## SDSU Looks to Break Recent Two-Match Slide Against 53rd-Ranked Tulsa

• The 25th-ranked San Diego State women's tennis team continues its longest homestand of the season with a single match versus No. 53 Tulsa on Tuesday. The Aztecs come into the match having lost two straight and own a record of 7-5. The Golden Hurricane, meanwhile, visits San Diego with a 7-9 record, having just recently lost to Mountain West Conference member New Mexico.

After the Tulsa match, SDSU will have the week off until it faces Ohio State, March 22, in the last match of the current seven-match homestand.

## Weekly Wrap Up

• After winning four consecutive matches and being ranked No. 25 in the country, the Aztecs dropped each of its two contests last week.

The non-conference tilt with No. 33 Florida State went down to the wire and was decided by the last match of the afternoon.

Florida State claimed the doubles point after sweeping all three matches by a score of 8-6.

The Seminoles took a 2-0 lead after their win at No. 1 singles, but Dita Hauerlandova won in straight sets at No. 2 to put the Aztecs on the board.

SDSU trailed in the match, 3-1, when Eliska Krausova fell at three, but once again, the bottom of the Aztec lineup pulled through and notched victories at Nos. 5 and 6 to tie the match at three apiece.

The deciding match was at No. 3 between SDSU's Andrea Hermansen and FSU's Lindsey Deason. The two went back and forth with Deason taking the first set, 6-0, and Hermansen fighting back tallying a 7-6 win. In the end, Deason would come out on top, winning the third set, 7-6, and giving the Seminoles the upset victory.

## Hauerlandova Named MWC Player of the Week

• Junior Dita Hauerlandova was named MWC women's tennis player of the week as announced by the conference on March 9. The honor is the first of her career.

Hauerlandova, from Prague, Czech Republic, had an outstanding week in helping the Aztecs win all three matches two weeks ago, including upsets of No. 28 Michigan and No. 8 Washington. The junior won five of her six matches, all at number two, including all three doubles matches with sophomore Alesya Vidov. Against Michigan, Hauerlandova notched a 6-4, 6-1, straight sets win over Kara Delicata and defeated Mugette Ahn of Washington, 3-6, 6-3, 10-0.

## SDSU In The Polls

• After three straight wins and a couple of upsets two weeks ago, the Aztecs made the leap from No. 68 nationally to the 25th-best team in America as announced in last week's ITA poll.

The 43-place jump is the largest since 2002 when it leaped 14 spots, from No. 53 to No. 39, after a victory over No. 41 Kansas State.

SDSU's No. 25 ranking is its highest since being ranked 23rd in the country during the 2003 MWC Championships. In that tournament, the Aztecs beat their three opponents by a combined score of 12-2, took the conference crown and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

## Super Spaeth

• Freshman Nina Spaeth is making a real case for MWC freshman of the year honors. Consider this: she currently owns a seven-match winning streak with a record of 5-1 at No. 5 and a 4-0 record at No. 6., she is 9-1 this spring and 11-2 for the 2004-05 season, and with Sisse Nielsen as her doubles partner, the duo has gone on to post a 6-4 spring record at No. 3.

## Scouting Tulsa

• Tulsa is led by head coach Paige McMurray. A former four-year SDSU letterwinner (1989-93), McMurray (formerly Hammond) guides a young Tulsa team that has only one senior, three juniors, two sophomores and two freshmen on the squad.

The Golden Hurricane have endured a losing streak of four back in February, but have bounced back by splittling its last four contests.

## SDSU Returns Home For a Brief One-Match Homestand Versus No. 29 Virginia Commonwealth

• San Diego State returns home from a 1-2 trip at the Blue/Gray National Tennis Classic in Montgomery, Ala., to play host to 29th-ranked VCU on Saturday.

The Aztecs head into the match with a 5-5 overall record after losing to Rice and Brown and defeating William and Mary at the Blue/Gray over the weekend. The Rams meanwhile have a record of 9-5 after beginning the year winning nine of their first 10 matches. Before Sunday's match, the Rams will take on UCLA Wednesday and San Diego on Saturday.

