AS A SENIOR (FALL 2008)

Singles - Defeated Maja Sujica of San Diego and Denise Muresan of Michigan in the SDSU Fall Classic I ... Emerged from the ITA West Regionals with two victories over Alexandra Demidova of USD and Ariane Masschelein of Arizona ... Posted two wins during the SDSU Fall Classic II over Brooke Bartlett of UC Irvine and Kristina Radan of Oklahoma.

Doubles - Paired with Julia Trunk during the SDSU Fall Classic I ... The duo earned two victories over Masschelein/Castany, 8-3, of Arizona and Howard/Muresan, 8-4, of Michigan ... During the SDSU Fall Classic II was paired with Olivia Colman.

AS A JUNIOR (2007-08)

Singles - Posted an overall record of 20-15 ... Opened the tournament season with three straight wins to advance to the finals of the SDSU Fall Classic ... Title run was cut short as she fell to Pepperdine's Anamika Bhargava, 4-6, 6-4, 6-0, in the championship match ... Picked up a pair of victories at the Wilson/ITA West Regionals ... Claimed the second SDSU Fall Classic by downing Idunn Hertzberg of TCU, 6-3, 7-5, in the finals ... Played most of the spring season at the top of the ladder ... Downed Donna McCullough of UC Riverside, Erin Weisener of Cal State Fullerton and Aglaya Kokurina of Gonzaga in straight sets to open dual-match play ... Handed Loyola Marymount's Tamara Tanner a 6-3, 6-4 loss at the No. 2 spot to clinch the win for the Aztecs ... Put together a five-match unbeaten streak to close out the season ... Started with a 6-0, 6-1 thrashing of Air Force's Christine Abayan ... Cruised to a 6-2, 6-1 triumph over Corina Lazar of Wyoming and a 6-4, 6-2 win against Colorado State's Hilary Tyler ... Outlasted Monica Wiesener of San Diego, 7-5, 6-4 ... With SDSU trailing New Mexico 3-0 at the MWC tournament, she kept the Aztecs' hopes alive with a 0-6, 7-5, 6-2 victory over Ola Abou-Zekry.

Doubles - Posted a 14-11 overall mark with three different partners ... Kicked off the campaign alongside Milana Yusupov at the SDSU Fall Classic ... Downed Pepperdine's Liles/Braverman and Denver's Bauregger/Iwinski by identical 8-6 scores ... Teamed with Eliska Krausova to advance to the quarterfinals of the Wilson/ITA West Regionals ... Cruised to an 8-3 victory over Wiesner/Litchfield of Cal State Fullerton before dispatching UC Santa Barbara's Damion/Onaga, 8-2 ... Title run was cut short by No. 1 seed Zalameda/Schnack of UCLA ... Went on to pick up two more wins at the second SDSU Fall Classic ... Opened the dual-match season with an 8-2 thrashing of UC Riverside's Oki/McCullough ... Put together a four-match winning streak from Feb. 23-March 8, highlighted by a 9-8(3) decision over Penn's Anisimova/Tansill to clinch the doubles point in the Aztecs' 4-3 victory ... Paired with Sisse Nielsen five times in the spring ... Defeated Gonzaga's Anderson/Kokurina, 8-2, in their first match together ... Also earned an 8-5 victory over Lindstrand/Demidova of San Diego ... Led White/Ryba of New Mexico, 7-6, at the Mountain West Conference tournament before the match was abandoned.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006-07)

Singles - Finished the season with a 16-16 overall record ... Tied Eliska Krausova for the team lead with seven victories during the fall tournament season ... Enjoyed a successful run at the Wilson/ITA West Regionals when she became the only unseeded player to reach the main draw quarterfinals ... Opened the tournament with a 6-0, 6-0 demolition of Pepperdine's Alicia Poladian and then rallied for a three-set triumph over Kanykey Koichumanova of Cal State Northridge in the round of 64 ...

