► **The Records:** San Diego State returns to action this week for a pair of games, as the Aztecs play their final non-conference road contest at Kansas Tuesday and return home to round out 2004 Thursday against Southern Utah. SDSU recently completed a stint of three games in five days, going 1-2 during that span, to move to 3-5 overall on the year.

Kansas is 5-4 on the year with its most recent action coming Dec. 21 at Creighton. The Jayhawks have won five of their last eight games after a season-opening loss.

Southern Utah plays host to Saint Mary's Dec. 28, before heading to San Diego. The Thunderbirds carry an overall record of 4-5 into their meeting with the Gaels.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his third season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 20-43.

► **Kansas Head Coach Bonnie Henrickson:** Henrickson is in her first season at Kansas. Her Jayhawk record is 5-4, while her career head coaching record is 163-66 in eight years.

► **KU Series History:** SDSU leads 1-0 (Last: SDSU def. Kansas, 76-63, on 12/30/87 in San Diego, Calif.)

► **Southern Utah Head Coach Joe Hillcock:** Hillcock is in his ninth season at Southern Utah. His school and career head coaching record is 110-117.

► **SUU Series History:** SDSU leads 2-0 (Last: SDSU def. SUU, 77-51, on 12/20/94, in San Diego, Calif.)

SDSU Women's Hoops Rounds Out 2004 Versus Kansas, Southern Utah

After a five-day holiday break, the San Diego State women's basketball team gets back to business with a pair of outings to round out 2004. The Aztecs play their final non-conference road contest of the season at Kansas on Tuesday, before heading back to San Diego to start a four-game homestand versus Southern Utah on Thursday.

SDSU will look to regain its footing after a busy pre-holiday stretch in which it played three

games in five days and went 1-2 during that span.

SDSU Drops A Pair Last Week

The Aztecs played two games in three days and came up empty in both, falling to UC Riverside (Dec. 20) and at SMU (Dec. 22).

On Monday, visiting UC Riverside broke open a tight game with a 22-8 closing run in the final five minutes to claim the 65-53 victory over San Diego State.

Aztec senior Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas) and freshman Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah) led San Diego State with 12 points each. Casey also added a team-best seven rebounds and four steals, while all nine Aztecs to see minutes scored at least two points.

San Diego State was outshot from the field, 47.9 percent to 31.8, and outrebounded by a 45-26 margin. Despite those numbers, the youthful Aztecs held a 45-43 lead with five minutes left. SDSU, however, would score just six points over the next 4:30 as UC Riverside claimed the game with the decisive closing run.

On Wednesday night, the Aztecs shot just 27.6 percent from the field and was unable to hit a three-pointer, falling to Southern Methodist, 80-36.

Senior Lindsey Casey scored nine of her team game-high 11 points in the first half for her third straight and fourth overall double-figure scoring effort of the season. Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.) added seven points, while Casey pulled down seven rebounds.

Other UC Riverside/SMU Notes:

SDSU is 3-5 to start a season for the second year in a row and the fourth time in the last five years ... the Aztecs had outrebounded their opponent two straight games, before seeing the trend reversed in both outings last week ... SDSU forced UC Riverside into 26 turnovers, the most by an Aztec opponent this season ... UC Riverside and SMU were a combined 35-for-40 from the free-throw line (87.5 percent), going to the stripe twice as much as the Aztecs ... SDSU freshman Marin McCue (Calgary, Alberta) made her first career start at SMU ... SDSU has had a lead at least once during each of its eight games this year.

All Hands On Deck

Since losing three due to injury in one week, San Diego State head coach Jim Tomey has used all nine players at his disposal in each of the team's last four games. Prior to the injuries, every available Aztec played in a game only once (vs. CS Stanislaus) in the first four outings.

Casey Leads The Charge

As the team's lone senior, forward Lindsey Casey has continued to lead by example. Casey has reached double-figures in scoring on four occasions, including in each of the last three outings. She has also led the team in rebounding two straight games by tying a career high with seven boards, a figure she has reached in four of the last six contests.

Casey is averaging 10 points and 6.4 rebounds in eight games this season, after putting up only 2.3 points and 2.6 boards a year ago. The co-captain posted a career best 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting in the win over Cal State Fullerton. Last season, she reached double-figures in scoring only once.

Casey has already exceeded her season total from a year ago in almost every category,

including points, blocks, steals, field goals and field-goal attempts.

Stealing One

In eight games this season, SDSU has already recorded double-figures in steals on four occasions, including 15 versus UC Riverside last week. Last year, the Aztecs had 10 or more steals seven times, with four of those coming during a five-game stretch from mid-December to early January.

Busy Decembers

This year, SDSU is scheduled to play eight games during the month of December, one fewer than last season's team, which played nine. In the program's 29-year history, the Aztecs have played eight or more games in December eight times. SDSU had played in at least one non-conference tournament in six of the eight seasons with the lone exceptions being this year and the record-breaking 10-game December schedule in 1978-79.

Depth Is The Key

Seven different Aztecs have been able to reach double-figures in points in at least one game this season. Ashley Cheesman and Lindsey Casey lead the way with three double-figure outings apiece. They are followed by **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)** and **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)**, who have each turned the trick twice. Freshman **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, sophomore **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** and junior Michelle Strawberry have each done so once.

To further accentuate the SDSU's depth in 2004-05, the Aztecs have had seven different players finish with a team game-high in assists.

