt Bradley led the offense in the second half and finished with 21 points after struggling with his shot in the previous three games.

Alijah Martin kept FAU in it, scoring 19 of his 26 points in the second half, seeming to have an answer for every Aztecs move.

He didn't get a chance for a final one.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State's rally from an 11-point second-half deficit fell short as UC Irvine claimed a 70-69 victory in the first round of the NIT.

SALT LAKE CITY -- SDSU made a late run at No. 9 UNLV but did not have enough firepower to overcome a 10-point halftime deficit as the Rebels earned an 85-80 victory in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

Tony Bland, who became the third Aztec player to reach 1,000 points in just two seasons, sent the game into extra time by going the length of the floor to hit a bank shot with 1.9 seconds left. Then with 1:15 left in overtime, Tommy Johnson put SDSU ahead for good at 63-60 with a 3-pointer as the Aztecs closed the game with a 13-2 run.

In its sixth postseason appearance in 33 years at the Division I level, the Aztecs overcame their largest halftime deficit of the season (32-22) snapping a three-game losing streak, limiting UCSB to just 62 points and 42.6 percent shooting.

After a dunk by Evan Burns with 5:58 left in the first half, UCSB closed out the opening period with a 14-1 run to take a 10-point lead into the half. The Gauchos scored the first basket of the second half before Bland jump started the Aztecs with a free throw and layup to start a 10-0 run.

The game was tied at 50 with five minutes left and both teams buckled down defensively.

The Gauchos scored the first six points of overtime before SDSU's game-ending run, which included six straight Mike Mackell points to tie the game at 60 and set up Johnson's heroics.

After an Indiana timeout, the ensuing play saw Robert Vaden, who had 18 points, hit a three-point field goal giving the Hoosiers a two-point advantage with the clock showing five seconds.

On the inbound play, Abukar sailed a pass out of bounds and the Aztecs fouled on the next possession sending IU to the line where they connected on both free-throw attempts to end the game.

Abukar led all scorers with 24 points and also had nine rebounds. Heath scored 15 with Marcus Slaughter contributing 13 points and 10 rebounds.

**GAINESVILLE, Fla.** -- In its third consecutive postseason appearance and its second straight in the NIT, San Diego State was dropped by Florida, 73-49, in a first-round matchup at the O'Connell Center.

The second-seeded Gators never trailed in the game and opened the game on a 7-2 run, before the seventh-seeded Aztecs tied the score at nine with 14:12 remaining in the first half. SDSU, however, would never get closer than three points the rest of the way and Florida went into the half with a 35-23 cushion.

In the second half, the Gators' lead ballooned to 21 points with less than 10 minutes gone. San Diego State managed to cut the lead to 17 points with 5:42 left in the game, but Florida kept the Aztecs at bay as they cruised to the 24-point victory.

For the game, the Gators shot 53.4 percent from the field, including an amazing 63.0 percent in the second half. All five starters shot above 50 percent and Florida's two leading scorers, Marresse Speights (18 points) and Nick Calathes (16 points), combined to shoot 15-for-25.

The Bears cut their deficit to 12 after consecutive buckets, but would get no closer as the Aztecs secured a spot in the third round against Temple.

TUCSON, Ariz. - No. 6/5 San Diego State needed two overtime sessions to hold off Temple, 71-64, in the third round of the NCAA tournament.

The Aztecs, who went 15,713 days between NCAA tournament victories and entered the tourney having never won a Division I NCAA tournament game, found themselves with two wins in nearly 50 hours and a spot in the Sweet 16.

Getting to the regional semifinals looked like a lock in the first half as SDSU was rolling and enjoying an 11-point lead with 3:13 left before halftime. Temple, however, closed the gap in a hurry, rattling off six straight points to trail, 36-31, at the break.

In the second half, things still looked promising for the Aztecs as they led, 52-45, with 7:16 remaining in regulation. But as the clock ticked, San Diego State had a hard time finding the bottom of the net and defending the Owls. After Billy White's jumper with 7:16 left, Temple went on a 9-2 run to tie the game at 54. SDSU's Chase Tapley had a chance to win the game in the final seconds, but his driving layup was contested and off the mark.

In the first OT, Juan Fernandez immediately hit a three and scored the Owls' first five points, but Kawhi Leonard answered with four straight points and was followed by a three-point play from Malcolm Thomas. Again, the Aztecs had a chance to win the game in the final moments, but Thomas' baby jumper missed.

