Placed fifth at the highly competitive UC Irvine Invitational ... The Aztecs finished with an eighth-place ranking in the final national poll ... SDSU has earned a top-10 national ranking every week that the poll has been released since the beginning of the 2006 season ... Three seniors, Erinn Greenwood, Anna Gonzales and Jenna Schuster ended their four-year careers on a high note establishing numerous SDSU records ... Erinn Greenwood broke the San Diego State record for career ejections drawn (321) and finished fourth in school history with 117 assists, eighth with 150 goals and her 101 ejections drawn in 2009 rank second in the single-season charts ... Anna Gonzales wrapped up her illustrious career at SDSU as the second-leading scorer in SDSU history (273 goals), while also ranking third with 123 assists, fifth with 130 ejections drawn, tied for sixth with 178 steals, and her 92 goals scored in 2009 is also the second-highest single season total ... Jenna Schuster leaves The Mesa as the third-leading scorer in program history (255 goals) and finished sixth with 126 ejections drawn, eighth with 163 steals and ninth with 74 assists, while her 64 goals scored in 2009 rank as the 10th highest single-season total ... Ronni Gautschi sits in eighth place all time with 115 ejections drawn and posted the Aztecs' fourth-highest single-season total with 49 assists in 2009 ... Sarah Brady's 46 assists rank as the eighth-best single-season total ... Kelly Campoli recorded the fourth-highest season total in 2009 with 300 saves as a true freshman in her first season as a starter.
