Wyoming Cowboy Basketball Postgame Notes

Following a 79-51 loss to San Diego State on February 19, 2013, in Viejas Arena in San Diego, Calif.

Team Notes:

- Wyoming still owns a 38-35 advantage in the all-time series with the Aztecs, but is 11-22 in San Diego and 3-7 in the last 10 meetings.
- San Diego State scored a season-high 79 points for a Wyoming opponent, while also shooting a season-high 30-of-44 (68.2 percent) from the field. The Aztecs' 30 field goal makes is the most for a Cowboy opponent this season
- The Aztecs are the first Cowboy opponent to score more than 70 points this season. UW had previously not allowed more than 69 points this season.
- The Cowboys scored a season-low 13 points in the first half on a season-low 4-of-24 shooting. It is the fourth time this season UW has not scored 20 points in a half.
- Wyoming's 16 rebounds were a season low, while its nine fouls tied a season low.
- Wyoming's starters were senior Derrious Gilmore, sophomore forward Larry Nance Jr., sophomore guard Riley Grabau, sophomore forward Derek Cooke Jr. and freshman guard Josh Adams. It was the first time this season UW has utilized that lineup and are 0-1 with that lineup. It was the fifth different starting lineup UW has used this season after using just two different lineups a season ago.
- Ten of 11 available Cowboys played in the game with seven playing 10 or more minutes.

Individual Notes:

- Senior guard Derrious Gilmore scored in double figures for the 18th time this season finishing with 15 points. It was his fourth-consecutive game in double figures.
- Sophomore center Matt Sellers appeared in his seventh game this season and scored the first 10 points of his Cowboy career. He also played a career-high nine minutes.
- Sophomore forward Derek Cooke Jr. started the first game of his career finishing with 10 minutes of action.
- Senior forward Leonard Washington did not play in the game due to injury, it was his first career game missed.
