@AztecWBB Set for Road Clash at CSUN on Monday

San Diego State opens a two-game road swing on Monday when heads north to the San Fernando Valley to battle CSUN, starting at 7 p.m. PT in Northridge, Calif. SDSU alumnus Chris Ello will handle the play-by-play responsibilities courtside at the Matadome for a live audio stream on GoAztecs.com, while streaming video via Big West TV will also be available online.

The Aztecs (2-5) are coming off a tough 60-53 setback to unbeaten San Diego in the annual city showdown last Thursday. SDSU trailed by as many as 11 points late in the third quarter before uncorking a 13-2 run to tie the score at 44-44 with just under five minutes remaining in the game. However, the Aztecs were unable to gain the upper hand as the Toreros responded with consecutive three-pointers and later sank six free throws in the final 40 seconds to thwart the Scarlet and Black's upset bid. Individually, SDSU was led by junior Kymberly Ellison (Columbus, Ga.) and sophomore McKynzie Fort (Fontana, Calif.), who finished with 14 points apiece.

Conversely, CSUN (1-7) returns home after suffering a pair of road defeats to Southern Utah (67-65) and Utah (97-56) last week. In their narrow loss to SUU, the Matadors rallied from a 12-point second-half deficit to take the lead, but the Thunderbirds hit five foul shots in the final 1:49 to eke out the win.

Despite the relative proximity of both schools, San Diego State will be engaging CSUN for just the 12th time in program history. The Aztecs hold an 8-3 lead in the series; however, the Matadors have captured the last two meetings, including a 65-54 triumph in San Diego a year ago. SDSU is 2-2 in four previous trips to Northridge, but has not set foot in the Matadome since dropping a 71-52 decision on Dec. 6, 2003. Prior to that defeat, the Aztecs last visited the Valley in 1983, when they emerged with a 95-65 conquest.

Monday's matchup will be SDSU's fourth of five scheduled encounters with Big West opponents this season. The Aztecs came up short against three Big West foes to open the 2015-16 campaign, falling at Long Beach State (74-54), before experiencing a pair of home defeats to UC Riverside (85-68) and UC Davis (65-54). The Scarlet and Black will also play host to Cal State Fullerton in its penultimate non-conference tilt on Dec. 19.

Entering the week, SDSU finds itself among the top half of the Mountain West in rebounding defense (2nd - 35.7/gm), field-goal percentage (5th - (.388)) and three-point percentage (5th - (.286)). Individually, Fort ranks fourth in the conference in both scoring (15.4 ppg) and steals (2.9/gm) while occupying the 10th position in free-throw percentage (.667). In addition, senior Deidra Smith (Aurora, Colo.) shares the seventh spot in blocked shots (1.1/gm), while junior Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.) is tied for ninth in three-point percentage (7-19, .368).

Following Monday's battle, San Diego State will return to Los Angeles on Thursday, Dec. 10, when it faces Loyola Marymount, beginning at noon PT.

Scouting the Matadors

Coming off two straight NCAA tournament appearances, CSUN (1-7) has fallen on hard times this season, dropping seven of its first eight games. The Matadors have been saddled with the unenviable task of replacing five starters from a year ago, including Ashlee Guay, a former prep standout at Academy of Our Lady of Peace in San Diego who twice earned first-team all-Big West honors. Still, CSUN recorded a huge upset last month with an 81-73 triumph over Big Ten member Penn State at home in the Radisson Chatsworth Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 27.

This season, the Matadors' scoring burden has been shouldered by the tandem of sophomore Tessa Boagni (11.1 ppg) and junior Serfina Maulupe (10.1 ppg), while freshman Channon Fluker has come off the bench to lead the team in rebounding (5.6/g). A native of Christchurch, New Zealand, Boagni tallied a season-high 21 points against Eastern Washington on Nov. 22, while Maulupe, a Virginia Tech transfer from Murrieta, Calif., paced CSUN with a 20-point performance in her last outing at Utah on Dec. 3. In addition, junior Emily Cole, an alumna of West Hills High in Santee, is the Matadors' main three-point threat, connecting on 10 of 31 attempts from beyond the arc.

As a team, CSUN is shooting 35.6 percent from the field, including a 30.6 percent clip from three-point range (44-144). As of Dec. 5, the Matadors find themselves among the nation's leaders with 162 free throw attempts (31st) and 106 free throws made (38th). However, the resulting 65.4 free-throw percentage ranks just 223rd in the country. Opponents have been outrebounding CSUN by 9.5 boards per game and have committed an average of five fewer turnovers per contest.

