Nine assists in the victory over UNLV ... Career-high seven steals to go with 19 points at CSU, including 17 in the first half ... Nine assists against Wyoming in the MWC quarters, committing just two turnovers in 40 minutes ... Clutch in-bound play in the upset of TCU in the MWC semis, scoring the go-ahead lay-up with just two seconds left on the shot clock ... Contributed 10 assists against the Lady Frogs, the third-most ever in a MWC tournament game, most by a sophomore in a game and most by a player in the conference semifinals ... Scored 12 points in the MWC championship game on a career-high four 3-pointers, while also adding eight assists and five steals ... Averaged 9.0 assists per game at the MWC tourney.






