
THE BREAKDOWN

- Fresno State and San Diego State are set to meet for the 61st time in program history on Saturday.
- It is the first trip to Fresno for the Aztecs since the 2018 season.
- Fresno State will battle to keep possession of the Old Oil Can trophy, playing in its third rivalry trophy game of the season.

THE BONES

- This is the 12th season* of the "Battle for the Old Oil Can" Trophy, given to the winning team in the rivalry series between San Diego State and Fresno State.
- If Fresno state wins on Saturday, it will be tied for first place in the West Division with San Jose State. Since the Bulldogs defeated San Jose State on Oct. 15, the path to the Mountain West Championship game is still clear ahead of the Bulldogs.
- As divisional opponents, Fresno State and San Diego State traditionally alternate hosting each other every other year. However, Saturday's matchup will be the first time that San Diego State plays in Fresno since Nov. 17, 2018. The teams were scheduled to play in The Valley during the 2020 season, but the game that season was canceled due to COVID-19 protocols. Fresno State has won four of the last five games played between the programs in Fresno.
- With four games as the starting quarterback under his belt, it is becoming clear that sophomore Logan Fife has got in his groove, and the rest of the offense more comfortable with him as well. Fife has thrown for 892 yards while completing 84-of-120 pass attempts. Fife is throwing at a 70.0 percent clip, a mark that is 13th-best in the FBS and a league-leading mark through games played Oct. 22.
- Senior wide receiver Jalen Moreno-Cropper has had an electric career as a Bulldog. Moreno-Cropper became the 13th Bulldog in program history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards. With 158 yards receiving last time out, Moreno-Cropper is up to 2,119 career receiving yards. He became the first Bulldog since KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan to hit the milestone - both played from 2015-18.
- Jordan Mims currently sits 8th in career rushing yards (2,565) at Fresno State. Mims is just one rushing touchdown away from breaking into the Top 10 in career rushing touchdowns - his 27th score would tie with Aaron Craver (1989-90) and Kelly Skipper (1985-88) in Fresno State's history. 2021 senior Ronnie Rivers holds the program record with 40 career rushing touchdowns.
- Center Bula Schmidt recorded a reception on a batted down pass, and ran with it for four yards with eight yards after catch. It was the first time a Bulldog offensive lineman caught a true pass reception (2-point conversions are not registered as pass receptions) since Adam McDowell at then-No. 8 Boise State on Nov. 28, 2008.
- Fresno State is one of 21 schools from around the FBS with 10 or more players with at least 1.0 sack on the season. The 11 players with a sack are the third-most among the 21 teams.
- Fresno State's defensive line is among the youngest in the country. The Bulldogs have played four true freshmen on the defensive line this season, with two of those four having earned at least one start.
- Last time out, Fresno State scored its most points in a game (41) since scoring 63 against Cal Poly on Sept. 11, 2021. It was its most against a conference opponent since scoring 41 at Hawai'i on Nov. 2, 2019.
- Defensively against the Lobos, Fresno State held New Mexico to only 138 total yards of offense (51 passing and 87 rushing), did not allow a touchdown in a game for the first time since its shutout at Wyoming on Oct. 16, 2021, and had a 10.0 TFL performance in its second-straight game.

HEAD COACH JEFF TEDFORD

On returning home...

“It’s great. It will be nice to not have to pack on Thursday night when we get home. It is awesome to come home and I am excited to be able to come be in front our our fans. It will be a great matchup this weekend, so I am hoping they come out and support us. We are going to need them.”

On the Bulldogs defense in the last two games...

“It was very impressive against San Jose State. Last week, I think [New Mexico] was trying to find themselves a little bit offensively. I think Coach Coyle and the defensive staff are doing a good job at putting a plan together and executing well. I think our guys on defense are playing really hard, running to the ball and doing a good job. We have done a nice job at holding people out of the endzone. It is not like they haven’t been down there, we have been holding them out of there and playing well in the red zone.”

On San Diego State...

“You know they are always going to be physical in running the ball. They always do a great job of it. The quarterback that they have playing now looks like he is finding his groove. He threw for over 300 yards against Hawai’i. As I understand it, they moved him to safety and then back to quarterback. Watching him on tape the last couple of weeks, you wouldn’t have known that he hasn’t been playing quarterback. He has done a really nice job. They are always dangerous because they run the ball so well, and then obviously the play action pass when you over-commit to the run. It is always a tough matchup. It is always a physical game with them.”

THE AZTECS

SCOUTING THE AZTECS

San Diego State is 4-3 (2-1 MW) on the season. The Aztecs have wins over Idaho State (38-7), Toledo (17-14), Hawai'i (16-14) and Nevada (23-7). SDSU's losses are to Arizona (38-20), No. 14/15 Utah (35-7) and Boise State (35-13).

San Diego State is 1-2 in games played on the road this season.

San Diego State returns just three starters on offense this season - senior center Alama Uluave, senior wide receiver Jesse Matthews and junior offensive tackle Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson. San Diego State's returns seven starters return from a defense that ranked third in rushing yards allowed per game (80.4), 12th in total defense (324.5), 14th in pass efficiency rating (118.2) and 17th in scoring defense (19.8). Starters that are back for the Aztecs are senior defensive ends Jonah Tavai and Keshawn Banks, senior linebackers Caden McDonald and Michael Shawcroft, senior safeties Patrick McMorris and Cedarius Barfield, and junior cornerback Noah Tumblin.

Associate head coach and running backs coach Jeff Horton took over for Jeff Hecklinski on Oct. 2 as the team's offensive coordinator. Horton was SDSU's offensive coordinator from 2015-19 where San Diego State won two Mountain West titles (2015-16) and had a pair of 2,000-yard rushers in Donnel Pumphrey (2015) and Rashaad Penny (2016).

SERIES HISTORY WITH THE AZTECS

The second-most played opponent for the Fresno State football program behind San Jose State is San Diego State, who will meet the Bulldogs for the 61st time on Saturday evening.

The 'Dogs trail the all-time series 30-26-4 since the first-ever meeting in 1923. In games in Fresno, Fresno State leads the series 14-13-2.

After an eight-year pause, the Bulldogs and Aztecs renewed their rivalry in 2011 with a nonconference game and have played every season since with Fresno State joining SDSU in the Mountain West in 2012. Prior to 2011, the two schools played once in a nonconference game in 2002 after a stretch from 1992-98 playing as WAC league members. They also had intra-conference stints in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (1940-67) and Pacific Coast Athletics Association (1969-75). Out of the 60 all-time meetings, 47 of them have been intra-conference battles.

Since the 'Dogs moved to the Mountain West in 2012, the 'Dogs are 6-3 against SDSU with wins in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2017, 2018 and 2021.

CARSON, Calif. – The Old Oil Can makes its way back to Fresno after the Bulldogs defeated No. 21 San Diego State 30-20 at Dignity Health Sports Park in a big Mountain West matchup on Saturday night.

Behind another strong performance on the ground by Jordan Mims, who finished the game with a career-high 186 yards and two touchdowns, the Bulldogs powered their way to their second win over a ranked opponent this season.

How It Happened

On its second possession of the night, Fresno State put together its longest drive of the year, a 15-play drive that saw the 'Dogs go 86 yards. Jordan Mims broke into the end zone from 13 yards out to give the 'Dogs an early 7-0 lead.

Late in the opening quarter, Evan Williams picked off Lucas Johnson on a third-and-13 and returned it 36 yards down to the Aztec 31-yard line. Four plays later, Jake Haener connected with Keric Wheatfall from 16 yards to double the Bulldogs' advantage.

Following a defensive stop after San Diego State crossed the 50 again, the 'Dogs turned it into three points with a career-long 49-yard field goal from Cesar Silva. The Bulldogs did the same thing on the next set of possessions, a stop after SDSU crossed the 50, and Silva connected from 27 yards to put Fresno State up 20-0 with 2:48 on the clock. The Aztecs scored in the final minutes to make 20-7 going into the half.