The Aztecs and Matadors share one common adversary so far this season in the University of San Diego. CSUN dropped an 86-64 decision to the Toreros on the road in the second game of the year, while SDSU fell short by a 60-53 last Thursday. Prior to last season's clash with the Aztecs, the Matadors last faced a Mountain West team on Nov. 30, 2013, when they fell to Utah State at home by 75-67 count.

Head coach Jason Flowers is in his sixth season at the helm of the CSUN program and has compiled a 79-88 overall record. During the 2013-14 campaign, Flowers guided the Matadors to the Big West regular-season and tournament title to earn that conference's Coach of the Year award for the second time in three seasons.

Notes With a 'W'

An SDSU victory over CSUN on Monday will mean:

- The Aztecs collect their first road win of the year.
- SDSU snaps a five-game slide against Big West opponents.
- The Aztecs raise their all-time record to 9-3 against CSUN, including a 3-2 mark at the Matadome.
- SDSU moves to 2-3 in games this year following a loss.
- The Aztecs improve to 36-18 in December contests since 2006.
- SDSU raises its record to 99-89 all-time against current Big West schools.

Flashback: Aztecs-Matadors 2014 Home Edition

Despite having three players finish in double figures, San Diego State was unable to avoid its third straight defeat with a 65-54 loss to CSUN at Viejas Arena on Dec. 20, 2014.

The Aztecs shot just 29 percent from the field (17-58), including a 1-for-10 clip from three-point range to fall to 3-7 on the season. Meanwhile, the Matadors capitalized on 22 SDSU turnovers, scoring 19 points off those miscues to help raise their record to 9-2 overall.

Individually, the Aztecs were led by junior Erimma Amarikwa, who finished with 14 points, while sophomore Chloe Johnson tied her career best with 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting. In addition, the SDSU cause was aided by sophomore Ariell Bostick, who scored 10 points for the second straight game, while senior Kristina Hunter snared a game-high 10 rebounds and posted two blocks.

CSUN didn't fare much better from the floor, connecting on just 21 of its 61 field-goal attempts (34 percent). However, the Matadors matched the Aztecs efficiency from the free-throw line as both teams went 19-for-23 (83 percent) from the charity stripe. Despite getting outrebounded 45-40, the visitors also outscored SDSU 28-24 in the paint and maintained a 13-8 advantage on second-chance points en route to the win.

Janae Sharpe paced the Matadors with a game-high 20 points and grabbed six rebounds, while Ashlee Guay finished with 17 points and

six boards of her own.

The contest witnessed four lead changes and three ties early in the first half, with the Aztecs building a pair of five-point advantages, including a 20-15 spread at the 9:17 mark following two foul shots by junior Deidra Smith. SDSU was unable to sustain the momentum, however, misfiring on six straight field goal attempts over the ensuing 5:34, while committing four turnovers. CSUN took advantage of the Aztecs' woes, uncorking an 11-0 run to take the lead for good, 26-20, with 3:43 left in the period.

SDSU managed to trim the margin to three by halftime, 30-27, before suffering another ill-timed drought after the break. The Aztecs went just 2-for-7 from the perimeter in the first six-and-a-half minutes of the second half, allowing the Matadors to build a 42-32 cushion by the 13:26 mark.

SDSU would only get as close as seven points the rest of the way, as a Johnson layup and a Bostick free thrown cut the margin to 46-39 with 8:05 left on the clock. However, CSUN countered with an 11-5 spurt over the next four minutes to forge its largest lead of the game at 57-44. Sharpe sank four foul shots during that stretch, while Camille Mahlkecht and Caroline Gilling added layups to help keep the host school at bay.

Rewind: Aztecs-Toreros Recap

The San Diego State women's basketball team put forth a valiant effort against unbeaten crosstown adversary San Diego, but came up on the short end of a 60-53 decision Thursday at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs (2-5) saw their modest two-game winning streak snapped, while the Toreros (7-0) kept their unblemished record intact.

USD came into the contest with an average winning margin of 19 points in its previous six victories, but SDSU hung tough, especially in the middle, maintaining a 35-27 rebounding advantage and a 28-18 spread on points in the paint. However, the Toreros converted 19 Aztec turnovers into 21 points and outscored the host school 17-6 in a pivotal third quarter to take a 42-33 lead.

The Aztecs fought back to tie the score at 44-44 thanks to some clutch shooting by junior Kymberly Ellison, who drained a three-pointer and polished off an and-one opportunity to cap an 11-2 blitz during the first five minutes of the fourth period. However, USD responded with consecutive triples by Cori Woodward and Malina Hood to take the lead for good. SDSU narrowed the gap to three at 54-51 with 48 seconds remaining after an Ellison's third trey of the evening, but the Toreros sank six free throws down the stretch to keep the Aztecs at bay.