In The MWC

The Aztecs remains second in the conference in turnover margin (+3.62) ... SDSU is third in steals per game (10.25) and three-point field-goal percentage defense (.327) ... Lindsey Casey is third in blocks (1.38/g) and fourth in field-goal percentage (.530)

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Kansas will mean:

- ▶ SDSU has claimed its first road win of the year.
- ▶ SDSU has won the ninth game of the season and is 4-5 overall in each of Jim Tomey's three years as head coach.
- ▶ The Aztecs improve to 9-12 all-time against members of the Big 12 Conference ... the win is SDSU's first over a Big 12 team in its last four chances (last: 12/28/97 vs. Kansas State (57-53)).

Kansas Tid-Bits

Kansas is 5-4 overall with wins over Sacred Heart, UMKC, Denver, Western Illinois and Dartmouth ... the two schools are not scheduled to play a common opponent in 2004-05 ... Crystal Kemp is the Jayhawks' leading scorer and rebounder with 16.7 points and 7.4 rebounds per outing ... Erica Hallman and Aquanita Burrad also both average in double-figure scoring ... Kansas averages only 35 rebounds per game, but has limited its opponents to just 51.7 points per outing, best in the Big 12 and fifth nationally.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Southern Utah will mean:

- ▶ SDSU is 4-2 at home in 2003-04, matching its home win total from a year ago.
- ▶ SDSU is a perfect 3-0 all-time versus Southern Utah

- ▶With a pair of wins this week, SDSU is 4-1 against teams it did not face a year ago.
- ▶With a loss at Kansas and a win versus Southern Utah, SDSU is 4-6 through 10 games for the second year in a row.

Southern Utah Tid-Bits

Southern Utah is 4-5 overall, but plays host to Saint Mary's Dec. 28, before heading to San Diego ... two of the Thunderbirds' victories have come against Utah Valley State, which travels to SDSU later this season ... Southern Utah opened its year with a 20-point loss to MWC member BYU ... the Thunderbirds are led by a pair of seniors in Janis Beal (11.1 ppg.) and Sarah Hutton (10.7 ppg., 5.9 rpg.) ... SDSU will have played a Mid-Content Conference member in each of the last four years ... SDSU's Michelle Elliott and SUU's Ally Smith both played high school basketball at Pasco High School in Washington ... Aztec Ashley Cheesman and Thunderbird Sarah Hutton are both Orem, Utah, natives, but played at rival high schools.

Fritz, Jackson To Miss Rest Of Season Due To Injury

San Diego State women's basketball players **Courtney Fritz** and **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** will miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season due to injury, Aztec head coach Jim Tomey announced Friday, Dec. 10. In addition, sophomore guard/forward **Michelle Elliott** is expected to be out the next two to three weeks with an injury to her right knee.

Both in their sophomore campaigns, Fritz tore her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the second half of the Aztecs' game at Nevada on Dec. 7, while Jackson will have ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle, which she suffered during warm-ups versus Northern Colorado on Dec. 4.

Elliott is expected to miss two to three weeks with a contusion and a non-displaced lateral tibial plateau fracture in her right knee. She suffered the injury in the team's win over Cal State Stanislaus on Nov. 30.

With the injuries, SDSU is down to just nine eligible players on its 2004-05 roster. Of the nine, five are in their first seasons playing at the NCAA Division I level.

Other 2004-05 SDSU Highlights So Far

- ▶The Aztecs' 80 points against Cal State Stanislaus are the team's most in 61 contests since scoring 83 in a win over Air Force on Feb. 21, 2002.
- ▶SDSU had 16 steals in its victory over Cal State Stanislaus, the Aztecs most in a game since tallying 17 on two occasions during the 2002-03 season.
- ▶SDSU trailed Cal State Stanislaus by 11 points, its biggest deficit in a victory since beating Air Force, 73-55, on Feb. 1, 2003. In that game, the Aztecs fell behind 14-2 to the Falcons at the 15:01 mark of the first half, but later went on to lead by as many as 23 points.
- ▶SDSU went 13-for-15 from the free-throw line (86.7 percent) against Northern Colorado, the team's best performance since making 88.9 (8-for-9) percent from the stripe on Nov. 25, 2000, versus Tennessee-Chattanooga.
- ▶SDSU attempted 20 three-pointers or more in its first four outings, including a school-record 27 against Northern Colorado. Nine different Aztecs have attempted and made at least one three this year.
- ▶SDSU's 26-point margin of victory over Cal State Fullerton is its biggest in the three-year Jim Tomey era. The last time the Aztecs defeated an opponent by more than 26 points was Dec. 28, 2001, when SDSU downed Radford 89-42 (47 points) in San Diego.

Aztecs Sign Three To National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Jim Tomey announced the signings Nov. 15, of three high school seniors, including two San Diego-area natives, to national letters of intent. Guard **Lasandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif./Azusa HS)**, center **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif./San Marcos HS)** and point guard **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif./The Bishop's School)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2005.

"We tried really hard to improve our team speed, size and physical strength with this year's signees," said Tomey about his third recruiting class at SDSU. "Tamika and Lasandra are quick, explosive guards, who have the ability to push the basketball up the floor and defend 94 feet. Audrey brings a nice package of skills and is someone who we know down the road will be a real force for us in the middle."

Green and Lipford are the first players from the San Diego-area to sign with the Aztecs since Tomey took over as head coach in time for the 2002-03 campaign. The duo also will be the first local players on the SDSU roster since Sophia Sledge (Santee, Calif./Santana HS), who finished out her career in 2001-02.