Silva knocked in his season-high third field goal of the game 11 minutes into the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 16-point lead. SDSU answered, though, with a 10-play, 80-yard drive to cut the Bulldogs' lead to 23-13 just before the end of the third.

With less than seven minutes remaining in the game, Carson King dropped a punt at the one-yard line into the awaiting hands of Deonte Perry. The Aztecs managed to get some breathing room, but on first-and-10 from their own 24, Johnson was picked off by Levelle Bailey. On the next offensive possession, it took Mims two carries to go 31 yards to seal the game, putting Fresno State up 30-13 with 4:28 on the clock.

FRESNO STATE NOTES

PLAYING FOR HARDWARE, AGAIN

This is the 12th season* of the "Battle for the Old Oil Can" Trophy, given to the winning team in the rivalry series between San Diego State and Fresno State.

The trophy stems from the discovery of an old oil can from Fresno (circa 1935) that was recovered during a San Diego State campus building project, said Jacquelyn K. Glasener, executive director of the Fresno State Alumni Association. "The old oil can," she said, "likely came from a time when Aztec and Bulldog fans traveled to football games between the two schools via the old, twisting, precipitous Grapevine section of Highway 99 over Tejon Pass."

"Cars in those days carried extra oil and water to be sure they could make it through difficult trips," added Jim Herrick, former executive director of the San Diego State Alumni Association.

The alumni associations of the two schools purchased an antique oil can to be the basis of the trophy to be awarded to the winner of the rivalry game each time the schools meet.

**This is the 11th game played for the trophy as the 2020 game was canceled due to COVID19.*

- Fresno State is playing in its third rivalry game of the season after having played for the Milk Can at Boise State (Oct. 8) and the Valley Trophy (Oct. 15). Fresno State is in current possession of the Old Oil Can, and will defend that this weekend.

PLAYING FOR A LITTLE MORE THAN JUST HARDWARE THIS WEEK

Like any other year, the Fresno State and San Diego State rivalry game is one that is looked forward to each year. With the in-state rivalry, the tough competition each year, West Division opponents, it being a trophy game, and many other things - it is no surprise that this season is no different.

If Fresno state wins on Saturday, it will be tied for first place in the West Division with San Jose State. Since the Bulldogs defeated San Jose State on Oct. 15, the path to the Mountain West Championship game is still clear ahead of the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs, however, still have five divisional opponents ahead of them on their schedule in San Diego State (Oct. 29), Hawai'i (Nov. 5), UNLV (Nov. 11) and Nevada (Nov. 19).

THE WEST DIVISION'S CREAM OF THE CROP

Since the Mountain West implemented divisions and a conference championship game in 2013, the winner of the Bulldogs-Aztecs game has gone on to represent the West division in the title game six-of-seven times. In 2021, however, Fresno State won the regular season matchup against San Diego State, but a divisional loss to Hawai'i by the Bulldogs and a SDSU win over Boise State gave the Aztecs the path to the championship game.

The Bulldogs captured the West Division crown in 2013, 2014, 2017 and 2018, while the Aztecs played in the annual game in 2015, 2016, 2019 and 2021 as the West representative. In 2013, an epic 35-28 overtime win proved to be the deciding factor for the Bulldogs to earn the West crown over SDSU as the teams finished one-two in the final regular season league standings. A season later, a 24-13 victory at home over the Aztecs gave the 'Dogs the edge when the season ended with both teams knotted at 5-3 in league play. In 2017, these two teams finished one-two again in the West race, but the Bulldogs defeated the Aztecs 27-3 on the road to give them the edge. In 2018, Fresno State ran away with the West Division going 7-1 while SDSU was 4-4 in league games. The Bulldogs won the 2018 edition of the series, 23-14.

The Bulldogs went on to win the MW Championship in two of the four seasons they advanced (2013, 2018) while SDSU won the MW Championship game in two of their four trips to the title game (2015, 2016).

- The 2020 championship game was the first time since 2013 that neither San Diego State or Fresno State was the West Division representative, rather it was San Jose State, who went on to claim the title.

IT'S BEEN A MINUTE

As divisional opponents, Fresno State and San Diego State traditionally alternate hosting each other every other year. However, Saturday's matchup will be the first time that San Diego State plays in Fresno since Nov. 17, 2018.

The teams were scheduled to play in The Valley during the 2020 season, but the game that season was canceled due to COVID-19 protocols. Fresno State has won four of the last five games played between the programs in Fresno.

HOME SWEET HOME

Fresno State will play its fourth home game of the season on Saturday. The Bulldogs had a five-week stretch without a home game and went 0-3 in games played during that stretch.

The Bulldogs have really emphasized the importance of the Fresno State fan base as the Red Wave has shown up in full force in each home game this season. Fresno State has had back-to-back sellout crowds at Valley Children's Stadium with reaching max capacity against Oregon State (Sept. 10) and San Jose State (Oct. 15) this season.

Additionally, the Bulldog student section (The Dog Pound) has sold out in seven of the last eight games.

Fresno State's average attendance this season is 39,358 - the third-highest mark in all of Group of 5 programs and a higher average than California Pac-12 schools in UCLA, Cal and Stanford.

Since 2021, Fresno State has had three sellout home crowds (in five games played in Fresno). Prior to 2021, the last time Fresno State announced a sellout was in 2014.

PLAYING CLEAN

For the second time this season, Fresno State has been flagged for a penalty only once. Against New Mexico, the Bulldogs had just one penalty called on an ineligible player downfield call. Since MW play started (three games), the Bulldogs have averaged two penalties per game.

The 'Dogs had one penalty each at Boise State and at New Mexico. One penalty called against Fresno State is the least amount in a game since 2017. Fresno State has had just seven games with one or fewer penalties called since 2006.

- Fresno State ranks No. 9 in the FBS in fewest penalties, and No. 2 in the MW (31) - averaging 4.43 penalty yards per game.
- Fresno State ranks No. 11 in the FBS and No. 2 in the MW in fewest penalty yards (274)

HOT START

Fresno State won the coin toss and elected to receive the opening kickoff last week at New Mexico.

The Bulldogs' offense came out firing, and completed a successful 12-play, 67-yard scoring drive on its opening possession with a 26-yard field goal by Abraham Montano. It was the first time since the season opener against Cal Poly (Sept. 1) that the Bulldogs scored points on the opening possession.

THE OFFENSE CLICKED, BIG TIME

It seems as though everything was going right for the Bulldogs last weekend at New Mexico - on both sides of the ball. The offense, specifically, had its most well-rounded showing in both the run and pass game in quite some time. With QB Logan Fife becoming more comfortable under center, the offense has been able to open up a bit more than we have seen. Fresno State finished with 510 yards of total offense with 225 through the air and 285 in the run game.

- It was the first time since the season opener (Sept. 1 vs Cal Poly) that Fresno State totaled more than 500 yards of total offense.
- It was the first time since playing at Hawai'i on Oct. 2, 2021 that Fresno State totaled more than 500 yards of total offense in a road game.

BIT BY THE INJURY BUG

It has been a tough go for the Bulldogs this season as it seems like everything is going against the program in every way possible. At USC on Sept. 17, the Bulldogs lost significant production to injury of key players. Since that week, Fresno State has not caught a break with the caliber of players that are suffering injuries this season, seeing players out for games on a week-to-week basis, or other players suiting up for limited action in games.

TEAM CAPTAINS

FRESNO STATE NOTES

HE'S BACK!

Fresno State announced Jeff Tedford as head coach of the football program on Dec. 8, 2021, igniting the beginning of his second stint as head coach at his alma mater. Tedford first coached the Bulldogs for the 2017-19 seasons.

