COACHING STAFF



Head Coach Lev Kirshner 19th Season Rutgers '91

Entering his 19th season at the helm of the SDSU men's soccer program, Lev Kirshner has brought the Aztecs back into the national spotlight while leading the program into its 14th season as a member of the Pac-12 Conference.

Kirshner has racked up over 130 wins while at SDSU and has taken the Aztecs to the NCAA Tournament three times (2005, 2006 & 2016). He has led SDSU to a .500 record or better nine times while overseeing seven freshmen All-Americans, 18 all-region selections and over 90 all-conference honorees.

In 2016, the Aztecs recorded 11 shutouts and went 9-4-6 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. That season SDSU placed seven players on the All-Pac-12 team, the most since the 2010 season. SDSU also had a historic 1-0 victory over Akron, the No. 1 ranked team in the country at the time.

The Aztecs advanced to the postseason in both 2005 and 2006 with backto-back nine win seasons, the first NCAA appearance for the program since the 1989 season.

In 2005, SDSU went 9-4-6, its best mark since 1991 and was nationally ranked by all four polls during the season and reached as high as No. 14 by Soccer American and College Soccer News. The Aztecs ranked first nationally with an 87.9 shots-on-goal save percentage and second in the country with a 0.54 goals against average behind 12 shutouts from goalkeeper Tally Hall. Hall became the first Aztec to receive All-American honors since National Soccer Hall of Fame member Marcelo Balboa did so in 1989.

With Hall back for his senior season in 2006, and the addition of Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, Nick Cardenas, the Aztecs returned to the NCAA Tournament and finished in second place in the Pac-10 with a 5-2-3 mark.

Kirshner also led the Aztecs to back-to-back 10 wins seasons in 2010 and 2011, but SDSU was left out of the NCAA Tournament.

Before coming to SDSU, Kirshner coached the women of Cañada College (Redwood City, Calif.) from 1992-95. During that time, he took over a program that had never won a conference game and led it to a 16-1-3 record in his final year. For his efforts, he was named the Coast Conference Coach of the Year. He also served as the men's assistant coach at Cañada and helped with their run to the state quarterfinals in 1992 and 1994.

From there, Kirshner moved to a head coaching position at Ohlone College (Fremont, Calif.) in 1995. At Ohlone, he helped take a team from a second-to-last place league finish the previous season to as high as No. 15 in the state.

Kirshner also had a stint as the men's assistant coach at his alma mater, Rutgers. Kirshner helped the Scarlet Knights reach the second round at the 1996 NCAA tournament and finish the season with a No. 13 national ranking and a 14-7-4 overall record.

Kirshner arrived at SDSU prior to the 1997 and spent three years as an assistant under long-time head coach Chuck Clegg, the school's all-time winningest coach.

As a player at Rutgers, Kirshner was part of a 1987 NCAA quarterfinal team, a 1989 NCAA semifinal squad that lost to eventual co-champion Virginia and a runner-up finisher to UCLA in the 1990 championship match.

He received his undergraduate degree in communication while graduating with honors in 1991, and is listed as one of the soccer program's top 25 alums

"Lev was an outstanding player for us and a very integral part of a team that went to two Final Fours in his career," Rutgers head coach Bob Reasso said. "In my 25 years at Rutgers, Lev was one of the finest players ever to come through our program."

Following his collegiate career, Kirshner represented the United States in 1993, winning a bronze medal for the U.S. national Maccabiah team. In 1997, he returned to Israel as captain of the U.S. team, and led the only squad to defeat eventual gold-medalist Brazil.

Kirshner was selected as one of 250 domestic and international athletes to be assessed in the inaugural Major League Soccer combine in 1995. Kirshner also had a stint in the USISL starting for the Reno Rattlers. During that year, he trained with and played in several intrasquad reserve games for the MLS San Jose Clash.

