Welcome Back

The San Diego State men's soccer team returns to San Diego this week for a pair of Mountain Pacific Sports Federation matches. The Aztecs face UNLV on Friday at 4 p.m. and New Mexico on Sunday at 2 p.m. The Aztecs (6-6-2, 2-1-1 MPSF) come off a weekend that saw them tie San Jose State, 1-1, and shutout Fresno State, 2-0. SDSU's 2-1-1 mark in league puts them in second place in the standings, trailing Air Force (12-2, 4-0 MPSF).

Recapping The Weekend

The Aztecs posted their second tie of the season Friday versus San Jose State. Senior Enrique Tovar knotted the score when he converted a penalty kick at the 83:28 mark. Competition was later suspended by officials leaving things tied at a goal apiece.

SDSU recorded its fourth shutout of year and the second in conference play in Sunday's 2-0 win over Fresno State. The victory moved the team to .500 for the third time this season. Enrique Tovar assisted on both goals, the first was scored by freshman Anthony Zoric and the second by sophomore Kevin Sapanli.

At .500, Again

The Aztecs have been at the .500 mark three times thus far this season. The last time the program posted an even mark at least 14 matches into a campaign was in 1997 when it was 6-6-3. The last time SDSU has been over .500 was during the 1998 season when it was 5-4-1. That year SDSU moved to at least a game over .500 on five occasions.

Scoring Turnaround

Another sign of the turnaround the Aztec program is making this season comes in terms of scoring. SDSU scored a total of 25 goals during the 2000 campaign compared to the 26 the team has scored thus far this season.

The Initial Strike

Thirteen of the the Aztecs 26 goals this season have come in the first half. SDSU has been the first team to score eight times this season and posts a 7-1 mark when doing so.

Scoring Punch

Junior forward Enrique Tovar is the team's lead scorer this season. His goal and two assists this past weekend give him five goals and six assists (16 points) on the year. Tovar is the first Aztec to receive the league's player of the week honor this season doing so on Oct. 1. The occasion also marks the first time Tovar has earned the weekly award. Earlier this season, he scored the fastest goal in program history, finding the net just 15 seconds into the match versus UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 6. Tovar is also 3-for-3 in penalty kick situations this season.

Another Scoring Punch

Also setting the tone of the Aztec offense this season has been a local product, sophomore midfielder Kevin Sapanli. Sapanli scored his sixth goal of the season in the Fresno State match, coupled with his one assist he is second on the team in scoring with 13 points.

Netminders

The Aztecs have allowed just two goals in their last three matches and have not yielded two goals in seven consecutive games. A large part of that success has come by way of senior goalkeeper Tim Edwards. Edwards is responsible for both of the team's conference shutouts and had a hand in the team's blankings of Christian Heritage on Sept. 19 and Oct. 4, sharing the shutout with junior keeper Brian Barnes. Through nine matches played, Edwards has allowed seven goals and recorded 27 saves. He is 3-1-2 and boasts a 0.92 goals-against average this year.

The New Guys

SDSU has gotten plenty of help from its incoming class thus far this season and has started anywhere from four to six newcomers throughout the year. Players prominent in the starting lineup have been senior Aaron Frimkess, junior Mauricio Soler and freshmen Drew Picone, Paul Szeffler, Patrick Strait and Eric Wohl. Eight of this year's new faces have scored at least a point and account for 33 of the Aztecs' 79 points this season (nine goals, 15 assists).

Aztec Coaching Staff

SDSU is led by second-year head coach Lev Kirshner. Kirshner is assisted by Matt Hall, Dave Siracus and Rene Miramontes.

Scouting UNLV

UNLV (7-6, 2-2 MPSF) come off a pair of conference losses this past weekend, 3-2 at Denver and 5-0 at Air Force. The team's lead scorer is sophomore Alex Hernandez with 7 goals (14 points) on the year. SDSU owns a 14-9-3 series record with the Rebels and won the last meeting between the two, a 1-0 decision last season in San Diego. UNLV is led by head coach Barry Barto, in his 20th season with the program.

Scouting New Mexico

New Mexico (3-8-2, 0-3-1 MPSF) comes to San Diego in search of its first conference win and comes off losses to Air Force and Denver this past weekend. The Aztecs are 2-8-1 all-time versus the Lobos and posted at 2-1 loss against them last season in Albuquerque. UNM is led by 15th-year head coach Klaus Weber.

Things To Come

SDSU takes a one-match break from league play next week, competing at CSU Fullerton on Halloween. The team concludes its conference slate on Nov. 4 at CSU Sacramento.