After Sunday's contest, the Aztecs will not be in action until March 29 when they travel to Santa Barbara during spring break to face Harvard and UC Santa Barbara March 30.

## Weekly Wrap Up

• The Aztecs finished the Blue/Gray National Tennis Classic with a record of 1-2, with their only win coming against William and Mary this past Saturday.

On the first day of the tournament, SDSU drew Rice in an afternoon match that was finished under the lights.

The Aztecs lost the doubles point after Daniel Jung/Markus Dickhardt and Dontia Haynes/Eugenio Romero lost their matches at Nos. 2 and 3.

In singles, Dickhardt won at number three, 6-4, 6-1 over Ben Harknett and Haynes notched a victory over Ralph Knupfer, 6-2, 6-3, at No. 4. But the Aztecs lost matches at one, two and six to lose the match 4-2.

## Stronk Named MWC Player of the Week

• Benedikt Stronk was named Mountain West Conference men's tennis player of the week for the second time this season and his career on March 9.

Stronk won both of his singles and doubles matches last week in a narrow 4-3 loss to No. 21 Washington at Fairbanks Ranch CC. At No. 1 singles, after winning the first set, the junior overcame muscle cramps in the second to upset No. 32 Alex Vlaski, 7-6(5), 7-6(9), and hand him just his second loss of the season. Stronk also teamed with Armando Carrascosa at No. 1 doubles to record SDSU's only doubles win, 8-6, over Daniel Chu-Vlaski.

## Series History vs. VCU

• Since 1996, SDSU and VCU have met three times, with the Rams holding a 2-1 series advantage.

The first meeting came in 2000 during the NCAA Tournament. After SDSU defeated Washington and Pepperdine, it was matched against VCU in the round of 16. The Rams narrowly pulled out the win, 4-3, to move on to the in the tournament.

In 2001, the two schools crossed paths again, this time at the National Team Indoor Championships in Seattle. The 11th-ranked VCU squad got the better of the Aztecs, winning 4-2.

The last meeting came in 2002 in the Blue Gray National Tennis Classic during the first round. That match, as the previous two were, was close, but this time SDSU notched a 4-3 victory.

## SDSU Faces Long Beach State For A Brief Road Trip Sunday

• San Diego State (9-9, 2-5 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) goes on the road again, this time for a single game against Long Beach State, on Sunday at noon.

After enjoying a five-game homestand, with a not-so-enjoyable 3-2 record, SDSU will take on the 49ers in a MPSF game and then heads to Hawaii March 26-30, for the Hawai'i Invitational and a conference game versus the Wahine during spring break.

## Homestand Recap

• At home for the first time in over a month, SDSU played host to five schools, starting with UC Irvine last Thursday.

Sarah Kilgore made four saves in net for the Aztecs and Elana Cervantes (3), Rachel Serna (2) and Becca Ur (2) all scored multiple times in the 10-9 win.

On Saturday morning, No. 1 UCLA rode into town with an undefeated record and added SDSU to the list of teams they steamrolled past, winning 12-3. The Aztecs received a goal apiece from Cia Cobb, Ashley Reta and Ur, while Kilgore stopped eight shots.

Later that afternoon, SDSU dominated Bucknell, 10-4. Both Savanah Kelley and Cervantes recorded hat tricks, while four other Aztecs found the back of the net in the win.

In the fourth game of the five-game homestand, seven Aztecs scored, including Stacy Werner and Dominique Delgado, who notched a pair of goals. Kilgore added 10 saves, but it was not enough as 17th-ranked Cal State Northridge scored five unanswered goals to break the game open to win, 10-9.

Against No. 16 Princeton, nine different Aztecs scored in a 10-7 non-conference win. Cervantes was the lone player to score on two different occasions and Werner chipped in with four steals to lead SDSU to victory.

## Serna Says Score

• Junior driver Rachel Serna leads the team in scoring through 18 games of the 2005 season. So far, Serna has a goal percentage of .443 with her 35 goals in 79 attempts and has netted a goal in 16 of 18 games this season.

