#### SAN DIEGO STATE AZTECS

**2022-23 Record:** 32-7 (15-3 Mountain West), NCAA National Runner-up

#### PRESEASON NOTES

- San Diego State embarks on its 103rd season in 2023-24. In 102 seasons, the Aztecs are 1,593-1,148-1 overall and, in its 53 seasons at the Division I level, has posted a 905-703 mark.
- San Diego State preps for the 2023-24 campaign after finishing last season 32-7, 15-3 mark in league play. The team won the regular season and then tournament titles in the Mountain West. The Aztecs have captured a league-high 16 conference titles, have finished champion or runner-up in 15-of-24 Mountain West Tournaments. Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for the second most in the nation.
- Entering the 2023-24 season, SDSU will look to return to the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in the last six years in which a champion has been crowned (the 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled due to COVID-19). The Aztecs' appearance in 2023 was their 15th postseason berth (11 NCAA, 4 NIT) in the last 17 years in which a national champion was crowned.
- San Diego State is one of 12 programs in the nation to have appeared in at least 10 of the last 13 NCAA Tournaments.
- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** is set for his seventh season after guiding San Diego State to a 32-7 record in 2022-23, and has a career mark of 151-47. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first six seasons. Among head coaches whose first season guiding his current program was 2017-18, his 151 victories lead the nation and are 12 more than the next highest total (Furman's Bob Richey).
- In 2018, **Brian Dutcher** was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament and in the previous 96 seasons of SDSU basketball, no other coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his initial season.
- Brian Dutcher** is the only coach in program history (since 1921-22) to lead his team to 100 or more victories in his first six seasons (151 total). Smokey Gaines (1979-80 through 1984-85) ranks second with 97 wins. In addition, Dutcher is one of two head coaches in SDSU history to lead their teams to the NCAA Tournament in their first season coaching at San Diego State (also: Tim Vezie in 1974-75).
- Brian Dutcher's** .763 winning percentage (151-47) is the highest in program history and in 2021-22 became just the fifth coach in program history to reach 100 career wins. In addition, his .571 winning percentage (12-9) against top-25 competition is the best for any Aztec coach and he is the only Aztec coach to post a winning record against the top-25.
- Brian Dutcher** welcomes back two returning starters in senior guard and 2023 NCAA All-Tournament Team honoree **Lamont Butler** and 2023 NCAA South Regional Most Outstanding Player and two-time Mountain West Player of the Week **Darrion Trammell**. Butler appeared in all 39 games with 38 starts, while Trammell was a starter in 37 of his 38 appearances.
- SDSU loses three starters (Matt Bradley, Keshad Johnson and Nathan Mensah) from its 2022-23 squad that went 32-7, won both the Mountain West regular season and tournament titles, the NCAA South Regional and finished the national runner-up. Bradley led the team in points (12.6) and Mensah in rebounds (232) and blocks (65) last season.
- SDSU has five Division I transfers on its 2023-24 roster, all of whom are available to compete. **Darrion Trammell** (Seattle U), the NCAA South Regional Most Outstanding Player, has one year of eligibility, **Jaedon LeDee** (TCU) the team's second leading rebounder and fourth leading scorer last season has one year of eligibility, and **Micah Parrish**, returning as the team's leading 3-point percentage shooter, has two years left to compete, while newcomers **Reese Waters** (Southern California), the reigning Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year, and **Jay Pal** (Campbell) are immediately available and have two and one year of eligibility, respectively.
- When the season tips off, the Aztecs will have six players on the roster who have never played a game in an SDSU uniform. **Reese Waters** (Southern California) is a transfer who has two years of eligibility. **Jay Pal** (Campbell) is a transfer who has one year of eligibility. **Cam Lawin** (Orr High, Chicago, Ill.) is a redshirt freshman while **BJ Davis** (Modesto, Calif., Modesto Christian High), **Miles Heide** (Snoqualmie, Wash., Mount Si High) and **Magoon Gwath** (Euless, Texas, Veritas Prep) are true freshmen.
- In addition to **Lamont Butler** (guard), **Darrion Trammell** (guard), and **Jaedon LeDee** (forward), SDSU welcomes back seniors **Micah Parrish** (guard), and **Cade Alger** (forward). In addition, sophomores **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** (forward), **Elijah Saunders** (forward), **Miles Byrd** (guard), and redshirt-freshman **Cam Lawin** (guard) return to the Aztecs in 2023-24. In 2022-23, among scholarship players, LeDee averaged 7.9 points and 5.3 rebounds, Parrish (7.4 ppg., 3.6 rpg.), Byrd (4.3 ppg., 0.5 rpg.), Saunders (0.9 ppg, 1.1 rpg.), Johnson Jr. (0.9ppg., 0.6 rpg.) are all forecast to play larger roles and make larger contributions in 2023-24.