In what proved to be the final five minutes, SDSU buckled down defensively and continued to go to the hoop, which resulted in it outscoring Temple, 10-3, to secure the victory.

COLUMBUS, Ohio — No. 22/23 San Diego State was unable to advance past the second round of the NCAA tournament, dropping a 79-65 decision to No. 11 seed North Carolina State at Nationwide Arena.

SDSU found itself down by just four, 33-29, at the half despite shooting 37.9 percent from the field. The Aztecs, however, shot 40 percent from three-point range compared to the 16.7 percent by the Wolfpack. NC State's 51.9 shooting percentage and 20-13 rebound advantage made up for the lack of three-point shots.

Coming out of the break, San Diego State managed to cut the deficit to one on a three-pointer by Chase Tapley. That would be short lived as North Carolina State used an 8-2 run to extend its lead to 43-36.

The Aztecs kept it close despite being down by as many as nine points and managed to pull within three after scoring on five consecutive possessions. Wolfpack head coach Mark Gottfried then called a timeout that sparked a 9-4 run and extended NC State's lead to 10 with 5:37 remaining.

From there, the Wolfpack never looked back and eventually won by a 14-point margin.

PHILADELPHIA - Seventh-seeded San Diego State rallied from a nine-point first-half deficit to beat 10th-seeded Oklahoma, 70-55, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Wells Fargo Center.

The win marked the third in program history and the third in the last three seasons for SDSU, which was 0-6 in the NCAA tournament prior to the 2011 campaign.

Jamaal Franklin led the way for the Aztecs with 21 points, eight rebounds, five assists and two steals. James Rahon added 17 points in 19 minutes off the bench and DeShawn Stephens collected a career-high 11 boards.

The Sooners broke the game open midway through the first half as a 12-0 surge propelled them to a 23-14 lead with 9:40 to go in the first half. The Aztecs, however, closed on a 17-10 run to trail, 33-31, at halftime.

In the final 20 minutes, SDSU took control of the boards, aided by five offensive and defensive rebounds by Stephens, and subsequently took control of the game.

Oklahoma led 36-35 with 18:03 left in regulation and it marked the final time the Sooners would have the lead. After OU tied the game at 48-48, SDSU went on an 8-0 run and never looked back. Romero Osby temporarily stopped the Aztec surge with a three-pointer, but San Diego State responded with seven unanswered points to move ahead by 12 with 2:11 to play and eventually sealed the 15-point victory.

SDSU finished with a 40-29 rebounding advantage after being minus-2 in the category at halftime. The Aztecs also held the Sooners to 37.0-percent shooting in the second half, while shooting 46.2 percent in the final 20 minutes themselves. SDSU also set a season-high for free-throw accuracy, finishing at 94.1 percent.

PHILADELPHIA - Looking to advance to the Sweet 16 for the second time in three seasons, seventh-seeded SDSU's bid fell short as it fell to 15th-seeded Florida Gulf Coast, 81-71, in the third round of NCAAs.

With the win, the Eagles became the first 15-seed in NCAA history to reach the Sweet 16. For the Aztecs, the loss ended their season with a 23-11 record.

SDSU received 20 points and 11 rebounds from Jamaal Franklin and Chase Tapley poured in 17 points. James Rahon and DeShawn Stephens, meanwhile, added 12 and 10 points, respectively.

The first half was a fairly close affair. Florida Gulf Coast jumped out to an early 7-2 lead, but San Diego State answered with a 12-0 run to take a five-point lead of its own. No team led by more than four points the rest of the half until a 7-3 SDSU spurt propelled the Aztecs to a 35-29 lead with 2:20 to go. The Eagles, however, closed the first half with five straight points and San Diego State led, 35-34, at halftime.

The game remained tight over the course of the first eight minutes of the

second half. An Xavier Thames jumper in the point brought the Aztecs to within, 54-52, with 11:33 to play. FGCU, however, caught fire from the field and forced San Diego State into quick shots, which turned into a 17-0 Eagles run.

During the deciding surge, SDSU went scoreless for 7:14 before Thames made a layup with four minutes left in regulation. At this juncture, the Aztecs trailed by 17 and their hole was too deep.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Fourth-seeded San Diego State led top-seeded Arizona with under eight minutes to play, was tied with seven minutes left and trailed by one with 3:30 remaining in regulation, but could not pull the upset as the Wildcats came from behind to win, 70-64. The victory sent Arizona to the Elite Eight.

