

Finished 2010 spring drills as the back up at one warrior spot behind Brandon Davis. 2009: Redshirted his first season at SDSU.

High School: A first-team all-area and all-city defensive selection who had six interceptions his senior year, while adding 45 tackles at Crenshaw High School ... Earned all-Coliseum League honors with 36 tackles, five pass breakups, two picks and a fumble recovery during his 2007 junior campaign ... Rated as the 84th-best cornerback nationally in the 2009 class by Scout.com.

Personal: Born June 16, 1991, in Los Angeles, Calif. ... Son of Janet Andrews ... Also received a scholarship offer to play football at Washington ... Undecided on his major.



A physical linebacker, who saw his first playing time a year ago on defense and special teams ... Was listed as the back-up at middle linebacker to end 2010 spring drills.

2009: Appeared in his first games in the Red and Black, earning his first letter ... Made his debut vs. Southern Utah ... Played in five contests overall with his only two stops both coming at Air Force on Sept. 26.

Had 104 tackles and added eight sacks and four forced fumbles his junior season to garner all-state underclassmen honors ... Had 750 yards rushing on 145 carries and scored 16 touchdowns in 2006 ... Threw a 21-yard touchdown strike to Vincent Brown in the third quarter of the win over New Mexico State ... Recorded three carries, a reception and three kick returns at Colorado State.

2008: Played in the first six games ... Made his first career reception against Cal Poly, hauling in a 36-yard pass to set up an Aztec touchdown ... Also had one carry against the Mustangs ... Returned two kickoffs for 27 yards against Notre

Returns for his senior campaign as one of the top receivers in the nation ... An explosive player with excellent speed and hands, who is able to make things happen ... Is a threat at both wideout and in the return game ... Breakout campaign a year ago, before suffering a season-ending injury ... Enters his fourth season on The Mesa with 140 career catches for 1,758 yards and 13 scores in 31 outings ... Ranks 10th in school career history in receptions



. 2010 preseason all-Mountain West Conference first team by Phil Steele Magazine, Sporting News, Lindy's and Blue Ribbon College Yearbook ... Rated the sixth-best wide receiver in the country and most dangerous deep threat in the MWC by Lindy's ... College Football Insiders preseason honorable mention All-American ... Seven career 100-yard receiving games.

2009: One of 10 semifinalists for the Biletnikoff Award, presented annually to the nation's top receiver ... Second-team all-MWC ... Ended the year with 45 catches for 778 yards and six touchdowns ... Five 100-yard receiving games, including four straight to start the year ... Had a touchdown in each of the team's opening five contests ... Started the first seven games, before suffering a season-ending thumb injury at Colorado State on Oct. 24 ... Became the 24th Aztec to reach the 100 career receptions mark with his five catches for 139 yards against UCLA ... Also met the 1,000 career receiving yards mark in the opener ... His 139 yards vs. the Bruins included a careerlong TD catch of 78 yards in the first half ... Also returned three kickoffs for 66 yards vs. UCLA ... Third-straight 100-yard receiving game in the win over Southern Utah, hauling in six passes for 142 yards and a 22-yard TD ... Had one punt return for 28 yards and two kickoff returns for 36 yards with a long of 28 vs. the Thunderbirds ... Career-best 13 receptions for 143 yards and his third TD of the year at Idaho ... Continued his 100-yard streak on his final catch against Air Force, posting 10 grabs for 123 yards and both of the team's touchdowns ... Also returned a punt for 33 yards and a kickoff for 18 yards ... Became the fourth SDSU player to record four consecutive 100-yard receiving games ... Saw his 100-yard receiving streak come to an end against New Mexico State, tallying three catches for 84 yards and touchdown ... Picked right back up vs. BYU, logging eight receptions for 147 yards for his fifth game of 2009 with more than 100 yards receiving ... Did not record a TD for the first time in 2009 in the game vs. the Cougars (five consecutive games with a TD) ... Missed most of the Colorado State game due to injury and did not log a catch.