## San Diego State 2023-24 Way-Too-Early Rankings

### No. 11 - John Fanta (Fox Sports - June 6)

"The Aztecs will welcome back three of their top four scorers — Darrion Trammell, Final Four hero Lamont Butler and Jaedon LeDee — from a team that reached the national championship game this past season. Brian Dutcher also added a steady rising junior guard Reese Dixon-Waters, who averaged 10 PPG in his sophomore year at USC. SDSU isn't going anywhere."

### No. 12 - Jeff Borzello (ESPN - June 20)

"Brian Dutcher lost a handful of veteran pieces from a team that reached the national championship game, but he brought back four players who saw at least 17 minutes in the title game, including two starters. Lamont Butler and Jaedon LeDee both withdrew from the draft shortly before the deadline, while Darrion Trammell is taking advantage of his extra year. USC transfer Reese Dixon-Waters is an underrated addition, too."

### No. 13 - Gary Parrish (CBS Sports - June 6)

"This ranking is based on the Aztecs returning four of the top six scorers - Darrion Trammell, Lamont Butler, Jaedon LeDee and Micah Parrish - from a team that won the Mountain West Conference regular-season title and the Mountain West Tournament before advancing to the championship game of the 2023 NCAA Tournament. Another MWC title seems likely for San Diego State."

### No. 13 - Mike Rutherford (SB Nation - June 14)

"The Aztecs — not UCLA or Arizona or Gonzaga — nearly became the first West Coast team since

1997 to win the national title before running into the buzzsaw that was UConn on the first Monday in April. Four of the top six scorers return from that team, including South Region MVP Darrion Trammell and Final Four hero Lamont Butler. USC transfer Reese Dixon-Waters should bolster what was already a solid starting five."

### No. 15 - Andy Katz (NCAA.com - June 2)

"The Aztecs can make another deep run in March after the decisions of Lamont Butler and Jaedon LeDee to return to San Diego. USC's Reese Dixon-Waters will help immediately as well. This team will still retain its defensive identity under Brian Dutcher."

### No. 21 - Seth Davis (The Athletic - May 12)

"This program made a habit of restocking with transfers well before the NCAA set up the portal, and the Aztecs got a good one in 6-5 junior guard Reese Dixon-Waters, who was voted the Pac-12's Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 9.8 points and 3.2 rebounds for USC. SDSU's second-leading scorer, 5-10 guard Darion Trammell, is expected to return for a super senior year. Two other potential returnees, 6-9 senior forward Jaedon Ledee and 6-2 junior guard Lamont Butler, have entered the NBA Draft, but neither was invited to the combine. If those two and Trammell return, then the Aztecs will have four of the top six scorers from the team that reached the national championship game."

### No. 21 - Bart Torvik (T-Rank - June 22)

## TEAM NOTES

- The Aztecs finished last year with a 32-7 record and a 15-3 mark in the Mountain West. SDSU posted its 18th straight season with at least 19 victories, which is tied for the third most consecutive seasons with at least 19 wins in the nation.
- San Diego State was one of the most dominant defensive teams in the nation in 2022-23, finishing No. 26 in scoring defense (63.5 ppg) and in the last 13 years, beginning in 2010-11, has finished in the top-10 in the nation six times. In addition, the Aztecs were No. 4 in 3-point field goal defensive percentage (.284), No. 41 in field goal percentage defense (.409) and led the Mountain West in each of those categories.
- According to KenPom, nationally the Aztecs were No. 4 in adjusted defensive efficiency, No. 4 in three-point percentage defense and No. 20 in effective field goal percentage defense. In Mountain West action, SDSU ranked No. 1 in defensive efficiency, effective defensive field goal percentage, 3-point defensive field goal percentage, and block percentage. No other program in the MW could equal or surpass SDSU's four top-20 rankings. UNLV was the only other team in the league to lead as many as two categories.
- San Diego State has done a good job in close games the last four seasons, going 23-10 in games decided by five points or less, including 10-1 in 2022-23. In addition, SDSU is 42-14 in games where the margin of victory was 10 points or less since the start of 2019-20 which includes an 18-5 mark last season.
- Last year when the Aztecs won, it was usually by a wide margin. In the team's 32 victories in 2022-23, 16 were decided by 10 or more points...11 by 15 or more, six by 20 or more and two by 25 or more points.