This Week

San Diego State (5-9-1, 1-2-1 MWC) travels to Albuquerque to face New Mexico (3-9-2, 2-1-1 MWC) on Sunday, Oct. 28, at 1:00 p.m. (MDT). The contest versus the Lobos will be the Aztecs' only game this week. It marks the third of four consecutive conference road games that SDSU will play to conclude the regular season.

Series Record

The Aztecs and Lobos have met seven times with SDSU holding a 5-1-1 advantage in the series. San Diego State has won the last five meetings, including a pair of 3-0 wins last season (in San Diego and at the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas). The Lobos' lone win was a 1-0 decision in Albuquerque in 1995.

Most Recently

SDSU made its first conference road trip of the season last weekend and came away with a tie and a loss. On Friday (Oct. 19), the Aztecs fell behind at Wyoming 1-0 before Kim Castellanos scored an unassisted goal just after halftime to knot the score. The game went through 90 minutes of regulation and two 15-minute overtime periods with no further scoring. It was San Diego State's first tie in three seasons of Mountain West Conference action. On Sunday (Oct. 21), SDSU suffered a 3-0 loss at Air Force as the Falcons handed the Aztecs their third shutout of the season. Air Force scored three unanswered goals in the second half to claim the victory.

Clegg Reaches Milestone

Chuck Clegg is his ninth season in charge of the SDSU women's soccer program with a record of 101-62-6 (.615). His 100th career win as coach of the women's squad came in SDSU's 2-0 win at UC Riverside on Sept. 18. He joins Clive Charles (Portland) and Anson Dorrance (North Carolina) as the only other NCAA Division I coaches to accumulate at least 100 wins as both a men's and women's collegiate head coach. Clegg compiled 194 victories as head coach of the Aztec men from 1982-99.

Scouting The Lobos

New Mexico enters the game with an overall mark of 3-9-2 and a 2-1-1 slate in league play. The Lobos pulled off the biggest upset in three years of MWC play when they defeated Brigham Young, 1-0, in Provo last weekend. Two of UNM's three wins this season have come against ranked teams (Kentucky and Brigham Young). The other was a 2-1 win at Air Force. All three victories have come on the road, and UNM is 0-4-1 at home this season. The Lobos are led this fall by three players who have scored two goals apiece: forwards Coco D'Angelo and Camille Bremer along with midfielder Erchen Theys. The Lobos have scored a total of 11 goals in their 13 contests. They will host UNLV on Friday (Oct. 26) prior to facing the Aztecs.

Castellanos On The Charts

With her goal at Wyoming last Friday, Kim Castellanos has matched her output (10) of last season when she was named the conference co-

freshman of the year. The 10 goals ties for the seventh-most in a season by an Aztec. Her 20 career goals rank fifth on the SDSU list. She is two goals shy of moving into a tie for the number-four spot with Shaw Vilorio (22 goals, 1992-94). Castellanos' 43 career points (10g, 3a) puts her two points away from moving her into the number-nine spot currently held by Aimee Jacobs (45 points, 1993-96).

Quinones Busy In Goal

With 72 saves thus far in 2001, senior goalie Linnea Quinones has moved into the number-three spot on the SDSU career saves list with 168. Number two on the list is Katherine Judkins (1996-99) with 192 career saves. Quinones' 72 saves this season represent the highest total in her four years as an Aztec and is the fourth-most in a season for an SDSU keeper. With four more saves, that total will become the second-most in a season ahead of Katherine Judkins (73 in 1996) and Lorena Snyder (75 in 1991). Quinones' previous high for saves in a season was 32 during the 2000 campaign. She has eight saves or more in five matches this fall.

Among The Leaders

Kim Castellanos leads the Mountain West Conference in scoring with 22 points (10g, 2a), and is tied for the lead in league games only with five points (2g, 2a). Her 10 goals is also a league high. Air Force's Beth Boyer is second with eight goals. Quinones ranks third in saves with 72, an average of 5.54 per game. Arinda Alvarez and Fay deLeon are among a group of seven players tied for fifth in the MWC with four assists. Castellanos and Nicole Findlay (who is injured and has not played since the third game of the season) remain tied with four others in game-winning goals with two apiece.

Fit To Be Tied

The tie vs. Wyoming last weekend was San Diego State's first tie in almost three years. SDSU's last tie came on Nov. 1, 1998, when it drew 1-1 with UC Irvine at home. The Aztecs had gone 61 straight matches without a draw until the 1-1 tie in Laramie.

