

## 2003-04 Top Team Notes

- o SDSU is 8-19 overall and 3-11 in conference play, finishing seventh in the MWC for the third straight season ... the Aztecs matched their MWC win total from a year ago, boasting a pair of victories against Air Force and an upset at home of Colorado State for the second straight year.
- o SDSU has committed less turnovers than its opponent in 17 games this season, exceeding its 2002-03 total by four. The total includes a season-low 10 against each of the MWC's top schools in Utah and New Mexico. For the year, the Aztecs currently boast a program-low 455 turnovers, beating the previous record of 494, set by the 1993-94 squad.
- o The Aztecs have set three team records for their shooting from beyond the arc in 2003-04. SDSU tallied a season high for most three-point attempts with 402 (prev. 389 in 1998-99) and tied the mark for most three-pointers made with 124 (also in 2001-02). The Aztecs combined for a record 25 attempts from beyond the arc in the team's home finale against New Mexico on Feb. 28, exceeding the previous high by one.
- o Freshman Courtney Fritz is fifth in the Aztec season record book for three-pointers made (59) fourth in attempts (160) and 10th in percentage (36.9). The guard is already seventh for most three-pointers in a career with 59 ... senior Nicolette McCartney became one of just five Aztecs to record 100 career blocks or more and currently ranks fifth with 106 blocks.
- o The Aztecs have outrebounded their opponents in 10 games after doing so in only five (once in league play) in 27 contests a year ago ... an Aztec has reached double-figures in points in the first half 14 times this season ... an Aztec has scored 20 or more points in a game six times this season.
- o SDSU began the year with three wins in its first four contests, its best start since the 1995-96 season.



► **When & Where:** Wed., March 10, 2004, vs. Utah at 6:00 p.m. MST, Pepsi Center, Denver, Colo.

► **TV/Webcast/Live Stats:** The game will be televised live on Channel 4 San Diego via the MWC TV Network with Beth Mowins, Becky Hammon and Andrea Lloyd Curry making the call. The game will also be broadcast live on the internet with Bill Earley and Dan Lawton calling the action and live stats will be available on www.goaztecs.com.

► **The Records:** For the first time in the conference's five-year history, San Diego State and Utah will square off in both teams' first game of the Mountain West Conference championship. The Aztecs, 8-19 overall and 3-11 MWC, earned the No. 7 seed and will be looking for their first ever MWC tournament victory. The Utes, who enter the game at 22-6 overall and 12-2, are the second seed and shared the regular season league title with New Mexico.

Wednesday's contest is a rematch of both schools' regular season finales last Saturday, which was won by Utah 63-51 in Salt Lake City.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 17-37.

► **Utah Head Coach Elaine Elliott:** Elliott is in her 21st season at Utah and owns a school and career record of 435-177.

► **Utah Series History:** Utah leads the series, 19-10 (Last: Utah def. SDSU, 63-51, in Salt Lake City, 3/6/04).

## SDSU Opens 2004 Mountain West Conference Championship With Utah Wednesday

The San Diego State women's basketball team will look for its first-ever victory at the Mountain West Conference Championship, starting Wednesday against Utah at 6 p.m. (MST) at the Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo. The Aztecs earned the tournament's No. 7 seed for the fourth straight year and will face the No. 2 seed Utes, who shared the league's regular season title with New Mexico.

Wednesday's game is a rematch of both teams' regular season finales last Saturday, as the Utes came away with a 63-51 victory in Salt Lake City. The two sides will be meeting in conference tournament action for the first time since 1997, when SDSU beat Utah in the Western Athletic Conference title game, 56-50.

On Thursday night, the Aztecs erased an 11-point second half deficit to tie the score at 38, but was unable to complete the comeback, falling 56-45 to host Brigham Young at the Marriott Center.

Junior **Candace Mattson (Alpine, Utah)**, making her first career start in an MWC game, played a career best 38 minutes, falling just one rebound short of her first double-double with 13 points and team game-high nine rebounds. Freshman **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)** was the only other Aztec in double-figures, scoring 13 points with three, three-pointers. Sophomore **Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.)** added eight points and seven rebounds.

Two days later, SDSU owned a 13-point first-half lead and was up by five points going into the locker room, but was unable to get the upset, falling to Utah 63-51 to close out the regular season.

