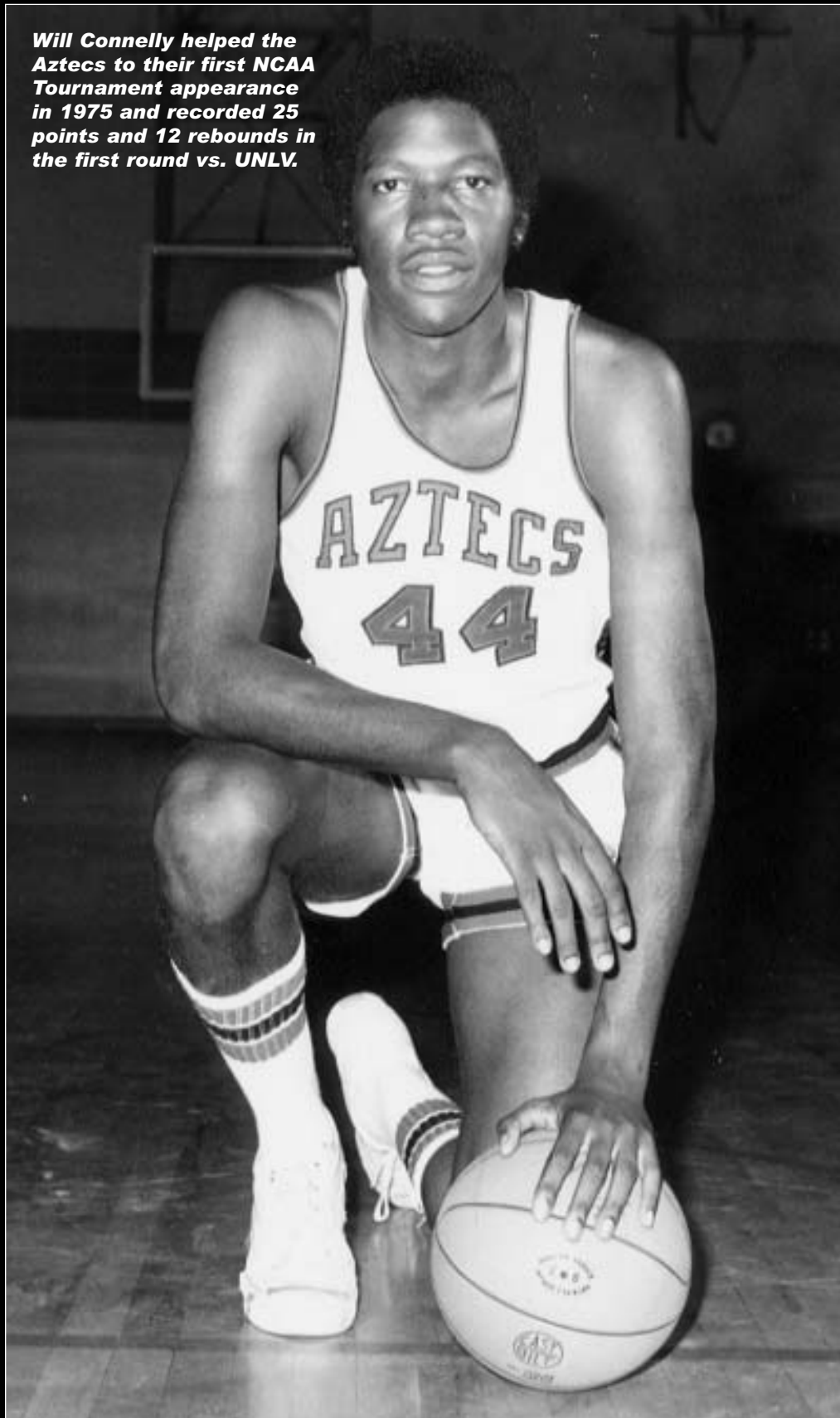

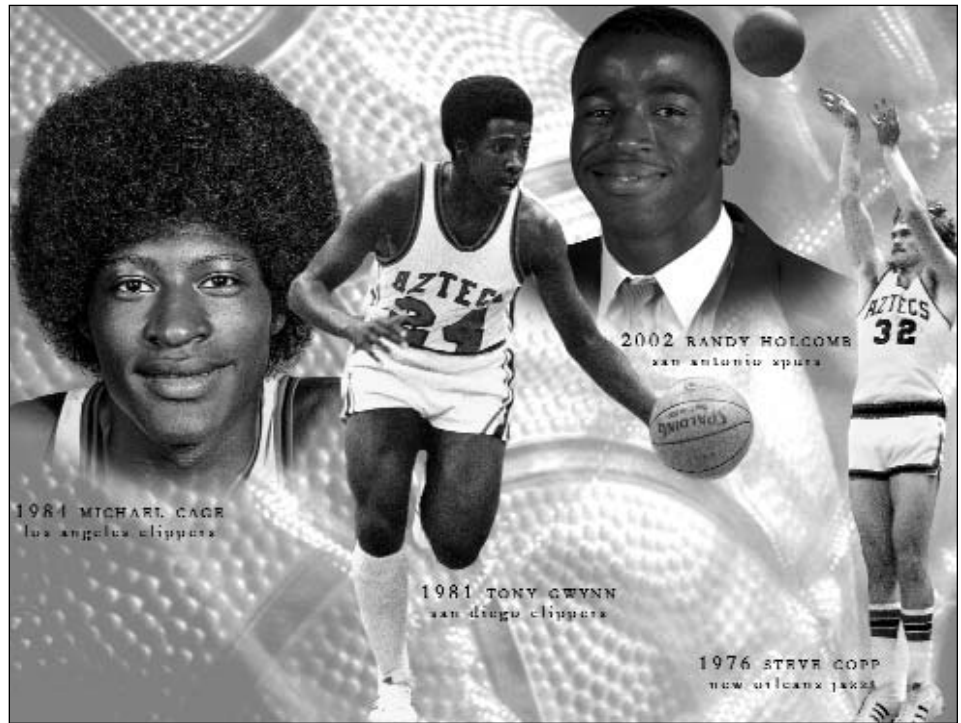

A four-year letterwinner who finished as the Aztecs' all-time leader in the following statistical categories: scoring (2,189), field goals (749), field goals attempted (1,815), three-point field goals (281), three-point field goals attempted (798), steals (217), games played (125), games started (120), double-digit scoring games (112) and minutes played (4,275)... Also finished among the school's all-time leaders in efficiency points (2nd - 1,652), points-rebounds-assists (2nd - 3,002), victories (2nd - 71), assists (3rd - 394), conference victories (3rd - 32), scoring average (4th - 17.5), three-point field goal percentage (10th - 35.2), efficiency average (15th - 13.22) and rebounds (17th - 419)... He finished as the only player in the Division I era to rank among SDSU's top 20 players in scoring (1st), rebounding (17th) and assists (3rd)... Finished as the only player in the 86-season history of the program to produce a 30-point scoring game in each of his four seasons... Won 71 games during his career, the second-highest total during a four-year span in school history... Guided San Diego State to the 2006 NCAA Tournament and to the second round of the 2007 NIT... One of only four players in school history to have five 30-point scoring games... Played in 125 games and recorded 112 double-digit scoring games, 54 20-point scoring games and five 30-point games... Led the Aztecs in scoring 60 times, in assists 45 times, efficiency 24 times and rebounds nine times... Eight-time Mountain West player of the week... Hit 13 big shots that either gave the Aztecs a lead it did not relinquish or forced overtime in the final 1:45 of the game... Left as the all-time Mountain West Conference leader in scoring and steals... Left San Diego State having scored in double figures a school-record 58 consecutive games and having started 85 straight games.

2. Michael Cage ► West Memphis, Ark. ► 1981-82-83-84

1,846 points

The player most associated with San Diego State basketball, Cage is the school's second all-time leading scorer (1,846) and top rebounder (1,317)... Brandon Heath broke Cage's scoring record in 2007... Selected a second-team All-American in 1984 by the *Associated Press*, *United Press International* and *Basketball Weekly*... Was an honorable mention All-American as a junior as named by