### No. 18 Aztec Men's Soccer Looks to Extend Eight-Game Unbeaten Streak; Travels to Washington, Oregon State This Weekend

The San Diego State men's soccer team will put its eight-match unbeaten streak on the line this weekend when it travels to the Pacific Northwest for games against Pac-10 foes Washington and Oregon State. The Aztecs (7-2-2, 3-0-0), who are in sole possession of first place in the Pac-10 and ranked as high as No. 18 by *Soccer America*, will meet the Huskies (5-5-2, 0-2-1 Pac-10) at 5 p.m. Friday before taking on the Beavers (4-7-0, 1-2-0 Pac-10) at 11 a.m. Sunday.

### Scouting the Huskies

Washington is winless in its last four games and 0-2-1 and in sixth place in the Pac-10. Injuries, however, have played a big part in the Huskies' recent struggles. Kevin Forrest, the 2006 Pac-10 Player of the Year and current league leading scorer, was recently diagnosed with a season-ending foot injury. Two other players have had their seasons ended prematurely because of injuries.

Forrest had led the team in scoring with six goals and three assists. Ely Allen (four goals, one assist) and George John (two goals, one assist) have also contributed offensively for Washington. Stephen Fung has stepped in for injured starter Rylan Hawkins and is 3-4-0 with a 1.14 goals against average.

The series is tied, 3-3-3, and has been very close in SDSU's Pac-10 era (since 2005). Last season, the Aztecs won, 1-0, at home and tied, 0-0, in Seattle. In 2005, the teams played to back-to-back 0-0 ties.

### A Look at Oregon State

Oregon State is 1-2-0 in Pac-10 play and in fifth place. The Beavers, however, are coming off an impressive 2-1, overtime win over Washington in Seattle on Friday night. Prior to the start of conference play, Oregon State defeated Loyola (Md.), 1-0, on Sept. 22.

Nick Webb leads the team in scoring with six points on two goals and two assists. Brett Gardner has one goal and two assists, while four others have one goal each. Packy Deenihan has played all 910 minutes in net and has 26 saves and a 1.58 goals against average.

The series between the two schools is tied, 3-3-1. In the Aztecs' Pac-10 era (since 2005), SDSU is 2-1-1, outscoring Oregon State, 7-6. San Diego State is 0-1-1 in Corvallis in the Pac-10 era.

The Aztecs stretched their unbeaten streak to eight games on scores by F Kraig Chiles and MF Khadim Diouf ... The win moved SDSU into sole possession of first place in the Pac-10 and ended Stanford's six-game unbeaten streak ... Diouf got on the board in the eighth minute on a play set up by D Nick Cardenas and MF Evan Toft ... Toft, who was named the Man of the Match, assisted on F Kraig Chiles' tally early in the second half ... The Aztec defense, consisting of Myles Davis, Danny Ortiz, Cardenas, Matt McManus and Raymundo Reza played well in the back once again, limiting the Cardinal to just six shots, two on net, over the 90 minutes ... No Stanford player had more than one shot attempt ... Jorge Rosales played all 90 minutes in net to pick up his first victory and shutout ... Diouf had four shots, Chiles had three attempts and F Jamel Wallace had two ... SDSU's eight-game unbeaten streak is tied for the sixth-longest single-season streak in the program's 39-year history. San Diego State hasn't lost a match since Sept. 7 ... The Aztecs are 5-0-3 in the last eight Pac-10 games and haven't lost a match in league play since Oct. 8, 2006, when they played with 10 men for most of the game in a 2-1 loss to UCLA ... SDSU is off to its best start in Pac-10 play with a 3-0-0 record. The previous two seasons, San Diego State was 1-1-1 (2005) and 2-1-0 (2006) after three contests ... The Aztecs are 5-0-1 following a victory this season, 7-0-0 when scoring first and 5-0-0 when leading at the half.

### SDSU's Kraig Chiles Picks Up Five Honors For Great Weekend

San Diego State's Kraig Chiles (San Diego/Poway HS) has been named the *College Soccer News* National Player of the Week after leading the Aztecs to a pair of victories over nationally ranked opponents over the weekend. Also on Monday, Chiles was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week, and was selected to two national teams - *College Soccer News* and *Top Drawer Soccer* - of the week. On Tuesday, Chiles was named to the *Soccer America* Team of the Week.

