AZTEC HEADLINES

- Following a week off, San Diego State returns to action on Saturday when it hits the road to battle UC Santa Barbara at The Thunderdome.
- The Aztecs are coming off an 88-54 setback at the hands of then-No. 19/14 South Carolina on Nov. 23 to close off a two-game homestand.
- For the second straight game, SDSU was led by junior Erimma Amarikwa, who finished with a season-best 15 points on 7-of-11 shooting.
- The Aztecs also received a double-digit scoring effort from junior Ahjalee Harvey, who logged 10 points in a season-high 34 minutes.
- After a 14-year hiatus in the all-time series, SDSU met UCSB last season in the opening round of the WNIT, with the Aztecs posting a 69-46 triumph at Viejas Arena.
- With that victory, SDSU logged its 11th win in its last 12 outings against Big West Conference foes and improved to 15-6 against the Gauchos all-time.
- Despite the wobbly start, SDSU is 17th in the nation entering this week with a .475 field-goal percentage. Individually, senior Cierra Warren ranks 10th in that statistic after connecting on 64.9 percent of her shots from the field (24-37).

#AztecWBB Heads North to Tackle UC Santa Barbara on Saturday

Still searching for its first victory of the 2013-14 campaign, San Diego State returns to the hardwood following a week-long break for Thanksgiving when it travels north to face UC Santa Barbara on Saturday, Nov. 30, starting at 2 p.m. PT. Links to live audio and streaming video will be available on www.goaztecs.com.

The Aztecs will be looking avoid their first five-game losing streak since February of 2008, when they dropped five in a row during Mountain West play. SDSU has not started a season with an 0-5 record since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign.

SDSU sports a 15-6 record against UCSB all-time, including a 5-4 mark in Santa Barbara. However, the two sides have not met at The Thunderdome since Jan. 2, 1999, when the Gauchos emerged with a 78-50 victory.

The Aztecs are 95-83 overall against current members of the Big West Conference, including a 11-1 mark in their last 12 meetings against that league dating back to the 2007-08 campaign. SDSU's only loss to a Big West opponent during that stretch was a narrow 68-66 defeat to UC Irvine at Viejas Arena on Nov. 23, 2010.

Scouting the Gauchos

UCSB raised its record to 3-2 on the year after collecting a 66-62 victory over Hampton at home on Tuesday night. The Gauchos nearly let an 11-point lead slip away in that contest after the visiting Lady Pirates jumped in front 60-58 with 2:14 left. However, senior Destini Mason converted an and-one opportunity, while fellow classmate Nicole Nesbit followed with four straight free throws to help secure the victory.

Nesbit, who received all-Big West honorable mention a year ago, and Mason are UCSB's primary scoring threats this season. Nesbit leads the Gauchos with 16.4 points per game, followed closely by Mason (16.0 ppg), who tops the squad with 7.0 rebounds per outing. In addition, senior Melissa Zornig (11.2 ppg) has posted a double-digit scoring average to go with a team-best 4.0 assists per game.

As a team, UCSB is shooting 43.1 percent from the floor, including a 26.7 percent clip from beyond the three-point arc and 72.8 percent from the free-throw line. The Gauchos have been especially adept at taking care of the ball this season, averaging just 11.0 turnovers per game entering the week, which ranks sixth nationally, while their +8.25 turnover margin is currently 11th in the country.

Now in her third year, head coach Carlene Mitchell has racked up a 36-35 record at the helm of UCSB program, highlighted by a Big West tournament title and an NCAA appearance in 2012. Prior to her arrival on the Isla Vista campus, Mitchell served as an assistant for 10 seasons at Rutgers, including the final three as associate head coach under the tutelage of Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer.

A starting point guard at her alma mater Kansas State during her senior season in 1995-96, Mitchell also held assistant coaching positions at UMKC, Western Illinois and Oklahoma State before moving on to Rutgers.

Stacie Terry has coached against UCSB three times during her career. At the start of Terry's first season at Louisville in 2000, the Cardinals fell to the Gauchos 78-67 in the first round of the Time Warner Classic in Lincoln, Neb. During her tenure at UCLA, however, the Bruins emerged victorious in a pair of home-and-home dates during the 2009-10 and 2010-11 campaigns.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over UC Santa Barbara on Saturday will mean:

- Stacie Terry picks up her first career head coaching victory.
- The Aztecs raise their record to 16-6 all-time against the Gauchos.
- SDSU improves to 12-1 in its last 13 games against current members of the Big West Conference.
- SDSU evens its record at 28-28 in regular-season games played in November dating back to the 2003-04 campaign.

Dissecting the Slow Start

The fact that San Diego State sits at 0-4 for the first time since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

► **Turnovers** - The Aztecs are committing an average of over 10 turnovers more per game (25.8-14.3) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 109-47 advantage in points off turnovers.

► **Offensive Rebounds** - The Aztecs are getting outrebounded on the offensive glass by an average margin of 17.8-8.8 during the first four games. As a result, SDSU's foes own a collective 65-28 advantage in second-chance points this year.

► **Experience** - The Aztecs' starting lineup against South Carolina featured four of five players who have combined for just 18 starts in an SDSU uniform prior to last Saturday. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, the Aztecs have lost their three of their first four games by a scant 11 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, nearly overcoming a pair of 19-point deficits in its first two games. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sacramento State and against USD, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

The Last Time Out - South Carolina at SDSU

The San Diego State women's basketball team dropped its fourth straight game on Nov. 23 with an 88-54 defeat at the hands of No. 19/14 South Carolina at Viejas Arena.