Upset a pair of seeded players the following day, cruising past USC's Anca Anastasiu, 6-0, 6-2, before prevailing in the round of 16 over Danielle Steinberg of Arizona ... Could not advance to the semifinals, however, after suffering a narrow 7-5, 7-5 loss at the hands of UCLA's Yasmin Schnack ... Played most of the spring season at the No. 3 position while also seeing some action at the No. 1 and 2 spots ... Opened MWC play with three consecutive straight-set victories en route to a 6-2 league record ... Captured the match clinching point with a 4-6, 6-2, 6-0 decision over Carmen Seremeta of Oregon ... Fell to New Mexico's Sandra Zmak, 6-4, 6-2, in the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament ... Trained Anya Rynarzewska of Florida State, 5-7, 1-2, in the first round of the NCAA tournament before the match was abandoned.

Doubles - Played with four different partners posting an overall record of 16-16 ... Teamed with Kathryn Kitts in the fall to pick up her first doubles win at the SDSU Fall Classic I with an 8-6 decision over Lindstrand/Demidova of San Diego ... Combined with Eliska Krausova in the second SDSU Fall Classic ... The duo defeated Quintal/White of New Mexico, 8-5, before disposing of UC Irvine's Broadfoot/Kaloi, 8-4 ... Dropped an 8-6 decision to New Mexico's Gersic/Abou-Zekry in the quarterfinals, but came back the next day to defeat another Lobo tandem of Scott/Sotirchos, 8-5, in a compass draw ... Teamed with Sisse Nielsen at the No. 2 position for most of the spring season, compiling a 6-6 dual-match record ... The twosome put together a string of four victories ... Rejoined with Kitts in the MWC tournament quarterfinals, falling to New Mexico's Obu-Zekry/Ryba, 8-2 ... The pair was trailing Foley/Wente of Florida State, 4-7, at the NCAA tournament before the match was abandoned.

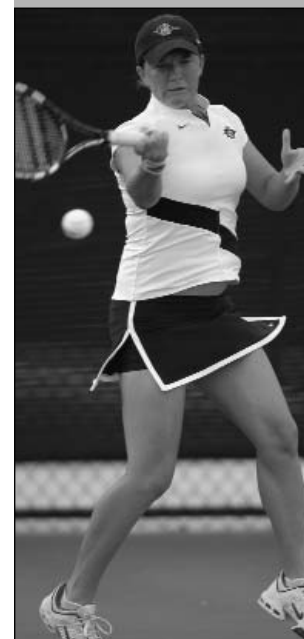

AS A SENIOR (FALL 2008)

Singles - Earned one win in the SDSU Fall Classic I over Maria Raygada, 6-2, 6-1, of San Diego ... Defeated Abbie Probert, 6-4, 6-2, of Colorado during the SDSU Fall Classic II ... Posted two wins at the ITA West Regionals over Angelia De Mestre of Pepperdine, 6-0, 6-0, and Bryanna Ojeda of UCSB, 6-1, 6-1.

Doubles - While paired with Milana Yusupov for the SDSU Fall Classic I, the duo defeated Perl/Raygada of San Diego, 8-4, and Tamborini/Faulkner also of San Diego, 8-2 ... Teamed with Yusupov for both the ITA West Regionals and the SDSU Fall Classic II, but the duo fell short in both tournaments.

AS A JUNIOR (2007-08)

Became the third Aztec in six years to win the ITA West Region Cisse Leary Sportsmanship Award ... Earned her first career all-Mountain West Conference award in singles.

Singles - Compiled a team-high 23 victories, which ranks eighth on the Aztec single-season charts ... Opened tournament play by claiming the consolation title at the SDSU Fall Classic ... Advanced to the round of 32 at the Wilson/ITA West Regionals ... Reached the semifinals of the second SDSU Fall Classic ... Played most of the spring season in the No. 4 slot and posted an impressive 7-1 record in MWC action ... Kicked off a seven-match win streak with a 6-0, 6-0 blanking of Penn's Michelle Mitchell ... Cruised to straight-set victories over Utah's Erin Monson, BYU's Dolly Chang and New Mexico's Emma Hayman ... Pulled out a 3-6, 7-6(3), 10-7 triumph over Katariina Tuohimaa of TCU ... Streak came to an end with a heartbreaking 7-6, 6-7, 10-7 loss to UNLV's Anna Maskaljun ... Bounced back to close out the regular season with four straight wins ... Fell to Hayman of UNM, 4-6, 4-1, ret., in the MWC quarterfinals.