In 2004, the Coronado native tallied just 15 goals in 70 attempts. For her career, Serna had 23 goals in her two seasons on Montezuma Mesa.

## Scouting the 49ers

• Long Beach State is currently ranked third in the nation according to the March 9 edition of the top-20 poll and own a record of 12-3 overall and 4-0 in the MPSF.

The 49ers are winners of four consecutive having beat Arizona State, Indiana, Stanford and San Jose State in the process.

Long Beach State is led by head coach Rick Azevedo who has an all-time record of 98-66 in six seasons at the helm.

Azevedo's daughter Cassie Azevedo, is ranked sixth in the nation with 27 goals, behind SDSU's Rachel Serna according to the March 8 national water

polo statistics.

In goal for the 49ers is Bri Hawkins who is eighth in the nation with 98 saves.

## Series History vs. Long Beach State

• The Aztecs hold a 13-9 all-time series advantage against the 49ers. Dating back to last season, Long Beach State has won four of the last five meetings including two straight.

## The Last Time

• The last time these two schools faced-off was at the UCSD Invitational on Feb. 6 in the championship bracket.

The Aztecs found themselves tied at five after three quarters. But the 49ers scored two in the fourth period to claim the 7-6 win. In a losing effort, SDSU received a goal apiece from Savanah Kelley, Stacy Werner, Elana Cervantes, Rachel Serna, Ashley Reta and Becca Ur.

## See-Saw Season

• This season has been so up and down it's comparable to a see-saw. The Aztecs have not won more than two in a row this season and have been winners of two straight only twice this year. They did it to begin the season with victories over Cal State Bakersfield and UC Davis and did it versus Michigan and at Pacific. Besides those two cases, it's been one up and one down for the Aztecs all year long.

## Road Warriors

• Before hosting UC Irvine last Thursday, the Aztecs had never played their first 13 games on the road to start the season. The last time an SDSU team played nearly as many on the road as this year's team has was back in 1999 when it played it first 11 away from America's Finest City. That team went 7-4 in those games, while this team went 6-7.

## Notable Notes

• This past weekend, two noteworthy accomplishments took place...

...Elana Cervantes is now tied with current assistant coach Sara Weyandt (formerly Hanneman) and Casey Finnegan for ninth all-time in school history for assists in a single season. The sophomore from Davis has 27 so far and needs only two more to move into a tie for seventh.

...Savanah Kelley moved ahead of Amber Prestegard on the all-time SDSU career steals list. The junior now ranks seventh in school history. She tied Prestegard against Cal State Northridge and moved ahead with her steal against Princeton.

Here are a couple of things to look for in the coming games...

...Dominique Delgado has 124 steals in her career. She is currently seventh all-time, only four behind Whitney Winlow's 128 (sixth place).

...Delgado also moved into second place for assists in a career at SDSU this season. She has 106 in three-plus seasons and is only 10 behind Prestegard for first all-time.

## SDSU Continues Spring Schedule In Hawaii

After a three-week break, the San Diego State women's golf team continues its spring schedule by heading to Hawaii for the Dr. Thompson Invitational, March 15-16. The tournament will be held in Kaneohe, Hawaii, at the par-72, 5,829-yard Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course. Kaneohe is approximately 12 miles northeast of Honolulu on the island of Oahu.

SDSU will be one of 12 teams in the field, which also includes two teams, No. 22 Washington State and No. 45 USF, ranked in the top 50 in the current *Golfweek/Sagarin* Top 25. Other teams competing include British Columbia, BYU-Hawaii, Hawai'i, Hawaii-Hilo, Middle Tennessee State, Northern Colorado, Osaka University, UTEP and Weber State.

The first 36 holes will be played on Tuesday, with the final 18 holes on Wednesday. A 7:30 a.m. (HT) shotgun start is scheduled for both days.

## Mahalo

The Aztecs will participate in the Dr. Thompson Invitational for the second consecutive season.