A redshirt senior, Chiles scored three goals over the weekend to help SDSU extend its unbeaten streak to eight matches. Chiles scored twice, including the game-winner in the 48th minute, to help San Diego State past No. 8 California, 3-2, on Friday. He added another tally in the 47th minute of the Aztecs' 2-0 win over No. 21 Stanford on Sunday. The victories ended six-game unbeaten streaks by both the Golden Bears and the Cardinal.

Chiles leads the 2007 squad in points (12), goals (five), shots (39), shots on goal (15) and is tied for the lead with two game-winners. He has now started 50 consecutive matches.

Chiles became the third Aztec in four weeks to be named the Pac-10 Player of the Week, joining redshirt sophomore Jamel Wallace (San Diego/Oceanside HS) and redshirt freshman Brad Byrns. The three selections for

SDSU are the more than any other team in the league.

Chiles became the second San Diego State player selected to the *Soccer America* Team of the Week (Brad Byrns was the other), third honored to the *College Soccer News* National Team of the Week (Wallace and Byrns were the others) and the third named to the *Top Drawer Soccer* National Team of the Week (Byrns and freshman Nick Cardenas).

## Unbeatable

SDSU is unbeaten in its last eight games with a 7-0-1 record and has gone over a calendar month without a loss heading into Friday's match at Washington.

San Diego State has outscored its opponents, 13-3, over the eight-game streak and owns an impressive 98-62 shot advantage, including a 44-29 edge on net.

The eight games without a loss in a single season is tied for the sixth-longest unbeaten streak in the program's 39-year history.

Two of the teams - 2005 and 1969 - with longer unbeaten streaks in a season made the NCAA tournament.

## Unbeatable in Pac-10 Play, Too

What might be even more remarkable than the Aztecs' current eight-game unbeaten streak is their eight-game unbeaten streak in Pac-10 play, dating back to last season.

SDSU is 5-0-3 in its last eight conference games. San Diego State's last loss in league action was Oct. 8, 2006, at home against UCLA. In that match, however, senior Raul Bautista was issued his second yellow card late in the first half, forcing SDSU to play with 10 men the final 48:02 of the match. With the one blemish against the Bruins, the Aztecs are 8-1-3 (.792) in their last 12 Pac-10 Conference games.

SDSU is off to a 3-0-0 start in Pac-10 play, its best conference start of its three seasons in the league. The previous two seasons, San Diego State was 1-1-1 (2005) and 2-1-0 (2006) after three contests.

The Aztecs are in sole possession of first place with nine points, three points ahead of second-place California (2-2-0, six points). In the preseason poll conducted by the league's six coaches, SDSU was picked fifth. San Diego State picked up nine points, four behind fourth-place Stanford (13 points). UCLA, the 2006 NCAA runner-ups, received 23 points, including three first-place votes, to lead the preseason poll for the sixth consecutive year.

It should be noted that the Aztecs were selected to finish fourth last season, yet managed a second-place finish with a 5-2-3 league record. In its inaugural season in the Pac-10 in 2005, SDSU was picked last with just five votes, yet wound up fourth.

## SDSU Moving Up in the National Polls

Riding the momentum of a eight-game unbeaten streak, the Aztecs are finally getting recognized in the national polls.

For the first time this season, SDSU is ranked in all five national polls, including as high as No. 18 by *Soccer America*. The Aztecs are also ranked No. 20 by *Top Drawer Soccer*, No. 24 by *Soccer Times* and *College Soccer News*, and No. 25 by NSCAA/adidas.

Each of the previously mentioned rankings are the highest that SDSU has been ranked in their respective poll.

## The Ball Stops Here

The Aztecs surrendered the fewest goals in the Pac-10 in 2005 and gave up the least in league play the following year. After struggling a bit in the beginning of 2007, it looks like the SDSU defense of old is back as it has improved game-by-game.

San Diego State has yielded just 62 shots, 29 on goal, in its eight-game unbeaten streak. The Aztecs allowed four attempts in a win against Fairleigh Dickinson on Sept. 9 and followed that up by giving up one shot on Sept. 15 against Cal State Bakersfield. The lone attempt against the Roadrunners didn't come until the 76th minute.

On Sept. 29, San Diego State allowed just four shots on goal to UC Irvine, a team who came into the match averaging 2.0 goals per game, in a 0-0, double-overtime draw. The Aztecs then followed that up by yielding eight shot attempts against UCLA's powerful offense.

SDSU held Stanford, which came into last weekend leading the league in shots and goals, to just six shots - two on goal - in its 2-0 shutout victory on Sunday.

On the season, San Diego State has six shutouts and has allowed eight or less shot attempts in five of its 11 games and in only three matches - vs. Drake (13), Creighton (22) and Cal (12) - has a team had more than 11 shots.