Tedford's first stint as Fresno State's head coach began in Nov. 2016 as he led the program to one of the best turnaround stories in college football history. He inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and was driven to re-instill the pride and tradition of Bulldog football. In three seasons as head coach, he guided Fresno State to a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles, two bowl wins and 26 wins overall.

Until surpassed, 2018 will remain in the record books as the winningest season in the now 100-year history of the program by achieving 12 wins during their championship run. The renaissance under Tedford also led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to ever secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

TEDFORD AND CO.

The excitement of the coaching staff didn't end with the announcement of Coach Tedford's return. Within days of the conclusion of the 2021 season, the head coach announced arguably one of the most exciting coaching staffs in Fresno State history, bringing back several former standout players and coaches to all coach together on one staff.

Tedford retained three members of the 2021 coaching staff - Kirby Moore, J.D. Williams and Jim Nelson. The remaining seven coaches are all new to the staff this season.

The Fresno State coaching staff is loaded with former Bulldog players and coaches, and years of experience in coaching at the college and professional level. More details, and a timeline, of the Bulldog coaching staff can be found on Pages 18-19 of the game notes.

WHO'S THAT NEW FACE IN THE BOOTH?

Kirby Moore is no stranger to the Bulldog football program, now in his sixth season on staff. Moore was initially brought on to the Bulldog coaching staff with Coach Tedford in 2017, and has since been a Bulldog assistant coach with the wide receivers. With Coach Tedford's return, Moore was promoted to assume the role of offensive coordinator for 2022.

Tedford hired Moore in 2017, offering him his first full-time coaching position. It didn't take long for Moore to prove he was worthy of the opportunity, being named in each of his first two seasons to the annual 247sports.com 30-under-30 lists as one of college football's rising stars.

In his career as a coach for the Bulldogs, Moore has coached up four all-conference receivers - with two earning the honor twice in their careers with Moore as the position coach. He was a big part in the production and growth of Fresno State's all-time leader in career yards (3,463) and receptions (275) KeeSean Johnson (2014-18). Johnson was a two-time All-Mountain West receiver and a sixth round draft pick of the 2019 NFL Draft.

The football blood runs deep in the Moore family as Kirby is the younger brother of former Boise State standout and current Dallas Cowboys offensive coordinator Kellen Moore. The father of the two, Tom Moore, is a legendary Hall of Fame coach after spending 23 years as the football coach at Prosser High School in Washington.

At only 32 years old, Moore is the youngest offensive coordinator in the Mountain West and among the youngest in the country.

WEST DIVISION FAVORITES

The Fresno State football team was picked to win the West Division by the media, the Mountain West announced prior to the 2022 Mountain West Football Media Days at the Mandalay Bay of Las Vegas in July.

Fresno State turned the 2021 predictions around as it was picked to finish fourth in its division a season ago, but ultimately finished with a 10-3 record (6-2 MW) and a PUBG Mobile New Mexico Bowl victory.

The Bulldogs, back under the direction of head coach Jeff Tedford, have been picked to win the West Division for the third time in the last five seasons (2018, 2019, & 2022). Since 2013, Fresno State has been the West Division favorite five times (2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, & 2022).

PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, AND MORE

Fresno State had five players earn preseason recognition by the conference this season. Quarterback Jake Haener was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, and All-MW quarterback. Haener is the first Bulldog to be named Mountain West Preseason Offensive Player of the Year since Derek Carr in 2013.

Joining Haener (QB) on the preseason all-conference team were wide receiver Jalen Cropper, running back Jordan Mims, offensive lineman Dontae Bull and defensive back Evan Williams. Each Bulldog represented on the 2022 preseason All-Mountain West team earned the honor for the first time in their career.

Fresno State's five preseason all-conference selections are its most in a season since having five in 2014.

CALIFORNIA'S TOP DOG

The 2021 season saw Fresno State being one of two FBS schools in the State of California to record double-digit wins.

Statistically, Fresno State was the State's leader in offensive yards per game and passing yards per game on offense. Defensively, the Bulldogs led the state in least points allowed and turnovers gained.

- 84 of the 107 players on Fresno State's roster this season call the State of California home.

THANK YOU, TRANSFER PORTAL

Fresno State added eight transfers in from a Division I program - Simi Bakare (RB - Missouri), Zach Hartsfield (TE - Eastern Michigan), Jacob Isaia (OL - Michigan State), Nikko Remigio (WR - Cal), Matt Robinson (QB - Illinois), Andres Fox (DL - Stanford), Cam Lockridge (DB - Hawaii'i), and Raymond Scott (LB - USC).

- Four of the above transfer student-athletes appear on Fresno State's 2-deep - Isaia, Remigio, Lockridge and Scott.
- Remigio and Isaia are listed as starters at their respective positions.

WE'RE STILL FAMILIAR

With the roster having a few players from the 2017 signing class still on it, Tedford has recruited members of three of the classes still at Fresno State and had a hand in building relationships for the recruitment of the 2020 class - despite being away from the program for the last two seasons.

- Three members of the 2022 roster were also on the roster in 2017 - OL Dontae Bull, RB Jordan Mims, and WR Zane Pope.
- The change in coaching staff is not anything new to a select group of the Bulldog roster. With the NCAA allowing the extra year of eligibility following the COVID-19 pandemic, several players have been here for (now entering) their sixth season in a Fresno State uniform and have seen a full rotation of three coaching staffs in their six years of collegiate football at Fresno State. The signing classes of 2017, 2018 and 2019 all are working with the third coaching staff in their collegiate careers.

BULLDOGS IN THE COMMUNITY

MORENO-CROPPER

Fresno State's leading wide receiver from 2021 returns as a Bulldog this season, but that 5 jersey looks a little bit different this year. Valley native Jalen Cropper has changed the last name on his jersey to "Moreno-Cropper" to honor his late grandfather.

Moreno-Cropper's statement on his name change...

"I lost my grandpa in 2020. He was one of the biggest influences in my life. To everyone who gets the chance to watch this year, I want to be remembered by both names because of the influence he had on me, and for the remembrance of my grandpa's life. I will continue to live through his name and dedicate this season to him."

The name change is not a legal name change, just the name he is adding to the back of his jersey.

IN MEMORY OF BILL WOODWARD

The Fresno State football team will be wearing a "BW" sticker on the back of their helmets this season, in honor of the late Bill Woodward. Woodward served as "The Voice of the Bulldogs" for 37 years, being on the call for some of the biggest moments in Fresno State history.

Woodward's iconic career sharing the stories of Fresno State Athletics spanned from 1972-2008 with more than 2,000 broadcasts for KMJ 580 AM of Fresno State football, men's basketball and baseball as the play-by-play announcer.

The radio booth in the press box on the west side of Bulldog Stadium is named in Woodward's honor – the Bill Woodward Radio booth.

Woodward passed away at the age of 81 in June 2022.

BRINGING THE J IN JUICE!

Fresno State has 29 players on its roster with a J name. To make the list a little bit longer, six of the 11 coaches on staff also have a J name. 27 percent of the 2022 Fresno State football players have a J name.

TURN ON THE TV

For the first time in program history, Fresno State has all 12 of its regular season games set to be broadcast on national television. The Bulldogs will play eight games on a Fox Sports Network platform, with the remaining four on CBS Sports Network.

The last time the Bulldogs opened the season at home, and played that game on a national televised platform was 2013 against Rutgers

Fresno State's Sept. 17 game at USC will be broadcast on FOX. It is the first time the Bulldogs will be featured on this network since 2014.

Fresno State led the conference, along with Boise State, with all 12 of its games getting picked up by the Mountain West's national television partners. The full TV schedule, with announced kickoff times is on Page 19 of the game notes.

MOST IMPORTANT THING: EARN YOUR DEGREE

Fresno State has 25 players on its roster who have earned their undergraduate degrees. Sixteen of those 25 earned their degree from Fresno State, while the remaining nine earned theirs at a former stop. Senior Elijah Gates is the lone Bulldog who has earned both a bachelors degree and a masters degree entering the 2022 season.