The rematch from the second game of the season was a see-saw affair until SDSU turned a 22-20 deficit into a 29-22 lead. After a Rondae Hollis-Jefferson lay-up to break the 9-0 run, Dwayne Polee II canned a three-pointer to put San Diego State ahead by eight, 32-24.

The Aztecs had an opportunity to put the Wildcats away right before halftime,

but missed their final three shots and committed two turnovers. Arizona, meanwhile, scored four points the rest of the way to trail San Diego State by just four at halftime.

Despite the missed chance to pull away, the Aztecs stuck to the game plan in the second half and eventually got their lead back up to eight points with 16:41 left in the second half thanks to six points from Xavier Thames.

In just over two minutes, however, Arizona was back within two. A Thames jumper temporarily halted the Wildcats' momentum, but the teams traded baskets over the next few minutes with Arizona taking its first lead, 50-49 (7:19), since 7:47 left in the first half.

Nick Johnson, the Pac-12 Player of the Year, missed his first nine shots, but with SDSU trailing by three points, Winston Shepard lost control of the ball near midcourt and Johnson was wide open for a lay-up to put Arizona up, 56-51, with 2:44 left. Johnson scored 13 consecutive points for UA and 15 of the team's final 16.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Eighth-seeded San Diego State used a balanced attack to defeat ninth-seeded St. John's, 76-64, in the second round of the NCAA tournament.

SDSU shot 47.2 percent from the floor, including 40.9 percent from three-point range, and outrebounded the Red Storm, 40-32, and enjoyed a 13-7 advantage in offensive rebounds to earn a spot in the third round.

The Aztecs were buoyed by an impressive shooting display from deep in the first half. Dwayne Polee II was 4-for-6 and Matt Shringley was 3-for-3 from behind the arc to help San Diego State take a 40-33 lead at halftime.

In the second half, SDSU opened with another three-pointer from Polee II to bump its lead to double figures, a margin the Aztecs would enjoy for most of the period. The Red Storm twice cut its deficit to seven points, the last of which occurred with 6:57 left in regulation. San Diego State, however, answered with six straight points to take a 66-53 lead with 3:22 to go.

St. John's responded by going on a 7-2 spurt to get its hole down to eight points with two minutes left, but SDSU made its next seven free-throws to put the game away.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Eighth-seeded San Diego State could not solve top-seeded Duke's front line and fell, 68-49, in the third round of the NCAA tournament.

The Blue Devils' front court of Jahlii Okafor and Justise Winslow put up dominating performances. Okafor finished with a game-high 26 points, while adding six rebounds and three blocked shots. Winslow, meanwhile, had 13 points, game highs of 12 rebounds, five assists and four steals, and three blocked shots.

Duke asserted itself early by scoring the first eight points and led, 15-4, after consecutive buckets from Quinn Cook, which forced SDSU to call timeout.

The Blue Devils took a 28-13 lead with 5:15 left in the first half on an Okafor layup. The freshman's basket gave him 14 points, which was one more than SDSU had as a team. San Diego State closed the half on a 7-2 run to make the score 37-24 entering the locker room.

The Aztecs made a run early in the second half, spurred by a pair of Malik Pope three-pointers. After an Okafor jumper to open the period, SDSU embarked on a 13-5 run to cut its deficit to 44-37 with 12:42 left in the game. Cook answered with a three, which was followed by a Winslow dunk and Duke was on its way to a 11-0 run to put the Blue Devils out in front by 18.

Aqeel Quinn made two free-throws to put an end to the spurt, but Duke scored 11 of the game's next 13 points to put the contest away.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State ended the first half on an 18-5 run, turning a three-point SDSU lead into a 16-point cushion and then fended off a second-half Washington run to defeat the visiting Huskies, 93-78, in front of a sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

**INDIANAPOLIS** - The decades-old zone defense of Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim claimed another frustrated victim Friday night.

The No. 11 seed Orange held 6-seeded San Diego State without a field goal for nearly a quarter of the game. Buddy Boeheim hit seven 3-pointers and finished with 30 points, and Syracuse cruised to a 78-62 victory.

Boeheim finished 7-of-10 from beyond the arc and 11-of-15 from the field, and Marek Dolezaj added 11 points, as Syracuse advanced to play third-seeded West Virginia or No. 14 seed Morehead State for a spot in the Sweet 16.