What's most remarkable about the SDSU defense is that it consists of no seniors. The players who have seen the bulk of the duty in the back include junior Danny Ortiz (11 starts), sophomore Nick Cardenas (11 starts), freshman Raymundo Reza (10 starts) and the combination of junior Myles Davis (eight starts) and first-year sophomore Matt McManus (two starts). Sophomores Jamel Wallace and Steve Beitashour have also helped out in the back for the Aztecs.

## The Air Up There

After being named a Preseason Third-Team All-American by *College Soccer News* earlier this summer, sophomore Nick Cardenas is off to another fine season early in 2007.

Cardenas wasted no time getting onto the scoreboard when he took a pass from classmate Evan Toft and headed the ball into the net to give SDSU a 2-1 lead at Creighton. Although the Aztecs would end up tying the Bluejays, Cardenas proved there will be no sophomore slump in 2007.

On the season, Cardenas is tied for third on the team with six points on two goals and two assists. He has scored his two goals on 10 shots and his .200 shot percentage is the third-highest on the squad. In addition, Cardenas is third on the team with six shots on goal, while putting 60 percent (6-for-10) of his attempts on net.

On Sept. 15, Cardenas was named the *Top Drawer Soccer* National Player of the Week after he helped limit Cal State Bakersfield to just one shot in SDSU's 2-0 shutout on Sept. 13.

In his career, the 6-5 Cardenas has eight goals in just 29 games. All eight of his tallies have been headers.

A 2006 NSCAA/adidas all-Far West second team selection, Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and a *College Soccer News* All-Freshman pick, Cardenas tied for the team lead with six goals, despite being a defender. He started all 18 games he appeared in last season and was a U.S. U-20 National Team Camp call-up in October.

## The Man in the Middle

Senior co-captain Kraig Chiles wasted no time in making his case as one of the top scorers in the Pac-10 once again. The Poway, Calif., native, scored on his first shot attempt of the season against No. 17 Creighton when his free kick from 25 yards found the back of the net 19:15 into the match.

A midfielder, Chiles has led the team in scoring each of the past two seasons, scoring seven times for 14 points in 2005 and following that up with a six goal, four assist (16 points) season in 2006.

This season, Chiles, who has started a current Aztec high 50 straight games, leads the squad with 12 points on five goals and two assists after a huge weekend in home wins over nationally ranked California and Stanford. Chiles scored twice, including the game-winner, in SDSU's 3-2 victory over the Bears on Friday. He then scored a goal in the Aztecs' 2-0 win against Stanford on Sunday. He was rewarded for his efforts when he was named the *College Soccer News* National Player of the Week and Pac-10 Player of the Week. In addition, Chiles was selected to the *College Soccer News* National Team of the Week and *Top Drawer Soccer* National Team of the Week.

Chiles, a two-time all-Pac-10 performer, needs seven goals to tie Aaron Susi (1993-96), Dida Mendes (1979-82) and Vince Bucelli (1979, 1981-82) for ninth on SDSU's all-time leading scoring list.

A clutch performer, 38.9 percent (7-of-18) of Chiles goals have been game-winners, while his four Man of the Match honors are tops on the squad in 2007.



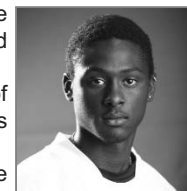

## Back With a Vengeance

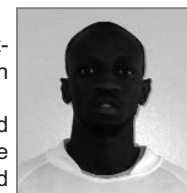
It was much of the same for Diouf in the next game against No. 8 California when he scored the team's second goal of a 3-2 victory in almost the same fashion as his UCLA goal. This time it was senior Freddy McDonald who took the first shot. Diouf pounced on the rebound and ripped a high shot that hit the crossbar and went into the back of the net.

On Sunday against Stanford, Diouf scored the game-winner in a 2-0 Aztec victory on a play set up by Toft and sophomore Nick Cardenas.

On the season, Diouf is second on the squad in points (eight) and goals (four). Diouf is also tied with Kraig Chiles with two-game winning goals.

Another impressive stats is Diouf's efficiency. Diouf has found the back of the net four times of his 13 shots for a 30.8 shot percentage, the highest such mark on the team. In addition, Diouf's 53.8 shots on goal percentage is No. 1 on the squad as seven of his 13 shots have been on net.

Of all the freshmen on the roster, only Raymundo Reza (11 games) has played in more matches than Diouf's eight appearances.