Ellison finished with a career-high 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting to match sophomore McKynzie Fort, who contributed a personal-best eight rebounds and five steals. In addition, the SDSU cause was aided by fellow classmate Cheyenne Greenhouse, who tallied seven points and five rebounds, while junior Ariell Bostick dished out three assists.

The Aztecs connected on one more field goal than USD (20-19), but squandered numerous scoring chances from close range, including seven missed layups. SDSU also experienced a dearth of free-throw opportunities, draining 9 of 13 shots from the foul line, while the Toreros went 17 for 26 from the charity stripe.

Still, the two sides battled through four ties and four lead changes, with the Aztecs forging a 22-16 bulge by the 4:22 mark of the second quarter following consecutive baskets by Bostick and senior Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.). However, the Scarlet and Black was unable to give itself some additional breathing room as USD reeled off nine straight points capped by an Aubrey Ward-El bank shot with 1:46 remaining in the period. SDSU ended the run on its ensuing possession when senior Deidra Smith converted an old-fashioned three-point play, while Fort sank two free throws with six seconds left to put the hosts back in front 27-25 at halftime.

The Toreros were paced by Hood's game-high 21 points on 7-of-13 shooting, including a 3-for-6 clip from beyond the arc, while Woodward and Sydney Williams contributed nine points each in the win.

SDSU-USD Postgame Notes

- The Aztecs dropped their third straight to the Toreros, their longest stretch against USD since a five-game skid from 2002-06.
- SDSU out-rebounded an opponent for the first time this season (35-27).
- The Aztecs limited the Toreros to 19 field goals made and 27 rebounds, both opponent lows for the season.
- SDSU fell to 1-1 on the year after leading at halftime. SDSU owned a 27-25 advantage at intermission.
- The Aztecs also lost for the first time this season when making more field goals (20-19).
- The SDSU bench outscored the USD reserves by a 29-11 tally. For the season, the Aztec bench has amassed 144 points (20.6/g).
- Sophomore McKynzie Fort (14 points) reached double figures for the fourth game in row and 25th time in her career.
- Junior Kymberly Ellison set career highs in field goals (5), field-goal attempts (9). She also matched her personal best with three triples.
- Senior Ahjalee Harvey now has 501 field-goal attempts for her career after a 3-for-5 shooting performance.
- Senior Deidra Smith played in her 68th consecutive game at SDSU and surpassed the 300-rebound plateau for her career after grabbing three boards.
- Sophomore Cheyenne Greenhouse equaled her season best with five rebounds.

Fort Tabbed MW Player of the Week

McKynzie Fort has been named Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her stellar performances in three games from Nov. 23-29, as announced Monday by the league office. With her award, the Aztec sophomore garnered weekly conference accolades for the first time in her career and first for SDSU this season.

Fort averaged 17.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 3.3 steals, helping the Aztecs to a 2-1 record last week. The 5-9 guard was the team's top scorer in all three games, connecting on 66.7 percent of her shots on 24 of 36 field-goal attempts, all inside the three-point arc.

After recording 16 points on 8-of-13 shooting and four rebounds in a tough road loss to Washington on Nov. 23, Fort almost single-handedly propelled the Scarlet and Black to a 64-54 triumph over North Dakota State in the opener of the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic last Friday, posting a game-high 20 points and a personal-best five steals. Against the Bison, the Etiwanda High alumna drained a collegiate-high 10 field goals on 12 tries (83.3 pct) and matched her season best with four rebounds.

Not to be outdone, Fort capped off her brilliant week with a 16-point, 4-steal effort in the Aztecs' thrilling 63-57 overtime victory over Wisconsin on Sunday, sinking 6 of 11 attempts from the floor to go with four clutch free throws. Against the Badgers, she converted two critical and-one opportunities, including one to punctuate a timely 23-7 run that erased an 11-point deficit in the second half.

For the season, Fort is averaging a team-high 15.4 points per game on 48.8 percent shooting and leads SDSU with 20 steals. She now has five double-digit scoring performances this year and 25 for her career.

In addition, Fort set a career high with 25 points against UC Riverside in the Aztecs' home opener on Nov. 16, and established collegiate bests in three-pointers made (2), field-goal attempts (17), free throws (11) and free throw attempts (12).

Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 35-18 during the month of December since 2006. Eight of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to Washington (rv) in 2014 following a pair of setbacks to No. 23 Texas A&M and North Carolina State (rv) the year before in 2013. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous seasons against No. 2 UConn (2007), No. 7 Texas A&M (2010), No. 14 Oklahoma State (2012), No. 17 George Washington (2006) and USC (rv - 2010). Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 38 of those 53 December contests at home.

