### SAN JOSÉ STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (Game #10)

**Upcoming game:** San José State vs. San Diego State  
Saturday, November 4, 2017  
CEFCU Stadium

**San José State record:** 1-8, 0-4 Mountain West. The Spartans lost at BYU, 41-20, on October 28. San José State is winless in its last seven games.

**San Diego State record:** 7-2, 3-2 Mountain West. The Aztecs ended a two-game losing streak with a 28-7 win at Hawai'i on October 28.

**San José State head coach Brent Brennan:** In his first season as a major college head coach. Has a major college head coaching record of 1-8, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. Brennan is 0-0 as a head coach against San Diego State.

**San Diego State head coach Rocky Long:** In his seventh season at San Diego State. Has a coaching record of 61-28 with the Aztecs. Overall, Long is in his 18th season as a major college head coach and has a record of 126-97.

He is 4-3 as a head coach against San José State after San Diego State defeated the Spartans, 42-3, in 2016.

As the head coach at New Mexico, the Lobos lost to the Spartans in 1998 (37-20 in San José) and in 2006 (20-12 in the New Mexico Bowl).

As a quarterback at the University of New Mexico, Long was 2-0-1 against San José State during the 1969 through 1971 seasons.

**Series history:** The series is tied, 19-19-2. San Diego State has wins in the last four meetings between these teams including a 42-3 triumph in San Diego last year.

The Spartans' last win in the series was a 38-34 triumph in San Diego on September 22, 2012. The San Jose State win in San Jose was a 35-10 win on September 13, 2008.

**San José State-San Diego State connections: Claude Gilbert** and Olympic Games gold-medalist **Willie Steele**, are members of both school's athletics or sports Halls of Fame and are among many connected with both universities.

San José State grad Claude Gilbert was an assistant coach and head coach at both schools. Gilbert compiled a 61-26-2 record at San Diego State during the 1973-80 seasons. At San José State, Gilbert had a 38-30-1 mark during the 1984 through 1989 seasons. He is one of just two Spartan football head coaches to lead teams to back-to-back seasons of 10 or more wins (1986 and 1987). Gilbert also holds the distinction as the only San José State football player to earn a varsity letter, serve as a team captain (1958), later become an assistant coach and eventually be named head coach.

Steele was a member of the 1942 San José State freshman football and Spartan track and field teams. He set the school record in the broad jump (long jump) with a 25-foot-7 mark that stood number for 24 years until 1968 Olympic Games gold medal winner Tommie Smith bettered the mark in 1966. Following World War II, Steele completed his college career at San Diego State competing in basketball, football and track and field. He won the broad jump at the 1948 London Olympics with a 25-foot-8 mark.

**First home game in a month:** San Jose State returns to CEFCU Stadium for its first home game since the October 7 Homecoming Game vs. Fresno State. The Spartans played half of its six home games by the end of September.

**Magnificent seven:** After nine games, just seven Spartans started in every game. Left tackle **Troy Kowalski** and right guard **Chris Gonzalez** are the only two on offense. Linebackers **William Ossai**, **Frank Ginda** and **Ethan Aguayo**, cornerback **Andre Chachere** and safety **Maurice McKnight** are the defensive players to start in each of the first nine games.

Thirty-seven (37) players, not counting the special teams positions, have at least one starting game assignment this season.

**Spreading the ball around:** In the last two games at Hawai'i on October 14 and at BYU on October 28, San Jose State involved many pass receivers. At Hawai'i, the Spartans matched a then-season high with nine different pass catchers. At BYU, San Jose State had a season-high 11 players with a pass reception.

Of the 11 San Jose State pass receivers in the BYU game, wide receivers **Tre Walker**, **Austin Liles** and **JaQuan Blackwell**, tight end **Billy Humphreys** and running back **Tyler Nevens** are freshmen.

The last time a San Jose State team had at least 10 players with a pass reception in a game was last year's San Diego State contest when 10 players combined to catch 28 passes in a 42-3 loss.

**Battle of two Mountain West teams with a kickoff return for a TD:** San Jose State and San Diego State are two of the three Mountain West teams with a kickoff return for a touchdown this season.

**Rahsheed Johnson** notched the Spartans' kickoff return for a TD in the October 14 Hawai'i game. Rashaad Penny and Juwan Washington each have one for San Diego State.

The last time a player returned a kickoff for a touchdown in a San Jose State-San Diego State game was in the 38-34 win by the Spartans in 2012. Running back **Tyler Ervin**, currently on the injured reserve list for the Houston Texans, scored on a 97-yard kickoff return in the second quarter for a 10-7 Spartan lead the play after Aztec running back Adam Muema scored on an 83-yard TD run.