- In the last four seasons, the Aztecs have posted 67 double-digit margin of victory wins among its 108 total victories... 67 came by 10 or more points, 47 by 15 or more, 28 by 20 or more and 19 by 25 or more points.
- Five Aztecs (Matt Bradley, Nathan Mensah, Lamont Butler, Keshad Johnson and Darrion Trammell) made 191 of a possible 195 starts last season. Entering the 2023-24 season, San Diego State will have to replace 116 of those 195 starting assignments (39 each from Bradley & Johnson and 38 from Mensah).
- The Aztecs were once again the top defensive team in the Mountain West in 2022-23, ranking first in scoring defense (63.4 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.409), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.284), blocked shots (151), defensive rebounds (1,255), and had a 16-steal game among a total of six games with double digit steals. In addition, SDSU ranked second in the league in steals (262) and third in steals per game (6.72). In conference games only, San Diego State ranked first in scoring defense (63.7 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.424), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.297), scoring margin (+7.5), opponent rebounding (29.3/g), and was second in rebound margin (+5.8), and blocked shots (3.89/g).
- SDSU has posted at least 20 wins 17 times in the last 18 years, 20 times in its Division I history (52 years) and 27 times overall. Head Coach Brian Dutcher has been on the San Diego State bench for 18 of those 27 seasons.
- San Diego State has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 12 times and played 23 games (11-12) in the last 22 seasons, in which a national champion was crowned. All 23 of those games have occurred with Brian Dutcher on the sideline and are the most in Mountain West history.
- SDSU has claimed a Mountain West-leading 16 conference titles, including seven MW Tournament crowns (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2018, 2021 & 2023). In 2023, the Aztecs played in their ninth Mountain West championship game in the last 11 seasons and advanced to the postseason for the 15th time in the last 17 years in which a national champion has been crowned (does not include 2020).
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 339-107. SDSU's 339 wins & .760 winning percentage are the sixth-best nationally over the last 12 seasons.
- SDSU enters the 2023-24 season having won at least 20 games and advancing to the postseason in 15 (11 NCAA, 4 NIT) of the last 18 years, in which a national champion was crowned. In the last 18 seasons (since the start of the 2005-06 campaign), the Aztecs have won 456 games (seventh most in Division I & one of two teams on the list not in a men's basketball power conference: also Gonzaga), an average of 25.3 victories per season.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) eight times (2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2019-20, 2020-21 & 2022-23) in the last 13 years.

