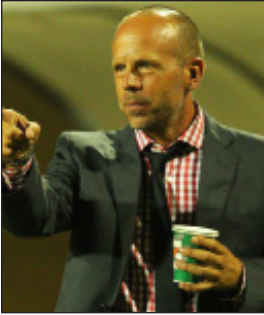

COACHING STAFF



Head Coach
Lev Kirshner
20th Season
Rutgers '91

Entering his 20th season at the helm of the SDSU men's soccer program, Lev Kirshner has brought the Aztecs back into the national spotlight while leading the program into its 15th season as a member of the Pac-12 Conference.

Kirshner has racked up over 130 wins while at SDSU and has taken the Aztecs to the NCAA Tournament three times (2005, 2006 & 2016). He has led SDSU to a .500 record or better nine times while overseeing seven freshmen All-Americans, 19 all-region selections and over 90 all-conference honorees. Off the pitch, Kirshner's teams have posted the top male team GPA at SDSU in six of the last seven semesters.

In 2016, the Aztecs recorded 11 shutouts and went 9-4-6 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. That season SDSU placed seven players on the All-Pac-12 team, the most since the 2010 season. SDSU also had a historic 1-0 victory over Akron, the No. 1 ranked team in the country at the time.

The Aztecs advanced to the postseason in both 2005 and 2006 with back-to-back nine win seasons, the first NCAA appearance for the program since the 1989 season.

In 2005, SDSU went 9-4-6, its best mark since 1991 and was nationally ranked by all four polls during the season and reached as high as No. 14 by Soccer American and College Soccer News. The Aztecs ranked first nationally with an 87.9 shots-on-goal save percentage and second in the country with a 0.54 goals against average behind 12 shutouts from goalkeeper Tally Hall. Hall became the first Aztec to receive All-American honors since National Soccer Hall of Fame member Marcelo Balboa did so in 1989.

With Hall back for his senior season in 2006, and the addition of Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, Nick Cardenas, the Aztecs returned to the NCAA Tournament and finished in second place in the Pac-10 with a 5-2-3 mark.

Kirshner also led the Aztecs to back-to-back 10 wins seasons in 2010 and 2011, but SDSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament.

Before coming to SDSU, Kirshner coached the women of Cañada College (Redwood City, Calif.) from 1992-95. During that time, he took over a program that had never won a conference game and led it to a 16-1-3 record in his final year. For his efforts, he was named the Coast Conference Coach of the Year. He also served as the men's assistant coach at Cañada and helped with their run to the state quarterfinals in 1992 and 1994.

From there, Kirshner moved to a head coaching position at Ohlone College in 1995. At Ohlone, he helped take a team from a second-to-last place league finish the previous season to as high as No. 15 in the state.

Kirshner also had a stint as the men's assistant coach at his alma mater, Rutgers. Kirshner helped the Scarlet Knights reach the second round at the 1996 NCAA tournament and finish the season with a No. 13 national ranking and a 14-7-4 overall record.

Kirshner arrived at SDSU prior to the 1997 and spent three years as an assistant under long-time head coach Chuck Clegg, the school's all-time winningest coach.

As a player at Rutgers, Kirshner was part of a 1987 NCAA quarterfinal team, a 1989 NCAA semifinal squad that lost to eventual co-champion Virginia and a run-

ner-up finisher to UCLA in the 1990 championship match.

He received his undergraduate degree in communication while graduating with honors in 1991, and is listed as one of the soccer program's top 25 alums.

"Lev was an outstanding player for us and a very integral part of a team that went to two Final Fours in his career," Rutgers head coach Bob Reasso said. "In my 25 years at Rutgers, Lev was one of the finest players ever to come through our program."

Following his collegiate career, Kirshner represented the United States in 1993, winning a bronze medal for the U.S. national Maccabiah team. In 1997, he returned to Israel as captain of the U.S. team, and led the only squad to defeat eventual gold-medalist Brazil.

Kirshner was selected as one of 250 domestic and international athletes to be assessed in the inaugural Major League Soccer combine in 1995. Kirshner also had a stint in the USISL starting for the Reno Rattlers. During that year, he trained with and played in several intrasquad reserve games for the MLS San Jose Clash.

Kirshner was named coach of the U.S. Maccabiah Pan-American U-20 soccer team in December 2003, where he won a bronze medal in Santiago, Chile. In the summer of 2005, Kirshner led the national Maccabiah squad to a second-place finish. Kirshner and his assistant, Amos Magee, became only the second and third members of the U.S. soccer delegation to have won two medals in the World Maccabiah Games. Additionally, Kirshner's squad earned the tournament's "Fair Play" Award, which is given to the team that exhibited the best sportsmanship.