With 25 players with degrees, Fresno State is second in the FBS in terms of graduates on a 2022 football roster.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

QUICK SWITCH FROM 9 TO 10

With Haener leaving the game to injury at USC (Sept. 17), sophomore quarterback Logan Fife stepped in and finished out the game. Fife was then the Bulldogs' starting quarterback at UConn (Oct. 1), following the bye week.

- Fife, a native of Tracy, Calif., grew up a Fresno State Bulldog fan. He attended games as a child, and with his verbal commitment, stated "Once a Dog, always a Dog".
- Coach Tedford originally recruited Fife to play at Fresno State. Fife committed to the program on Oct. 22, 2019.
- With Fife starting at quarterback for the Bulldogs now, it was the first time since 2017 (Chason Virgil and Marcus McMaryion) that the Bulldogs have had two different quarterbacks start a game in a season.

WE ARE MOVIN' AND GROOVIN' NOW

With four games as the starting quarterback under his belt, it is becoming clear that sophomore Logan Fife has got in his groove, and the rest of the offense more comfortable with him as well. Fife has thrown for 892 yards while completing 84-of-120 pass attempts. Fife is throwing at a 70.0 percent clip, a mark that is 13th-best in the FBS and a league-leading mark through games played Oct. 22.

Fife had a career-high game against San Jose State (Oct. 15), who's defense brings some of the most experience and pressure among the Mountain West. The sophomore QB threw for 24 completions on 32 attempts, and totaled 236 yards passing with his first passing touchdown of the season that night.

One week later, and Fife had another big night at New Mexico - throwing for 225 yards on 19-of-29 pass attempts. Fife threw his second passing touchdown of the season on a 75 yard toss to Jalen Moreno-Cropper. Fife showed what he can do in the run game as well, scoring two rushing touchdowns of his own on quarterback keepers.

- The 75-yard touchdown pass to Moreno-Cropper tied the 18th longest pass completion in program history. It was the longest pass by Fife and the second-longest reception by Moreno-Cropper in their Bulldog careers.

MAKE ROOM FOR 5

Senior wide receiver Jalen Moreno-Cropper has had an electric career as a Bulldog. Moreno-Cropper became the 13th Bulldog in program history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards. With 158 yards receiving last time out, Moreno-Cropper is up to 2,119 career receiving yards. He became the first Bulldog since KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan to hit the milestone - both played from 2015-18.

Moreno-Cropper is currently 10th in program history with 17 career receiving touchdowns, scoring his first of the season last time out at New Mexico on a 75-yard catch.

THE STREAK CONTINUES FOR MORENO-CROPPER

Moreno-Cropper is Fresno State's leading wide receiver with 45 reception for 504 yards. Moreno-Cropper is averaging 11.2 yards per catch and 72.0 yards per game.

Moreno-Cropper is one of 21 players from around the FBS to have active streaks of more than 25 games with a reception. Moreno-Cropper has caught a pass in 30-straight games, a streak that is third all-time in Fresno State history, having passed Jamire Jordan (2015-17), Davante Adams (2012-13) and Jalen Saunders (2010-11) who sat at 26 games with a reception.

HELLO TOP 10!

Jordan Mims has found himself among Fresno State's best when it comes to running backs and all-purpose players.

Mims currently sits 8th in career rushing yards (2,565). Mims also works in the receiving game, moving up the ranks in receiving stats by a RB - pass receptions (82 - fifth most), receiving yards (926 - third most) and receiving TDs (8 - third most).

- Mims is currently 12th all-time in career all-purpose yards at Fresno State (3,822).

MIMS IN THE ENDZONE... AGAIN

Jordan Mims is very familiar with the endzone this season, having scored a team-high eight touchdowns on the year with his seventh rushing touchdown of the season last time out at New Mexico.

In his career (2017-pres), Mims has scored 34 touchdowns (26 rushing, 8 receiving). His 34 total touchdowns are the seventh-most by a Bulldog in their career. He is one score away from tying Dean Philpott (1954-57) for sixth in program history.

Mims is just one rushing touchdown away from breaking into the Top 10 in career rushing touchdowns - his 27th score would tie with Aaron Craver (1989-90) and Kelly Skipper (1985-88) in Fresno State's history. 2021 senior Ronnie Rivers holds the program record with 40 career rushing touchdowns.

LOOKING LIKE WE HAVE A NEW 1-2 PUNCH

For many years, the Bulldog run offense was powered by the duo of Ronnie Rivers and Jordan Mims. With Rivers moving on to the NFL, Mims slid up to the starting RB spot, but his No. 2 spot was left open for competition this off season.

Malik Sherrod took that opportunity and ran with it, now being named the back up to Mims and seeing significant game action this season. Sherrod is the Bulldogs' second-leading rusher with 42 carries for 230 yards. Sherrod makes the most of every attempt he has, averaging a team-high 5.5 yards per carry this season. He produced positive yardage only, having just one yard lost on the season. Sherrod is up to two rushing scores on the year after scoing the first of his career at USC (Sept. 17) and again at New Mexico (Oct. 22).

GIVE IT UP FOR THE O-LINE, SHALL WE?

Fresno State's offensive line has seen quite a few different looks this season. The Bulldogs have started a different rotation in four of the seven games played on the year, but they are in constant rotation throughout the game. The Bulldogs' offensive line had its most productive game of the season at New Mexico, going up against a defensive front that was No. 2 in the MW in rush defense. Fresno State's offensive line blocked for 285 yards rushing and 225 in the air attack while not giving up a sack.

- Fresno State had two first-year junior college additions start in the game at UConn in Taumalolo (College of San Mateo) and left tackle Jacob Spomer (Diablo Valley JC). The Bulldogs are one of just three schools (Illinois and UTSA) to have a pair of JUCO starting offensive linemen this season.
- Center Bula Schmidt recorded a reception on a batted down pass, and ran with it for four yards with eight yards after catch. It was the first time a Bulldog offensive lineman caught a true pass reception (2-point conversions are not registered as pass receptions) since Adam McDowell at then-No. 8 Boise State on Nov. 28, 2008.

QUARTERBACK WHISPERER

After spending a short time in the transfer portal following the 2021 season, Haener made the decision to return to Fresno State when the athletics department made the announcement of the hiring of Jeff Tedford as head coach.

Haener originally transferred to Fresno State from Washington in 2019 to play under Tedford, but the head coach's health caused him to step away from coaching. Haener stayed with the program and played under coach Kalen DeBoer and familiar offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb.

Haener feels confident in his choice to return as a Bulldog, playing under Coach Tedford who has coached six quarterbacks who have been first round NFL Draft picks.

- Haener and Tedford's history goes far beyond Haener's college football days. The two have been familiar with each other since Haener was a young boy, having connected at football camps and through recruiting efforts as Haener grew up and went through the game.

A LOOK AT HAENER'S CAREER

Fresno State is hopeful for another big offensive season behind the return of sixth-year quarterback Jake Haener. Haener, who was Fresno State's starting quarterback in all 13 games last season, had the best passing performance by a Bulldog in a single season since Derek Carr in 2012, finishing the year with 4,096 yards passing and 33 touchdowns.

His numbers in 2021 were enough to break him into the Top 10 in several Fresno State Football program records. In reality, Haener has only played one full season in a Bulldog uniform. His first season of his Bulldog career was the shortened 2020 season. Haener's career numbers are all recorded in just 22 games.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

EVAN WILLIAMS... NOT THE GUY YOU WANT SIDELINED

Fresno State suffered the loss of senior captain Evan Williams in its last game at then-No. 7 USC (Sept. 17). The Bulldogs will be tasked with filling his loss on the field, a task that won't be an easy one.