**Two more TDs through the air:** In the 41-20 loss at BYU, San Jose State's two touchdowns came via the pass. The Spartans have only one rushing touchdown this season on a 17-yard run by Zamore Zigler in the September 2 win over Cal Poly.

**Second 100-yard rusher in 2017:** For the second time this season, a San Jose State player rushed for 100-plus yards in a game when freshman **Tyler Nevens** gained 112 yards on 26 carries at BYU on October 28. It was the first time as a Spartan Nevens rushed for 100 or more yards in a contest.

**Zamore Zigler** gained 121 yards on 12 carries in the Cal Poly win on September 2.

**Season-low two penalties:** The two San Jose State penalties in the BYU game marked the fewest number of penalties in a Spartan game this season and is a reversal of the season-high 11 penalties in the loss at Hawai'i two weeks earlier.

**Busiest defense in FBS football:** Nine games has a lot do with it, but San José State's defense has faced more snaps to date than any other Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in games played through October 28. Spartan opponents have combined for 737 snaps. California is next closest at 694 for its nine games played.

**Another top-10 rusher faces the Spartans:** San Diego State's Rashaad Penny is the third player this season in the top-10 in rushing nationally facing San Jose State. Penny, who rushed for three TDs in last year's San Jose State-San Diego State game, comes into the contest ranked fourth with 1,368 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Earlier in the season, Hawai'i's Diocemy Saint-Juste was fifth and UNLV's Lexington Thomas was seventh. Saint-Juste rushed for 202 yards and two touchdowns; Thomas, 146 yards and two TDs against the Spartans.

**Spartans in top-20 for fumble recoveries:** Heading into the San Diego State game, San José State is tied for 17th nationally with eight fumble recoveries.

Safety Chandler Hawkins added to the Spartans' total in the BYU game with a fumble recovery in the end zone.

Bowling Green and Memphis share the national lead with 12 fumble recoveries.

**Spartans in top-25 for defensive touchdowns:** Heading into the San Diego State game, San José State is tied for 24th nationally with two touchdowns scored by its defense.

In the Cal Poly win, linebacker **Jamal Scott** picked up a fumble and ran 22 yards for a touchdown. More recently against Utah State, cornerback **Jermaine Kelly** scored a touchdown on a 68-yard interception return.

Texas is the national leader with five defensive touchdowns.

**Playing with a lead:** The Hawai'i game was the first time since the September 2 win over Cal Poly that San José State had a lead in a contest. The Spartans were ahead 10-0 after the first quarter and trailed 14-13 at halftime before losing to Hawai'i, 37-26.

**First team with eight games played:** San José State was the first team among the 129 Football Bowl Subdivision teams to play eight games when the Spartans finished their game at Hawai'i on October 14.

**A 13-game regular-season schedule:** For the first time since the 2010 season and fifth time in school history, San José State has a 13-game regular-season schedule. The Spartans also played 13 regular season games in 2002, 1939 and 1937.

The 2017 San José State football team is the first in school history to play six games in a season through September 30.

**Season-high in total offense and passing yards:** The Hawai'i game marked the first time this season San José State had at least 500 yards of total offense with a season best 504 yards. The Spartans also had a season-high 381 passing yards against the Rainbow Warriors.

In two of its last three games, San José State passed for at least 300 yards with 315 at UNLV on September 30.

**Kickoff return to the house:** **Rahsheed Johnson** became the first San José State player in five years to return a kickoff for a touchdown when he raced 96 yards against Hawai'i (10/14). Johnson's previous long was 70 yards against Nevada in 2016.

**Johnson scores three for the Spartans:** **Rahsheed Johnson** became the first San José State player this season to score three touchdowns in a game this season. Besides his 96-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter of the October 14 Hawai'i game, Johnson caught touchdown passes of 15 and 59 yards earlier in the game.

Johnson and wide receiver **Bailey Gaither** are the first two Spartans to score more than one touchdown in a game this season. Gaither scored twice on touchdown receptions in the season-opener vs. USF.

**First to 100:** Linebacker **Frank Ginda** is the first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player this season to be credited with 100 tackles. Ginda has 124 tackles in nine games heading into San Diego State contest. He shares is national leader in total tackles and tackles per game.

**Turnovers still plaguing Spartans:** This season, Spartan opponents have turned 31 turnovers (12 interceptions, 14 fumbles) into 123 points. San José State had five turnovers on four fumbles and an interception in the October 28 game at BYU.

**Crawford sets San José State career and sets school single-season records:** Junior **Bryce Crawford** is the first San José State kicker to kick four field goals of 50 or more yards in a season and a career with his 52-yard field goal at Hawai'i (10/14).

Austin Lopez, the Spartans' primary placekicker during the 2012 through 2015 seasons, kicked three 50 yards field goals in his San José State career.

