#### **AZTEC HEADLINES**

- San Diego State will play its final road contest of the 2013 calendar year on Tuesday when it travels to the Lone Star State to face No. 23 Texas A&M at Reed Arena in College Station, Texas, beginning at 7 p.m. CT (5 p.m. PT).
- The Aztecs rallied from a nine-point deficit to post a 71-67 triumph at UC Santa Barbara on Saturday as Stacie Terry collected her first career head coaching victory.
- SDŚU was led by senior Cierra Warren, who registered 21 points on 9-of-10 shooting and pulled down a game-high seven rebounds against the Gauchos.
- With her performance, Warren captured Mountain West Player of the Week honors, marking the first time this year an Aztec received such distinction.
- San Diego State also received important contributions off the bench from sophomore Deidra Smith, who tallied a career-high 12 points in just 12 minutes, while freshman Ariell Bostick (11 pts) and Deajanae Scurry (10 pts) finished with double-digit scoring totals as well.
- SDSU will be making its first trip to the state of Texas since February of 2012 when it fell to TCU by a 58-39 count in Fort Worth.

#### #AztecWBB Travels to Lone Star State to Face No. 23 Texas A&M

Fresh off its come-from-behind victory at UC Santa Barbara last Saturday, San Diego State continues its road swing on Tuesday when it locks horns with Texas A&M, starting at 7 p.m. CT (5 p,m. PT). Links to live audio and live stats will be available on www.goaztecs.com.

The Aggies are the second ranked opponent the Aztecs will face in the last three games after falling to then-No. 19/14 South Carolina at home on Nov. 30.

SDSU is winless against Texas A&M in three all-time meetings, which have all been contested in San Diego, including a tough 75-72 overtime loss in the second round of the 1994 NCAA West Regionals at Peterson Gym. The Aggies also posted a 96-52 victory in their last visit to The Mesa in 2010 to claim the San Diego Surf 'N Slam title. Later that season, Texas A&M went on to capture the national championship.

The Aztecs, who are 6-9 overall against current members of the Southeasern Conference, last defeated an SEC team a year ago when they downed Auburn 78-57 in the opener of the OMNI Hotels Classic on Nov. 23, 2012, in Boulder, Colo.

#### **Scouting the Aggies**

No. 23 Texas A&M (4-2) finished with a 1-2 mark at the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam over the Thanksgiving weekend to slip 12 places from the 11th spot in the latest AP rankings. The Aggies opened with a 69-59 victory over Memphis, before suffering a 69-58 upset at the hands of Texas, followed by 78-63 setback to Syracuse on Saturday.

Against the Orange in the finale, sophomore guard Courtney Walker scored a career-high 26 points to earn a spot on the Paradise Jam Reef Division all-tournament team, while junior forward Achiri Ade added 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds in the loss.

Walker, a preseason all-SEC first-team selection, leads Texas A&M so far this year with 14.7 points per game, while Ade (11.5 ppg) and senior center Karla Gilbert (10.5 ppg) have also recorded double-digit scoring averages. In addition, Gilbert tops the squad in rebounding (8.5/gm) and field-goal percentage (.571), while sophomore guard Jordan Jones has contributed a team-best 4.7 assists and 2.0 steals per game.

Through six games, the Aggies are shooting a collective 42.7 percent from the field, including a 25.6 percent clip from three-point territory and 73.3 percent from the foul line. Defensively, Texas A&M is limiting the opposition to 35 percent of its field-goal attempts, while maintaining a  $\pm$ 3.0 rebounding advantage and a  $\pm$ 2.3 turnover margin.

Now in his 11th year, head coach Gary Blair has compiled a 241-102 record at the helm of the Aggie program, highlighted by a national championship in 2011. Blair, a two-time national finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award, has directed Texas A&M to eight consecutive NCAA tournament appearances and four conference titles, including the 2013 SEC tournament championship. Prior to his arrival on the College Station campus, Blair coached at Stephen F. Austin for eight years from 1985-93, followed by a 10-year run at Arkansas from 1993-2003. He needs just one win to become the 19th coach to reach 650 Division I career victories.