In four years, Williams has been a consistent part of the Bulldog defense, having played in significant action as a true freshman and on. Williams has played in 32 career games while earning 26 starts in that time. He has totaled 182 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, four interceptions, 13 broken up passes, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in his career.

Williams made an impact on and off the field in his time as a Bulldog, having been named a team captain in two seasons (2020 and 2022). He was a preseason addition to the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Jim Thorpe Award watch lists. He was also a preseason All-Mountain West defensive back after earning first team all-conference honors a season ago.

PERALES PUTS THE "P" IN PRESSURE

Senior defensive end David Perales has kicked it into gear the last four games, stepping up big on the defensive line front. This season, Perales fourth on the team with 27 total tackles, but leads the team in TFLs (9.0) and sacks (6.5).

Against San Jose State (Oct. 15), Perales recorded a 4.0 sack and 5.0 tackle for loss performance that would eventually earn him Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week. His 4.0 sacks were the most sacks in a game by any Mountain West player this season and the second-most in a game among all FBS players this season. It was the most sacks in a game by a Bulldog since at least 2000, and the most by any MW player since the 2019 season.

His 5.0 tackles for loss were the most TFLs in a game by any MW player this season and the second-most in a game by any FBS player. Perales had the most TFLs in a game by a Bulldog since Ejiro Ederaine in 2014, and the second-most by any MW player in the history of the league.

GATES CLOSED

Senior leadership is beginning to show across the defense in the absence of senior captain Evan Williams, and a big part of that has come in fellow senior safety Elijah Gates. Gates is tied for second on the team with 34 tackles (26 solo). He also adds two broken up passes, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, one sack and one tackle for loss.

On Oct. 15, Gates had four tackles but the most notable stat on the postgame stats sheet was his sack for a loss of 12 yards against the San Jose State offense. Gates recorded his first sack as a Bulldog, having been with the program for now his second year.

- Gates is one of two Bulldog defensive backs to register a sack this season, joined by CB Bralyn Lux.

MAKING HIS NAME KNOWN

Junior cornerback Bralyn Lux has been one of many playmakers for the Bulldog defense this season. Now in his third season on the field, Lux has continued to grow his game. The junior from Sunnyvale, Calif. has done just about everything for the defense as he has 34 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, one interception, seven broken up passes, and one forced fumble.

- Lux already has single-season career-high numbers in tackles, TFLs, sacks, and broken up passes.
- He has tied his single-season career-high numbers in interceptions and forced fumbles through just seven games this season.

BREAKING UP IS FUN HERE

Fresno State's defense has put an emphasis on limiting explosive plays this season. The Bulldogs have recorded 34 pass breakups this season, many that have limited those explosive plays downfield.

The 'Dogs are led by CB Bralyn Lux who has seven in seven games on the year.

15 different players are responsible for Fresno State's 34 pass breakups, led by a trio of cornerbacks in Lux (7), Cale Sanders Jr. (4) and Cam Lockridge (4). In 2021, the Bulldogs finished the season with 55 PBUs in 13 games played.

No player has had more than six pass breakups in a season since Justin Rice (LB), Juju Hughes (DB) and Jaron Bryant (DB) each had eight in the 2019 season.

FEASTIN' FOR THE SACKS

Lux and Gates... they're just two – Fresno State has 11 players who have gotten to opposing QBs this season. Fresno State added two players to that list last time out in defensive linemen Leonard Payne Jr. and Andres Fox.

Fresno State is one of 21 schools from around the FBS with 10 or more players with at least 1.0 sack on the season. The 11 players with a sack are the third-most among the 21 teams.

Senior David Perales leads the group with 6.5 sacks through six games this season. His 0.93 sacks per game average leads all MW players and is No. 8 in the FBS. Although having played in all seven games, his 6.5 sacks this season have been recorded in just three games with a career-best 4.0 sacks against San Jose State.

- Perales has 17.5 career sacks, just 1.0 sack away from cracking the Top 10 in Fresno State history.

DBS IN ON THE SACK ACTION

With a sack at UConn (Oct. 1), Bralyn Lux became the first Bulldog defensive back to record a sack in a game since Juju Hughes at San Jose State in 2017. Lux responded with his second sack of the season at Boise State.

Against SJSU, it wasn't Lux but it was safety Elijah Gates who knocked Chevan Cordeiro for a loss of 12 yards. Gates registered his first collegiate sack (including games played at UCLA and Fresno State).

LEVELLE BAILEY, THE SHOW IS YOURS

Fourth-year senior linebacker Levelle Bailey has been as productive as ever this season, but it's nothing that we haven't seen out of him since his freshman season in 2019. Bailey came in and made an immediate impact as a true freshman in 2019, under head coach Jeff Tedford in his last season as head coach before stepping away for health concerns. Coming in alongside safety Evan Williams, the duo has been one that causes problems for offenses over the course of their careers. Now, with Williams out to injury, Bailey has stepped up as a leader of the defense.

Bailey has been selected as a team captain in four games this season. He has finished as the team's leading tackler in five of seven games on the year, including the last two games played.

The senior from Sacramento leads the Bulldogs with 50 tackles (33 solo). He adds 4.0 tackles for loss, two broken up passes and a forced fumble. Bailey has had two 10-tackle performances this season (Oregon State and UConn), the first of his career.

TALK ABOUT YOUTH

Fresno State's defensive line is among the youngest in the country. The Bulldogs have played four true freshmen on the defensive line this season, with two of those four having earned at least one start.

- DT Gavriel Lightfoot got the start in three games this season, including the season opener against Cal Poly. Lightfoot became the first Bulldog to start on the interior defensive line as a true freshman since Russell Harding in 1997. He was the first true freshman to start at any position on the defensive line since Isaiah Johnson (DE) in 2018. Johnson is still a starter, in his fifth year with the Bulldogs.
- Lightfoot was the youngest player in the FBS to see the field in Week 1, at only 17 years old. Lightfoot will play a majority of his freshman season as a youngster, not turning 18 until mid-November.
- Lightfoot has seven tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack.
- DT Jacob Holmes started at UConn, in place of an injured Lightfoot. In four games played, Holmes has five tackles with one fumble recovery.
- DT Jahzon Jacks has appeared in four games, recording two total tackles.
- DE Sione Noa has appeared in four games, recording one tackle.

MORE YOUTH AND NEW FACES

Next man up has been the mentality of the season for the Bulldogs. On the defense, the safety spot has been hard to replace with Williams going down to injury, and later losing L.J. Early and Steven Comstock to injuries. Last week it was Chrishawn Gordon who earned the start, playing both as a safety and on special teams.

True freshman safety Jayden Davis (Fresno, Calif.) saw the first play action of his career at New Mexico. He recorded the tackle on his first collegiate play.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

WAIT... BUT HE'S A WIDE RECEIVER

What better way to transition into the special teams portion of the game notes like talking about Mac Dalena, the Bulldogs' leading tackler on special teams.

Dalena, a wide receiver, has six tackles this season - all on return coverage. Dalena has taken full advantage of his role on special teams over the years, earning most of his play time in that role while seeing some action as a wide receiver as well.

IT FINALLY HAPPENED

For the first time since 2013, Fresno State had a punt returned for a touchdown.

Nikko Remigio, who has shown why he has been a nationally recognized kick returner in his career, returned a UConn punt 87 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter of the Oct. 1 game. Remigio dodged six tackles to make it all the way to the end zone for Fresno State's first special teams score in many years.

- Remigio's 87-yard punt return for a touchdown was the first by a Bulldog since Isaiah Burse in 2013.
- His 87-yard return was the longest punt return by any Bulldog since 2009.
- Remigio had Fresno States' 40th all-time punt return for a touchdown.

WE CROSSED ONE OFF THE LIST

Fresno State's kickoff and punt return game hasn't been something that people talk about in a positive way over the years, because there hasn't been too much to talk about until now. It has been nine years since Fresno State's last punt return for a touchdown, but Remigio got that taken care of for us.