Kirshner was named coach of the U.S. Maccabiah Pan-American U-20 soccer team in December 2003, where he won a bronze medal in Santiago, Chile. In the summer of 2005, Kirshner led the national Maccabiah squad to a second-place finish. Kirshner and his assistant, Amos Magee, became only the second and third members of the U.S. soccer delegation to have won two medals in the World Maccabiah Games. Additionally, Kirshner's squad earned the tournament's "Fair Play" Award, which is given to the team that exhibited the best sportsmanship.

Kirshner has valuable experience working with all levels of soccer having had stints with the Region IV Olympic Development Program (ODP) and serving as the interim head coach of the national runner-up West team during the 2001 U.S. regional championship. He was also as an assistant coach during the team's undefeated April 2002 tour of Australia.

Additionally, Kirshner worked as both an assistant and head coach with the Northern California ODP U-23 men's team during 1995 and 1996. He led those squads to consecutive Western Regional championships, including a third-place finish at the 1995 Donnelly Cup. He also won a Western Regional title with the under-15 ODP Northern California state team as the assistant coach of the 1984 age group.

Kirshner possesses a USSF A-License and has received the NSCAA Premiere Badge with distinguished honors; the highest accolade provided by that organization.

A graduate of Mission San Jose High School, Kirshner was inducted to the first hall of fame class at his alma mater. While at Mission San Jose, he guided his team to two North Coast Section (NCS) appearances. During his senior season, he led his squad to its school's first league title en route to the NCS semifinals. A three-time all-league selection and led his team in points all four years.

COACHING STAFF



Associate Head Coach Matt Hall 19th Season San Diego '01

Matt Hall enters his sixth season as associate head coach and 19th overall with the San Diego State men's soccer program. His primary responsibilities are working with the Aztec goalkeepers. In addition to his goalkeeping duties, Hall coordinates the team's recruiting, and organizes and runs practice sessions.

Known as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation, Hall has coached an SDSU netminder to a postseason honor in eight of his last 12 seasons on Montezuma Mesa.

Actively involved as the team's recruiting coordinator, Matt Hall helped San Diego State produce three straight top-40 recruiting classes from 2005-07 while adding four more in subsequent years. The Aztecs were ranked No. 39 by College Soccer News in 2005, No. 19 in 2006, No. 17 in 2007, No. 22 in 2009, No. 29 in 2010, No. 35 in 2011 and No. 37 in 2014.

The accolades are not surprising since Hall helped Kirshner build the program back up to a national force. Hall helped SDSU earn a full allotment of scholarships for the first time in school history. In the process, the Aztecs joined the Pac-10 (now Pac-12), arguably one of the top soccer conferences in the nation.

Hall is a familiar face to San Diego State soccer fans, having spent three years (1996-98) defending the Aztecs' net and beginning SDSU's recent tradition of nationally renowned goalkeepers.

Hall is listed third on the school's season saves list, recording 89 during the 1998 campaign. He is ranked fourth on SDSU's career saves list with 213. Only Hall pupils Barnes (1999-2002), Tally Hall (2003-06) and Adam Allmaras (2014-17) are above Hall on the lists.

In June 1998, Hall represented SDSU at the adidas Summer League, a prestigious camp designed for the nation's top collegiate players. He was one of 15 goalkeepers from across the country invited to participate in the clinic.

He also had a solid professional career, starting for the San Diego Flash, which reached the quarterfinals of the A-League championships in 2001. Hall completed his undergraduate degree at the University of San Diego in 2001, and holds a U.S.S.F. National "A" license.

He resides in San Diego with his wife Kelli, and their two children.



Assistant Coach Josh Hill 2nd Season La Verne '14

Josh Hill enters his second season as assistant coach for the San Diego State men' soccer program.

A native of Chino, California, Hill brings a vast array of coaching experience to Montezuma Mesa, ranging from the collegiate level to the USL Premier Development League (PDL). He most recently was an assistant coach at UCLA in 2016 after serving the Bruins' director of soccer operations in 2015.

During Hill's tenure at UCLA, the Bruins led the Pac-12 with 17 all-conference selections overall and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in both years.

Prior to his arrival in Westwood, Hill worked as assistant coach for his alma mater the University of La Verne (2014-15) while serving as head coach at Chino High School from 2010-16, where he guided the Cowboys to numerous tournament titles, league championships, as well as the CIF state finals.