the *Associated Press* and *UPI*... Earned co-Western Athletic Conference player of the year honors in 1983 and won the award outright in 1984... Ranked third nationally in rebounding as both a freshman and junior and as a senior was the only player to rank among the top 10 in scoring and rebounding... Member of the 1983 United States Pan American gold-medal winning team... First-round draft pick in the 1984 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Clippers... Among the many school records he set, he still holds the Aztec lead in the following categories: career scoring, single-season scoring (686), highest single-season scoring average (24.5), career rebounding, rebounds in a game (26), single-season field goals made (250), career free throws made (488), games started (112) and consecutive games started (112)... He played on Aztec teams which posted a 68-44 record with four straight winning seasons... Inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame in 1993.

3. Anthony Watson ► Detroit, Mich. ► 1983-84-85-86

1,735 points

One of the finest players in San Diego State history, Watson played in 110 games in his four seasons from the 1982-83 campaign through the 1985-86 season... Before Brandon Heath in 2006, he was the last Aztec player to earn league Most Valuable Player honors (WAC - 1985-86), he was a two-time first-team all-Western Athletic Conference selection (1985 and 1986)... In both 1985 and 1986 he was named to the all-WAC tournament team and is still today the only Aztec Division I player to be named to the all-conference tournament team twice... Ended his career as the fourth-leading scorer in Western Athletic Conference history trailing only Devin Durrant, Danny Ainge and San Diego State's Michael Cage... Broke the school record for points in a game when he tallied 54 points against U.S. International on Feb. 20, 1986... That is a San Diego State record that still stands today.

4. Tony Pinkins ► East Chicago, Ind. ► 1955-56-57

1,475 points

Broke the SDSU scoring record in 1957 and held the mark as the school's top scorer for 27 years... Remains the top Aztec scorer in a three-year career... Ranks third all-time with an 18.1 career scoring average... A three-time all-CCAA selection... Sits in second place with 485 free throws made in his career, only three behind Michael Cage, and holds the record for free throws in a three-year career.