Now, the Bulldogs are looking for their first kickoff return for a touchdown since 2008.

THE GUY BEHIND THE RUN

A big addition to the arsenal of talent is Cal transfer Nikko Remigio, who is expected to make an impact on the Bulldogs return game. Remigio was a mid-year addition this spring, and has been with the team since January. While at Cal, Remigio played a role in the kick return and punt return tasks. As a kickoff returner, Remigio totaled 20 returns for 549 yards. As a punt returner, he had 39 returns for 344 yards and one touchdown. In 2021, he was a third team All-Pac 12 selection as a kick returner (PFF). He ranked second in the Pac-12 and 12th nationally in kickoff return average (29.7 yards per return). He ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 30th nationally with a combined 564 combined kickoff and punt return yards.

Remigio was selected to the Paul Hornung Award Preseason watch list for 2022 - the award presented to the most versatile player in college football.

GETTING HIS GROOVE

Senior transfer wide receiver Nikko Remigio was brought in to the program with the expectations of being an exciting wide receiver, but also making his name known in the return game. Seven games in, and Remigio has shown what he can do.

Remigio is ranked fifth in the Mountain West and 30th in the FBS in kickoff returns, averaging 22.6 yards per return this season.

- Remigio leads the conference and ranks third in the FBS in combined kick returns (kickoff and punt), totaling 508 total return yards (361 kickoff, 147 punt).
- Remigio leads the conference and ranks 22nd in the FBS in all-purpose yards per game, averaging 127.86 yards.
- While at Cal, Remigio was selected as an All-Pac-12 kickoff returner and punt returner by several outlets.

LEFTY CREW

Fresno State's kicking duo of Abraham Montano and Dylan Lynch have been splitting duties this season.

Montano entered the year as the primary kicker, being utilized for kickoffs, field goals and PATs. On the year, he has scored 50 points with his leg, going 10-of-14 on his field goal attempts and 20-of-21 on PATs. He has 23 kickoffs for 1,447 yards for an average of 62.9 yards this season. Montano has kicked 11 touchbacks on the year.

Lynch has stepped up with assisting on kickoffs for the last few games, recording 13 kickoffs for 784 yards and six touchbacks. Lynch is averaging 60.3 yards per kickoff this season.

IN GOOD HANDS

If there is a year to be excited about the Bulldog special teams unit, it's this year. Returners and new faces aside, the man leading the group is a legend when it comes to Bulldog special teams groups. Head Coach Jeff Tedford announced the hiring of John Baxter as Special Teams Coordinator in December, sparking excitement around the entire phase of the game.

Baxter, with 37 years of coaching on his resume, has experience coaching special teams, tight ends, wide receivers, running backs, linebackers and the defensive line. With the Bulldogs, he leads the special teams efforts and the tight ends. Baxter previously spent the 1997-2009 seasons on staff at Fresno State. In 13 years at Fresno State, Baxter was the associate head coach and special teams coach in addition to also handling either the tight ends (1997-01, 03, 09) or wide receiver (2002, 04-08) position groups.

Baxter turned the Bulldogs' special teams into one of the top units in the nation annually. During his time, Fresno State blocked 84 kicks and punts (including a national-best 49 from 2002 through 2009) and scored 39 special teams touchdowns (with 3 safeties). The Bulldogs topped the nation in fewest punt return yards allowed in 2004 and 2005. A.J. Jefferson led the nation in kickoff returns in 2007. Clifton Smith's 189 punt return yards with 2 touchdowns against Weber State in 2005 were Fresno State game records, while his 5 career scoring punt returns also was a school mark. Six of Baxter's Bulldog kickers and punters earned All-Western Athletic Conference first team honors.

Along with his coaching duties at Fresno State, Baxter developed the highly-successful and nationally-regarded program, "Academic Gameplan." His innovative and comprehensive study-skills program teaches students the rules, fundamentals, techniques and life skills needed to succeed in the classroom. "Academic Gameplan," which is now being used at schools throughout the country, was a key reason for the academic success of the Fresno State football program, which during Baxter's tenure produced 141 Academic All-WAC players and an NCAA APR score nearly 20 percentage points higher than the national average.

SPECIAL YEARS, SPECIAL RECOGNITIONS

Fresno State has a long lineage of special years, and the 2022 season just happens to bring up memories of the last few decades of Bulldog teams. Fresno State Athletics will honor four decades of Bulldog football programs throughout the 2022 season, recognizing the anniversary of significant events and years in Fresno State football history.

2012

10 years ago, Fresno State was playing football with Derek Carr and Davante Adams together in a Bulldog uniform. The Bulldog team in 2012 became the first team to win a conference championship title since 1999 as the 'Dogs were crowned the 2012 Mountain West co-champions in their first year as members of the conference. Fresno State finished the 2012 season with a 9-4 record and a perfect 6-0 mark at home under then-first year head coach Tim DeRuyter. The 2012 team will be recognized at Fresno State's Oct. 29 game against San Diego State.

2002

20 years ago, Fresno State won nine games under the direction of head coach Pat Hill. The Bulldogs capped the season with a 30-21 win over Georgia Tech in the Silicon Valley Football Classic (Dec. 31, 2002). It was the Bulldogs' first bowl game win since 1992. That season, former Bulldog safety and current Bulldog Sports Network sideline reporter Cam Worrell, led the team in tackles and interceptions. Worrell went on to play six years in the NFL with the Chicago Bears and Miami Dolphins. The 2002 team will be recognized at Fresno State's Nov. 5 game against Hawai'i.

1992

30 years ago, Fresno State won its first WAC conference title with a 9-4 record under head coach Jim Sweeney. The Bulldogs rode a five-game winning streak into their Freedom Bowl Game appearance against USC, defeating the Trojans 24-7 for their only win against USC in program history (Dec. 29, 1992). The win was considered the bowl season's biggest and most talked about upset that year. It is still arguably the biggest game in Fresno State football history. Coach Tedford (HC) and Coach Franklin (DL) were on staff in 1992. The anniversary of The Freedom Bowl win is extra special this season as the Bulldogs travel to the Coliseum to take on USC on Sept. 17. The 1992 team will be recognized at Fresno State's Sept. 10 game against Oregon State.

1982

40 years ago, quarterback Jeff Tedford led Fresno State to a 29-28 win over Bowling Green in the California Raisin Bowl to cap a historic season in Fresno State Football history. The Bulldogs finished that season 11-1 and as Pacific Coast Athletic Association champions. The wins were great, but what is more special is how those wins came about, and what the program endured that season. Fresno State's only loss of the season was at Nevada (Oct. 16). On the Friday before that game, while at their walk thru, the Bulldog coaching staff was notified that a car full of wives traveling to Reno had been in an accident on their way out of Fresno, leaving their loved ones severely injured or deceased. Many staff flew home that night. The team played the game, and lost. The rest of the season was coached mostly by volunteer coaches, but it was the players who held themselves accountable to lead the team to six-straight games through the rest of the season. The 1982 team will be recognized at Fresno State's Oct. 15 game against San Jose State.

The Fresno State coaching staff is loaded with former Bulldog players and coaches, and years of experience in coaching at the college and professional level. Below are some notes about the staff:

- Eight coaches on staff (including Tedford) have previously coached at Fresno State at one point in their careers.
- All but one coach from the defensive side of the ball (Nelson) coached together under Pat Hill in the late 90’s.
- Notably, Tedford (OC), Kevin Coyle (DC) and John Baxter (ST) were all coordinators at Fresno State under Coach Hill.
- Tedford also coached under Jim Sweeney alongside Jethro Franklin as offensive coordinator while Franklin led the defensive line.
- Four members of the coaching staff are Fresno State alums, including Tedford. Joining Tedford as Bulldog alumni are Franklin (DL), Williams (DB) and Tim Skipper (LB).
- Since 1981, at least one member of the current coaching staff has been in the program each season outside of the four years from 2012-16.
- Only two staffers (Pat McCann and Saga Tuitele) do not have prior ties to Fresno State, or to Jeff Tedford.
- Combined, the staff has nearly 200 years of collegiate coaching experience and 36 years of professional football coaching experience.