@AztecWBB Picked Sixth in MW Preseason Poll

San Diego State has been predicted to finish sixth the Mountain West preseason poll released on Oct. 28 by the league office. The voting panel consisted of the MW's 11 head coaches and select women's basketball media from around the conference.

The Aztecs, who placed seventh in the MW standings during the 2014-15 campaign, earned 135 points from the panel, trailing fifth-place UNLV (132) by just three points while topping seventh-place Wyoming (125) by 10 points.

Two-time defending regular-season champion Colorado State was picked to repeat once again after receiving 21 of 28 first-place votes and 237 points, just ahead of New Mexico, which garnered seven first-place votes and 221 points, while 2015 MW tournament champion Boise State followed closely in the third spot with six first-place votes and 215 points.

ed to finish among the top three places in the MW preseason rankings in back-to-back years for the first time since the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. The Aztecs completed conference play where they were projected last season, landing in the seventh spot with an 8-10 record.

Back Again

San Diego State returns three starters from a year ago, featuring sophomore McKynzie Fort, along with seniors Ahjaleé Harvey and Deidra Smith. A 5-9 guard, Fort earned Mountain West all-freshman honors last spring after finishing third among conference rookies with 10.9 points per game in league play while averaging 3.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists. In addition, Harvey made a successful recovery from a knee injury that sidelined her for the final 22 games of the 2013-14 campaign with 25 starts in 29 appearances last season. The 5-6 point guard was SDSU's top ball-handler and main three-point threat in 2014-15, dishing out 2.3 assists per contest to go with 21 triples. Meanwhile, Smith has played in all 62 games for the Aztecs the past two years following her transfer from Boston College. The tallest member on the squad as a 6-2 forward, Smith is the team's top returning rebounder after averaging 3.5 caroms last season.

Third-year head coach Stacie Terry and staff welcome back four additional letterwinners, including juniors Ariell Bostick and Aleiah Brandon and sophomores Cheyenne Greenhouse and Lexy Thorderson. Fellow classmate Allison Brown, who made seven spot appearances last season, also finds herself in the mix once again.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, four players will be wearing a Scarlet and Black uniform for the first time during the 2015-16 campaign. Guard Kymberly Ellison (Columbus, Ga.) practiced with the squad last year, but did not compete after transferring from Georgia Tech, while fellow backcourt mate Geena Gomez (Huntington Beach, Calif.) utilized her redshirt season as well following her transfer from St. Joseph's (Pa.).

With the departure of forwards Erimma Amariakwa, Khristina Hunter and Desi Culberson, who accounted for 43 percent of SDSU's rebounding total and 38 percent of the team's scoring offense from a year ago, a pair of newcomers look to gain significant experience on the frontline this season. Junior Kylie Herd (Phoenix, Ariz.) received second-team All-America recognition and was named the Arizona JC player of the year as a sophomore last year at Mesa Community College, following a solid freshman campaign when she helped the Thunderbirds to the NJCAA Division II national championship. Not to be outdone, freshman Arantxa Gómez (Valencia, Spain) brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after sharpening her skills as a six-year member on the Spanish club circuit, including an MVP performance in U18 regional competition last April.

Listen Live

For the 15th consecutive year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of regular-season games over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alumnus Chris Elio begins his ninth season of calling the action and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. In addition to his responsibilities with the Aztec women's basketball squad, Elio is a member of the football broadcast team as a sideline reporter for the school's flagship station, The Mighty 1090 AM.

Elio started his career in sports talk radio in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has accumulated a wealth of experience doing play-by-play for a variety of sports at every level, including stints with the SDSU football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads.

From 1996-2006, Elio was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). He also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

For the third straight year, nearly all regular-season Aztec home contests in 2015-16 will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

- The Aztecs have recorded 81 Mountain West victories in the last eight seasons after posting 31 wins in the league's first nine years.
- SDSU has won 44 straight games and is 74-1 over the last three seasons when leading with five minutes to go in the game, including an 12-0 mark in 2014-15. The Aztecs' lone blemish during that stretch was a heartbreaking 59-58 defeat at Washington in December 2012.
- SDSU is 35-19 in December games dating back to the 2006-07 campaign, with eight of those losses coming against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls.
- The Aztecs have advanced to finals of the MW Championship in five of the last eight years after not winning a single game in the tournament's first eight years of existence.
- For the third straight season, SDSU will play 18 conference games. The Aztecs will complete a home-and-away slate with eight squads, while facing Nevada (home) and Air Force (away) just once.