Freshman **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** made four three-pointers and had a team best 16 points. Classmate Michelle Elliott added three more from beyond the arc and ended up with 13 points for her 20th game in double-figure scoring in 2003-04. Junior Candace Mattson had seven points and a career best 12 rebounds, becoming the first Aztec other than Ashlee Dunlap to reach double-figures in rebounding in a game this year.

### Other Road Trip Notes

Against Utah, SDSU failed to go to the free-throw line until the 1:52 mark of the second half and missed on its only attempt, as the Utes made 22 trips to the charity stripe ... the Aztecs matched its season high for three-pointers in a game with nine (also vs. CS Fullerton) ... Sophomore **Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.)** matched a team season high with five steals at Utah ... Ashlee Dunlap's streak of 52 consecutive starts came to an end at BYU when she was not among the Aztecs' starting five ... SDSU boasted a better field-goal percentage than both of its opponents ... the Aztecs played four of its final six regular season games on the road for the fourth time in the MWC's five-year history.

### New Venue - New Beginning?

The Mountain West Conference championship will take place at the Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo., for the first time in the league's five-year history. Las Vegas and Thomas & Mack Arena served as the tournament's site each of the last four years. SDSU's last five conference tournament appearances have been in Las Vegas, including a trip in 1997, in which the Aztecs won the WAC title with victories over New Mexico, Hawai'i and Utah.

The Pepsi Center will also be used for the MWC tournament in 2005 and 2006.

### San Diego State Tournament Tidbits

- ▶ In its history, San Diego State has played in a total of 16 postseason conference tournaments in four different leagues - Pacific Coast Athletic, Big West, Western Athletic, Mountain West.
- ▶ The Aztecs have played a total of 28 games in those conference tournaments and own a 14-14 (.500) record.
- ▶ San Diego State has captured two conference championships, winning both the 1995 and '97 WAC Tournaments. SDSU has won at least two games on three other occasions.
- ▶ San Diego State has failed to win its first-round game just four times since 1991, falling to New Mexico in the opening session of the 2000, 2001, 2002 and 2003 MWC Tournaments. Still, the Aztecs have fared well in first-round games and own a 9-8 (.529) record.
- ▶ SDSU brings a three-game losing streak into this year's Mountain West Championships. The Aztecs have not posted a postseason victory since winning the 1997 Western Athletic Conference Tournament.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 6-7 all-time in conference tournament games against current Mountain West Conference members, including a 1-2 mark against Utah.
- ▶ Although this is his second trip to a conference tournament as a head coach, Jim Tomey helped lead the SDSU men's squad to the MWC title in 2002 in his third season as an collegiate assistant.

### At Stake For State

▶ The Aztecs will be looking for their first Mountain West Conference Tournament victory. SDSU has lost in the first round of each of the first four MWC Championships and hasn't won a post-season contest since 1997. San Diego State did not qualify for either the 1998 nor 1999 Western Athletic Conference Tournaments.

### Utah Tid-Bits

Utah is coming off a 1-1 week with a victory over SDSU and a loss to UNLV ... the Utes shared the MWC regular season title with New Mexico as both finished with 12-2 league records ... Utah saw its 27-game home winning streak come to an end in overtime versus the Lady Rebels on Thursday ... Utah has claimed at least a share of the regular season conference title in eight of the last nine years, including four times in MWC history ... the Utes are 5-3 all-time in MWC tournament games, falling in the first round once (2001-02) and the semifinals twice (both to BYU) ... Utah won the inaugural MWC championship in 1999-2000 against BYU ... the Utes returned all five starters from a year ago, including 2003 MWC player and newcomer of the year Kim Smith, who averages a team high 15.4 ppg. and 7.5 rpg. ... Smith is helped by Shona Thorburn, who chips in 11.6 points per contest ... Ute Lana Sitterud is a former high school teammate of Aztec Candace Mattson at Lone Peak HS in Highland, Utah.

### San Diego State-Utah Series Shorts

► Wednesday's game will be the 30th all-time between the Aztecs and Utes and the fourth time the two teams have squared off at a neutral site ... it will be the first meeting in MWC tournament action.

► San Diego State has faced Utah more than any other MWC opponent.

► SDSU's last win in the series was a 56-50 victory in the 1997 WAC Tournament title game ... the win was also the Aztecs' last in a conference tournament contest.

► SDSU dropped two WAC tournament games against Utah, falling in 1993 (74-56) and in 1995 (64-57) ... the 1993 contest was played in the Utes' home gym, while the 1995 game was for the WAC tournament title.