Kirshner has valuable experience working with all levels of soccer having had stints with the Region IV Olympic Development Program (ODP) and serving as the interim head coach of the national runner-up West team during the 2001 U.S. regional championship. He was also as an assistant coach during the team's undefeated April 2002 tour of Australia.

Additionally, Kirshner worked as both an assistant and head coach with the Northern California ODP U-23 men's team during 1995 and 1996. He led those squads to consecutive Western Regional championships, including a third-place finish at the 1995 Donnelly Cup. He also won a Western Regional title with the under-15 ODP Northern California state team as the assistant coach of the 1984 age group.

Kirshner possesses a USSF A-License and has received the NSCAA Premiere Badge with distinguished honors; the highest accolade provided by that organization.

A graduate of Mission San Jose High School, Kirshner was inducted to the first hall of fame class at his alma mater. While at Mission San Jose, he guided his team to two North Coast Section (NCS) appearances. During his senior season, he led his squad to its school's first league title en route to the NCS semifinals. A three-time all-league selection and led his team in points all four years.

COACHING STAFF



Associate Head Coach
Matt Hall
20th Season
San Diego '01

Matt Hall enters his seventh season as associate head coach and 20th overall with the San Diego State men's soccer program. His primary responsibilities are working with the Aztec goalkeepers. In addition to his goalkeeping duties, Hall helps coordinate the team's recruiting, and organizes and runs practice sessions.

Known as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation, Hall has coached an SDSU netminder to a postseason honor in eight of his last 13 seasons and has helped set a high standard for the expectations of Aztec goalkeepers.

Hall was instrumental in the development of two-time All-American Tally Hall (2003-06), all-time career saves leader Brian Barnes (1999-02) and Adam Allmaras (2014-17), who finished his SDSU career second in shutouts (25) and saves (260).

In 2016, the Aztecs, allowed just 12 goals during the regular season to become the just the third squad in school history to give up 12 or fewer goals in the first 18 games of the year. SDSU ranked among the national team leaders in save percentage (3rd, .857), shutout percentage (4th, 0.58) and goals against average (10th, 0.63). Individually, goalkeeper Adam Allmaras ranked fourth in the country in save pct. and logged 11 shutouts, good for second on the team's single-season charts.

Under Hall's guidance in 2006, Tally Hall (no relation) allowed just nine goals in Pac-10 play and became the first Aztec to earn All-America honors in consecutive years since 1989. Hall also was a M.A.C. Hermann Award semifinalist, a Scholar All-American and a first-team all-West Region and all-Pac-10 performer.

The year prior (2005), Tally Hall and the Aztecs led the nation with an 88.9 shots-on-goal save percentage and were second in the country with a 0.49 goals against average, both school records. For his efforts, he was named a first-team all-Far West selection and first-team all-Pac-10 pick.

Hall also oversaw Brian Barnes early in his career, who recorded 90 saves in 2000 and 98 in 2002, the top-two all-time in a single-season for an Aztec goalkeeper. Barnes finished his career with 282 saves, the most in program history.

Actively involved as the team's recruiting coordinator, Matt Hall helped San Diego State produce top-40 recruiting classes on a near annual basis.

Hall spent three years (1996-98) defending the Aztecs' net and beginning SDSU's tradition of nationally renowned goalkeepers. He finished his career with the most saves (213) in school history and now sits in fourth place after being passed by three of his pupils (Barnes, Allmaras and T. Hall). Hall is also third on the school's single-season saves list after recording 89 during the 1998 campaign.

After SDSU, Hall had a solid professional career, starting for the San Diego Flash, which reached the quarterfinals of the A-League championships in 2001.

Hall completed his undergraduate degree at the University of San Diego in 2001, and holds a U.S.S.F. National "A" license.

He resides in San Diego with his wife Kelli, and their two children.

Josh Hill
3rd Season
La Verne '14

Josh Hill enters his third season with the San Diego State men's soccer program. One of the top young assistants on the West Coast, Hill was promoted to Associate Head Coach following the 2018 season.

Hill has been instrumental to the Aztecs' recent recruiting success and is one of the main reasons the 2019 class was ranked No. 10 in the nation by Top Drawer Soccer. For his efforts, Hill was recognized by TDS as an "Assistant Coach to Watch."

A native of Chino, California, Hill brings a vast array of coaching experience to Montezuma Mesa, ranging from the collegiate level to the USL Premier Development League (PDL).