The Orange were trailing 18-14 midway through the first half when they clamped down on defense, holding San Diego State without a field goal the rest of the half. And when the Aztecs threatened to trim their deficit to less than 10 early in the second half, the son of the Syracuse coach was there to provide an answer.

Boeheim hit three quick threes to put the game out of reach.

Jordan Schakel had 17 points, but the nation's third-best 3-point shooter was just 5-of-13 from distance. Matt Mitchell also had 17 points on 8-of-19 shooting. SDSU made it clear from the moment it put up three treys on its first couple of possessions that the plan was to break Syracuse's zone by shooting over the top.

Problem was the Aztecs didn't make many.

Beginning with Boeheim's own 3-pointer with 9:17 left, the Aztecs never scored again in the first half. They missed their final 10 attempts from beyond the arc, finished 3 of 20 from the 3-point line in the first half, and even missed the front end of a one-and-one with a few seconds left before the break.

"Buddy Buckets" nearly outscored San Diego State by himself. Boeheim had 16 points as Syracuse built a 32-18 halftime lead; it was the fewest points Dutcher's high-scoring, perimeter-oriented team had scored in a half all season.

Schakel got a 3-pointer to go right out of halftime, giving the San Diego State fans a long-awaited reason to cheer. But the Aztecs promptly went into another long slump, and the Orange' built a 56-30 lead before coasting to the finish.

**FORT WORTH, Texas** - Trey Alexander converted a go-ahead, three-point play late in overtime, and Creighton rallied for a 72-69 victory over San Diego State in an NCAA Tournament opener Thursday night.

The Bluejays hadn't led since the first five minutes of the game when Alexander, who also had the tying bucket late in regulation, drove right and was fouled on the layup. The free throw put Creighton ahead 71-69 with 1:08 remaining.

Down by two, the Aztecs had the ball with 4.3 second left when Matt Bradley inbounded to Ageuk Arop, then ran around him for the handoff. Bradley lost control of the ball before getting a shot off, and Creighton secured it with 0.8 to go.

Alexander scored 18 points, and Ryan Kalkbrenner had 16 points and 10 rebounds before leaving with an apparent left leg injury in overtime.

The ninth-seeded Bluejays (23-11) will play Saturday against the winner between Kansas, the top seed in the Midwest Region, and Texas Southern. Creighton reached the Sweet 16 last year.

Chad Baker-Mazara scored 15 of his 17 points in the first half for the Aztecs (23-9), who were in position for their first tournament win since 2015. Gus Bradley added 15.

Bradley had a chance to give San Diego State the lead on free throws with 6.4 seconds left in regulation when Alex O'Connell fouled him on a drive. Bradley missed the front end of a one-and-one, and Arthur Kaluma dribbled the length of the court before lofting an air ball from the baseline as time expired.

The Aztecs had led by at least five points since the middle of the first half when O'Connell hit just the second 3-pointer of the game for Creighton to get the Bluejays within four just inside the two-minute mark.

After a steal led to a layup from Kalkbrenner, Creighton forced another turnover before getting two shots blocked at the other end. The Bluejays thought they had the tying basket on another steal after the second block, but an official ruled San Diego State called timeout.

That ruling was reversed on replay, and Alexander hit the tying layup with 11 seconds to go.

Kalkbrenner went down and grimaced after a posting up Arop as they made contact with each other early in overtime. The 7-foot-1 sophomore got up, tried to take a couple of steps and went back down, holding his left knee. After several minutes, Kalkbrenner was helped off the floor without putting weight on his left leg.

Baker-Mazara had a bucket and a three-point play during a 7-2 run that gave the Aztecs their first double-digit lead in the first half, then converted a four-point play to get the margin back to double digits at 27-15.

**ORLANDO, Fla.** -- Matt Bradley scored 17 points, including two free throws in the final minute, and No. 5 seed San Diego State held on to beat 12th-seeded College of Charleston 63-57 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday.

The victory was a measure of redemption for Bradley, whose turnover in the waning seconds of overtime last year cost the Aztecs in a three-point loss to Creighton.

The senior provided pivotal plays down the stretch in this one, helping the Aztecs (28-6) win their first game in the Big Dance since 2015. They ended a four-game losing streak in the tournament and snapped an 11-game skid for the Mountain West Conference.

