San Diego State's all-time winningest softball coach, Kathy Van Wyk has transformed the Aztec softball program into not just a west coast power, but a team that competes with the best nationally. Under her guidance, the Aztecs have become perennial Mountain West Conference champions and NCAA tournament participants, and in 2001, came within a hair's-length of its first-ever Women's College World Series berth.

Along with taking Aztec softball to new heights, Van Wyk is San Diego State's senior woman administrator. She started her SWA duties, which include overseeing the department's academic and initial eligibility for student-athletes, on Oct. 31, 2003.

Prior to Van Wyk's inaugural head coaching season in 1997, the San Diego State softball program had losing records in 18 of its previous 20 years. SDSU boasted just a .413 winning percentage up to that point with a 400-569-5 record.

Things are different now.

Under Van Wyk's leadership, the Aztecs have won two of the last three Mountain West Conference regular-season titles, advanced to the NCAA tournament twice in the past four seasons, including a regional runner-up finish in 2001, and compiled a .600 or higher winning percentage in the last four campaigns. The Aztecs have improved their winning percentage in five of the last six seasons and have been .500 or better in seven of Van Wyk's eight years.

Van Wyk is also the first Aztec softball coach to achieve a top-25 ranking, two 40-win seasons and is the fastest to both 100 and 200 career wins in the history of the program.

She won her 200th game in memorable fashion on Feb. 15, 2003, when catcher Amber Grahman's RBI single in the bottom of the ninth scored first baseman Jacque Vaca, giving SDSU a 2-1 victory over No. 4 Michigan in the Campbell/Cartier Classic.

When Aztec softball first baseman Lacey Craft finished off a ground-ball double play and the Buffalo Bulls for a 6-0 victory on March 21, 2004, Van Wyk won her 254th career game, more than any SDSU softball coach in history.

Prior to San Diego State, Van Wyk spent 10 seasons as a player and an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton. She was an assistant coach from 1983-87, helping the Titans to the 1986 NCAA national title. After leaving Fullerton, she became a pitching instructor at the Rod Carew Baseball School in Anaheim, Calif., from 1987-89.

In 1989, she moved to Azzano Decimo, Italy, where she was the head coach and pitcher for the Azzanase club. She guided a team that had recorded just one win the previous season to its first play-off berth. From January to March 1990, she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, Australia. She then returned to Cal State Fullerton as an assistant for the 1991 season.

In addition to coaching the Aztec softball team, she was the pitching coach for the Dutch national team leading up to and during the 1998 World Championships in Japan.

As a player, Van Wyk established herself as one of the top pitchers in the history of collegiate softball, enjoying a phenomenal 1982 season with a 35-1 mark and a 0.18 ERA. The victories remain a school single-season record and her .972 winning percentage was an NCAA Division I record (30 or more decisions) until 2001 when Jennie Finch of Arizona went 32-0. Her ERA is still eighth-best in Division I



history and her 33-game winning streak remains a record for consecutive victories. Her phenomenal season included four no-hitters, six one-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts and 270 strikeouts.

Throughout her career, she won numerous awards, including All-America honors and the Broderick Award, which is given annually to the nation's top collegiate player. She was also named the WCAA Player of the Year, Orange County Athlete of the Month and won an NCAA postgraduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade-point average. Van Wyk was a member of the U.S. softball team in 1985 and 1989 and a five-time Amateur Softball Association All-American.

Van Wyk began her collegiate playing career at Texas Women's University, where she garnered 1979 Texas AIAW Player-of-the-Year honors and is a member of the TWU Hall of Fame. She transferred to Cal State Fullerton in 1981 after TWU dropped its softball program.

A 1983 graduate of Cal State Fullerton with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Van Wyk completed her master's degree in physical education in 1993 at Azusa Pacific.

San Diego native Kelly Howard Warren is in her fifth season as an Aztec assistant coach. Warren previously served as an undergraduate assistant at UCLA when the Bruins were runners-up in the national title series in 1997. She also spent time in Wisconsin as an assistant coach at St. Norbert College in 1999.

Warren works with the Aztec infielders and hitters and since she has joined the Aztec softball family, SDSU has seen its first ever conference championships (2002, 2003) and have advanced to the NCAA tournament twice. Warren's duties are not limited to the field. Besides working with players, she is responsible for Aztec softball scheduling, recruiting, fundraising, and arranges all team travel.

Warren is one of the most decorated softball players in UCLA's history, starting every game during her four years of competition. She helped the Bruins to four NCAA College World Series appear-

ances and was a member of the 1995 NCAA championship team, earning all-World Series team honors. Warren is a four-time all-Pac-10 pick, three-time all-regional selection, and two-time All-American. Warren graduated owning Bruin career records for at-bats, runs scored, hits and doubles and was named an all-decade Pac-10 honoree. Warren compiled a career batting average of .374 at UCLA.

Warren was invited to the US National Team camp in 1993 and also participated in the 1993 Olympic Festival in San Antonio, TX. Following her career at UCLA, Warren played professional softball for the Tampa Bay Firestix in the Women's Professional Softball League in 1998.

Warren is a 1992 graduate of Monte Vista High, where she competed in softball, soccer and tennis. She earned her Bachelors degree with a major in geography, environmental sciences from UCLA in 1997. Warren and husband Dave live in Point Loma.