## PLAYER PERSONNEL

- In senior guards **Lamont Butler** and **Darrion Trammell**, San Diego State returns two of its five starters from the 2022-23 squad which reached the 2023 NCAA Tournament national championship game. The pair figure to be included in the team's first five from the outset of the 2023-24 campaign. Butler started 38 of the team's 39 games last year, while Trammell finished with 37 starts in 38 appearances.
- **Lamont Butler** is a 6-2 senior point guard, who knocked down the biggest shot in program history, a 12-foot buzzer-beating jumper in a 72-71 over FAU in the Final Four to send the Aztecs to the 2023 national championship game. He is the only player in Final Four history to hit a game winning bucket while trailing in a game. He was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team and the All-South Regional Team. A physical guard, he has one of the team's highest vertical leaps and is a nightmare to stop when he gets downhill both on the floor and at the rim. Begins the 2023-24 season 337 points from becoming the 37th player in program history to reach the 1,000-career point plateau and if he reaches it will be the 7th player who achieved the milestone in Brian Dutcher's seven seasons. If he continues to shoot his career average (40.8 FG%) and dish out his seasonal average of assists (75/season), he could become the fourth player since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) to complete his Aztec career with 300 assists and 1,000 points, while shooting at least 40.0 percent from the field. Enjoyed the most productive season of his college career in 2022-23 and for his career, he averages 7.1 points, 2.2 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.4 steals, and after his performance last year, has two years of eligibility remaining.
- In 2020-21, was the only Aztec true freshman to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and was just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (also: Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah). Was playing his best basketball in the seven games prior to his wrist injury scoring 9.7 points on 45.8 percent shooting from the floor, including 47.1 percent from distance, 2.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. A physical guard, he has one of the team's highest vertical leaps and is a nightmare to stop when he gets downhill both on the floor and at the rim.
- **Jaedon LeDee** is a 6-9 senior forward who after sitting out the 2021-22 season due to NCAA transfer rules, showed a glimpse of what he is capable of in 2022-23 and is expected to build on that foundation in 2023-24, his final year of eligibility. Last year he nearly or more than doubled his career averages from the previous three seasons. Despite coming off the bench in 38-of-39 appearances, he ranked No. 9 in the Mountain West in total rebounds. He is a matchup problem for opponents due to his physicality with smaller players and his quickness and strength with other bigs. Will more than likely play as a face-up five for the majority of his minutes, but can also dominate on the block when called to do so. Should be a walking double double in 2023-24.
- The native of Houston, Texas, originally competed for Ohio State in the 2018-19 season, his freshman year. He then transferred to TCU and played for the Horned Frogs in each of the past two seasons. In 79 collegiate games prior to arriving at SDSU, LeDee averaged 5.2 points and 3.1 rebounds in 11.0 minutes per game. He had gone 90-of-182 (49.5 percent) from the floor and 112-of-156 (71.8 percent) from the line in three collegiate seasons. In addition, he has 15 assists, 21 blocks and 23 steals in 869 total minutes. In 2022-23 he averaged 7.9 points and 5.3 rebounds in 18.0 minutes, while shooting 48.9 percent (109-of-223) and 72.8 percent (91-of-125) from the line with 37 assists, 19 steals and 14 blocks, all career-highs.
- **Darrion Trammell** is a 5-10 senior guard who transferred to San Diego State prior to the 2022-23 season has one year of eligibility remaining. He changed his offensive game last year in order to fit more effectively in the San Diego State scheme. Despite those adjustments, he earned the NCAA Tournament South Regional Most Outstanding Player and All-South Regional Team designation after averaging 12.8 points and 4.0 rebounds in four games in the South Regional. In the Sweet 16 vs Alabama and Elite 8 vs Creighton. Against Alabama, the No. 1 team in the nation and No. 1-seed in the Tournament, he averaged 16.5 points and 5.0 rebounds while leading all-scorers with 21 points on 9-of-16 shooting (56.3 percent) from the field, including 3-of-5 from the bonus distance. Against Creighton he broke a 56-56 tie with a free throw with a second left on the clock to send the Aztecs to the program's first Final Four. In 2022-23, Trammell averaged 9.8 points and returns in 2023-24 as the team's leading scorer. In addition, he averaged 2.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.3 steals.



## In 2022-23 San Diego State achieved several firsts in program history...

- Won a game in the Sweet 16
- Appeared in and won a game in the Elite 8 and Final Four
- Played for the national championship
- Finished the season ranked No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, the highest in program history
- **Brian Dutcher** won his first NCAA Tournament game as HC, but has a 41-21 NCAA Tournament record as a coach
- Defeated the AP No. 1 team in the nation and the top seed in the NCAA Tournament (Alabama in the Sweet 16)
- Surpassed Ohio State as the most successful school in the nation in combined football and men's basketball win percentage since the start of the 2009-10 season
- **Lamont Butler** hit a buzzer-beating game-winning shot to defeat Florida Atlantic in the Final Four...it is the only successful shot from a team that was trailing to win a game in the Final Four
- **Darrion Trammell** is the first Aztecs to earn an NCAA Regional Most Outstanding Player honors at the NCAA Tournament
- The Aztecs placed two players on an NCAA All-Regional team and one on the NCAA All-Tournament Team