Junior Erimma Amarikwa led the Aztecs with 15 points on 7-of-11 shooting to go with five rebounds, while fellow classmate Ahjalee Harvey chipped in 10 points and three assists, but it wasn't enough as the Gamecocks (6-0) had four players record double-digit scoring totals, including Alaina Coates' game-high 21 points, to help remain unbeaten on the year.

SDSU was once again beset by a rash of turnovers as South Carolina scored 33 points off 25 miscues and maintained a 12-2 advantage in fast-break opportunities. In addition, the Gamecocks attempted over twice as many free throws as the Aztecs, connecting on 21-of-31 shots from the charity stripe, compared to an 8-for-15 clip by the host school.

Still, SDSU hung tough for the first 23 minutes of the game. After Asia Dozier's jumper put South Carolina up 43-28 with 58 seconds to go before intermission, the Aztecs fashioned a 10-1 spurt through the halftime break, pulling to within 44-38 following a Harvey basket with 16:56 left in the second half.

That would be as close as SDSU would get, however, as the Gamecocks seized control of the game over the next 10 minutes, with two Coates free throws punctuating a 24-6 run that put South Carolina comfortably in front 68-46. Tiffany Mitchell scored 10 of her 17 points during that stretch, while the Aztecs sank just two of eight field goals and committed four turnovers.

Mitchell narrowly missed out on a double-double after posting a game-best nine assists, while Dozier contributed 16 points, including a 4-for-10 effort from three-point range. Khadijah Sessions also aided the victors with 12 points of her own and tied for game-high honors with four steals.

Conversely, the Aztecs received a career-best four assists and four steals from sophomore Deajanae Scurry, who also finished with six points and seven rebounds, while fellow classmate Deidra Smith contributed six points and four rebounds. SDSU's leading scorer, senior center Cierra Warren was plagued by foul trouble and totaled just five points and five rebounds in 20 minutes.

Noting the South Carolina Game

- The Aztecs lost a game by 30 or more points for the first time since falling to Texas A&M 96-52 in the finals of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam on Dec. 30, 2010.

- SDSU dropped its second straight contest to a ranked opponent.

- The Gamecocks shot 52.7 percent from the floor, marking the first time the Aztecs have allowed the opposition to convert more than 50 percent of its field-goal attempts since Jan. 21, 2012 at Air Force - a span of 53 games.

- With her 15 points, Erimma Amarikwa finished with the 18th double-digit scoring effort of her career.

- Similarly, Ahjalee Harvey's season-high 10 points represented the fifth time in her career in which she recorded double-figure scoring totals.

- Freshman Alyssa Lawrence sank two free throws to notch her first two-points as an Aztec.

Flashback: Aztecs-Gauchos 2013 WNIT Clash

Senior Courtney Clements scored a career-high 31 points to power San Diego State to a 69-46 victory over UC Santa Barbara in the opening round of the 2013 WNIT last March at Viejas Arena.

Clements connected on 10 of 17 field goal attempts, draining a personal-best seven 3-pointers on 10 tries, as the Aztecs set a program record with 27 wins in a single season. With her performance, Clements recorded the highest point total by an SDSU player since Jené Morris tallied 32 points at Texas in the first round of the NCAA tournament in 2010.

In addition, senior Chelsea Hopkins posted another strong performance with 13 points, eight rebounds and eight assists, while sophomore Erimma Amarikwa finished with nine points and six boards.

SDSU, which never trailed in the contest, shot 47.3 percent from the field (26-55), including a 43.5 percent clip from 3-point range, while maintaining a 38-26 advantage in rebounds. On the flip side, the Gauchos (16-17) were limited to a 33.3 percent field goal percentage on 17-of-51 shooting and came up empty on seven tries from beyond the 3-point arc.

Clements got off to a blistering start, scoring 10 of the Aztecs first 12 points, while senior Gabrielle Clark followed with a 3-pointer to give the host school a 15-8 lead by the 14:37 mark of the first half. UCSB responded with four straight points on a jumper and a pair of free throws by Sweets Underwood to pull within 15-12. However, Clements buried another triple on

SDSU's next possession to spark a 12-0 run over a span of 5:10, which provided the Scarlet and Black a 27-12 cushion with 8:11 left.

The Gauchos misfired on 10 shots during that stretch and found themselves in pursuit mode for the rest of the night. By the time the halftime horn sounded, the Aztecs were firmly in control at 40-20, with Clements (21 pts.) out-scoring the entire UCSB team.

SDSU maintained the momentum in the second half, as a Hopkins layup at the 16:20 mark extended the hosts' lead to 48-24. The Gauchos reeled off seven straight points, capped by an Underwood foul shot with 11:26 remaining, to pull within 48-31. However, SDSU answered with a 9-4 spurt to dash any hopes of a UCSB comeback. Amarikwa converted two layups, while Clements added another and soon nailed a 3-pointer to give the Aztecs a commanding 57-35 lead by the 6:35 mark.

In all, SDSU owned a 14-0 advantage in fast-break opportunities and outscored the Gauchos 11-2 in bench points.

#AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLI's

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on MaxPreps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a three-star recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A three-time all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a team-best 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

Meet the New Staff

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa. Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight lockers, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

SDSU continues its road swing on Tuesday, Dec. 3 when it travels to the Lone Star State for a clash with No. 12/11 Texas A&M, beginning at 7 p.m. CT (5 p.m. PT). Following their encounter with the Aggies, the Aztecs will have nearly two weeks off before playing host to UCLA on Sunday, Dec. 15 at Viejas Arena.

Stacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transferred UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyin-gifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