► A win will give the Aztecs at least one victory over each of the Mountain West Conference schools since the league was formed.

► Utah head coach Elaine Elliott is 18-9 versus SDSU, while Jim Tomey is 0-4 against Utah.

### San Diego State-Utah Take One Notes

-San Diego State stuck to its defensive game plan, holding Utah to just 21 first-half points, but were unable to match that effort on the offensive end, falling to the visiting Utes, 56-29.

- The Utes, ninth nationally in scoring defense, held the Aztecs to 19 percent shooting from the floor.

- Michelle Elliott and sophomore Veronica Shaw led the Aztecs in scoring with eight points each and sophomore Ashlee Dunlap grabbed nine rebounds.

- Utah was led offensively by Kim Smith, who tallied 16 points and 13 rebounds.

### On The Top Of Turnovers

SDSU has committed less turnovers than its opponent in 17 games this season, exceeding its 2002-03 total by four. For the year, the Aztecs currently boast a program-low 455 turnovers, beating the previous record of 494, set by the 1993-94 squad.

SDSU had a season low 10 turnovers against the conference's top two squads in New Mexico on Feb. 28, and Utah on Feb. 5. The 10 turnovers are the fewest by an Aztec squad in a game since the 1996-97 campaign. That team had 10 turnovers or less in a game three times with the most recent being the WAC tournament game on March 7, 1997, versus Hawai'i when SDSU had exactly 10.



### On The Line

With the conclusion of the MWC regular season, San Diego State opponents went to the free-throw line 107 more times than the Aztecs, making 292 trips to SDSU's 185. The total includes a season low one trip to the charity stripe last Saturday at Utah and two attempts in a three-point loss to New Mexico on Feb. 28. The Aztecs have failed to record a free throw in a game just five times in program history with three of those coming in the last two seasons against MWC schools.

To put it in perspective, SDSU went to the line 177 times less than UNLV, which led the conference with 362 attempts in the 14 MWC games in 2004. New Mexico had the second-fewest free throw attempts with 212, still 27 more times than the Aztecs.

San Diego State went to the charity stripe more times than its opponent in just three MWC games, owning a 18-9 margin versus Utah, an 18-13 mark at Wyoming and a 20-16 advantage versus Air Force.

Aztec opponents own a smaller advantage in overall games at 538-450. A year ago, the Aztecs took 84 fewer free throws than their opponents and 43 less in MWC contests.

### Three-Ball

San Diego State has continued its recent onslaught from beyond the arc, making 36 threes in its last six outings, after making only five in its previous four outings.

Courtney Fritz has led the way, accounting for almost half of the team's total with 17 on 42 opportunities. **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)**, who started the season just 3-for-26, has made six of her last 12, while Michelle Elliott has nine three's all in the last three games.

Candace Mattson has tallied a three-pointer in each of the team's last three games after making only one earlier this season in the team's second game versus Nevada.

Overall, six Aztecs have made at least one three-pointer in 2003-04, combining for 124 on 402 attempts.

### A Rain Of Threes

The Aztecs have set three team records for their shooting from three-point land in 2003-04. SDSU tallied a season high for most three-point attempts with 402 (prev. 389 in 1998-99) and tied the mark for most three-pointers made with 124 (also in 2001-02).

The Aztecs combined for a record 25 attempts from beyond the arc in the team's home finale against New Mexico on Feb. 28, exceeding the previous high by one.

In all, SDSU has attempted 20 or more three-point shots in four games, including each of its last three outings heading into the MWC tournament.

### Fritz For Three

Aztec freshman Courtney Fritz continued to add to her season three-point total with a combined 5-for-13 performance in Utah last week. Fritz was held without a trey during the team's three-game home-stand from Feb. 5-14, but has made 17-of-42 since.

With her four three-pointers against Utah, the freshman remained in the fifth place slot on the Aztec single-season list with 59. She needs four

more to move up a spot past Falisha Wright's 1994 season total of 62.

Fritz's eight three-point attempts Saturday also moved her up in that category, jumping from sixth to start the week all the way to fourth. She needs 14 more tries to secure third place, going past Jamey Cox, who had 174 in 2000.

Fritz is also 10th in SDSU single-season history for three-point percentage with a 36.9 mark.