- Trammell is the only active player in 2023-24 to have scored at least 1,375 points while shooting at least 39.0 percent from the field and having dished out 390 assists since the start of 2020-21 and is the only player under 5-11, who enters 2023-24 to have totaled at least 390 assists, 175 steals and 14 blocks in the same time frame.
- In two seasons at Seattle U, Trammell was twice named a first team NABC All-District 6, garnered two first-team All-Western Athletic Conference (WAC) and two WAC All-Tournament Team honors to go along with inclusion on the 2020-21 WAC All-Newcomer and 2021-22 All-Defensive Teams. While competing for the Redhawks, he averaged 18.7 points, 5.1 assists, 3.8 rebounds, 3.8 steals in just under 35 minutes per game. He shot 40.6 percent from the floor (309-of-761), 34.6 percent from the bonus distance (101-of-292), and 84.0 percent from the line (289-of-344). In addition, he reached double figure scoring in 49-of-54 career games and scored at least 20 points in 22 of those contests and 30 or more in five, including a career-best 39 in his final game for the Redhawks in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) tournament. It was also in that game that he surpassed the 1,000-career point plateau.
- **Micah Parrish** is a 6-6 senior wing who joined the Aztecs in 2022-23 via the transfer portal from Oakland and has two years of eligibility available. Knocked down a game-winning corner three with two seconds to go against UC Irvine to help the Aztecs avoid the Maui Invitational hangover. His 49 three-pointers are a career high and the second most made for a player returning from last year's roster and his 76.4 percent free throw shooting tops the list of returners. Sank multiple 3-pointers in 16 contests and SDSU was 14-2 in those contests. In two seasons at Oakland (Rochester Minn.), he earned inclusion on the Horizon League All-Defensive Team. While competing as a Golden Grizzly, he averaged 10.5 points, 5.9 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.7 steals in just under 32 minutes per game. He shot 48.4 percent from the floor (207-of-428), 35.2 percent from the bonus distance (62-of-176), and 76.2 percent from the line (141-of-185).
- With the graduation of Aguek Arop, Matt Bradley, Nathan Mensah and Adam Seiko, and the loss of Keshad Johnson head coach **Brian Dutcher** will replace major parts of his roster in 2023-24. The five combined to average 36.6 points, 19.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists last season, but look for transfer **Reese Waters** from Southern California and Campbell's **Jay Pal** to replace a portion of the productivity which has been lost. The pair combined to average 22.1 points, 12.0 rebounds, and 2.5 assists last season.
- **Reese Waters** is a 6-5 junior guard who transferred to San Diego State from Southern California over the summer and has two years of eligibility. In 2022-23 he averaged 9.8 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.1 assists while earning the Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year. Was one of five players nationally last season, who in a minimum of 21 games off the bench, averaged at least 10.3 points (shooting at least 46.0 percent from the floor), 3.1 rebounds and 1.5 assists and had at least nine blocks. In three seasons as a Trojan, he averaged 6.2 points, 2.2 rebounds and 0.7 assists. In his final 11 games at Southern California, he averaged 11.7 points on 28-of-61 shooting (45.9 percent) from the field and 10-of-22 (45.5 percent) from the bonus distance, with 4.4 rebounds and 0.9 assists. A four-star rated recruit coming out of St. Bernard High in Playa del Rey, Calif., he was the No. 11 shooting guard in California and the nation and overall was No. 77 nationally.
- **Jay Pal** is a prototypical Aztec wing, a 6-9 senior forward with one year of eligibility after transferring to SDSU from Campbell University after the 2022-23 season. In his finest collegiate season, in 2022-23, he averaged 12.3 points on 58.0 percent shooting (149-of-257) from the field, including 32.9 percent (26-of-79) from the bonus distance, pulled down 6.9 rebounds and blocked 48 shots. Nationally, in 2022-23, was the only player who stands at least 6-9 to shoot at least 58.0 percent from the floor, including a minimum of 32.0 percent from the bonus distance (minimum of 75 3-point attempts) and averaged at least 12.3 points. Began his major college career at Jacksonville State, where in 55 games he averaged 4.0 points (44.3 FG%, 24.1 3FG%, 60.3 FT%), 3.5 rebounds and 1.2 assists, and in his lone season at Campbell, starting all 32 of his appearances, wiped out those totals as noted previously.
