SDSU Men's Golf Ready for 11th Straight NCAA West Regional Appearance

For the 11th consecutive year and the 14th time in program history, the San Diego State men's golf team has earned an invitation to the NCAA regional tournament. The Aztecs are seeded fourth out of 13 teams in the West Regional, which will be contested May 14-16 on the 6,863 yard, par-72, Lake Merced Golf Club in Daly City, Calif.

SDSU, ranked 22nd in the latest Golfstat and Golfweek/Sagarin ratings, is among 81 NCAA Division I schools selected to play in one of six regional tournaments. The other five regional tournaments will be held concurrently in Austin, Texas (Southwest Regional), Bowling Green, Ky. (Central Regional), Galloway, N.J. (Northeast Regional), Sorrento, Fla. (Southeast Regional) and Stillwater, Okla. (South Central Regional).

The three-day tournament features 18 holes of stroke play each day. The top five teams and the top individual not on an advancing team will move on from each regional to the championship finals.

San Diego State is seeking its 26th trip to the national championships in school history and its fifth since the inception of the regional format in 1989. The Aztecs have advanced to the championship series four times (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2008) under the regional-qualifying format, and are trying for their first back-to-back appearance at the NCAA championships since their streak of 11 consecutive appearances ended in 1984.

The NCAA Championships will be held May 26-30 at the Inverness Club in Toledo, Ohio.

The 2009 NCAA West Regional Field

A total of 13 teams from five different conferences comprise this year's West Regional, including four schools from the Pac-10 and three from the Big-12. San Diego State and New Mexico are the lone representatives from the Mountain West Conference after league champion TCU was placed in the South Central Regional. Colorado State and UNLV, meanwhile, were selected to the Northeast and Southwest Regionals, respectively. Other top 25 ranked teams in SDSU's regional include No. 3 Southern California, No. 13 Texas A&M and No. 15 Arizona State.

The Aztecs have played nine of the other 12 teams in the West Regional during the 2008-09 season, compiling 22-6 overall record in head-to-head competition, while maintaining a winning mark against eight of those squads. In the six regionals combined, SDSU has faced 44 of 80 schools, posting a 64-22-3 mark.

This Week's Lineup

Head coach Ryan Donovan will utilize another new lineup at the NCAA West Regionals. Leading the way for SDSU will be sophomore Johan Carlsson, who will be joined by senior Bryan Martin and the freshman trio of Andrew Cooley, Alex Kang and J.J. Spaun.

Carlsson leads the squad with an overall stroke average of 72.50, followed closely by Spaun (72.55), Cooley (73.00), Kang (73.06) and Martin (73.37).

Carlsson will be making his second West Regional appearance, while each of the other four is making their first start. Last season in Bremerton, Wash., Carlsson posted the Aztecs' lowest score in the final round, setting the stage for a stirring rally that propelled the Scarlet and Black into the NCAA Championships. He posted an eagle on the final hole of regulation to card a 4-under 68 in the third round to climb 32 places into a tie for 19th with his 2-over 218 effort.

A Look At The Course

The host site of the 2009 NCAA Men's Golf Regional, the Lake Merced Golf Club owns a storied history. Originally designed by Willie Lock in 1922, Lake Merced Golf Club was redesigned in 1929 under the guidance of fabled architect Dr. Alister MacKenzie. When Interstate 280 was constructed in the early 1960's, the Club utilized vacant land acquired in the 1920's and retained Robert Muir Graves to reroute the course as necessary to create the basis of today's championship layout. The golf course underwent a major renovation in 1996 under the direction of Rees Jones, known the world over for his brilliant restoration of legendary championship venues. Lake Merced has hosted numerous Collegiate, NCGA and USGA events, including the 1990 U.S. Junior Amateur Championship. Lake Merced regularly hosts sectional qualifying for both the U.S. Open and the U.S. Women's Open.

Back Spin: SDSU In The NCAA West Regionals

Since the NCAA regional tournaments began in 1989, SDSU has received a bid 14 times, including its current streak of 11 straight from 1999 to 2009.

The Aztecs have placed in the top 10 on four occasions, with their best finish coming in 1999 when the team came in fifth after carding a combined 11-over 875 at the Omni Tucson National Golf Resort. The lowest team score in regional competition for SDSU occurred in 2005 when it posted a 20-over 860 en route to a seventh-place tie at Stanford Golf Course.

That same season, Gilberto Rodriguez recorded the best individual finish by an Aztec when he tied for sixth after firing an even-par 210, which is the lowest 54-hole total at a regional in school history. The best single round by an SDSU golfer at an NCAA regional was logged by Magnus Carlsson, who shot a 6-under 66 in 1999.

Flashback: 2008 NCAA West Regionals

San Diego State staged a comeback for the ages, vaulting 11 places from the 20th position into a tie for ninth to force a three-way playoff during the final round of the NCAA West Regionals. The Aztecs tied for the tournament low by carding a 5-under par 283 over the final 18 holes of regulation, then capped off their improbable rally after a sudden-death playoff, shooting a combined 2-under par in shotgun format along with Texas to eliminate Pepperdine and advance to the NCAA Championships.

Leading the way were Johan Carlsson and David Palm, who each delivered clutch performances on the final hole of regulation. Carlsson posted an eagle on the par-5 ninth, while Palm sank a birdie to force the playoff. The playoff featured a five-hole shotgun format with players from each three teams playing holes 14 through 18 simultaneously.

