Aztecs Look To Close Out Pac-12 Swing With Win Friday At Washington State

- ▶When & Where: Friday, Dec. 2, 2011, Friel Court at Beasley Coliseum (11,671), Pullman, Wash, 7 p.m. PT
- ▶Live Media: Live audio webcast, as well as live stats will be available on goaztecs.com.
- ▶SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 328-239 in 20 seasons, while she is 247-174 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.
- ▶WSU Head Coach June Daugherty: Daugherty is in her fifth season at Washington and has compiled a school record of 29-70. Her overall heading coaching record stands at 350-307 in 23 campaigns.
- ▶Series History: The Aztecs and Cougars are meeting for the second consecutive season and the fifth time overall. SDSU won last year's contest at Viejas Arena on Dec. 21, 2010, by the score of 66-57. The Aztecs won the only previous meeting in Pullman 63-56 on Dec. 22, 2003.

NEWS & NOTABLES

- San Diego State is playing its third consecutive game against a current member of the Pac-12 Conference when it travels to Washington State on Friday for a 7 p.m. PT contest at Friel Court.
- The Aztecs defeated Washington at home this past Saturday, before falling at UCLA on Wednesday, 78-71, despite rallying to take the lead after an early 16-point deficit. SDSU also faced three Pac-12 members (not including Utah) a year ago, going 1-2 in those outings with the win coming at home vs. Washington State.
- San Diego State has only competed once in Pullman previously, with that being a 64-56 victory on Dec. 22, 2003. The Aztecs have only played one road game against a Pac-12 member other than Utah since that time with that being at USC last season (L, 74-64).
- After having five of it first seven games away from home, Friday's contest at Washington State is the last time San Diego State will venture out of California until

- Jan. 14, when the team travels to UNLV for its first conference road game. That streak covers eight games and 42 days.
- At 4-2, San Diego State is still off to its best start since the 2008-09 team also was 4-2 and went on to win 24 games and advance to the second round of the NCAA tournament. With a victory over the Cougars, the Aztecs would have their best start through seven contests since 2007-08 (6-1).
- The month of December has been particularly good to the Aztecs over the last five seasons as the program has compiled an impressive 23-6 record during that span. Of the six losses, three have been to top-25 foes and a fourth has been against a squad receiving votes. Only one of the six defeats have come on the road.
- ESPN.com's Graham Hays had the Aztecs as the No. 5 ranked mid-major team in the nation in his blog published Wednesday afternoon. SDSU remains the only Mountain West women's squad with a victory over a top-25 foe this season.

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA Wednesday at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2 this season, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.) led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.) matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.) and junior Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.) both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.), all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior **Malia Nahinu** (Hayward, Calif.) ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who each contributed a basket to get to with four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting six points in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

DISPARITY AT THE STRIPE

UCLA went to the free-throw line 34 times on Wednesday, the most trips to the stripe by an SDSU foe since February 2010.

With the Aztecs trying 17 free throws vs. the Bruins, opponents have now attempted 46 more shots at the charity line over the six contests.

In the two losses, opponents have tried 57 free throws compared to the Aztecs' 32, making 42 of them (73.7). In SDSU's four victories, it has gone to the line on 74 occasions vs. its opponents' 95 opportunities.

BETTER ON THE BOARDS

Although they fell behind early, the Aztecs ended the contest at UCLA with a rebounding advantage for the fifth time in 2011-12. SDSU pulled down 41 boards compared the Bruins' 37.

The team continues to lead the Mountain West in offensive rebounds with 16.8 per contest and is second in the league in rebounding margin at +7.2.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of their 12 victories

CLOSE LOSSES

Over the last two years, 14 of the Aztecs' 19 total defeats have been by 10 points or fewer, including both this season with a one-point margin against Portland and a seven-point loss at UCLA,

In those 19 defeats, San Diego State been up by at least four points in 14 of them and had an early six-point advantage on Wednesday at 6-0 and 8-2.

The Aztecs have not trailed in two of the four victories in 2011-12, and were only down by a pair early against both No. 18/18 DePaul and Washington.

LOW ON TOS

Despite having seven players on this year's roster who did not compete a year ago, San Diego State has kept its turnover total at a minimum, averaging just over 16 a contest to rank first in the conference in turnover marqin at +3.7.

The Aztecs committed more than 20 giveaways just once in the first six games with that being in the opener against Arkansas-Pine Bluff when they had 22. The 13 turnovers against Washington on Saturday are a season low and are the team's fewest since having 12 against Air Force on Jan. 19, 2011.

SDSU had more than 20 turnovers in 11 games in 2010-11.

MONEY AT THE LINE

Although they shot a season-low 70.6 percent at UCLA, clearly one of the most improved statistical categories for the Aztecs this season is at the free-throw line. As a team, SDSU is shooting a conference-best 80.2 percent, making 85 of its 106 attempts.

In the opener, the team shot 91.3 percent (21-for-23) and followed that up with a 24-for-30 (80.0) performance against No. 18 DePaul. San Diego State made both of its free-throw chances against Hawai'i and then was only 11-of-15 (73.3) in the loss to Portland. The team followed that up with a 78.9 free-throw percentage in the win over Washington.