"Everybody makes us aware of (the losing streak)," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "The thing that you can't lose sight of is every team and every season is different. You know, there is no history."

"This team is creating its own history right now," Dutcher continued. "So there are some returning players off our last year's team that experienced some things that were disappointing, but you learn from that. And so we're not worried about past failures or successes. We're only focused on the moment, and that's how you win games."

The Cougars (31-4) lost for the first time in six weeks and have not won an NCAA tournament game since 1997.

San Diego State advanced to face 13th-seeded Furman in the South Region at the Amway Center on Saturday. The Paladins used a late steal and 3-pointer to stun No. 4 seed Virginia four years to the day since the Cavaliers became the first and only No. 1 seed to lose in the opening round.

Charleston looked to provide another upset in Orlando, but coach Pat Kelsey's scrappy team simply couldn't do enough down the stretch.

San Diego State did.

Bradley scored on a driving layup coming out of a timeout with 2:37 to play, breaking a tie and ending a nearly 3-minute scoring drought for the Aztecs. Micah Parrish followed with a huge 3-pointer, giving them a little breathing room in the final minutes.

Charleston looked like it might be able to rally, but Jaylon Scott was called for a foul as Bradley shot a 3. He hit two of three from the charity stripe to essentially seal it.

Ante Brzovic led Charleston with 12 points and eight rebounds. Ryan Larson added 11 points, and seventh-year senior Dalton Bolon finished his college career with 10 points.

Bradley, one of four senior starters for San Diego State, chipped in seven rebounds and four assists.

### BIG PICTURE

**Charleston:** The Cougars had three graduate-senior starters who carried them to the tournament, and coach Pat Kelsey will probably turn to the transfer portal to find replacements. The one glaring weakness against San Diego State was a post presence as the team got outscored by 12 points in the paint.

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs salvaged what looked to be another rough start for the Mountain West. Nevada lost in a play-in game Wednesday night to extend the league's losing skid to double digits, and Utah State made it 11 straight with a loss to Missouri early Thursday. But the conference champs stepped up and got the league back in the win column.

**ORLANDO, Fla.** - San Diego State had little trouble ending the run of March Madness darling Furman, getting 16 points from Micah Parrish to pace a balanced scoring attack and pulling away for a 75-52 win on Saturday in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Darrian Trammell had 13 points, Lamont Butler added 12 and leading scorer Matt Bradley finished with 10 for San Diego State (29-6), which is heading to its first Sweet 16 since 2004.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs have won 11 of their past 13 games and will play top overall seed Alabama next week in the South Region semifinals in Louisville, Kentucky.

"You should play your best at the end of the season, and we're playing our best basketball at the end of the season," coach Brian Dutcher said.

"Obviously we hang our hat on defense. That's the one thing that we do every game," Dutcher added. "Then when we get the opportunity, we start making shots and play good offensively, then we're very good."

San Diego State is the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the Sweet 16 since Nevada in 2018. It'll be the third regional semifinal appearance for the Aztecs and the seventh for the Mountain West overall.

Two days after struggling off cold shooting and overcoming a 12-point, second-half deficit to shock No. 4 seed Virginia 68-67 on JP Pegues' bracket-busting 3-pointer, Furman was outmuscled and gradually worn down by the much more physical Aztecs.

San Diego State led 39-25 at the half, getting 14 points off the bench from Parrish and limiting Furman to one field goal over the final 11 minutes leading into the break.

The Aztecs took control during a 15-0 run that turned a two-point deficit into a 30-17 lead. Furman missed seven straight shots and turned the ball over four times during a 9:56 field goal drought that dumped the Paladins into the big halftime hole.

Southern Conference player and the year Jalen Slawson picked up his fourth foul with 16:27 remaining and fouled out shortly after returning midway through the second half. The super senior stomped the floor in frustration, drawing a technical foul that gave San Diego State a pair of free throws that put the Aztecs up 60-37.

Mike Bothwell led the 13th-seeded Paladins (28-8) with 15 points. Alex Williams had 11 and Pegues finished with 11 as Furman shot 32%, including 6 of 26 from 3-point range.

Like Slawson, Bothwell is a super senior who returned to Furman for a fifth season after the Paladins were denied the Southern Conference's automatic NCAA Tournament berth by a buzzer-beater in their league championship game.

**LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)** San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher has insisted throughout the NCAA Tournament that if his team plays to its strengths, it doesn't matter what the opposition does.