For the season, the Oregon native has made at least one three in 22 of 27 games, including a span of 13 straight from Dec. 10 to Jan. 31.

## More About The Three

Not only has she moved up in the season books, Courtney Fritz has already etched her name in the Aztec career list for three-pointers. Fritz is seventh overall and trails Ashonda Williams (2002-03) for the No. 6 spot by just two.

Fritz's classmate Michelle Elliott has 36 this season and with two more treys can also be among the top 10.

## Seeing Double

After a three-game dry-spell, Michelle Elliott has reached double-figures in scoring in six of her last eight outings, bringing her season total in that category up to a team best 20.

For the season, Elliott is SDSU's leading scorer with 12.5 ppg., a stat that ranks her eighth overall and first among freshmen in the Mountain West Conference.

## .500 or above

SDSU has made 50 percent or more of its shots from the field three times this season, with the most recent time being against UNLV on Feb. 14. The Aztecs also hit the even mark against Cal State Fullerton (.563) and Santa Clara (.519).

In its 14 conference outings, San Diego State made 40 percent or more of its shots from the field seven times, but only had three wins to show for it.

## A Force In The First Half

Fourteen times this season, an Aztec player has reached double-figures in points in the first half. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap has led the charge, tallying 10 or more points in the first half six times. Freshmen Michelle Elliott and Courtney Fritz are close behind with double-figures in four games.

bined to score 20 or more points in a game seven times.

Dunlap and Elliott became the first Aztecs other than Jamey Cox to reach the milestone since Atim Otii had 21 points against New Mexico at the MWC championships on March 7, 2001. SDSU also had two, 20-point scorers in one game for the first time since Cox and Claire Swinbank scored 24 and 20, respectively, against UNLV on Feb. 24, 2001.

#### Double-Double

Ashlee Dunlap has 11 double-doubles in 2003-04, one more than she had last season and tied for second in the MWC with UNLV's RanDee Henry. The pair trail leader UNLV's Sherry McCracklin, who has 12.

Dunlap is still in her third place spot in Mountain West Conference career history with the 21 double-doubles. Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the MWC record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23 and McCracklin, a junior, is one behind Dunlap with 20.

A year ago, Dunlap had a conference best 10 double-doubles in 27 games as a freshman.

#### A.D. On The Boards

Ashlee Dunlap has tallied double-figures in rebounding 12 times overall in 2003-04, tying her for the MWC lead. For her career, the sophomore has 23 double-figure rebounding performances in her 54 career games and has tallied nine boards in five others.

#### McCartney Reaches The Century Mark

Senior Nicolette McCartney became the fifth player in SDSU history to log 100 career blocks, reaching the milestone against BYU on Feb. 7. McCartney is in fifth place in the Aztec record book with 106 blocks, and is eight away from moving up another notch, passing Jessica Haynes' 114 blocks.

#### The Full 40

Only two Aztecs have logged all 40 minutes in a game this season. Freshman Michelle Elliott has played the full 40 six times, including three straight games from Feb. 7-19. Classmate Courtney Fritz is the only other SDSU player to turn the trick, doing so versus Air Force on Feb. 26. A year ago, five different players went the distance, including former standout Jamey Cox (seven times) and current team members Dunlap (three) and Nicolette McCartney (once).

#### Bucking A Trend

In 2003-04, San Diego State has posted a 6-1 record when finishing with more assists than its opponent. The lone blemish is a 14-10 margin in the Aztecs' loss to UNLV on Feb. 14.

Individually, however, an Aztec has had four or more assists in a game in nine of the team's last 16 outings, a trend that occurred only three times in SDSU's first 11 contests.

#### Out Of Nowhere

After shooting just 27.8 percent (5-for-18) from the line against Air Force earlier this season, San Diego State did a complete 360, hitting a season high 85 percent or 17-of-20 free throws against the Falcons on Feb. 26.

The Aztecs have shot above the 80 percent mark from the foul line two other times early in year against Nevada (.826 - 19-for-23) and at Cal State Northridge (.846 - 22-for-26).

**The 85 percent mark versus Air Force is the team's best-ever performance at the line in Mountain West Conference play (5 seasons).** In fact, SDSU has made 80 percent or more of its free throws in a regular season MWC game just two other times versus Wyoming in 2001 (.818) and against Air Force (.806) in 2002.

In overall games, the 85 percent mark is the team's best percentage at the charity stripe since a 6-for-7 performance (.857) at Missouri-Kansas City on Dec. 20, 2001.

