

The 2004 season could be the latest in an incredible stretch for the San Diego State softball team. Dating back to 1999, the team has seen its winning percentage improve every year and it has advanced to the NCAA Tournament twice, including a trip to the 2001 regional championship against UCLA, and a return trip to the NCAAs in 2003. Last year's squad also recorded the highest winning percentage in SDSU history at .650 (39-21 record).

"I'm extremely excited about this season," head coach Kathy Van Wyk said. "We're a veteran team and have hard-working kids coming back. We've got to be disciplined, pushing and working hard this season. If we do that, we have the ability to be ranked in the top 25 throughout the season, earn an NCAA berth and hopefully advance to the Women's College World Series."

The Aztecs return 15 of 18 players, including nine of 10 starters, two of whom are pitchers. Among the starters returning are four all-Mountain West Conference selections from a year ago, including Celena Velasquez, the league's reigning MWC Pitcher and Freshman of the Year. More than 90 percent of the team's runs, hits and stolen bases return, along with almost the entire defense that finished 2003 ranked No. 18 in the country.

## Pitchers

The pitching duties will be split among Velasquez, sophomore Deanna Richards and junior Cori Janelli.

"I don't think we've ever had the strength and overall depth in pitching that we do this year," Van Wyk said. "They'll all compliment each other nicely with their different styles. We have three strong pitchers while most teams can only claim one."

Velasquez was named the 2003 MWC Pitcher and Freshman of the Year for her conference-record 0.81 ERA in MWC games. The right-hander also held MWC opponents to a conference-low .144 batting average, compiled a 6-2 record in MWC games and earned Louisville Slugger/NFCA all-West Region honors. Overall, she went 15-8 with a 1.71 ERA.

Richards, who was 6-6 with a 1.96 ERA in 2003, battled injuries throughout the second half of last season. Also a first baseman, she is a hard thrower, often reaching 65 mph and above, and can mix it up with a change-up.

Janelli is a drop ball hurler who earned first team all-state honors for the College of Sequoias with a 0.65 ERA and 36-11 record last season.

## Catchers

SDSU boasts two options behind the plate in 2004, junior Danielle Touhey and senior Jacque Vaca. Touhey started 34 games last season and had an MWC-best 1.000 fielding percentage. If Touhey hits well to start the season, she will start behind the dish and Vaca will play first base. Vaca, who played her first two seasons at Illinois-Chicago, is the only current Aztec to have played in three NCAA Tournaments. She led the 2003 SDSU squad in numerous offensive categories, including batting average (.333), RBI (34) and slugging percentage (.420). Sophomore Jamie Burton will back them up and also see time as a pinch runner.

## Infielders

"We have great depth and are very versatile in the infield," Van Wyk said. "Generally speaking, whoever provides the offense will start. At this point, we don't quite know how it will shape up but it's a good problem to have - a healthy competition."

Vaca or Richards will likely start at first base but junior Lacey Craft and senior Kelcy Murphy could see time there.

Senior Joann Figueroa returns to her spot at second base. A year

ago, she earned all-West Region honors with her .319 batting average and stellar defensive play. Junior Brittany Green will back her up.

At shortstop, two sophomores, Bianca Cruz and Meagan Hartung, will battle for playing time with Cruz earning the early edge after starting all 60 games in 2003.

Third base will likely see Murphy start. She compiled a 1.000 fielding percentage while starting all 15 MWC games at the hot corner last season. Also expecting to see time at third base will be Cruz and Craft.

As a utility infielder, junior Brittany Green will likely play an assortment of infield positions throughout the season.

### Outfielders

All-MWC honoree junior Erin Mahoney earns the starting nod in left field. The Texas transfer and former first team all-Big 12 honoree hit .388 in MWC games, fifth in the league.

Senior Janna Kovensky will start in center field after leading the 2003 squad with 12 stolen bases and hitting .281 in 59 starts. Her nine career homers ties for second on the all-time SDSU charts.

Sophomore Bridgette Caron is the leading contender to start in right field, hitting .262 in 40 games as a freshman. Sophomore Bree Boyer, junior Kathleen Galbraith, freshman Amanda Beasley and Murphy will likely see playing time there.