Doubles - Racked up a team-leading 15 doubles victories, partnering with four different Aztecs ... Played the entire fall season next to Julia Trunk, going 4-2 in tournament play ... The duo combined for a four-match win streak to start dual-match play ... Earned an 8-5 triumph over Injejkian/Akhmedova of Cal State Fullerton in the Aztecs' season-opening victory ... Also cruised past Gonzaga's Lederhouse/MacWilliam, 8-3 ... Outlasted Malovic/Wong of Washington, 9-8(4) ... The tandem was the first off the court in a doubles sweep over Loyola Marymount, defeating Bulkley/Nixon, 8-4 ... Streak came to an end at the hands of Long Beach State's Armstrong/Sutton ... Went on to pair with Milana Yusupov for four wins, including a nail-biting 8-7(8) victory over Harvard's Stewart/Curto ... Closed out the season alongside Kathryn Kitts ... The pair went 3-0 in MWC play before falling to New Mexico's Hayman/Tessman in the quarterfinals of the league championships.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006-07)

Singles - Finished the season second on the team with 20 victories and tops in dual-match competition with 15 ... Cruised to two early wins at the Wilson/ITA West Regionals, but was unable to advance to the round of 16, falling to Arizona's Danielle Steinberg ... Came back the next day to defeat San Diego's Helene Lindstrand, 6-3, 6-4, in a consolation singles match ... Alternated between the No. 3, 4 and 5 positions in the spring ... Won 11 of her last 13 meetings to finish with a 15-9 mark ... Also had an impressive 7-1 record in MWC play ... Downed Wyoming's Andrea House, 6-3, 6-1, to clinch the match for the Aztecs ... Closed out the regular season with four consecutive straight-set victories, including a 6-0, 6-0 shutout over USD's Justine Perl ... Led New Mexico's Mackenzie White, 7-5, 3-2, in the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament before the match was abandoned ... Led Carolin Walter of Florida State, 6-0, 3-4, before the Seminoles clinched the match at the NCAA tournament.

Doubles - Picked up five wins, playing with seven different partners ... Kicked off the fall season by pairing with Milana Yusupov to defeat Bigos/Tunaru of Alabama, 8-4, at the SDSU Fall Classic ... All three dual match wins came with different partners ... Teamed with Alesya Vidov to squeeze past Le/Tran of Cal State Fullerton, 9-8 ... Paired with Yusupov to dispose of Iowa's Berry/Klockenga, 8-4, before partnering with

Sisse Nielsen four days later to claim an 8-5 decision over LMU's Fermin/Tanner ... Also teamed with Nielsen in the MWC tournament quarterfinals where the pair was trailing UNM's Sotirchos/Quintal, 6-7, before the Lobos clinched the match.

AS A FRESHMAN (2005-06)

Singles - Completed her first season on The Mesa with an 18-15 overall record and a 14-10 mark in dual-match competition ... Won her first two matches as an Aztec at the Wilson/ITA West Regionals ... Kicked off the tournament with a 6-0, 6-2 decision over Cal State Fullerton's Jessica Winkler before shutting out Hana Im of Cal State Northridge, 6-0, 6-0 ... Played the majority of the spring season at the No. 6 position, while seeing limited action in the No. 5 slot ... Won four in a row to open dual-match play, highlighted by a 6-2, 6-1 victory over Loyola Marymount's Sladjana Kos ... After dropping two decisions, she started a five-match unbeaten streak, beginning with a 6-3, 6-2 performance versus Merve Asimgil of Pepperdine ... Her gritty 6-7, 7-5, 7-6 effort sealed the Aztecs' come-from-behind upset victory vs. No. 36 Oregon ... Posted a 6-1, 6-4 win over Jessica Watts of Utah in the MWC opener ... At the MWC tournament, she tied the Aztecs' match with New Mexico at 2-2 after her 6-3, 7-5 triumph over Mackenzie White ... Trained Elizabeth Lumpkin of UCLA, 5-4, in the first set when the match was abandoned at the NCAA tournament.

