► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team ends its 2006 home schedule with a pair of games against two of the top teams in the conference. The Aztecs play back-to-back contests versus ranked foes in No. 21/18 BYU on Wednesday and No. 23/22 New Mexico on Saturday. All three of SDSU's wins this season have come at home as have its last victories in the all-time series with both schools.

Saturday's outing with New Mexico will be the final home games for seniors Lindsay Goldblatt, Veronica Shaw and Michelle Strawberry. Guard Courtney Fritz and center Jordie Smith will also be honored after suffering career-ending injuries earlier this season.

► **San Diego State Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 154-103 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 235-168.

► **BYU Head Coach Jeff Judkins:** Judkins in his fourth season at BYU. He has a school and career record is 78-38.

► **BYU Series History:** BYU leads the series, 21-9, but only owns an 8-7 advantage in games played in San Diego (Last: BYU def. SDSU, 64-39, on Jan. 21, 2005, in Provo, Utah).

► **New Mexico Head Coach Don Flanagan:** Flanagan is in his 11th year as head coach of the Lobos and owns a school and career record of 235-101.

► **New Mexico Series History:** New Mexico leads the series 18-13, but it's tied at 6-6 in games played in San Diego (Last: New Mexico def. SDSU, 76-45, in Albuquerque, N.M., on Feb. 25, 2005).

SDSU Women's Basketball Plays Host To Two Ranked Foes For Final Homestand

The San Diego State women's basketball team ends its 2005-06 home slate with two games versus ranked teams at Cox Arena Wednesday evening and Saturday afternoon. The Aztecs will be playing host to a pair of home conference contests in the same week for the first and only time this season, as both No. 21/18 Brigham Young and No. 23/22 New Mexico make their way to the west coast. SDSU held early first-half leads against the Cougars and Lobos in the games earlier this season, but came up empty in the end in both meetings.

Saturday's contest with New Mexico is Senior Day, as the Aztecs say goodbye to three seniors and two red-shirt sophomores. The game will be the final outing at Cox Arena for seniors **Lindsay Goldblatt (West Hills, Calif.)**, **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** and **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)**, while injury

SDSU's Long Trip Ends In Loss At TCU

TCU had five players score in double-figures as the Lady Frogs defeated the visiting San Diego State women's basketball team, 80-49, Saturday at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-20 overall and 0-13 in conference play, while the Lady Frogs improved to 14-9 and 8-4 in league action.

Senior Veronica Shaw had 10 of her team-high 12 points in the first half, adding six rebounds and four assists before fouling out. Two of SDSU's season leaders in scoring, senior Michelle Strawberry and junior **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)**, were each held without a point in the first 20 minutes of action. Johnson would later foul out at the 16:15 mark of the second half with just two points and four boards, while Strawberry ended with 10 points, her 18th game this season in double-figures.

Aztec junior **Ijlal Barnes (San Diego, Calif.)** had a career-high seven rebounds and two assists, while sophomore **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** tallied six points and four assists in her second trip back to her home state of Texas.

The Long Trip

SDSU's journey to TCU took a little longer than expected last weekend. Poor weather conditions in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area caused the Aztecs' original flight out of San Diego to be canceled Friday evening. SDSU then traveled to TCU Saturday morning and arrived in Ft. Worth just over two hours before tip-off, which was pushed back from 2 to 7 p.m. CST.

Other TCU Notes

The Aztecs have owned a lead in 22 of its 23 games this season, with the only exception being the Pittsburgh game back on Dec. 22 ... SDSU outrebounded TCU, 39-36, marking just the second time in conference play that the Aztecs have owned a positive margin on the boards (the other being a +7 versus Wyoming) ... The Aztecs' 17 offensive rebounds were a season game-high in conference contests ... SDSU has had more offensive boards than its opponent 12 times in 2005-06, including in six of its last seven outings.

The Three-Ball

After making only 24 three-pointers in 10 non-conference contests (2.4/g), the Aztecs have 61 triples in 13 league games (4.7/g) to almost double their per game average.

Last Saturday, four players accounted for the team's seven treys at TCU, which ties as the second most in a game this season. In that game, SDSU shot a season-high 41.2 percent from beyond the arc, converting on seven of 17 attempts.

Block Party

Not only does San Diego State have the top shot blocker in the Mountain West Conference, two other Aztecs also rank among the top 12 in the league. Senior Desiree Johnson was shutout in that category last week, but still has at least one block in 16 of 23 outings. She leads the MWC in both overall (1.39/g) and league-only (1.46/g) contests.

Johnson is joined in the top 12 by sophomore Shanna Demus (0.91/g) and freshman Audrey Green (0.67/g). Green had a career-best three blocks in only eight minutes Saturday at TCU, marking the seventh time an Aztec has had three or more blocks in a game in 2005-06.

Straw's String

With her 10 points at TCU, Aztec senior Michelle Strawberry has scored in double-figures in 18 of 23 outings in 2005-06, including in nine of 13 conference contests. Dating back to last year, she has reached double-figures in points in 20 of her last 25 games and has 41 career games with 10 or more points (33 in the last two seasons).