The Aztecs certainly played the way they wanted to against the top overall seed in March Madness.

Darrian Trammell and San Diego State used a dominant defensive performance to knock Alabama out of the tournament, bottling up All-America freshman Brandon Miller in a 71-64 victory in the Sweet 16.

Trammell scored 21 points while Miller, whose outstanding season was marred by off-the-court complications, was held to nine points on 3-of-19 shooting and had six turnovers.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs (30-6) will face either Creighton or Princeton on Sunday in the West Region final as they seek their first Final Four in program history. Roughly 30 minutes later, the tournament's final remaining No. 1 seed, Houston, lost 89-75 to Miami, leaving March Madness without a single top seed among its final eight teams for the first time since seeding began in 1979.

The other top seeds, Purdue and Kansas, lost during the tournament's opening weekend.

"It's just parity," Dutcher said. "That's what it is. There's not a lot of difference between the best team in the country and the worst team in the country. You're seeing that on this stage."

San Diego State trailed 48-39 midway through the second half before going on a 12-0 run and controlling the game from there. The Aztecs finished with eight blocked shots - five by Nathan Mensah - and forced 14 turnovers.

Trammell scored the first eight points of SDSU's big run. He made a 3-pointer, stole the ball from Miller and converted a layup, and then buried another 3.

"We're going to go on our run," Trammell said, "and I just took the opportunities they gave me. I took my shot, and I just made a play on defense. From there, our team was in it. That's when the momentum changed."

So did the Crimson Tide's season.

The March Madness run of Alabama (31-6) was clouded by its response to the Jan. 15 fatal shooting of a 23-year-old woman in Tuscaloosa, which led to capital murder charges against a then-Crimson Tide player, Darius Miles.

Miller was at the scene of the shooting and has not been charged, but police have said in court documents that Miles texted Miller to bring him his gun. Authorities have said Miller is a cooperating witness, and he did not miss any playing time. Miller received armed security protection during the tournament.

Mark Sears had 16 points and Jahvon Quinerly and Charles Bediako scored 10 each for Alabama, which shot 32% overall and a miserable 3 of 27 (11.1%) from 3-point range. The Crimson Tide fell short of the second Elite Eight berth in school history.

"We came to this game prepared as much as we could possibly," Miller said. "I think our shot-making could have been better. Our shot choices could have been better, but it's just that San Diego's a good group of guys. They're vets, so they have a lot of experience. I feel like they came out and played hard."

San Diego State's players knew they had to impose their will on Alabama's deep and gifted roster.

"Alabama's a great team. They have a lot of talented players and individuals," Trammell said. "We knew it was going to be hard. It was a dogfight. Very physical."

Sears' layup got Alabama within 66-64 with 46 seconds remaining, but Matt Bradley made two free throws and Micah Parrish followed by making three of four attempts, including two with 17 seconds left.

After the final buzzer sounded, Aztecs players and coaches rushed the court and hugged each other in a joyous celebration.

Jaedon LeDee finished with 12 points for the Aztecs.

San Diego State shot just 38% overall and was outrebounded 52-48, but made clutch shots to rally when Alabama seemed in control behind a faster pace after halftime. A technical foul on Dutcher also seemed to spark his seasoned team, which maintained its physical play and thwarted every attempt by the Tide to rally.

**BLOCK PARTY**

Mensah and Johnson had emphatic rejections with San Diego State ahead 53-50.

Both blocks came on layup attempts by Quinerly. Mensah swatted the first and Johnson rejected a subsequent attempt seconds later. Trammell followed with a step-back jumper for a five-point cushion.

**BIG PICTURE**

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs never seemed fazed by Alabama or Miller. More impressive was their resilience when the game seemed to be slipping away.

**Alabama:** Other than the second-half run that put them ahead briefly, the Crimson Tide seemed out of sorts in multiple ways. The team's reliance on 3-pointers showed its desperation.

**LOUISVILLE, Ky.** - Darrian Trammell converted a go-ahead free throw after he was fouled on a floater with 1.2 seconds left, and San Diego State muscled its way into its first Final Four, grinding out a 57-56 victory over Creighton on Sunday in the NCAA Tournament's South Region final.

Lamont Butler scored 18 points and Trammell had 12 for the fifth-seeded Aztecs (31-6), who slowed down the high-scoring, sixth-seeded Bluejays (24-13) and became the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the national semifinals.