Doubles - Finished the season with an overall record of 11-17 and a dual-match mark of 9-14 ... Played with four different partners over the course of the year ... Reached the finals of the SDSU Fall Classic along with Alesya Vidov as the Aztec duo notched wins over Cao/Braid of Rice (8-4) and Quintal/Sotirchos of New Mexico (8-6) ... Came up short in the title match, dropping a narrow 8-6 decision to Brown/Lindstrand of San Diego ... Started the spring with Vidov, crushing Sakhakorn/Khoury of UC Riverside, 8-2, and Cal State Fullerton's Tran/Le, 8-0, in SDSU's season-opening doubleheader sweep ... Teamed with Milana Yusupov to help the Aztecs claim the doubles point against No. 38 Washington with a 9-7 decision over the Huskies' Svanfeldt/Wong ... Joined forces with Eliska Krausova at New Mexico, helping the Scarlet and Black clinch the crucial doubles point with their 8-4 effort over Quintal/Ryba ... At the MWC tournament, she and Yusupov had their match abandoned while leading Quintal/Sotirchos of New Mexico, 7-4 ... The duo found themselves on the short end of an 8-2 score against UCLA's Joelson/Lin at the NCAA tournament.

Attended Faithful Ambassadors Bible Baptist Academy ... Played six years of junior tennis because her high school did not offer sports ... Was the San Diego junior tennis player of the year for the 12-, 14-, 16- and 18-year old divisions ... Was the top player in San Diego for six years ... Held a national top 25 ranking and was ranked among the top 10 in southern California during her junior tennis career ... Played on the San Diego team that won the Billie Jean King Junior Team Tennis championship in 2004 ... Is the first person from her high school to earn an athletic scholarship to a Division I school.

AS A SENIOR (FALL 2008)

Singles - Added two victories to her record during the SDSU Fall Classic I, defeating Alexandra Demidova, 7-6, 6-2, and Maria Raygada, 6-4, 1-6, 7-6 (4), both of San Diego ... Recorded two wins during the ITA West Regionals over Shaghig Injejkian of CS Fullerton, 6-0, 6-1, and Ali Van Horne of Arizona State, 6-4, 7-5 ... During the SDSU Fall Classic II defeated Michala Jensen of Colorado.

Doubles - Garnered two wins alongside Esther Cadua during the SDSU Fall Classic I over San Diego's Perl/Raygada 8-4 and Tamborini/Faulkner 8-2 ... Partnered with Cadua for both the ITA West Regionals and the SDSU Fall Classic II.

AS A JUNIOR (2007-08)

Singles - Finished the season second on the team with 21 victories ... Advanced to the round of 32 at the Wilson/ITA West Regional with a pair of 6-3, 6-1 victories over Julia Sandborn of Hawai'i and San Diego's Ellie Faulkner ... Played most of the dual-match season at the No. 5 spot ... Posted an impressive 6-1 record in league action ... Opened the Mountain West Conference slate with a 2-6, 6-2, 6-4 comeback victory over Utah's Leigh Walsh ... After falling to Jennifer Ryba of New Mexico, reeled off seven consecutive wins ... Defeated Kewa Nichols of TCU, 6-4, 6-4, before holding off UNLV's Katy Williams, 6-4, 7-6 ... Cruised to straight-set wins over Christen Monreal of Air Force, Michelle Brown of Wyoming and Caitlin Fluegge of Colorado State ... Cut the Aztecs' deficit to one (3-2) at the MWC tournament with a 6-2, 1-6, 6-4 triumph over UNM's Ryba.

Doubles - Picked up nine wins with four different partners ... Teamed with Holly Bagshaw to go 2-1 at the SDSU Fall Classic ... Advanced to the round of 32 at the Wilson/ITA West Regional alongside Orze Atalay ... The duo defeated UC Santa Barbara's Kausen/Ojeda, 8-6, before falling to No. 5 seed Joelson/McGoodwin of UCLA ... Paired with Esther Cadua for most of the dual-match season, picking up four wins in the No. 3 slot ... Closed out the regular season with Sisse Nielsen ... The pair went 2-1 in MWC action, downing Wilson/Monreal of Air Force (8-4) and Brown/VanHollen of Wyoming (8-1).