2008: Played and started all 12 contests ... Easily led the team in catches (64) and receiving yards (631) ... Started at the X receiver spot vs. Cal Poly, ending the game with seven catches for 98 yards and a 23-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter ... The 98 receiving yards were a then career-best ... Three catches as a starter vs. Notre Dame ... Pair of receptions at San Jose State ... Career-best 183 receiving yards and three touchdowns in the victory over Idaho ... His three scores came on catches of 41, 48 and 51 yards ... His 183 yards was the 34th-best receiving total in SDSU game history and ranked 23rd in the Bowl Subdivision in 2008 ... Team game-high six catches for 52 yards at TCU with a long of 27 yards ... Four receptions vs. Air Force and five at New Mexico ... Career-best 11 receptions vs. Colorado State, including a 10-yard touchdown ... 11 catches are the most by an Aztec since Jeff Webb had 13 at Hawai'i in Dec. 2005 ... Started at Wyoming, making one catch and returning a punt before leaving the game with a concussion ... Team game-high seven catches for 52 yards at BYU ... Two receptions vs. Utah ... Logged his second-career 100-yard receiving game in the finale with UNLV, catching eight balls for 119 yards ... Became the 47th Aztec in school history to have at least two 100-yard receiving games in his career ... Fifth in the MWC and 46th nationally in receptions per game (5.3).

2007: Played in all 12 contests, starting eight of the final nine games ... Fourth on the team in receptions with 31 and in receiving yards with 349 ... Third in school season history in most receptions by a freshman and fourth in most receiving yards ... Returned 25 kickoffs for 547 yards (21.9 ypr.) ... One of four true freshmen to see action in the opener with Washington State ... Returned six kickoffs for 146 yards with a long of 33 yards ... player who always seems to be around the ball ... Team's defensive scout player of the year in 2007, while using his redshirt season ... SDSU scholar-athlete ... 2008 President's Award for Highest Standards of Academic & Athletic Excellence ... Two-time MWC all-academic honoree ... 2010 preseason all-Mountain West Conference second team by Phil Steele Magazine ... Has played in 24 consecutive contests.

2009: Was SDSU's second-leading tackler with a career-high 58 stops ... Third on the team in tackles for loss with 6.0 ... Played and started all 12 contests ... Accounted for four solo tackles, including one for a loss of a yard vs. UCLA ... Five stops, two TFLs and his first career sack against Southern Utah ... Four tackles



with a half sack at Idaho ... Career high in tackles with nine against Air Force ... Two stops in the win over NMSU and five vs. BYU ... Four tackles in the victory at CSU ... Three solo efforts against New Mexico ... Had four solo stops vs. TCU ... Recorded a team-best seven tackles (six solo) and a TFL vs. Wyoming ... Six stops in the season finale at UNLV.

#14 Ryan Lindley Quarterback Junior - 2L 6-4, 220 Alpine, Calif./El Capitan HS

A strong-armed passer who made his Aztec debut in 2008, and has been the starter ever since ... Started 23 games overall - fifth most in school history - in the last two seasons ... Threw for over 2,500 yards in both 2008 and 2009 ... First Aztec to pass for 2,000 yards in consecutive seasons since Billy Blanton (1995-96) ... Is the ninth Aztec to throw for at least 5,000 yards in his career ... Tied for sixth in SDSU history in career passing yards (5,707) with current quarterbacks coach Brian Sipe ... Fourth in career completions (481), fifth in attempts (864) and eighth in passing TDs (39) ... Has two career 400-yard passing games and six for 300 or more yards ... 2009 Manning Award Watch List ... Rated as the Mountain West Conference's best passing quarterback by Sporting News in 2010 ... Lindy's tabbed him as having the "strongest arm" in the MWC ... Preseason all-conference second team by Phil Steele Magazine ... Has made 18 consecutive starts entering 2010 season.

2009: Team co-offensive player of the year with DeMarco Sampson ... Ranked second in the conference and 19th nationally in passing yards per game (254.5) ...