NCAA Rule Changes at a Glance

Game Format

- Beginning with the 2015-16 campaign, NCAA women's basketball games will be played in four 10-minute quarters.
- Teams will now reach the bonus and shoot two free throws on the fifth team foul in each quarter. Previously, teams reached a one-and-one bonus on the seventh team foul of each half and reached the double bonus (two shots) on the 10th team foul.
- In the four-quarter format, team fouls reset to zero at the start of each quarter. However, if a team reaches the bonus in the fourth quarter, that team would remain in the bonus during any additional overtime periods.

Advancing the Ball

- Teams will be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a timeout immediately after a made basket in the last 59.9 seconds of the fourth quarter and any overtime periods.
- Teams will also be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a rebound or a change of possession. In these scenarios, the ball would be inbounded at the 28-foot mark on the side of the court where the scorer's table is located.

10-Second Backcourt Exceptions

- For the upcoming season, a team will not receive a new 10-second backcourt count when a throw-in results from the following situations:
 - The ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense.
 - There is a held ball and the possession arrow favors the offensive team.
 - A technical foul is called on the offensive team while the ball is in its backcourt.

Post Defense

- Defenders will be allowed to place a forearm or an open hand with a bend in the elbow on an offensive post player with the ball whose back is to the basket.

Bands and Amplified Music

- In an effort to improve the overall fan experience, bands or amplified music may be played during any dead-ball situation during a women's basketball game. Previously, rules allowed music to be played only during timeouts and intermission.

SDSU Holds Grand-Opening Ceremony for Jeff Jacobs JAM Center

San Diego State held a grand-opening ceremony for the 23,500-square foot Jeff Jacobs JAM Center on Sunday, Aug. 23. The event marked the official opening of the Aztecs' on-campus basketball performance center, which broke ground almost a year to the date on Aug. 27, 2014.

Speaking before the ceremonial ribbon cutting was SDSU president Elliot Hirshman, men's basketball head coach Steve Fisher and women's hoops senior guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Preliminary site work started in July 2014, just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields. The facility, which will support the continued growth and development of the SDSU men's and women's basketball teams, includes two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film room, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms.

Hundreds of supporters contributed to the effort to make the Jeff Jacobs JAM Center a reality. In addition to the naming gift from Jeff Jacobs, Hal and Debby Jacobs, Steve and Lisa Altman and Jim Morris, creating the name "JAM" Center, sizeable donations were made from the Manna Charitable Foundation and the Walter and Betty Zable Foundation. The total cost of the project was \$15 million.

The project was designed by JCJ Architecture and was built by The Hunt Construction Group.

San Diego native Stacie Terry enters her third year at the helm of the Aztec women's basketball team after she was named the eighth head coach in program history on May 15, 2013.

Despite a 12-19 record and an 8-10 mark in the Mountain West, Terry's squad still showed dramatic improvement on defense last season, finishing second in the conference and 34th nationally in opponent three-point field goal percentage, compared to 2014 when SDSU ranked last in the league and near the bottom of Division I in that statistic.

In addition, the Aztecs were fourth in scoring defense during MW play a year ago, allowing nearly 10 points per game fewer than the previous campaign and topped the conference in rebounding defense for the second straight season.

Under Terry's watch, forward Erimma Amarikwa capped off her collegiate career with honorable mention all-MW accolades, while guard McKynzie Fort gave SDSU's its second consecutive all-conference freshman honoree.

Terry's charges also made tremendous strides in the classroom, with the squad posting the highest collective GPA in program history during the fall of 2014, while five Aztecs landed a spot on the MW all-academic team, the most since 2001-02.

During her first season on Montezuma Mesa, Terry was saddled with the unenviable task of replacing four senior starters who accounted for nearly 64 percent of the team's scoring offense from the previous year, as well as overcoming the loss of two key players to injuries prior to conference play, Amarikwa, who was a preseason all-MW selection, and starting point guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Despite those obstacles and a demanding schedule featuring nine games against teams that eventually advanced to postseason competition, Terry's squad flashed its resiliency during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing with a 13-17 overall record and a 9-9 ledger in the MW.

With Terry at the controls, the Aztecs led the league in rebounding margin and rebounding defense while ranking second in field-goal percentage.

Individually, Terry also oversaw the progress of senior center Cierra Warren, who became the fifth SDSU player in a six-year span to receive first-team all-MW recognition.

Prior to her arrival on The Mesa, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level for 14 years, including five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. During that season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

Prior to her appointment at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA

tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN Hoop-Gurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Greutz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at the University of Texas at Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to UT Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry prepped at El Capitan High and held the Vaqueros' career scoring record for three years following her graduation. She was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