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006-07)

Singles - Finished the season with an overall record of 14-8 ... Reached the Flight 2 singles final at the second SDSU Fall Classic ... After receiving a first-round bye, knocked off New Mexico's Jenn Ryba, 6-3, 6-2 ... Came back the next day to defeat Jessica Broadfoot of UC Irvine, 6-2, 6-4, in the semifinals ... Title run was cut short after suffering a straight-set loss at the hands of New Mexico's Sandra Zmak ... Played at mostly the No. 4 and 5 spots in the spring, compiling an 11-5 dual-match record ... Notched one of the Aztecs' two victories versus 18th-ranked Pepperdine with a 4-6, 6-4, 10-6 triumph over Tania Rice ... Defeated Kelcie Klockenga, 1-6, 6-1, 6-4, to clinch the match vs. No. 52 Iowa ... Led Nora Quintal of New Mexico, 7-5, 2-1, in the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament before the match was abandoned ... Fell to Florida State's Jessica Wentz, 6-1, 6-3, in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

Doubles - Completed the season with an overall record of 8-12 and a dual-match mark of 6-9 ... Played with three different partners over the course of the year ... Limited to four matches in the fall due to injury ... Paired with Kathryn Kitts at the No. 3 spot for most of the spring season ... The duo started out by disposing of Rice's Dao/Pan, 8-3 ... Posted the Aztecs' only doubles win versus No. 41 TCU as they cruised to an 8-1 victory over Beck/Munch-Soegaard ... Also disposed of Washington's

Rainey/Summers (8-2), Air Force's Kiser/Rudico (8-3) and Colorado State's Stople/Pohjalainen (8-2) ... Four-match win streak came to a halt when the pair fell 9-8 (13-11), to Quintal/Sotirchos of New Mexico.

AS A FRESHMAN (SPRING 2006)

Singles - Arrived on Montezuma Mesa in time for the dual-match season, finishing with a 14-10 record ... Played primarily at the No. 4 position, but also saw action in the fifth and sixth spots ... Emerged triumphant in her first two collegiate matches, downing UC Riverside's Catrisha Cabanilla, 6-1, 6-3, before pummeling Mai-Ly of Cal State Fullerton, 6-1, 6-0, in the Aztecs' season-opening doubleheader sweep ... Survived an epic battle one week later versus Loyola Marymount's Patricia Hubl in a 7-6, 7-6(15-13) thriller ... Ignited a six-match winning streak with a grueling three-set victory over Carmenta Seremeta of No. 36 Oregon, 6-4, 4-6, 7-6 ... Her win knotted the match at 3-3 as the Aztecs rallied for a 4-3 upset over the Ducks ... Her unbeaten string continued into MWC play against Utah, BYU and UNLV ... After dropping her match against No. 19 Harvard, she posted wins against MWC foes in Lauren Strasburger of Colorado State and Andrea House of Wyoming ... Defeated San Diego's Helene Lindstrand, 6-4, 6-2, in the regular season finale ... At the NCAA tournament vs. UCLA, she had her match with No. 56 Alex McGoodwin abandoned at the No. 4 position.

Doubles - Posted a 9-14 record on the season with four different partners ... Earned her first collegiate doubles victory playing next to Eliska Krausova in an 8-2 thrashing of Cal State Fullerton's Dunbar/Injejkian ... Combined with Alesya Vidov in SDSU's win over Loyola Marymount as the Aztec duo routed the Lions' Ivey/Sundac, 8-1 ... Teamed with Esther Cadua to reel off four wins over a six-match stretch, including a gritty 9-7 effort against 38th-ranked Washington's Svanfeldt/Wong ... Tandem also recorded back-to-back 8-4 performances over Carpenter/Jobe of Wisconsin and Utah's Reveche/Bourdages ...