- **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** is a 6-10 sophomore forward out of Salesian College Prep in Richmond, Calif. In 2022-23 appeared in nine contests, all off the bench and shot 60.0 percent (3-of-5). Per 40 minutes played averages 11.4 points, 7.1 rebounds, and 1.4 blocks and assists. In four high school seasons, he helped his team to a 101-12 record, including a 37-0 mark in Tri-County Athletic League (TCAL) play. The program won three TCAL championships and back-to-back (2017-18 & 2018-19) CIF North Coast Section Division III titles.
- **Miles Byrd** is a 6-7 sophomore guard who appeared in four games and averaged 5.3 points and 0.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists. Per 40 minutes played averaged 17.0 points, 6.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds. A graduate of Lincoln High School in Stockton, Calif. and a 4-star rated recruit. At the time of his signing, nationally rated as the No. 162 recruit, the No. 20 shooting guard and No. 15 in California. Led Lincoln to a 26-6 record while averaging a team-best 17.2 points, 5.2 rebounds, 2.8 steals, and 1.2 blocks and ranked second with 3.3 assists as a senior.
- **Elijah Saunders** is a 6-8 sophomore forward out of Sunnyslope High School in Phoenix, Ariz. His 16 appearances and 89 minutes were the most of any underclassman on the roster. Averaged 6.3 points, 7.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists per 40 minutes played. A 4-star rated recruit who, at the time of his signing, nationally ranked No. 115 at his position and No. 23 at power forward as well as No. 8 in Arizona according to 247Sports. He has a big body and is equally comfortable down on the block as well as beyond the 3-point line. Saunders can run the floor, has a quick release, and scores with his back to the basket as well as off the bounce.
- **BJ Davis** is a 6-1 freshman point guard out of Modesto (Calif.) Christian High School. A four-star prospect according to 247Sports.com who was rated, at the time of his signing, the No. 122 recruit nationally, the No. 17 point guard and No. 18 overall in California. In leading the Crusaders to a Sac-Joaquin Section Division I championship and the NorCal Regional Open Division final, was named a California All-State third-team honoree, the Sac-Joaquin Section co-MVP, and the Sacramento Bee's Player of the Year in his senior campaign. Completed his high school career with over 1,400 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists.
- **Miles Heide** is a 6-9 freshman forward out of Mount Si High School in Snoqualmie, Washington. A three-star prospect by 247Sports.com who was ranked No. 218 nationally and No. 32 at power forward and No. 3 in Washington. As a senior, averaged 17.4 points (shooting 68.7 percent), 13.4 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.0 blocks per game according to MaxPreps and had 26 double doubles in 29 games. Named the 2022-23 4A KingCo Player of the Year. In three seasons at Mount Si (not including 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic), according to MaxPreps, his teams went 76-9, including 44-1 in league play & won three 4A KingCo championships and won the 2020 4A state championship and was the state runner-up in 2022 and finished fourth in 2023.
- **Magoon Gwath** is a 6-11 freshman forward out of Veritas Prep in Garden Grove, Calif. Has a 7-4 wingspan and can handle the ball and distribute, score from all three levels and run the floor. Spent the first three years at Trinity High School in Euless, Texas.
- **Cade Alger** is a 6-9 non-scholarship senior forward who has averaged 1.0 points and 0.3 rebounds while shooting 47.4 percent (9-of-19 FG) from the floor for his career. He transferred from Seattle prior to the 2020-21 season.
- **Cam Lawin** is a 6-3 redshirt freshman shooting guard who is a non-scholarship player out of Chicago's Orr High. He was a fourth-team *Chicago Sun-Times* All-City Team performer as a senior.