Aztec Notes

- The loss at Air Force last weekend marked the first time the Falcons had defeated the Aztecs in four meetings.
- San Diego State is 2-0 in overtime matches this season with wins over Cal State Fullerton (3-2) and Utah (2-1).
- Senior defender Fay deLeon now has 57 career points, one point out of the number-five position on the SDSU career list behind Elicia Petre (58 points, 1997-2000).
- Kim Castellanos' 10 goals this fall have come against nine different opponents.

On The Horizon

The Aztecs conclude their regular season next weekend when they travel to Las Vegas to take on UNLV on Saturday, Nov. 3, at 7:30 p.m. (PDT). Four days later, the team will return to Las Vegas for the 2001 Mountain West Conference Tournament which runs Nov. 7-10.

Following a week off, the San Diego State cross country team travels to Albuquerque, N.M., for the Mountain West Conference Championships. Competition gets underway Saturday at 9 a.m. at the Paradise Hills Golf Course. SDSU will be sending its top six runners to event – Julie Amster, Allison Brown, Laura Preston, Jennifer Stakiw, Alicia Stewart and Amanda Vielbaum.

Recapping The UC San Diego Invite

SDSU finished fourth in a 13-team field on Oct. 13 at the 2001 Triton Classic Cross Country Invitational held on the UC San Diego campus. The Aztecs placed two runners in the top 20, with juniors Alicia Stewart and Jennifer Stakiw finishing 16th and 18th, respectively. Stewart ran the 6,000-meter course in 23:41.60 and Stakiw in 23:53.50. Sophomore Allison Brown crossed the finish line next for SDSU, doing so in 24:22.70 and in 30th place. She was followed by Amanda Vielbaum's 31st-place time of 24:23.

SDSU This Year

Prior to the UC San Diego Invite, SDSU placed sixth at the Long Beach State Invitational. An eighth-place finish and a season-best time by junior Alicia Stewart paced the team as three Aztecs placed in the top 25. On Sept. 29, SDSU placed 16th in a 25-team field at the Stanford Invite in Palo Alto. The event was the Aztecs' first 6,000-meter course. The team's top finisher was Jennifer Stakiw, who crossed the finish line at 22:53 and in 53rd place. The previous Saturday, SDSU ran to a 10th-place finish in a 25-team field at the UC Riverside Invite. SDSU was led by junior Alicia Stewart, who placed

29th with a time of 19:34 and junior Jennifer Stakiw's 30th-place finish of 19:35. The scarlet and black got its 2001 campaign started with an eighth-place finish at the CSU Fullerton Jammin' Invitational on Sept. 1. The Aztecs were led by junior Jennifer Stakiw, whose time of 19:43.30 was good for 42nd-place, and Allison Brown's time of 20:22.40 earned her 69th-place.

Coaching Staff

The Aztecs are led by the coaching staff of Rahn Sheffield and Jennifer Nanista. A 1990 graduate of SDSU, Nanista is one of the best middle distance runners to don the scarlet and black. She finished second in the 800 meters at both the 1989 and '90 Big West Championships.

Looking Ahead

The Aztecs take next week off to prepare for the District 8 Championships to be held in Tucson, Ariz., on Sat., Nov. 10.

The two-day, 54-hole event will be held at the Kapolei Golf Course (Par 72; 5,900 yards), located on Oahu's eastern shore. The tournament's first two rounds are slated for Monday, Oct. 30, with the third and final round scheduled for Tuesday, Oct. 31. Both days will feature 7:30 a.m. (HT) shotgun starts.

Three individuals — Heather Rollo, Sandy Kim and Shayna Miyajima — have played in both fall events, while Frieda Englund saw action in the season opener at Denver.

The Field

In addition to San Diego State and host school Hawaii, the 19-team field for the Wahine Fall Classic includes Arizona, Baylor, BYU, California, Central Florida, Colorado, Denver, Idaho, Long Beach State, New Mexico, Oregon, Oregon State, San Francisco, San Jose State, Southern Illinois, UC Riverside, UNLV. Of the 19 teams, eight are ranked in this week's *Golfweek* Top-50, including No. 13 Arizona, which is the highest ranked team in the field.

Aztecs Against The Field

San Diego State has already faced six of the 19 teams scheduled to compete at the Wahine Fall Classic — Baylor, BYU, Colorado, Denver, Hawaii, San Jose State. The Aztecs are 1-5 versus those six teams thus far, with the lone win coming over Hawaii at the Pioneer Intercollegiate.

Back Spin: Last Year's Wahine Classic