"We have strong, veteran players in left and center field, while right field will be filled by the person who steps up at the plate," Van Wyk said. "Everybody will get playing time and whoever performs the best will get the starting position."

### The Schedule

The 2004 schedule is the toughest San Diego State has ever faced. It is highlighted by seven games against 2003 Women's College World Series participants, including three versus defending national champion UCLA. In all, the Aztecs have 22 games versus NCAA Tournament teams.

"It's important to schedule this way," Van Wyk said. "We are playing the type of schedule we have to in order to make it to the Women's College World Series."

Following a season-opening double-header against NAIA power Point Loma Nazarene, the Aztecs start a span of 14 games in which it plays teams ranked in the top 100 of last year's RPI.

The Aztecs begin defense of their 2002 MWC regular season championship with a couple of doubleheaders in Utah, on April 2 against Brigham Young and April 3 at Utah. The MWC home-opening doubleheader will be against Colorado State, the team that bested the Aztecs in last year's tournament championship, 3-1, at 1 p.m. on April 9.

This year's MWC Tournament takes place from May 13-15 at Colorado State, while the NCAA Regionals are May 20-23 at campus sites and the WCWS is May 27-31 at Oklahoma City, Okla.

# HEAD COACH



## Kathy Van Wyk Head Coach Eighth Season Cal State Fullerton, '83

Now in her eighth year as head coach, Kathy Van Wyk continues to transform San Diego State's softball program into a west coast power. Under her guidance, the Aztecs have become perennial Mountain West Conference champions and NCAA Tournament participants, and in 2001, came within an eyelash of its first-ever Women's College World Series berth.

Along with taking Aztec softball to new heights, Van Wyk is in her first season as San Diego State's senior woman administrator. She started her SWA duties, which include overseeing the department's academic, compliance and initial eligibility for student-athletes on Oct. 31.

Prior to Van Wyk's inaugural head coaching season in 1997, the San Diego State softball program had losing records in 18 of its previous 20 years, also its first 20 seasons of existence. SDSU boasted just a .413 winning percentage up to that point with a 400-569-5 record.

Things are different now.

Under Van Wyk's leadership, the Aztecs have won two consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, advanced to the NCAA Tournament twice in the past three seasons, including a regional runner-up finish in 2001, and compiled a .600 or higher winning percentage in each of those three seasons. The Aztecs have improved their winning percentage in each of the past five seasons and have been .500 or better in six of Van Wyk's seven years.

Van Wyk is also the first Aztec softball coach to achieve a top-25 ranking, two 40-win seasons and is the fastest to both 100 wins and 200 wins in the history of the program.

She won her 200th game in memorable fashion on Feb. 15, 2003, when catcher Amber Grahman's RBI single in the bottom of the ninth scored first baseman Jacque Vaca, giving SDSU a 2-1 victory over No. 4 Michigan in the Campbell/Cartier Classic.

Prior to San Diego State, Van Wyk spent 10 seasons as a player and an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton. She was an assistant coach from 1983-87, helping the Titans to the 1986 NCAA national title. After leaving Fullerton, she

became a pitching instructor at the Rod Carew Baseball School in Anaheim, Calif., from 1987-89.

In 1989, she moved to Azzano Decimo, Italy, where she was the head coach and pitcher for the Azzanase club. She guided a team that had recorded just one win the previous season to its first playoff berth. From January to March 1990, she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, Australia. She then returned to Cal State Fullerton as an assistant for the 1991 season.

In addition to coaching the Aztec softball team, she was the pitching coach for the Dutch national team leading up to and during the 1998 World Championships in Japan.

As a player, Van Wyk established herself as one of the top pitchers in the history of collegiate softball, enjoying a phenomenal 1982 season with a 35-1 mark with a 0.18 ERA. The victories remain a school single-season record and her .972 winning percentage was an NCAA Division I record (30 or more decisions) until 2001 when Jennie Finch of Arizona went 32-0. Her ERA is still eighth best in Division I history and her 33-game winning streak remains a record for consecutive victories. Her phenomenal season included four no-hitters, six one-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts and 270 strikeouts.