Stacie Terry coached against Texas A&M twice as an assistant at LSU, with each side winning on the opposing court during the 2012-13 SEC regular-season slate. The Aggies came away with 74-57 triumph in Baton Rouge on Feb. 4, before the Lady Tigers turned the tables with a 67-52 victory at College Station a month later on March 3.

#### With a Victory...

An SDSU win over Texas A&M on Tuesday will mean:

- The Aztecs post their first victory over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 18 DePaul in the opening game of the Rainbow Wahine Classic on Nov. 18, 2011, in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- SDSU wins in the Lone Star State for the first time since recording a 64-55 upset over No. 10 West Virginia during the second round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament in Austin.
- The Aztecs even the all-time series at one game apiece.
- SDSU improves to 7-9 against Southeastern Conference members.
- The Aztecs raise their record to 32-10 in December games played since the 2006-07 campaign.

#### Warren Tabbed MW Player of the Week

Senior Cierra Warren (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her dominating performance in the Aztecs' 71-67 victory at UC Santa Barbara, the league office announced Monday.

With her award, the SDSU center garnered her first career weekly conference accolade and the first for an Aztec player this season.

Against UCSB last Saturday, Warren scored a team-high 21 points on 9-of-10 (.900) shooting from the floor and a 2-for-2 effort at the free-throw line. She also added one assist, one block and a steal to help SDSU notch its first win of the season.

In the second half, Warren tallied 11 straight points, including the first three-point basket of her career, during a 22-9 run that overturned a 42-33 deficit and catapulted SDSU into the lead for good at 55-51. She also secured the game-clinching rebound after the Gauchos missed a potential game-tying three-pointer with nine seconds remaining in the contest.

With her totals, Warren logged her third 20-plus point performance in just four games played this season, as well as the 15th double-digit scoring effort of her career. For the season, she is averaging 18.8 points per game and shooting a robust 70.2 percent from the floor on 33 of 47 field-goal attempts.

#### **Dissecting the Slow Start**

The fact that San Diego State sits at 1-4 for the first time since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

- ► Turnovers The Aztecs are committing an average of over nine turnovers more per game (24.4-15.0) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 129-64 advantage in points off turnovers.
- ▶ Offensive Rebounds The Aztecs are getting outrebounded on the offensive glass by an average margin of 15.8-8.0 during the first five games. As a result, SDSU's foes own a collective 75-36 advantage in second-chance points this year.
- ▶ Experience The Aztecs' starting lineup against UCSB featured five players who have combined for just 25 starts in an SDSU uniform prior to last Saturday. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, three of the Aztecs' four losses have come by a scant 11 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, overcoming a nine-point deficit at UCSB and nearly rallying from a pair of 19-point deficits at Sacramento State and USC. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sac State and against San Diego, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

#### The Last Time Out - SDSU at UC Santa Barbara

San Diego State received double-digit scoring totals from four players and overcame a nine-point deficit early in the second half to fuel a 71-67 road win over UC Santa Barbara last Saturday at The Thunderdome.

Senior Cierra Warren led the Aztecs (1-4) with 21 points on 9-for-10 shooting and pulled down a game-high seven rebounds, while sophomore Deidra Smith added career-best 12 points on 5-of-6 field goal attempts as Stacie Terry picked up her first career victory as a head coach.

In addition, the SDSU cause was aided by freshman Ariell Bostick, who contributed 11 points, including five clutch free throws in the second half, while sophomore Deajanae Scurry registered 10 points, six rebounds and two steals

As a team, SDSU shot a blistering 65.9 percent from the floor, connecting on 27 of 41 shots, including a 70.6 percent clip (12-17) in the second half, while sinking 15 of 20 foul shots to help snap a four-game losing streak.