She currently ranks seventh in the Mountain West Conference in scoring (13.7) in overall games and is 11th in league-only contests (13.0). Should the season end today, her 13.7 average would be the best

Another Aztec Injury

Aztec freshman forward **Jana Heinrich (Fischbach, Germany)** will miss the remainder of the season with a stress reaction in her left foot, which was diagnosed prior to the UNLV contest on Feb. 15. Heinrich played in 20 games in her first year on The Mesa, starting five and averaging 4.3 points and 2.2 rebounds per outing.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the BYU will mean:

►SDSU earns its first win over BYU since 2001, when the Aztecs beat the Cougars 63-61 in San Diego on Jan. 11.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 7-6 all-time versus the Cougars.

BYU Tid-Bits

BYU is leading the Mountain West with a 10-2 league mark and a 20-3 overall record in 2005-06... the Cougars lost just once in non-conference action, but have dropped two of their last three outings heading into this week to Utah (70-52) and Wyoming (57-56) both at home ... BYU is led by the conference's second-leading scorer in Ambrosia Anderson (18.6 ppg.), while sophomore Mallary Gillespie and senior Dani Kubik both chip in 10.0 points per contest ... the Cougars have started the same five in all 23 contests with Jennie Keele and Melinda Johnsen joining Anderson, Kubik and Gillespie ... BYU ranks second nationally in field-goal percentage defense (.342) and is seventh in scoring defense (54.6) ... former Aztec Ashley Cheesman (2005) is a member of the Cougar squad, but is not eligible to play due to NCAA rules.

the same season six times in the two schools' history... SDSU and New Mexico also played in the Aztecs' home finale in 2004, as the Lobos just barely avoided the upset, 47-44, at Peterson Gym ... Lobos assistant coach Yvonne Sanchez was in a similar role at SDSU in 1999-2000.

The Mountain West Conference Championships

The 2006 conference campaign culminates in the MWC championships in Denver, Colo., March 7-11. The tournament will span five days (one day off) for the first time in league history, while it will take place in Denver for the third and final year before returning to Las Vegas, Nev., in 2007.

Although there are still three regular-season contests remaining for the Aztecs, they will play their first game of the 2006 MWC tournament on Tues., March 7, at 5 p.m. (MST) versus either Air Force or Colorado State. The Falcons currently have one more win than the Rams, but the two sides still have to face one another at Air Force on the final day of the regular season on March 4.

This year's MWC championship will be one of the most competitive as three teams are currently ranked in the top 25, while a fourth is receiving votes in both polls. The conference also has six teams ranked in the top 65 of three different RPI indexes.

Lipford To Miss Remainder Of The Season With Knee Injury

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced Feb. 13, that freshman point guard **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** suffered a season-ending right knee injury that will require surgery. Lipford tore her ACL and partially tore her MCL shooting at practice before the team departed for its game in Salt Lake City, Utah on Feb. 10.

Lipford played in 17 games in 2005-06, starting 14 at point guard in her first season with the Aztecs. The freshman averaged 4.1 points and 2.0 rebounds per contest and leads the team with 58 assists. She also is second on the squad in steals (31) and ranks in the top eight in the Mountain West Conference in both assists per game (3.41) and assist/turnover ratio (1.35).

Fritz Suffers Career-Ending Knee Injury

The San Diego State women's basketball program announced Jan. 31 that redshirt sophomore guard Courtney Fritz has ended her collegiate career after injuring her right knee for the third time in the last 14 months. Fritz, who has torn her ACL on two separate occasions, sustained yet another injury to the same knee in last week's game at New Mexico.

Fritz played in seven games for SDSU this season, all during conference action. She was averaging 2.4 points and 1.0 rebounds per contest after returning to the court for the first time in over a year at Colorado State on Jan. 5. For her career, Fritz played in 39 games and ranks fifth all-time in Aztec history in three pointers made (69) and is seventh in attempts (202).

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.

- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).

- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in Feb. 1996.

-The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.

-The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

- Michelle Strawberry was named Mountain West Conference player of the week on Dec. 19, following her 22-point, 11-rebound performance in the team's win over Portland State. Strawberry is the first Aztec to be named Mountain West Conference player of the week since December 2002. She became the fifth SDSU player in the league's seven-year history to be named player of the week.

-Michelle Strawberry and Veronica Shaw were both selected to the all-tournament team at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Strawberry averaged 12 points and 4.5 rebounds in the two contests, while Shaw put up comparable numbers at 11.0 ppg. and 6.5 rpg. The pair are the first Aztecs to earn all-tournament honors since 2003.

-The game with Air Force on Jan. 7 was San Diego State's first overtime effort in its seven years as a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Aztecs also went to the extra five-minute period for the first time since the 2002-03 campaign.

- Two SDSU players have scored 20 or more points in a game six times, including five by Michelle Strawberry.

Blackburn and Earley are in their 12th year of covering SDSU women's basketball, while Lawton is in his 11th season with the Aztecs.

Aztecs Sign Five To National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signings Nov. 9 of four high schools seniors and one junior college sophomore to national letters of intent. Center **Kendra Calvin (Perris, Calif.)**, forward **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)**, guard **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, forward **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** and forward **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2006.

"We are pleased to announce our first recruiting class for 2006-07," said Burns, who is in her second stint as head coach at SDSU. "Through the efforts of many, we know that we've signed a terrific foundation of excellent student-athletes, who are excited about the opportunity to be an Aztec."

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 235-168 (.583). Her current SDSU record stands at 154-103 (.599).
