AZTEC STORYLINES

VS. THE MATADORS: SDSU and CSUN will meet for the first time since the 2015 season on Tuesday. The Aztecs enter Tuesday's game having won six of its last seven against the Matadors.

SDSU has won each of the last 10 meetings with CSUN at Tony Gwynn Stadium, with the last Aztec home loss coming on April 28, 1996.

RECAP VS. CAL STATE FULLERTON: San Diego State won its first three-game series against Cal State Fullerton since 1976, defeating the Titans in both the series opener and finale to improve to 23-13 on the year.

Having won both of the prior two meetings entering the series, SDSU extended the winning streak against CSF to three, giving the Aztecs three consecutive wins against the Titans for the first time since 1968.

On Saturday, the Aztecs erased a pair of multiple-run deficits, but fell after allowing four ninth-inning runs, the Aztecs fell 13-9 to even the series.

The Aztecs used a six-run third inning and four combined shutout innings by Christian Winston and Casey Schmitt to seal the series win, winning 9-6. The Aztecs stay perfect in weekend series finales this year, jumping up to 8-0.

The Aztecs enter Tuesday's contest 7-2 in its last nine non-conference games.

SCHMITT NAMED MW PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Casey Schmitt became the first SDSU freshman since 2013 and the first MW freshman since 2015 to earn MW Pitcher of the Week honors after recording a pair of saves against Cal State Fullerton last weekend.

In addition to his duties as SDSU's starting third baseman, Schmitt has become a mainstay in the Aztec bullpen, owning a 0.57 ERA over 11 appearances and 15.2 innings pitched this year.

The Eastlake HS product has not allowed a run to score in each of his last six appearances and rides a 9.2-inning streak of not allowing an earned run. His last earned run allowed came nearly a month ago on March 17 against Cal Poly.

AZTEC STORYLINES

Hensley rides the longest on-base streak by an Aztec since the start of the 2016 season, having reached base in 29 consecutive games entering Tuesday.

Hensley produced exceptionally well at the plate last week, going 10-for-16 (.625) with a home run, two doubles, and two RBIs. He also has a current 10-game hitting streak, which he's hitting .476 (20-for-42) with nine runs scored, two home runs, and eight RBIs.

HOME COOKING: Chase Calabuig extended his on-base streak in home games to 39 this weekend, good for the longest home on-base streak by an Aztec since the statistic became available in 2000. At home, Calabuig is hitting a team-best .378 with team-highs in doubles (13), home runs (3), RBIs (20), while owning a team-best .646 slugging percentage and the second-best on-base percentage at .418.

JUST HOLD ON, WE'RE COMING HOME: San Diego State kicked off an eight-game homestand last Tuesday, beginning a homestand that is tied for the team's longest home-stretch of the season, tied with SDSU's season-opening eight-game homestand. Eight of SDSU's next nine games will be played at home.

AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS: In addition to being the Mountain West leader in earned run average (3.93) and hits allowed per nine innings (8.81), several of SDSU's team and individual statistics rank among the top in the nation.

- SDSU's 37 double plays turned are ninth most in the nation.
- SDSU's 381 total hits is 12th most in the country.
- SDSU's .302 batting average is 19th best in the country.
- SDSU's 73 doubles is 28th most in the country.
- SDSU's 11 triples is 35th most in the country.
- Jordan Verdon and Chase Calabuig are third and sixth in the nation, respectively, with 18 and 16 doubles.

HOMEGROWN: The San Diego State roster features 10 players from San Diego. Collectively, San Diego natives have posted 65.4 percent of SDSU's 2018 hit total (249 of 381)

EXPERIENCE ON THE DIAMOND: Despite having a team of 15 freshmen -- the program's largest freshman class since 2011 -- the Aztecs have two of the most experienced players in the nation this year in Chase Calabuig, who is fourth among all DI players with 211 career games played, and Jacob Erickson, who leads all DI pitchers with 109 career pitching appearances. The Aztecs are the only team in the nation to have a player in the top five of both categories. Erickson recently set SDSU's program record in pitching appearances, while Calabuig is 21 games shy from setting the program's career games played record.

Mark Martinez heads into his fourth season as the head coach at San Diego State, a position he assumed in 2015 after nine years as an Aztec assistant coach under the late Tony Gwynn.

Martinez helped Gwynn transform and build the program into what it is today. He has helped guide the Aztecs to five regional appearances in the past eight years after an 18-year absence from the postseason. Along the way, he has guided the team to Mountain West Championships in four of the past five seasons.

Martinez comes into his fourth year at the helm of the SDSU program after compiling 104 in his first the campaigns since assuming that position. He is the lone coach in program history to record 100 wins in his first three seasons as head coach.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had six of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry and Lance Zawadzki). In addition, Martinez has helped guide 47 Aztecs to All-Mountain West honors and eight Aztecs to All-American accolades.

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans

In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Moun-

tain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals. The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons.

Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well.

During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season, only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State.

In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American.

Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series

of seminars offered each winter and summer.

During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage.

New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title.

Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

The 55-year-old Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88.

Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990.

In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa (18), and a son, Cade (13).
