

2005-06 Season

Fall: Posted two top-20 finishes during the fall campaign... Fired an opening-round 69 en route to a 4-over 217 and a seventh-place tie at the Fresno State Lexus Classic... Also carded a 69 during the third round of the Barona Collegiate Cup, tying for 27th with a 5-under 211... Was the Aztecs' second-best finisher at the UH Fall Intercollegiate in Hawaii, tying for 12th with a 3-over 219.

Spring: Earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, following a highly productive spring in which he posted four top-10 finishes... Recorded a season-best finish at the Oregon Duck Invitational, where he tied for third to help SDSU claim its third team tournament title of the year... Placed fifth at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational with a 6-under 207 on rounds of 70-65-72... His second-round 65 tied him for third on the school's all-time list for the lowest 18-hole score... Shot a 2-over 215 at the Ashworth Collegiate to finish in a seventh-place tie... Tied for 10th at the Callaway Golf Invitational with a 7-over 223... Carded a 4-over 220 at the MWC championships, finishing tied for 14th... Was one of four Aztecs, along with Andrew Scott, Josh Warthen and David Palm, to play in all 38 rounds during the season... Ranked second on the team with a 72.58 stroke average for the year... Also had the squad's second-best score-in-relation-to-par (SCIRP) at +2.69... Finished the season ranked 137th nationally by *Golfweek/Sagarin* ... Received MWC all-academic honors.

2004-05 Season

Fall: Played in just one tournament for the Aztecs... Carded a 4-over 220 at UCLA's Gold Rush... Shot a 72 in the second round of that event... Was one of four scholar-athletes on the Aztec men's golf team.

Spring: Did not compete.

Summer: Qualified for the U.S. Amateur Public Links after winning the sectional tournament in San Diego with a 141... Participated in the 2005 CGA Amateur Championships and tallied a first-round 74.

2003-04 Season

Fall: Competed in three events for SDSU and recorded a 74.00 stroke

average with all nine of his rounds counting towards the team score in his first season of collegiate golf... Posted his top finish at the Opus NW Husky Invitational where he placed 23rd with a total of 8-over 224... Fired a 3-under 69, his low round of the season, in the final round of the Husky tournament... Delivered his lowest score at the Barona Collegiate Cup, a 4-over par 220, including rounds of 71 and 72 to finish the tournament... Began the year with a 6-over 222 at the William H. Tucker to place 34th.

Spring: After seeing limited varsity in the fall, became one of State's most consistent performers in the spring... Finished second on the team with a stroke average of 72.30 in 23 rounds... Had four top-10 finishes and was among a tournament's top 20 golfers on nine occasions... Claimed his most prestigious career title when he won the U.S. Intercollegiate at Stanford... Completed the event with an 8-under 205 on rounds of 68-70-67... Won his first-ever tournament in North County when he fired a 69-70 (-3) to win the Aztec Battle at the Lake... Finished 10th at the MWC championships with a 4-over 220 at Sunriver, Ore.

RYAN DONOVAN



Head Coach

Fourth Year

San Diego State (2001)

Ryan Donovan is entering his fourth year as head coach at his alma mater. Donovan, who previously served as an assistant coach under Dale Walker, was promoted to interim head coach after the conclusion of the 2003 fall season and guided SDSU

through the entire 2004 spring campaign.

Since assuming the reins of the men's golf program, Donovan has coached the Aztecs to 25 top-10 tournament finishes, 17 top-five tournament finishes, four team titles and two NCAA championship appearances.

Under Donovan's tutelage last year, SDSU captured three team tournament victories en route to its eighth consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Three Aztec golfers - seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen and sophomore David Palm - also claimed individual titles during the season, while Scott and sophomore Aaron Goldberg garnered all-Mountain West Conference accolades.

In 2004-05, Donovan led SDSU to its second NCAA championship appearance in three years, while the Aztecs posted 12 top-10 individual finishes to go along with six straight top-five team performances during the regular season.

Donovan completed his first season as head coach with four of his players finishing with eight top-five individual tournament finishes collectively and two tournament wins both by then-freshman Aaron Goldberg.

Prior to coaching at SDSU, Donovan was a four-year member of the Aztec golf squad and returned to his alma mater after a stint in the professional ranks.

Donovan competed for the Aztecs from 1997-2001. His most successful season came as a junior when he posted five top-30 finishes. During his senior year, Donovan shot a career-best 4-under 212 at the Aztec Invitational, placing second overall and helping SDSU to the tournament title.

Donovan also has national experience on his playing résumé. He qualified for the U.S. Amateur in 1996 and 1999 and also played in the British Amateur in 2001 before turning pro. He then competed on the Golden State Tour in 2001 and the Gateway Tour in 2002.

A native of Yorba Linda, Calif., Donovan was a four-time all-Sunset League performer at Esperanza High School and was named first-team all-Orange County his senior season. Donovan graduated with a degree in public administration and currently resides in San Diego.

DALE WALKER



Dir. of Golf Operations

Seventh Year

San Diego State (1980)

Dale Walker is entering his seventh year at San Diego State and his third as the director of golf operations. Walker was the Aztecs' head men's golf coach from 2000-03.

A former San Diego State golfer, Walker took the helm of the Aztec men's golf program just prior to the 2000-01 campaign, and the Aztecs hardly missed a beat.

Walker guided San Diego State to eight top-three finishes, including four team titles, during his inaugural campaign. The Aztecs also placed second at the Mountain West championships, advanced to the NCAA West Regional, and were ranked in *Golfweek's* top 25 throughout the year.

In 2001-02, SDSU began the spring with three consecutive team titles in a season that totaled nine top-five results. Walker and the Aztecs fell just shy of advancing to the NCAA championships, falling in a playoff to Texas Tech for the final berth out of the west regional.

A year later, the Aztecs had a solid 2002-03 campaign, highlighted by a first-place finish at the 2002 Barona Collegiate Cup and in the spring, returned to the NCAA championships, its first appearance since 1984.

Driven by his goal to make San Diego State golf the premier program on the West Coast, Walker developed a knack for driving his players to be the most well-prepared participants in each event. To accomplish this, he has relied on his past experience at both the collegiate and professional levels, which allowed him to offer his expertise to Aztec golfers with the mechanics of their swing, as well as the mental aspect of competition.

Walker's vision, however, is not limited to the course. He has been the driving force behind the San Diego State Golf Association whose purpose is to provide the financial and human resources to ensure a successful future for San Diego State golf.

Walker's aim is to raise \$2 million for the men's and women's golf programs, an endowment that would make each program self-funding.

Walker is the father of two sons, Colton and Carson. In his free time, he enjoys white-water river rafting and riding dirt bikes with his kids and of course, playing golf.