His first three field goals of 50 or more yards in a season were 51 yards at Utah (9/16), career-long 53 yards vs. Utah State (9/23), and 51 yards vs. Fresno State (10/7).

Based on available records, Crawford is the first San José State player to attempt field goals of 50 or more yards in five consecutive games. He missed a 52-yard try at UNLV (9/30) and a 51-yarder at Hawai'i.

**50-yard field goals at San José State:** Junior **Bryce Crawford** became the tenth San José State kicker to convert a field goal of 50 or more yards when he kicked a 51-yard field goal at Utah on September 16. Crawford's 51-yarder was the first field goal of 50 or more yards by a Spartan since Austin Lopez's 50-yard field goal at Wyoming in 2014.

As an encore, Crawford kicked a career-best 53-yard field goal, the second longest in school history, at home against Utah State on September 23.

His four 50-plus yard field goals this season are the 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th times in school history a San José State kicker made a field goal of 50 or more yards.

**Streak ends: Bryce Crawford** made 17 consecutive field goals over two seasons before missing from 52 yards at UNLV on September 30. The 52-yard field goal try was his second of the game after making a 28-yard try in the first quarter.

His streak is the second longest in school history trailing Austin Lopez (2012-15) who made his first 23 field goal tries covering his entire freshman and the first half of his sophomore season.

Crawford's last two misses are 52 yards at UNLV on September 30, 2017 and 50 vs. Hawai'i on October 21, 2016.

**Oliver beginning to make a mark:** Junior **Josh Oliver** has 17 receptions in the last four games and now is among the top tight ends nationally in pass receiving. Oliver has a single-season career best 29 receptions. He came into the season with just seven in two seasons.

Based on available records dating back to the 1970's, Allen is the first known San José State player to play as a special teams defender and at quarterback in the same game. Allen did it in the Cal Poly game as a member of the Spartans' punt coverage unit. **Freshman QB starters at San José State: Montel Aaron** became the sixth San José State freshman to start a game at quarterback since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972 when he started the September 9 Texas game.

Other Spartan freshmen to start at quarterback since 1972 include current sophomore **Josh Love** in 2016 at Iowa State and **Adam Tafralis**.

Aaron's start at Hawai'i was the 15th time a San José State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five), Tafralis (2004, three) and Love (2016, one) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

Aaron's current season totals of 928 passing yards and eight touchdowns are the most by a San José State freshman quarterback. His 59.7 pass completion percentage is best among freshmen to play the position for the Spartans.

**30 pass completions:** The San José State-UNLV game marked the first time since the 2015 season opener at home vs. New Hampshire on September 3 that the Spartans had at least 30 pass completions in a game. San José State was 30-of-49 with two interceptions for 315 yards and a touchdown against UNLV.

**First timers:** Heading into the San Diego State game, 22 freshmen and 13 others played in their first major college football game for San José State this season. Of the 22 freshmen, eight started at least once for the Spartans.

**Young Spartans:** The current San José State football roster consists of 48 freshmen. In the last eight seasons, the 2017 squad is the third one to begin a season with at least 40 freshmen. The 2012 (41) and 2013 (45) teams had more than 40 freshmen on the opening-game roster.

The fewest freshmen on a San José State opening-game roster since 2010 was 35 in 2013 and 2014.

**Nate Velichko One of 181 national semifinalists:** Offensive tackle **Nate Velichko** is one of 181 semifinalists named by the National Football Foundation for the 2017 Campbell Trophy honoring college football's top scholar-athlete.

On November 1, 12 finalists will be named. Each finalist will be awarded an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship and will be honored in New York city. The winner will have his postgraduate scholarship award increased to \$25,000. Velichko is a senior from Foster City, Calif., majoring in kinesiology.

**Brent Brennan & quarterback Michael Carrillo - guest speakers at "Powering Silicon Valley":** Head coach **Brent Brennan**, quarterback Michael Carrillo, a business administration major, and Cam Radford, the football team's director of football digital communications, are three of the guest speakers participating in "Powering Silicon Valley," a November 3 symposium at San Jose State University.

The symposium will highlight the collaboration between academics and athletics with an emphasis on science, technology, engineering, arts and math (STEAM) behind sports and entertainment. Specific program information is available at [www.steam-sportsgroup.com](http://www.steam-sportsgroup.com).

**San José State football partners with TEAM Impact:** On October 6, the San José State University football program and TEAM Impact, a nationally-recognized non-profit organization that seeks to improve the quality of life for children through the power of teamwork, announced that 16-year old Keannu Linnell from nearby Lathrop, Calif., will be a Spartan for the next two seasons. Linnell was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2016 and is undergoing extensive physical therapy to regain strength and mobility.