The experienced Aztecs, in their sixth season under coach Brian Dutcher, will play the surprising East Region champion, ninth-seeded Florida Atlantic, on Saturday in Houston for a spot in the national title game.

With the game tied at 56-all on San Diego State's final possession, Trammell drove toward the free-throw line, elevated for the shot and was fouled by Creighton's Ryan Nembhard. Trammell missed the first free throw but converted the second.

"I've been dreaming this my whole life, grateful to be here and thankful to everyone who believed in me," Trammell said.

Creighton's Baylor Scheierman threw the ensuing inbound pass the length of the floor. San Diego State's Aguek Arop and Creighton's Arthur Kaluma both jumped for it and the ball deflected out of bounds. Officials reviewed the play and determined that time had expired, and the celebration was on for the Aztecs.

"I wasn't given an explanation other than there was no time on the clock," Creighton coach Greg McDermott said. "They made no call on the floor but officiating is part of the game and we're not gonna go there."

Scheierman had tied the game at 56-all when he stole an inbounds pass and converted a layup with 34 seconds remaining.

Ryan Kalkbrenner scored 17 points and Scheierman and Kaluma had 12 apiece for the Bluejays, who went 2 of 17 from 3-point range.

The Aztecs, who got this far thanks to defense and physical play, held the Bluejays to 23 second-half points on 28% shooting as they won for the 14th time in 15 games. Creighton shot 40% overall.

San Diego State shot 38% but got clutch baskets from Nathan Mensah, whose jumper gave the Aztecs a 56-54 lead with 1:37 left, and Arop, who made two straight shots for a 54-50 advantage with 3:03 remaining.

Creighton, which beat San Diego State in overtime in the first round of last year's NCAA Tournament, fell just short of joining Big East rival UConn in the Final Four.

The teams didn't appear to share any hard feelings from last year's meeting. They shared a round-trip flight to Hawaii last fall for the Maui Invitational, and there were no dustups during a tight, physical game in which no team led by more than eight points.

**DIVIDED LOYALTIES**

Kaluma played against his brother, San Diego State's Adam Seiko. Their parents sat a few rows up at midcourt, sitting quietly before joining Seiko to celebrate.

Creighton's offense started well enough as the Bluejays built a 33-28 halftime lead and extended their advantage to seven in the second half. But Creighton didn't make a single 3-pointer after halftime.

San Diego State proved again that defense matters, especially since the Aztecs also scuffled for points. Their experience as depth showed as Mensah and Arop, who averaged just 6.1 and 4.5 points per game respectively, converted the last three baskets.

HOUSTON - Lamont Butler made a jumper at the buzzer, sending San Diego State to its first national championship game with a 72-71 win over fellow mid-major Florida Atlantic in the Final Four on Saturday night.

"It's unbelievable," Butler said. "This is what I came here to do. I'm glad the shot went in. I'm just happy for my team right now."

The Aztecs (32-6) appeared to be in trouble as the free-flowing Owls (35-4) picked them apart while building a 14-point lead.

San Diego State got back in it, as it always does, with defense. The Aztecs shut down FAU and pulled within one when Jaedon LeDee hit a short jumper with 36 seconds left. After FAU's Johnell Davis missed a contested layup, the Aztecs didn't call timeout and got the ball to Butler.

The clock ticking down, Butler dribbled to the baseline, found that cut off and circled back. He stepped back to create a little room and hit a jumper that sent the Aztecs racing out onto the floor - and into Monday's championship game against UConn or Miami.

"The plan was just to get downhill," Butler said. "They cut me off a little bit. I looked up, there was two seconds left, so I got to a shot that I'm comfortable with. And I hit it."

San Diego State's defense has played a key role in its run to the final. It clamped down on four straight opponents to open the NCAA Tournament.

The Aztecs had no answer for the swaggy Owls in the first half, allowing them to hit 5 of 11 from 3-point range to build a 40-33 halftime lead.

FAU stretched the lead to 14 midway through the second half. Then the Aztecs got gritty.

Contesting nearly every shot and pass while pulling down a string of offensive rebounds, San Diego State rallied into a tie at 65. Matt Bradley led the offense in the second half and finished with 21 points after struggling with his shot in the previous three games.

Alijah Martin kept FAU in it, scoring 19 of his 26 points in the second half, seeming to have an answer for every Aztecs move.

He didn't get a chance for a final one.