Additional staff notes:

- Fresno State’s Assistant Athletics Director for Football Operations and Chief of Football Staff Mike McHugh has ties to Coach Tedford that run far deeper than their time together as Bulldogs. The 2022 season is the 13th season that the pair has spent together dating back to 1999. Tedford and McHugh were together as Bulldogs in 2018 and 2019, as well as 10 seasons (2003-12) at California. The two were also on the same Oregon staff (1999-2000) when Tedford was the Ducks’ offensive coordinator.
- Fresno State has two Graduate Assistants who are former Bulldog football players. Pat Belony (defensive GA) played for the Bulldogs as a standout defensive tackle from 2015-18 under Coach Tedford. Offensive graduate assistant Matt Smith is in his first season in this role, having just graduated as a Bulldog offensive lineman. Smith also played under Coach Tedford, as his six-year career span over the 2016-21 seasons.
- Current Bulldog defensive quality control Brad Vonnahme returns to the Bulldogs’ staff with Coach Tedford. Vonnahme is no stranger to the Bulldog football program, having spent the 2016-19 seasons with the ‘Dogs as an offensive analyst.

WHAT TEDFORD SAID ABOUT HIS STAFF...

“This staff has extensive experience and history here at Fresno State, and across the country at the highest level of college football and the NFL. They appreciate the pride and tradition of Bulldog football, the Red Wave, and the Valley. SUMMARY:

Jeff Tedford, who coached the Bulldogs for the 2017-19 seasons, makes a return to the helm of the program for his second stint as head coach of his alma mater. Tedford was hired as head coach of the program on Dec. 8, 2021.

In his first stint as the Bulldogs' head coach, Tedford inherited a 1-11 football program when he took over the reins of his alma mater and in three seasons all he's done as the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history is lead the program to a 26-14 record, a 2018 Mountain West Championship, two MW West division titles and two bowl wins.

The renaissance under Tedford led to FBS history being made as Fresno State became the first team to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

In 2019, Fresno State finished 4-8. Five of Fresno State's eight losses that season were decided by one possession, notably falling by a small margin to both USC and Minnesota that season. The Bulldogs were highlighted by first team All-Mountain West linebackers Mykal Walker and Justin Rice in 2019. Six Bulldogs were honored by the conference that season, in addition to Walker and Rice, running back Ronnie Rivers earned second team honors, and defensive lineman Kevin Atkins, punter Blake Cusick and defensive back Juju Hughes were honorable mention selections. Rice was tabbed the preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the conference, entering the 2020 season. Walker and Hughes went on to have professional NFL careers as both currently are on rosters with the Atlanta Falcons and Detroit Lions, respectively.

In 2018, in addition to defeating Boise State on the road in overtime, 19-16, for Fresno State's first conference championship since 2013, the Bulldogs capped the season with a 31-20 triumph over Arizona State to win the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl. The bowl win left the Bulldogs with their first 12-win season in the 97-year history of the program. This came one season after Tedford engineered one of the greatest turnarounds in FBS history guiding the Bulldogs to a 10-4 record, an appearance in the MW title game and a Hawai'i Bowl win over Houston.

The 2018 Bulldogs finished nationally ranked in the final rankings of the season for the first time since 2004. Fresno State finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll, announced Jan. 8, 2019. It was the best finish in the AP Top 25 in program history, besting No. 22 in 2004. The 'Dogs also held a No. 21 ranking in the final College Football Playoff poll released on Dec. 2, 2018.

Individual accolades in 2018 included Tedford being named an Eddie Robinson Award finalist and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award finalist. Fresno State sported 15 all-conference honorees in 2018, including the league's Defensive Player of the Year in linebacker Jeff Allison. In addition, 19 student-athletes were named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

With a 10-4 record in his first season, Fresno State became the third team in FBS history to turn a double-digit loss season (2016) into a double-digit win season (2017) the following year. The season included an appearance in the nation's top 25, clinching the Mountain West's West Division crown and leading the 'Dogs to their first appearance in the MW Championship game since 2014. He also guided the 'Dogs to the program's first bowl victory since 2007 with their win at the Hawai'i Bowl.

Great success brought great notoriety as Tedford was named the 2017 Mountain West Coach of the Year, was a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award presented by the Maxwell Football Club, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and the AFCA Region-5 Coach of the Year.

While Tedford was honored as the league's coach of the year, the team had 16 student-athletes recognized with MW postseason honors - the most for the Bulldogs in a single-season since joining the conference in 2012. In the classroom, the 'Dogs also set a team-best number since joining the conference as they had 24 named to the Fall Academic All-Mountain West team.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies - a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, 2016, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as Eric Kiesau carried out interim head coaching duties for the remaining two games on the 2016 schedule following Tedford's introductory press conference. Tedford was officially hired on Nov. 10, 2016.

Tedford, who was an already proven winner on the West Coast, came to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level - having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons. From there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League - a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year twice, leading the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence, which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Belotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey, California and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two sons, Taylor and Quinn. Quinn and his wife Randi have a son Tanner - Tedford and Donna's first grandchild.

FRESNO, Calif. - The Fresno State football team opened up the second wave of the Jeff Tedford era with a 35-7 win over Cal Poly in front of 36,011 Bulldog fans at Valley Children's Stadium on Thursday night. The Bulldogs posted 549 yards of total offense, powered by 377 yards from the arm of Jake Haener.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Getting off to a hot start and holding the ball for over 10 minutes in the first quarter, the Bulldogs scored on their first three offensive drives of the contest.

After forcing a three-and-out on Cal Poly's opening drive, the 'Dogs used a 10-play, 68-yard drive that was punctuated by a 1-yard touchdown run by Jordan Mims. With the defense forcing another three-and-out, the Bulldogs pushed their lead to 14-0 with a nine-play, 93-yard drive that saw newcomer Nikko Remigio scamper for a 13-yard scoring run. The high-scoring quarter was finished out by a second touchdown run from Mims that pushed the 'Dogs lead to 21-0.

Putting together their lone scoring drive of the contest, Cal Poly closed out the first quarter and opened the second with a nine-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a nine-yard touchdown reception from Jadan Jones to Bryson Allen.

Adding to their lead in the second half, the 'Dogs scored on two of their four drives in the second half as a third touchdown by Mims, this time a 19-yard catch and scamper down the left sideline in the third quarter, followed by an eight-yard score from Raymond Pauwels Jr. in the fourth quarter rounded out the scoring. The Bulldogs defense came up with two key defensive stops deep in Fresno State territory in the second half that helped keep the Mustangs to single digits.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State suffered a 35-32 loss to Oregon State in the final seconds on Saturday night at Valley Children's Stadium. The Bulldogs move to 1-1 on the season.

How It Happened

The visiting Beavers got the scoring started in the first quarter with a two-yard rushing touchdown, but the 'Dogs quickly answered back with a six-play, 68-yard drive that saw Jordan Mims punch it in from 42 yards out.

The Beavers responded with a touchdown of their own, but the Bulldogs stayed close with back-to-back drives to end the first half resulting in field goals from kicker Abraham Montano hitting from 21 yards and 23 yards, respectively.

Opening the second half with the ball, the 'Dogs continued to move it offensively putting together an 11-play, 49-yard drive that chewed up more than four-and-a-half minutes off the clock and saw Montano connect from 43 yards out and put Fresno State ahead, 16-14.

The Bulldogs kept the pedal to the metal on their next drive with a quick four-play, 80-yard drive in 81 seconds that saw Mims get into the end zone for the second time in the contest, this time an 11-yard scoring scamper that extended the 'Dogs lead to 23-14.