A year ago, the Aztecs were the tournament runner-up, finishing with a 54-hole total of 918 (+54). SDSU carded a 302 in the first round, a 299 in the second and finished with a 317 in the final 18 holes.

Then junior Heather MacRae (Dunblane, Scotland) led SDSU with a second-place finish, posting a five-over total of 221. Overall, three Aztecs finished among the top 20 individuals and SDSU placed in the top two in the team standings in a tournament for the third time in 2003-04.

## Fab Five: Aztec Line-Up For This Week

Aztec head coach Felicia Brown will bring the same starting line-up that she used in the spring season opener. Senior Veronica Ojeda (San Diego, Calif.), who sat out the first tournament of 2005 due to injury, will also make the trip and compete as an individual.

Only sophomore Jamie Oliver (Los Alamitos, Calif.) was among the Aztec line-up at the same event a year ago. She finished in a tie for 26th overall with a 238, including a second round two-over 74.

## Rewind: 2005 Bay Area Classic

In its first tournament of the spring season, the San Diego State women's golf team placed ninth at the 2005 Bay Area Classic in San Jose, Calif., Feb. 21-22. The Aztecs shot 328 in both the first and second rounds for a total of 656. Tournament co-host USF rallied to win the team title by one stroke with a 49-over 625 at the par-72, 6,095-yard Golf Club at Boulder Ridge.

Aztec freshman Jackie Kazarian (Dana Point, Calif.) was the team's top finisher with a career-best two round total of 158, including a second round six-over 78. Kazarian tied for 16th in the field of 70 golfers and beat her previous best 36-

hole score by five strokes.

Sophomore Jamie Oliver was SDSU's second-best golfer with an 80 in the first round and a 12-over 84 on day two to tie for 32nd place. Freshman MacKenzie Swecker (Winnemucca, Nev.) had the team's second-best performance in the second round with an 82, while senior Megan Mulhaupt (Trabuco Canyon, Calif.) also improved her first round score by one stroke to finish 25-over 169.

Freshman Anna Booth (Coffs Harbour, Australia) rounded out the Aztec starting five with a 14-over 86 for a 36-hole total of 174.

USF's Joan M. Shimozaki completed the Dons' sweep by earning medalist honors with a 73 Tuesday for a two-round total of six-over 150. Shimozaki was tied with Hawai'i's Dale Gammie, but won on a scorecard playoff after shooting a two-under 34 on the back nine.

## Roster Notes

Aztec senior Cameron MacFarland, who participated in one tournament this past fall, earned her degree in December and will not compete in the spring ... senior Heather MacRae and newcomer freshman Megan McLeod (Fallbrook, Calif.) are not expected to see action in spring 2005 ... this year's spring SDSU roster is at both extremes when it comes to class levels. The Aztecs have four seniors, no juniors, one sophomore and five freshmen.

## New For Spring

After this week's annual trip to Hawaii, the Aztecs stay closer to home, Mar. 21-22, at the University of Oregon tournament in Grand Junction, Ore., followed by a trip to St. George, Utah (April 3-5).

The Mountain West Conference championships are slated for April 21-23 in Sunriver, Ore., which is also the site of this season's NCAA championships (May 17-20). The NCAA West Regionals take place in Las Cruces, N.M., May 5-7.

## Recapping 2003-04

- SDSU made the program's first trip to the NCAA tournament since 2001 and its third trip overall.
- SDSU ended the year ranked No. 40 in the *Golfweek/Sagarin* rankings after placing fourth at the MWC championships.
- SDSU earned their first win in three years during the fall when they set a school record by shooting 878 to win the Lady Aztec Invitational. SDSU has also recorded two runner-up finishes and was in the top four in four of its last five outings.

## Head Coach Felicia Brown

Head coach Felicia Brown is in her third season at the helm of the SDSU golf program after serving as an assistant in 2001-02. A native San Diegan, Brown prepped locally at San Marcos High School before playing collegiately at Arizona.

She is assisted by Doug Barba for the second year in a row.