In addition, Hill was the lead assistant coach for the PDL's Orange County Blue Stars FC from 2012-14, and helped lead the amateur club team PSA Elite to consecutive appearances at the Lamar U.S. Open Cup in 2014 and 2015.

A four-year starter and scholar-athlete at the University of La Verne, Hill was a three-time team captain for the Leopards, garnering a trio of all-conference scholar accolades from the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) as well. He earned a bachelor of science in business administration before receiving his masters of science in leadership and management.

As a player at the club level, Hill also completed stints with Legends FC and Arsenal FC. In addition, he played for PSA Elite, an annual contender in the U.S. Open Cup. Previously, Hill helped assemble one of the most successful amateur sides in U.S. Soccer, as PSA Elite made consecutive Round of Four appearances at the U.S. Open Cup in 2014 and 2015, losing only to Major League Soccer powers Seattle Sounders and LA Galaxy.

Hill currently holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "C-National" license, and he has also served as a Nike All-Star Coach, a youth development coach and mentor.

Volunteer Assistant Coach Matt Deemer 1st Season Chapman '18

Matt Deemer is in his first season as SDSU's Director of Soccer Operations. A recent graduate of Chapman University, where he was a back-up goalkeeper, Deemer already has four years of coaching experience under his belt.

Deemer got his first coaching experience as the Chapman Women's Club Team Head Coach for the 2015-16 season. He also was the JV Head Coach at Villa Park High School from 2015-17, before being elevated to the Head Coach for the 2017-18 school year. As Villa Park's Head Coach, Deemer helped them reach the CIF Finals, which earned him CIF Coach of the Year honors.

Along with his duties at SDSU, Deemer serves as an assistant coach for the LA Galaxy San Diego Youth Soccer Club.

Deemer holds a USSF "D" and "E" license and is working towards his "C" license.

A standout goalkeeper at Carlsbad High School (2010-14), Deemer was named the 2014 Avocado West Player of the Year and the 2014 All-CIF San Diego section Player of the Year. He left Carlsbad with the most career saves and shutouts in school history and the second most career shutouts in all of CIF. Deemer owns the distinction of being the only person in CIF history to win CIF Player of the Year and CIF Coach of the Year in a four year span.

Kristin Manyak has been on the San Diego State athletic training staff since 2011. She currently works with men's soccer and women's rowing, helping those student-athletes with injury prevention, treatment and rehabilitation. Manyak has prior experience working with SDSU's women's water polo team, women's cross country, and women's track and field.

Manyak's other duties include being the SDSU ATEP Clinical Site Coordinator and overseeing the department's mental health initiatives.

Manyak earned a degree from SDSU in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Athletic Training in 2011, working with the swim and dive and softball teams during her time as an athletic training student. She then completed her Master's degree in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Rehabilitation Sciences at SDSU in 2013. She is currently working towards a doctorate in Athletic Training from A.T. Still University (Ariz.) with an expected graduation in December 2018.



Strength & Conditioning Coach Eddie Padilla 6th Season San Diego State '10

Eddie Padilla started his tenure as a strength and conditioning coach in 2013-14 and works with a variety of programs. In addition to his duties on the pitch, Padilla works with the men's soccer team, as well as the women's basketball, lacrosse and volleyball teams.

Padilla received his undergraduate degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in fitness, nutrition and health from SDSU in 2010 and continued his education on Montezuma Mesa, earning a master's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in biomechanics in 2012.

Padilla began his coaching career in 2008, serving as an intern with the Aztec strength and conditioning coaches before spending one season as a graduate assistant with the department in 2011-12. After completing his master's degree, Padilla became a full-time staffer at SDSU as an assistant strength and conditioning coach before his promotion to assistant director of strength and conditioning in the summer of 2015.

A 2005 graduate of Mira Mesa High School in San Diego, Padilla is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association and is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).

Padilla is married to the former Brandi Jones, who is an assistant coach with the SDSU women's lacrosse team. The couple resides in San Diego with their two sons.