#### In The Beginning

SDSU put together a three-game win streak earlier this season for the first time since the 2001-02 campaign ... the Aztecs won three of their first four games of the season, their best start since 1995-96.

#### Other Aztec Notes

- SDSU has just 10 active players on its roster with freshmen **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** and **Jordie Smith (Ft. Collins, Colo.)** both out due to injury.
- The Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent in 10 games this year after doing so only five times (once in league play) in 27 outings in 2002-03
- SDSU has held four opponents to 20 points or less in the first half ... an Aztec opponent has scored 20 points or less six times in either the first or second half.



## Game No. 2 New Mexico 55 San Diego State 49

**LAS VEGAS, Nev.** - San Diego State brought its defensive "A" game but was frustrated on the offensive end all afternoon as the Aztecs were edged by eventual WNIT runner-up New Mexico, 55-49, in a nip-and-tuck first-round game at the 2001 Mountain West Tournament.

Atim Oti scored a game- and season-high 21 points and graduating senior Sophia Sledge went out in style, adding a season-best 17 for San Diego State.

Three players finished in double figures for New Mexico, paced by Miranda Sanchez's 15 points.

The Aztecs used a stingy defensive effort to take a 21-19 lead at intermission after forcing 14 Lobo turnovers and holding New Mexico to just 8-for-23 shooting from the field in the first half.

New Mexico, which got 12 points each from Jordan Adams and Molly McKinnon, broke out of its offensive woes coming out of the break, however, opening the period with a 10-0 run and holding SDSU without a point for the first 6:13 of the period.

SDSU, which never trailed by more than eight points, kept things close and sliced UNM's lead to just 48-47 following Sledge's fourth 3-pointer with 31 seconds to play.

But that's as close as the Aztecs would get as New Mexico scored seven of the game's final nine points.

## Game No. 3 New Mexico 65 San Diego State 52

**LAS VEGAS, Nev.** - SDSU gave No. 2-seeded New Mexico all it wanted for 37 minutes but the Lobos pulled away down the stretch to defeat the Aztecs, 65-52, in the opening game of the 2002 MWC championship.

San Diego State (10-18, 2-12 MWC), the tournament's No. 7 seed, led for much of the first half and was down by just 32-27 at intermission. But the Aztecs struggled out of the gate after the break, allowing New Mexico to build a 14-point lead with just under seven minutes to go before rallying to make the game close.

Tanisha Knight connected on consecutive back-to-back possessions and Claire Swinbank hit three straight free throws and a field goal to spark a 9-0 Aztec run that closed the Lobo's edge to just 50-45 with three minutes left.

But San Diego State could draw no closer as the Lobos sank 11-of-13 attempts from the stripe as time wound down to keep the Aztecs at bay.

Swinbank tied for game-high scoring honors with 16 points and Jamey Cox added 12. Knight finished with 11 points before fouling out.

Three other Aztecs would end up leaving the game after fouling out, including Atim Oti, who played just 13 minutes.

Jordan Adams scored 16 points to pace New Mexico (22-7, 10-4 MWC), which out-rebounded SDSU, 44-25. The Lobos also finished the game a combined 18-for-24 from the free throw line.

**LAS VEGAS, Nev.** - Despite a furious second-half rally, San Diego State was knocked out of the first round of the Mountain West Conference Championships by New Mexico for the third straight season, falling 54-49.

SDSU came out of the game with the hot hand, racing out to a 4-0 lead and then a 6-1 advantage in the first two minutes.

New Mexico jumped ahead for the first time at 9-8 and led by 12 points, 34-22, going into the locker room.

SDSU grabbed the early momentum in the second half by scoring five straight buckets to get to within one at 34-33.

The Aztecs held New Mexico off the scoreboard for the first five-and-a-half minutes until Mandi Moore made her third three-pointer of the game at 37-33. The two schools then traded baskets with the Lobo lead never reaching more than seven points until Chelsea Grear's rebound basket but her team up 52-43.

SDSU rallied to pull within four points with less than a minute remaining, but were unable to pull off the upset, falling 54-49.

Despite the loss, San Diego State committed a season-low 11 turnovers and three Aztecs played all 40 minutes of the game, while another logged 39.

Moore led her team with 15 points, while leading scorer Jordan Adams was held to just seven points, three of which came at the line.