Prior to coming to SDSU, he was an assistant coach at UCLA in 2016 after serving the Bruins' director of soccer operations in 2015. During Hill's tenure at UCLA, the Bruins led the Pac-12 with 17 all-conference selections overall and helped UCLA advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in both years.

Prior to his arrival in Westwood, Hill worked as assistant coach for his alma mater the University of La Verne (2014-15) while serving as head coach at Chino High School from 2010-16, where he guided the Cowboys to numerous tournament titles, league championships, as well as the CIF state finals.

In addition, Hill has been an assistant coach for the OC Blues (now known as OCSC) of the USL and the for the PDL's Orange County Blue Stars FC (2012-14), who he helped lead to consecutive appearances at the Lamar U.S. Open Cup.

Hill plays a large role with US Soccer where he scouts regionally and nationally while also working with the national teams.

A four-year starter and scholar-athlete at the University of La Verne, Hill was a three-time team captain for the Leopards, garnering a trio of all-conference scholar accolades from the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) as well. He earned a Bachelor of Science in business administration before receiving his Masters of Science in leadership and management.

As a player at the club level, Hill also completed stints with Legends FC and Arsenal FC. In addition, he played for PSA Elite, an annual contender in the U.S. Open Cup. Previously, Hill helped assemble one of the most successful amateur sides in U.S. Soccer, as PSA Elite made consecutive Round of Four appearances at the U.S. Open Cup in 2014 and 2015, losing only to Major League Soccer powers Seattle Sounders and LA Galaxy.

Hill currently holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "B-National" license, and he has also served as a Nike All-Star Coach, a youth development coach and mentor.

Matt Deemer is in his second season as SDSU's Director of Soccer Operations. A 2018 graduate of Chapman University, where he was a back-up goalkeeper, Deemer already has five years of coaching experience under his belt.

Deemer got his first coaching experience as the Chapman Women's Club Team Head Coach for the 2015-16 season. He also was the JV Head Coach at Villa Park High School from 2015-17, before being elevated to the Head Coach for the 2017-18 school year. As Villa Park's Head Coach, Deemer helped them reach the CIF Finals, which earned him CIF Coach of the Year honors.

Along with his duties at SDSU, Deemer serves as an assistant coach for the LA Galaxy San Diego Youth Soccer Club.

Deemer holds a USSF "D" and "E" license and is working towards his "C" license.

A standout goalkeeper at Carlsbad High School (2010-14), he set the school record for most career saves and shutouts. Deemer owns the distinction of being the only person in CIF history to win CIF Player of the Year and CIF Coach of the Year in a four year span.

Joe Tedesco is in his first year with the men's soccer program. He is no stranger to SDSU or the San Diego community having made previous coaching stops at Point Loma & with the Aztec women's soccer team. He also has coached at Old Dominion and Georgia State as well as having coached club teams in four states.

Tedesco currently serves at the college coordinator for the San Diego Soccer Club where he helps guide and advise players through the college recruiting process.

In his three seasons with the SDSU women, Tedesco coached 16 All-Mountain West conference selections and helped lead the Aztecs improve from 6-10-3 to 15-4-5 in 2009.

Prior to his time with the Aztecs, Tedesco was an assistant coach of the Point Loma Nazarene University women's team from 2004-2007 and was the associate head coach for both the men's and women's programs in 2008.

Tedesco holds several coaching licenses including the European UEFA "A" license, the United State Soccer Federation "A" license and the United States Soccer Federation National Goalkeeping License.

Tedesco played two seasons at the University of New Hampshire where he was an All-America East Academic team honoree and was the team's H. Richard Sandlar

award winner for academic achievement in 1999. In 2003, Tedesco played professionally for the San Diego Gauchos in the United Soccer Leagues pro select league. Kristin Manyak has been on the San Diego State athletic training staff since 2011.

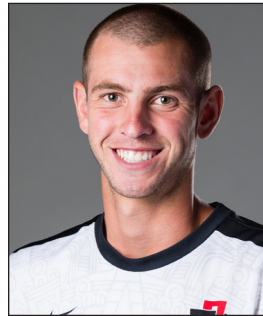

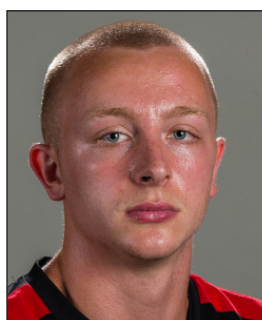