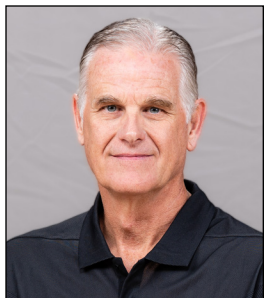

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Seventh Season • 25th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

**Career Record: 151-47 (.763)**

**MW Record: 81-25 (.764)**

Brian Dutcher enters his seventh season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach and is coming off leading the program to its first national championship game after winning its first Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four games in the 2023 NCAA Tournament. He is building on the previous six years in which he led the Aztecs to six title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th & 16th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament in four of the five years in which a champion was crowned since he took control of the program prior to the 2017-18 season. He is the only coach in the 102-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons. His 151 victories in six seasons (151-47) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 76.3 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 20 occasions and posted an 11-9 record and includes wins over No. 1 Alabama, Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 5-3 against Pac-12 opponents and 9-6 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the seventh best home win percentage in the nation (89.2 percent), and in the last four years, San Diego State has posted a 91.8-win percentage (56-5) in Viejas Arena, the sixth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last six years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first-team designation. Flynn, Yanni Wetzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year, and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors. Last season, Mensah was again named the Defensive Player of the Year, a third-team performer, and a member of the all-Defensive Team, while Bradley earned first-team honors and Lamont Butler was a third team and All-Defensive Team designee.

His players have earned 17 all-Mountain West designations and 18 players of the week honors. Three Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018, Mitchell in 2021 and Bradley in 2023, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 12 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his six seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions, a pair of Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar awards, and Flynn was named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2022-23 season saw SDSU fulfill a promise coach Dutcher, and previously Hall of Fame coach Steve Fisher, made from the day they stepped on campus in the 1999-00 season...that the program's goal was to compete for national championships. The Aztecs finished with a 32-7 record, played Connecticut for the NCAA championship in Houston's NRG Stadium in front of more than 72,000 spectators and finished the season as the national runner-up. The team ranked No. 2 in the final USA Today Coaches poll, the highest the program has ever achieved.

SDSU's 32 victories are the second most in a season in San Diego State history, trailing only the 34 wins in 2010-11. In conference play, SDSU was 15-3 and secured both the regular-season and tournament titles to earn a No. 5 seed, its third consecutive season with a single-digit seed in the NCAA Tournament. Five of the team's seven losses were by nine points or less, with three of its losses coming against top-25 opposition and in each of its losses its opponent was receiving votes in the national polls. Senior guard Darrion Trammell was named the South Regional Most Outstanding Player with Lamont Butler also included on the South Regional All-Tournament Team. Butler, who hit the biggest shot in SDSU history, the game winner as the clock expired against Florida Atlantic in the Final Four to send the Aztecs to the national championship game, earned inclusion on the 2023 NCAA All-Tournament Team.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a No. 8 seed. Six of its nine losses were by six points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, turnover margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third

of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the fourth most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

In 2017-18, Dutcher was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament in his initial season after going 22-10, including winning the 2018 MW Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 24 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 17 times, including 12 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 18 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has three NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014, 2023) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016) appearances, won at least 25 games nine times and captured 13 MW championships (eight regular season, five tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

- **Had two game-winning shots at the buzzer (no time left) in 2022-23, including in the Final Four vs. Florida Atlantic on April 1 and at New Mexico on Feb. 25.**
- Completed his high school career as the leading scorer in Riverside Poly history, passing NBA Hall-of-Fame inductee Reggie Miller.
- **Was the only Aztec true freshman (2020-21) to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah).**
- Was the 25th Aztec since the start of the 1999-00 season to finish a game with a 6:1 assists-to-turnover ratio (vs. Cal State Fullerton - 11/7/22) and if you include his 4 steals, he is one of two SDSU players, and the first since Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on 3/1/01.
- **Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) is just the second Aztec to have four steals & a 6:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in a game (also Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on March 1, 2001). He did it in the season opener vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7).**

- MW Rankings: No. 7 in steals, No. 10 in assists-to-turnover ratio, No. 12 in assists*

- Scored game-winning jumper as time expired in Aztec win over Florida Atlantic (4/1) in Final Four, making the first buzzer beater in an NCAA Final Four game when trailing.
  - Scored 11 pts vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7) with three boards and a game-high 6 assists & 1 turnover and four steals. **Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) he is just the second Aztec to have four steals and a 6:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in a game (also Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on March 1, 2001).**
  - Back-to-back double digit scoring games for the first time this season, at Stanford (11/15) & vs. Ohio State (11/21).

- In his first two seasons, 55 total games, had 12 double figure scoring games, versus 14 in 39 games last season.
- In games in which he has one or fewer turnovers San Diego State has a 39-7 record & in games in which he has started and recorded one or fewer turnovers, SDSU is 21-5.
- Has 14 career games of three or more steals and in those contests San Diego State has an 13-1 record.