Throughout her career, she won numerous awards, including all-America honors and the Broderick Award, which is given annually to the nation's top collegiate player. She was also named the WCAA Player of the Year, Orange County Athlete of the Month and won an NCAA postgraduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade point average. Van Wyk was a member of the U.S. softball team in 1985 and 1989 and a five-time Amateur Softball Association All-American.

Van Wyk began her collegiate playing career at Texas Women's University, where she garnered 1979 Texas AIAW Player of the Year honors and is a member of the TWU Hall of Fame. She transferred to Cal State Fullerton in 1981 after TWU dropped its softball program.

A 1983 graduate of Cal State Fullerton with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Van Wyk completed her master's degree in physical education in 1993 at Azusa Pacific.

**Kelly Howard**  
Assistant Coach  
Fourth Season  
UCLA, '96

Kelly Howard, a two-time All-American who participated in four Women's College World Series at UCLA from 1993-96, is in her fourth season as an Aztec assistant coach. Howard previously served as an undergraduate assistant at UCLA when the Bruins were national runners-up in 1997. She also spent time in Wisconsin as an assistant coach at St. Norbert College in 1999.

Howard's duties at SDSU are not limited to the field. Besides working with players, she is responsible for the Diamond Club (a booster club), Aztec softball camps and clinics and coordinates all team travel arrangements.

Howard became one of the most decorated softball players in UCLA's rich



history. She was a member of the 1995 NCAA championship team, earning all-WCWS team honors. A four-time all-Pac-10 selection and a three-time all-region selection, Howard earned the UCLA Bruin Boosters Women's Athletic Outstanding Athlete of the Year Award as a senior. Howard still owns Bruin career records for at-bats, runs scored, hits and doubles and was named an all-decade Pac-10 selection.

Howard's success as a Bruin extended far beyond the playing field, as she also earned Academic All-America honors.

Following her collegiate career, Howard played professional softball for the Tampa Bay Firestix in the Women's Professional Softball League in 1998.

A native of San Diego, Howard is a 1992 graduate of Monte Vista High School, where she competed in softball, soccer and tennis and earned all-CIF accolades in all three sports. Howard's sister, Kristy, also an all-decade Pac-10 honoree, is the head coach at UC Santa Barbara. The two won the "Over the Line" World Championship in the summer of 2002 in San Diego.

Jennifer Milo, a former player and assistant coach at the University of San Diego, has brought her coaching skills across town and is an assistant coach with the Aztecs. As a player at USD from 1994-97, she compiled a career batting average of .354, including a .402 clip her senior season. She followed up her playing

career with an assistant coaching stint at USD from 1997-01.

As a player, Milo played every inning of every game in high school and at San Diego. A first baseman, she had her No. 44 jersey retired after her career concluded and was featured in *Sports Illustrated's* Faces in the Crowd for her athletic achievements.

As an assistant at USD, her responsibilities included hitting instruction, recruiting, organizing team travel and field maintenance.

Milo earned a bachelor's of arts degree in education and a teaching credential and also received a master's degree in educational counseling at USD in 2001.

Milo also has experience as an academic counselor at SDSU. Her responsibilities at San Diego State included monitoring the academic progress of 140 student-athletes on five different varsity teams, including men's basketball.

Athleticism has run in Milo's family. Her father, Robert Sr., played professional baseball for the Philadelphia Phillies organization, while her older brother, Robert Jr., played baseball at Stanford and her younger brother, Tony, played in the Anaheim Angels' organization.

Milo currently teaches courses in the San Diego State exercise and nutrition-related sciences department.



**Amber Grahman**  
Undergraduate Assistant  
First Season

Amber Grahman brings her Aztec playing experience to a coaching position in 2004 as undergraduate assistant coach.

A former SDSU catcher, Grahman's duties include assisting the Aztec catchers with their technique and training and helping coach the other facets of softball to team members. She also will act as the team's video coordinator and as a liaison between the players and the coaches.

Grahman played her first two seasons at Cal State Northridge prior to coming to San Diego State for the 2002 and 2003 campaigns. She played in 81 games and started 73 in her career, while her senior season was highlighted by her game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning of SDSU's upset of then-No.4 Michigan, 2-1, at the 2003 Campbell/Cartier Classic.

Grahman is majoring in social science with plans to teach and coach. She is due to graduate in May 2003.