Five Aztecs are currently perfect at the stripe thus far in 2011-12, while true freshman Erimma Amarikwa (12-for-13) and senior Kalena Tutt (10-for-11) have missed just one attempt.

SDSU entered this week ranked eighth nationally in team free-throw percentage. A year ago, the team shot 62.8 percent at the free-throw line to rank 308th nationally out of 333 Division I teams. SDSU only crossed the 80-percent mark three times in the 29 contests.

LEAGUE'S LEADERS

Aztec junior Courtney Clements continues to lead the Mountain West in scoring through the end of Wednesday's games, posting a 19.2 average.

Clements has reached the 20-point barrier three times and scored over 10 in all six contests.

In addition, junior Chelsea Hopkins remains atop the MW stats in assists per game (5.2) and Clements is tied for first in 3-pointers per contest with 2.3.

SWEET DECEMBER

Entering the final month of the calendar year, San Diego State brings to Pullman an impressive record in December over the last five seasons.

The Aztecs are a combined 23-6 with four of those losses coming to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll in No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other two defeats were vs. Pepperdine in overtime last year and against Quinnipiac in the opening contest of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam.

Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 24 of those 29 December contests at home.

WITH A WIN

An SDSU victory over the Washington State will mean:

- SDSU improves to 4-1 all-time vs. the Cougars and is 2-0 in games played in Pullman.
- SDSU moves to 1-1 against teams it also faced last season.
- SDSU starts a campaign with a 5-2 record for the first time since the 2007-08 team was 6-1.
- SDSU is 68-105 all-time vs. teams currently playing in the Pac-12 and has won three of the last four.
- SDSU improves to 2-1 in games at an opponent's arena this season.
- SDSU is now 24-6 during the month of December over the last six years and has yet to lose a road game.

WSU TIDBITS

The Cougars carry a 4-4 overall record into Wednesday's game ... WSU already has half its season win total from all of last year with victories over UNC-Wilmington, Wisconsin, Marquette and Prairie View A&M ... The Cougars also played Wednesday night, losing a heart-

breaker to rival Gonzaga ... For the second year in a row, SDSU will face a WSU squad that does not have a player averaging more than 10 points a contest at game time ... Freshman Tia Presley is averaging a team-high 9.3 points a game, while senior Jazmine Perkins is the Cougs' top rebounder with 7.0 an outing ... Two WSU players have more than 20 assists and Perkins has 24 steals on her own ... Washington State holds its opponents to just 61.2 points per game and is shooting over 43 percent from the field ... The four games in the series have all been decided by 10 points or less ... SDSU head coach Beth Burns was a graduate assistant at Ohio State the year after WSU head coach June Daugherty played for the Buckeyes from 1974-78 ... Aztec athletic director Jim Sterk held a similar position at WSU for 10 years prior to coming to San Diego ... Perkins is a graduate of Berkeley High School in the Bay Area, as are SDSU freshmen Chairese Culberson and Khristina Hunter and Aztec associate head coach Jualeah Woods.

2010 SDSU-WSU REWIND

The San Diego State women's basketball team got 26 points from senior Paris Johnson, including 17 in the first half alone, to lead the Aztecs to a 66-57 victory Dec. 21, over Washington State. With the win, SDSU claimed its first home victory and improved to 5-5 overall, while the Cougars dropped to 2-10 on the year.

Johnson was 8-for-11 from the field in the first 20 minutes and ended up 11-for-21 for 26 points. Johnson also tallied 15 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the year and second in the last three games.

Classmate Jessika Bradley was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 11 and pulled down seven rebounds in 24 minutes. Senior guard Coco Davis recorded eight boards and contributed nine of the team's 18 assists on the night, while sophomore Courtney Clements notched nine points.

The two sides combined for five lead changes in the first four minutes of action, until San Diego State turned a one-point advantage into a nine-point lead via an 8-0 run, featuring three consecutive buckets in the paint at 19-10. WSU would climb back to within five on three occasions, but the Aztecs outscored the visitors 8-4 in the final five minutes to go into the locker room up 11

points at 36-25.

After a Cougar bucket to open the second half made it just a nine-point game, SDSU went on a 12-0 run, highlighted by its only 3-pointers on the evening to jump ahead by 21 points at 48-27.

After a timeout, WSU took a huge bite into the deficit, cutting it down to only nine points with just under eight minutes remaining, as San Diego State missed several chances around the rim to put the game out of reach. The lead was nine on two more occasions before the end of the game, including at the 2:52 mark at 61-52, but the Aztecs pushed the advantage back out to 13 points. The Cougars finished out the night with two layups in the final 31 seconds to round out scoring in the 66-57 SDSU victory.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU received votes in both national top-25 polls last week after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs garnered 13 votes in the Associated Press top-25 poll, while they also received one vote in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.

The last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State's win over No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 is the program's first vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it knocked off No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice when the Longhorns were ranked No. 4 in 2008, and again when they were the No. 17 team on their home floor in 2010. League foes New Mexico (No. 23 - 2009) and TCU (No. 23 - 2010) have also been upset.