The collaboration between the Spartans and TEAM Impact is another element of the team's Beyond Football initiative.

**The Ellen Show honors San José State football:** On the September 26 nationally-syndicated Ellen Show starring Ellen Degeneres, the San José State University football team was featured for community support, participation and involvement through its Beyond Football Program. Through the Ellen Foundation and Cheerios cereal One Million Acts of Good, Ms. Degeneres presented San José State University football \$25,000 to continue its work in its Beyond Football Program.

**San José State participated in Extra Yards For Teachers Program:** San José State is one of the eight Mountain West schools participating in the College Football Playoff (CFP) Foundation's Extra Yard for Teachers Week honoring the contributions teachers make in the lives of children of all ages.

Teachers from 19 Bay Area schools were honored at the October 7 Homecoming game and one teacher received a \$1,000 grant from San José State and the Mountain West to help support the teacher's classroom project listed in [DonorsChoose.org](http://DonorsChoose.org).

**It was hot:** The September 2 game time temperature for the San José State-Cal Poly game at CFECU Stadium in San José was recorded as 108 degrees. Previously, the last time San José State played in a game with 100-plus degree weather was on September 1, 2007 in a 45-3 loss at Arizona State. The evening temperature was 101 degrees at kickoff.

**Four hours, three minutes of football:** For the first time since defeating #16-ranked Fresno State, 62-52, on November 29, 2013, San José State played a football game that lasted at least four hours in its season-opener against USF. The game had 189 plays, 39 possessions, 23 punting situations, and four replay reviews leading to a 4-hour, 3-minute contest. The 2013 San José State-Fresno State game lasted 4-hours and 9-minutes.

**Lots of pass plays:** San José State's 50 pass plays against #19-USF are the most attempts by the Spartans in a game since 51 passes in a 38-31 loss to Colorado State on November 1, 2014. USF tied a San José State opponent record becoming the third school to run 101 plays against the Spartans in a game.

**Lots of punts:** The San José State-USF game included 23 punts, 11 by San José State's **Michael Carrizosa** and 12 by USF. The last time the Spartans punted 10 times in a game was in a 48-0 loss to Boise State on October 16, 2010.

USF became the first San José State opponent to punt at least 10 times in a game since Utah State punted 10 times in a 30-7 Spartan victory on October 11, 2008.

The San José State-USF contest marked the first time since a 21-0 home loss to Louisiana Tech on November 8, 2008 that there were at least 20 punts in a Spartan game. That day, there were 11 by San José State and nine by Louisiana Tech.

**New coordinators:** Offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** and defensive coordinator **Derrick Odum** are in coordinator roles for the first time in their respective coaching careers. Sowder is in his ninth season of college coaching; Odum, his 22nd.

**Two generations of Bernardis:** First-year offensive line **Joe Bernardi** is a second-generation San José State offensive line coach. His dad, **Gary Bernardi**, now at the University of Colorado, was the Spartans' offensive line coach from 2010 through 2012.

The Bernardis are the second multi-generational football family to serve as San José State assistant coaches. **Tom Quinn**, current New York Giants special teams coordinator, had the same role with the Spartans during the 1999 through 2001 seasons. His dad, **Mike Quinn**, was San José State's special teams coordinator from 1976 through 1978.

**Youth movement in the coaching box:** Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** (30), offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** (29), linebackers coach **Bojay Filimoeatu** (27) and wide receivers coach **Kevin Cummings** (26) begin the season aged 30 and under. Filimoeatu and Cummings will be a year older in December.

**Experienced offensive line:** San José State's starting offensive line at the beginning the season consisting of tackles **Troy Kowalski** and **Nate Velichko**, guards **Jeremiah Kolone** and **Chris Gonzalez**, and center **Keoni Taylor** have 163 combined starts after nine games in 2017. That number is tops among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools.

**Families that stay together:** The 2017 San José State team has two sets of brothers and one second-generation Spartan. Cornerback **Jermaine Kelly** is the older brother of wide receiver **Jeremy Kelly**.

Linebacker **William Ossai**, a senior, is the older brother of freshman **Isaiah Ossai**. Isaiah is the third Ossai in the family to join the San José State football program. Their older brother, **Onyeka Ossai**, was a linebacker from 2001 through 2003.

Defensive lineman **Nico Aimonetti** is the son of former San José State team captain and 1986 honorable mention All-America offensive lineman **John Aimonetti**.

**New CEFCU Stadium playing surface:** In 2017, San José State replaced its FieldTurf playing surface with its second artificial playing surface, AstroTurf, since CEFCU Stadium opened in 1933. For the first time, the Spartans' home field has a two-

toned look with light and dark greens alternating every five yards from goal line to goal line.

**Home stadium name history:** San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year two of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

**New uniforms:** In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas.