The Beavers quickly answered back marching down the field in under two minutes to trim the 'Dogs lead back down to two, but Montano again came through with his fourth field goal of the night connecting from 37 yards out to put the Bulldogs ahead 26-21 with 10:31 to play in the fourth quarter.

After forcing a turnover on downs by the Beavers, the 'Dogs looked to extend their lead to eight on a 52-yard attempt by Montano, but his kick sailed right. Oregon State capitalized marching down the field in 1:50 to score on a 17-yard reception from Chance Nolan to Tre Shaun Harrison and added a successful two-point conversion to put the Beavers ahead, 29-26.

The 'Dogs would not go away going on a quick five-play, 75-yard drive in 45 seconds that ended with Jake Haener connecting with Erik Brooks on a four-yard score to take a 32-29 lead as Montano's point after attempt sailed right.

Taking a three-point lead into the final 58 seconds of regulation, the Beavers used every single second remaining on the clock heading down the field on a seven-play, 73-yard drive that saw linebacker-turned walk-off back Jack Colletto punch it from two yards out as time expired for the walk-off win for the Beavers.

LOS ANGELES - The Fresno State football team fell 45-17 at No. 7 USC (3-0, 1-0 Pac-12) at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum on Saturday night, battling key injuries throughout the night on both sides of the ball. Fresno State falls to 1-2 on the season, with its bye week ahead of it.

How It Happened

With USC scoring on each of its first two offensive drives, the Bulldogs fell behind 14-0 early. The offense began to find their footing on a 10-play, 70-yard drive that ended with Fresno State putting points on the board as kicker Abraham Montano connected from 23 yards out.

The Trojans responded with a lengthy 15-play, 83-yard drive that took over six-and-half minutes off the clock and put USC ahead 21-3.

The 'Dogs returned to work quickly on their next drive, blazing down the field in 84 seconds as Jake Haener connected with Erik Brooks for a 39-yard touchdown. The Corona, Calif. native found the left corner of the endzone to cut the Trojans' lead to 21-10.

Opening the second half with the ball, the 'Dogs got off to a promising start, but a fumble by Haener and recovery by the Trojans halted the early momentum. USC took advantage of the Bulldogs blunder going on a five-play, 46-yard drive that ended with a three-yard rushing touchdown to go up 28-10.

Not going away, the Bulldogs quickly answered back with a five-play, 71-yard drive that saw running back Malik Sherrod rush up the middle for a 32-yard touchdown.

Fresno State saw touchdown scores by seniors Nikko Remigio and Jordan Mims, and a 10-tackle performance again by senior linebacker Levelle Bailey.

"Conference play is about to start and we need to get a lot better," said head coach Jeff Tedford. "We had a couple offensive linemen go down during the game. We need definitely need a gut check on who we are and what we are doing. We need to be tougher in tight games. We had too many penalties and we didn't execute well enough. We are going back to the drawing board before we start conference play."

How it happened

Montano kicked a 29-yard field goal to tie the game at 20 apiece. Boise State responded with two touchdowns and two field goals in the half to run away with its 40-20 win for the Milk Can.

FRESNO, Calif. – Fresno State maintains possession of the Valley Trophy after a 17-10 win over San Jose State in front of a sellout crowd at Valley Children's Stadium on Saturday night.

Fresno State saw both sides of the ball click this week, as quarterback Logan Fife, who started his third career game on Saturday, threw for a career-high 230 yards on 22 completions (32 attempts). Senior leadership showed from the defense in sixth-year defensive end David Perales, who had five tackles, all for a loss – including a career-high 4.0 sacks.

"I'm extremely excited," said Fife on his first win as a starter. "It's something that you think about, but now it's here. It took everyone. We worked our tails off all week. It's what we expected to happen. It was a team win. It was a great win, a great feeling and a great atmosphere in the locker room."

How It Happened

After a scoreless opening quarter, the Spartans got the scoring started in the second on a 24-yard field goal that capped an 11-play, 59-yard drive. The 'Dogs responded with an eight-play, 74-yard drive marching down the field in three-and-half minutes getting a key 22-yard pass from Logan Fife to Nikko Remigio that set up the 'Dogs at the six-yard line as Jordan Mims punched it in on a rush to the left to put the Bulldogs up 7-3.

With the Bulldog defense forcing San Jose State to a three-and-out, the 'Dogs took over at their own 40-yard line with 52 seconds left in the first half. Looking to extend their lead, the Spartans had other plans as defensive end Viliani Fehoko stripped Fife of the ball returning it down to San Jose State 32-yard line. San Jose State quickly capitalized as quarterback Chevan Cordeiro found wideout Elijah Cooks in the back of the end zone to put the Spartans ahead 10-7 with 30 seconds left.

The second half saw the Bulldogs surge ahead while holding the Spartans scoreless. A nine-play, 80-yard drive that was keyed by a pair of pass plays from Fife, first finding Zane Pope for 24 yards and added a 17-yard completion to Jalen Moreno-Cropper down to San Jose State's seven-yard line. That set up a Fife touchdown toss to Remigio that pushed the 'Dogs in the lead, 14-10.

The Spartans looked to cut the 'Dogs lead down to one with a 32-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, but Taren Schive's field goal attempt sailed wide right. Needing one more defensive stop, the Bulldogs forced a turnover-on-downs getting the ball back with 1:52 remaining and added a 28-yard field goal from Abraham Montano for the final score of the contest.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - Fresno State picked up its first road win of the season with a dominant 41-9 win at New Mexico on Saturday evening. Fresno State moves to 3-4 (2-1 Mountain West) on the season.

Fresno State was clicking on offense, putting up 510 yards of total offense against one of the top defensive groups in the Mountain West. Quarterback Logan Fife led the way with 225 yards passing with one passing touchdown and two rushing scores. Jalen Moreno-Cropper and Jordan Mims had explosive outings for the offensive attack as Moreno-Cropper had 158 yards receiving and Mims added 165 yards in the run game.

How It Happened

Fresno State scored on its opening drive for the first time since the season opener, capping a 12-play 67-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal by Abraham Montano.

New Mexico responded with a 63-yard kickoff return on the ensuing kickoff, but Fresno State's defense held the Lobos to just a field goal that evened the score a three each mid-way through the first quarter.

The Bulldogs got their offense clicking in its next drive as Logan Fife hit Jalen Moreno-Cropper on back-to-back 18 yard passes to move the 'Dogs down the field. The Bulldogs scored their first touchdown of the game on a Fife keeper from two yards out.

Fresno State's defense had another key outing, holding UNM to just a field goal after it returned a punt 38 yards to the UNM48 yard line. The Bulldogs' red zone defense stayed tough, getting UNM behind schedule after marching down the field. The Lobos scored on a 24-yard field goal to make it 10-6 in favor of Fresno State with 2:46 left in the half.

Montano put Fresno State ahead 13-6 at the half with a final second 38-yard field goal.

The Bulldogs opened the second half with a big defensive stop to get the offense back on the field. Fresno State wasted no time on its first offensive possession in the half as Fife threw for a 75-yard touchdown pass to Moreno-Cropper to put Fresno State up 20-6 with 12:44 left in the quarter.

Fife continued on with his career-high night as he snuck away untouched for a 30-yard touchdown run.

The Lobos gained momentum off of a 24-yard interception return to set themselves up in Bulldog territory. Fresno State's defense again held them to just a field goal. The Bulldogs led 27-9 with 1:59 left in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs' running backs powered the offense to its next scoring drive as Jordan Mims accounted for 56 yards to move the ball down field. Malik Sherrod capped the scoring drive with a two-yard run to the endzone to give the 'Dogs a 34-9 lead.

The backs didn't stop there as Mims added one more score on a 22-yard run to complete Fresno State's 41-point offensive showing against one of the top defenses in the Mountain West.