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

■ With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.

The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.

- The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.
- SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese

State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.

- The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.
- Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010.

This is the first time in both Clements and Stamps' Aztec careers that they have been named to an all-tournament team.

■ Clements was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Nov. 21, after averaging 21.3 points and shooting .536 (30-for-56) from the field, including a .522 (12-for-23) mark from 3-point range, and .813 (13-for-16) from the free-throw line in the team's opening four outings.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first-place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's Chairese Culberson was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *Hoopgurlz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

A year ago, current Aztec sophomore Melissa Sweat was named the league's preseason freshman of the year, while former standout Paris Johnson was picked in 2007.

CLARK, HOPKINS TABBED CAPTAINS

Aztec juniors Chelsea Hopkins and Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.) were tabbed team captains for the 2011-12 season.

Hopkins sat out a year due to NCAA transfer rules, but was able to practice with the team. The 5-foot-8 guard has started the first six contests and also has two years of collegiate experience under her belt at Duke from 2008-10.

Clark, meanwhile, is in her fourth season on The Mesa and served as one of the squad's two captains a year ago. She is a two-time winner of the Tammy Blackburn coaches' award and has appeared in 58 career outings, starting twice.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced earlier this month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season. Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

- San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.
- Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago.

Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.

- The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards Erimma Amarikwa, Chairese Culberson, Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.) and Deajanae Scurry to go with guard Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.). The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.
- Entering this season, five players accounted for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLIS

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.) and point guard Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State's 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, fourstar recruits according to *HoopGurlz*, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the class.

THE WELCOME MAT

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

Aztec head coach Beth Burns added one new member to her staff over the summer with the hiring of assistant coach Tammi Reiss (pronounced Reese).

Reiss, who works with the Aztec guards, was an assistant coach for the WNBA Utah Starzz from 2001-02, before joining the franchise in its move to San Antonio in 2003.

The Eldred, N.Y., native spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater, when Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995 and 1996, made it to the Sweet 16 in 1994 and claimed a pair of ACC regular-season titles in 1994 and 1995.

One of the all-time greats in Virginia basketball history, she played for the Cavaliers from 1988-92, when the team made three consecutive Final Four appearances and earned two ACC regular-season and tournament titles. Reiss garnered both Kodak and USBWA All-America honors as a senior in 1992.

Following her collegiate career, Reiss was chosen by the Utah Starzz in the first round (fifth pick overall) of the inaugural WNBA Draft in 1997.

WOODS PROMOTED

San Diego State head basketball coach Beth Burns announced this past April that Jualeah Woods has been promoted to the position of associate head coach.

Since Woods' arrival in May of 2005, the Aztecs have won a Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament title, and recorded back-to-back NCAA appearances, including a trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 2010. On the court, she helped tutor four-time all-conference center Paris Johnson, who finished her career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and consecutive starts. Woods also mentored 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year forward Jessika Bradley, who was tabbed a third-team all-league pick as a senior.

2010-11 REWIND

Here are some of team's notes from last season:

- SDSU won at least 12 games for the fifth consecutive season and advanced to the championship game of each of its three non-conference tournaments.
- The Aztecs had 11 contests decided by five or fewer points and nine by three or less, including six in league play. Only five of the team's 17 losses were by more than 10 points and the 10 regular-season conference defeats were by 74 total points. SDSU also had at least a four-point lead in 13 of 17 losses.
- SDSU set a Mountain West record for most blocked shots in league play with 115 to its credit. The Aztecs easily surpassed the previous high of 101 set by the

- San Diego State finished fifth nationally with 6.4 blocks per game. The Aztecs trailed only Baylor (7.4), Saint Mary's (6.8), High Point (6.7) and North Carolina (6.5) in that category and had 34 more blocks than any other Mountain West squad, despite playing the fewest number of games.
- SDSU led the MWC and ranked 27th nationally in three-point field-goal defense (28.1). Opponents failed to shoot above 30 percent from three-point land in 17 of the 29 contests.
- Senior Coco Davis led the Mountain West and ranked fifth nationally in assists per game with a 6.3 mark. Her 428 career assists rank third in school history.
- Senior center Paris Johnson capped a phenomenal collegiate career by becoming the school's all-time leader in career blocks (267) and consecutive starts (126). She also was only the third player in school history to score 1,500 points.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has four of its recent standouts playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season. Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 328-239, while her school record stands at 247-174 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before settling for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Čoming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Culberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a De-Paul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

Portland did not take a timeout and quickly got the ball up the court, missing on its first shot, but Day got the rebound and was fouled. Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSU-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory Saturday over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Freshman Chairese Culberson notched a team-high 14 points, including her first career 3-pointer, to go with four of the team's 13 steals. The Aztecs took the lead on a pair of Tutt free throws and had a two-possession advantage until going on a 13-5 run to jump ahead by double figures for the first time at 26-16. Following a timeout, the Huskies trimmed their deficit to eight three times, including at the break with the score 32-24.

Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.