Still, the Gauchos (3-3) gave the Aztecs everything they could handle and more as the two sides battled through 16 lead changes and seven ties. UCSB drained nine three-pointers on the afternoon, including six in the first half to build a 39-33 lead by intermission.

Nicole Nesbit led all players with 22 points, including a 5-for-8 effort from beyond the arc, while Destini Mason (20 pts) and Melissa Zornig (14 pts) finished in double figures for the Gauchos as well.

With the Aztecs trailing 16-14, Scurry hit a pair of jumpers during a 12-2 run that put the visitors up 26-18 by the 7:38 mark of the first half. However, a free throw by Onome Jemerigbe and consecutive three-pointers by Zornig and Nesbit sparked a 21-7 Gaucho outburst to close out the period.

SDSU committed five turnovers during that stretch, while UCSB sank 6-of-9 shots from the floor, including a Mason triple just before the halftime buzzer.

Following the break, Nesbit added to the Aztecs woes by draining another trey, which provided the host school with its biggest lead of the contest at 42-33 and forced a quick SDSU timeout with just 23 seconds elapsed in the second half.

The sideline huddle seemed to spark the Aztecs, who promptly reeled off six straight points on a pair of Smith baskets sandwiched around a layup by senior Danesha Long to pull within 42-39 at the 17:37 mark.

Mi'Chael Wright converted an old-fashioned three-point play on the Gauchos next possession, but SDSU answered with a pivotal 21-11 surge over the ensuing 10 minutes as a banked triple by junior Ahjalee Harvey provided the Scarlet and Black a 60-53 cushion with 7:37 left. Warren scored 11 straight points during the run, including her first career three-pointer, while UCSB misfired on five straight shots.

Following a media timeout, the Gauchos scored two quick buckets on a Nesbit triple and a Jemerigbe layup to trim the deficit to two at 60-58 with 5:31 remaining. However, the Aztecs kept UCSB at bay and eventually reclaimed a seven-point advantage at 69-62 after Bostick converted an and-one opportunity with just 1:34 left.

Still, the Gauchos managed to make things interesting down the stretch as a quick three-pointer by Zornig and a basket by Nesbit inched the hosts closer at 69-67 with 55 seconds to go. The two teams then traded possessions before Bostick and Harvey each sank one of two free throws during the final 19 seconds to secure the victory. In the interim however, the SDSU faithful was on the edge of its seats as a potential game-tying three-pointer by Nesbit from the top of the key went

#### Noting the UC Santa Barbara Game

- The Aztecs' .659 field-goal percentage against the Gauchos marked the second time the team shot over .600 for a single game this season after posting a .623 clip at Sacramento State on Nov. 10. SDSU surpassed the .600 plateau in a single game just twice between 2000 and 2013.
- The Aztecs improved to 12-1 in their last 13 meetings against Big West Conference foes.
- SDSU raised its record to 16-6 all-time against UCSB, including a 6-4 mark in Santa Barbara, after winning at The Thunderdome for the first time since Feb. 24, 1990.
- The SDSU bench outscored the UCSB reserves 38-7.
- The Aztecs were whistled for just 11 fouls last Saturday, their lowest total since finishing with 10 against Nevada in the MW tournament last March.

#### **#AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLIs**

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on Max-Preps all-state first team.

'Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a threestar recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A threetime all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a teambest 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6

assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players.'

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

#### **Noting the Newcomers**

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12

#### **Meet the New Staff**

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa. Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

#### **Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors**

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

#### **Basketball Performance Center On the Docket**

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

#### What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.

#### Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists

The Aztecs will be look to exact a measure of revenge after dropping a 66-52 decision to the Bruins at Pauley Pavilion in the 2012-13 season-opener. San Diego State will remain in "America's Finest City" until Jan. 8, when it travels to Boise State in the second game of Mountain West conference play.

### **STACIE TERRY**

### Head Coach First Season Texas-Arlington (1999)

tacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing careerat Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
