A RECORD-BREAKING SEASON FOR THE 2006 AZTEC SOFTBALL TEAM

The 2006 season was certainly a year for the ages for San Diego State softball. The Aztecs finished with a 34-15 record, their best mark in school history, and won the Mountain West Conference regular season title for the third time in the past five years with a 15-3 record in league action. SDSU's fantastic season was highlighted by a runner-up finish to perennial power UCLA in the Los Angeles NCAA regional final. It was the Aztecs' third trip to the NCAA tournament in the past six seasons. Other win-loss school records set by the 2006 squad included fewest home losses (six), best home winning percentage (.769), fewest road losses (four), best road winning percentage (.696), fewest conference losses (three), best conference/MWC winning percentage (.833) and most MWC wins (15). In addition, SDSU's 13-game winning streak from March 31-April 29 tied a school record set by the 2003 NCAA tournament squad.

AZTECS IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

The Aztecs' spectacular season didn't go unnoticed by the rest of the country as they earned their first national ranking in school history on April 25, when they came into the ESPN/USA Softball poll at No. 24. On March 5, SDSU received votes from both the ESPN/USA Softball and USA Today/NFCA polls. The Aztecs received votes or were in the top 25 in either poll in eight of the final 10 weeks of the year. SDSU picked up two wins against ranked opponents during the season with both coming against No. 23 Oregon (4-1 (March 3) and 5-4 (March 5)).

SDSU AND THE RPI

To see how good the Aztecs really were last season, one would only have to look at the RPI ratings, where SDSU finished at No. 21 of 275 schools.

According to the rankings, SDSU had the 35th-best winning percentage in the nation (.694) while playing the 36th toughest schedule. Aztecs opponents combined for .554 winning percentage.

SDSU ended the season with a 12-9 record against top 50 RPI schools, 12-5 against teams rated between 51 and 100 and was 10-1 versus 101-200 schools. The Aztecs did not play an opponent with an RPI rating in the 201 and up range.

HERE BATTER, BATTER, BATTER

The San Diego State offense had a season to remember in 2006, outhitting its opponents for much of the year and setting numerous game and season records in the process.

Despite playing most games at sea level while the other five teams in the conference are at elevation (New Mexico - 5,000 feet, Colorado State - 4,800, Brigham Young - 4,553, Utah - 4,500 and UNLV - 2,030), the Aztecs finished first in MWC contests in on base percentage (.428), second in batting average (.333) and third in runs per game (5.67). In addition, SDSU struck out the fewest times of any team (1.94 per game) in MWC play and stole the most bases per game (1.06), while walking 3.72 times per game (second in MWC).

The Aztecs hit a school-record 27 home runs in 49 games, eclipsing their previous school record of 19 set by the 1999 squad (48 games). SDSU also set school records in runs (230), RBI (210) and walks (158) despite playing in far fewer games than previous seasons.

Other records that were broken last season included team batting average (.293, .289 in 1996), slugging percentage (.410, .345 in 2002 and 1996) and on-base percentage (.379, .344 in 1996).

When comparing the successful 2006 season to 2005's 27-30 campaign, one could look at the improvement in hitting as the main difference. The 2006 Aztecs batted .293 after only hitting .244 in 2005. Other glaring differences from 2006 to the previous year included runs (234-148), walks (161-101) and stolen bases (48-31). Also, 12 players in 2006 batted above the 2005's .244 team batting average.

SDSU broke its single-game run record twice in 2006. On Feb. 17, the Aztecs defeated Rider, 20-2, in five innings, and then scored 21 in a 21-5, five-inning win at New Mexico on April 23.

PITCHING WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Although the offense might have received most of the credit for the Aztecs' success in 2006, the bread and butter of the team was once again the pitching staff.

The SDSU hurlers went 34-15 with a 2.34 ERA, lowest in the MWC. The staff also ranked first in the league in win percentage (.694) and strikeout-to-walk ratio

(4.61).

Against No. 2 UCLA on Feb. 12, SDSU held the Bruins, who came into the game averaging 13.0 runs per game, to their then lowest run total of the year in a 2-1 loss. After allowing four runs in their first game of the season against Cal Poly (W, 9-4), the Aztecs gave up only 18 runs over their next 14 games (1.29 runs per game) before being shutout by No. 25 Fresno State, 11-0. Included in the 14-game streak were five shutouts.

On the season, SDSU gave up two or fewer runs in 29 of its 49 games, one or fewer runs in 21 games and had nine shutouts. To show how remarkable the pitching staff is when given run support, the Aztecs were 26-2 when scoring four or more runs and 32-4 when scoring three or more runs.

Three pitchers - senior Celena Velasquez, sophomore Christina Ross and freshman Melissa Owens - were named MWC Pitcher of the Week in 2006, while Ross was named the MWC Pitcher of the Year, marking the fifth time in six seasons that an Aztec has won the award.

THE FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

What might even be more remarkable is how well SDSU did despite its youth. The underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) combined to bat .301 (team average was .293) and pitched 65.3 percent (217 1/3 innings) of the team's innings for a combined ERA of 1.84 (team's ERA was 2.34).

In addition, the underclassmen had 85.2 percent (23-of-27) of the team's home runs, 85.0 percent (181-of-213) of the team's RBI and 83.0 percent (44-of-53) of the team's doubles.

The underclassmen earned the starting nod 77.5 percent of the time as well.

A SIGN OF THINGS TO COME

In her first collegiate career at-bat and first collegiate game against Cal Poly on Feb. 9, freshman Erin Floros drilled a two-out pitch over the left field wall for a solo homer. She didn't stop producing the rest of the season on her way to arguably the best offensive in school history.

Floros ended up setting school records in slugging percentage (.558) and on base percentage (.467), and was just one percentage point short of tying the batting average (.388) record.

She became the first All-American in school history when she was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Third Team. She later earned first-team Easton-Bell Sports All-America accolades.

In addition, she became the first Aztec since 2003 (Bre DeSanta) to be named to the NFCA all-West Region first team, and was named the MWC Freshman of the Year and an all-league pick.

She also ranked among the school single-season top-10 in doubles (tied for fourth, 13), home runs (tied for seventh, four) and in total bases (tied for eighth, 82).

To show just how important she was to the team, SDSU was 18-4 when she scored a run and a perfect 13-0 when she had at least one RBI.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE SDSU SOFTBALL STADIUM

Playing every home game at SDSU Softball Stadium for the first time was a good thing for the Aztecs. SDSU finished 20-6 at home for a remarkable winning percentage of .769, a school record.

The Aztecs fared particularly well down the stretch, winning eight of their final 10 home contests.

Eleven of the team's 20 home victories were by three or more runs, while three of their six losses were by two runs or less.

A MEMORABLE SEASON FOR COACH VAN WYK

Tenth-year head coach Kathy Van Wyk had another fine season for SDSU, guiding the team to its third conference title in the last five seasons and third NCAA trip in the past six years. She coached an Aztec team which set 18 team school records and earned numerous postseason accolades, including Erin Floros, the first All-American in school history, and Christina Ross, the fifth Aztec to win MWC Pitcher of the Year honors in the last six seasons.

For her efforts, Van Wyk received the league's coach of the year, the second of her career.