Aaron Goldberg was the Aztecs' top finisher for the regional at 1-under 215, climbing eight spots to finish in 10th place with a 3-under 69 over the final 18 holes.

Carlsson tied for 19th with his 2-over 218, climbing 32 places after tying for the lowest round of the tournament

with his 4-under 68 on the final day.

Palm drained three birdies of his own, while recording the Aztecs' third eagle of the day en route to a final-round total of even-par 72. He shook off rounds of 76 and 80 to leap 33 places into tie for 71st (12-over 228).

Chad Moscovic figured into SDSU's frantic comeback as well, firing his best round of the week with a 2-over 74. He jumped 21 spots on the final day to finish at 16-over 232. Rounding out the Aztec delegation was Matt

Last Time Out: SDSU At The 2009 MWC Championships

San Diego State carded a final-round best 281 and was the only team to break par on the final day but the Aztecs dropped a team playoff to TCU to finish second at the Mountain West Conference Men's Golf Championships. The Aztecs started the day seven strokes behind the Horned Frogs, but had all five players shoot 72 or better to make a dramatic run at the conference title. San Diego State has now finished second in the event four times in the 10year history of the conference.

The final round team score of 281 established a new SDSU record for the lowest team conference championship score. The Scarlet and Black were led by four top seven finishes on the individual leaderboard.

Bryan Martin established new bests on the final day of the tournament. His 54-hole total of 209 is the second lowest individual score at a conference championship and also establishes a new three-round low for Martin. The senior finished the tournament in a tie for third place.

Johan Carlsson made the biggest improvement on the final day. He fired a final round 3-under 68 to finish tournament play at 2-under 211. He posted four birdies and an eagle en route to his highest finish at the MWC championships (6th).

I.I. Spaun fired a final round 2-under 69 to finish the event at 1-under 212. Spaun went from a tie for 17th entering the round to finish in a four-way tie for seventh place. The freshman eagled number 10 and went on to birdie four of the next five holes to play 6-under-par through the first six holes of the back nine. He ended up carding a 31 on the back side.

Alex Kang ended the championships tied for seventh overall. He shot a one-over 72 on Saturday and finished the 54-hole event at 1-under-par 212.

Matt Hoffenberg posted his best round of the tournament with a 1-over-par 72 on the final day. Hoffenberg posted a round that included two birdies and three bogeys to go along with 13 pars.

Carlsson All-Conference

Sophomore Johan Carlsson was selected to the 2008-09 all-Mountain West Conference team following the league champi-

Carlsson, who ranks 11th in the MWC with a 72.50 stroke average, has recorded seven finishes within the top-20 during the 2008-09 campaign. The award is the first all-league recognition for

This is the 10th straight season in which SDSU has had at least one player recognized by the MWC and is the 16th all-MWC men's golf selection for the Aztecs since the league's inception in 1999-2000.

Carlsson Named Mountain West Conference Golfer of the

Carlsson was named the Mountain West Conference men's golfer of the month as announced by the league office on Nov. 19. The award is the first of his career.

Carlsson helped the Aztecs to a third-place finish at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate on Daufuski Island, S.C. in early November, followed by a second-place team finish at the Turtle Bay Resort Intercollegiate in Kuhuku, Hawaii.

Carlsson recorded five rounds below 70 during the fall campaign, including two during the month of November.

Freshmen Fantastic

San Diego State's freshman class is among America's best. The class currently ranks second on the Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking, released May 7. As a class, the SDSU freshmen hold a 72.86 stroke average, according to Golfstat. Only Oregon ranks ahead of the Aztecs.

Two Former Aztecs Named to MWC 10th Anniversary Team

Former San Diego State men's golf standouts Aaron Goldberg and Mark Warman were named to the Mountain West Conference 10th Anniversary Men's Golf Team, as selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and online fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been a first-team all-MWC selection at least once in their

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Goldberg earned first-team all-MWC accolades three times (2006-08) and was named the league's player of the year in 2008. Goldberg was named the MWC golfer of the month five times in his Aztec career, joining Ryan Moore of UNLV as the only two players to be recognized on a least five occasions since the league's formation in 1999-2000. A two-time All-American, Goldberg became the first SDSU golfer to gain All-America status in consecutive seasons since Kris Moe accomplished the feat in 1983-84. Goldberg ended his Aztec career with two individual tournament titles and currently owns the top 54hole individual score in the SDSU record books (68-66-67--201 at the 2006 District 7 Shootout).

Warman, meanwhile, earned first-team all-MWC honors each of the three years he played for the Aztecs (2002-04). The San Clemente, Calif., product claimed medalist honors at the 2003 U.S. Intercollegiate, a tournament in which he shot a 62 which stands as the lowest individual 18-hole score in the SDSU record books. The MWC player of the month in March 2002, Warman was also an All-American candidate his senior season and was named one of Golf World's top 50 "Players to Watch" in 2004.

Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Coming off San Diego State's best season since 1982 and the Aztecs' best showing during his tenure, San Diego State alumnus Ryan Donovan is now in his sixth season as the leader of the Aztec men's golf program. With Donovan at the helm, SDSU placed in the top 14 in all 15 outings with the 15th tournament being a 14thplace finish at the NCAA Championships. Overall, the Aztecs compiled a 266-21 head-to-head record and finished 20th in Golfstat's final collegiate poll.

Individually, Donovan helped a pair of athletes in senior Aaron Goldberg and junior David Palm earn All-America accolades. Additionally, both were all-Mountain West Conference and all-Southwest Region selections. Other players to earn season-ending honors under Donovan were matt Hoffenberg (MWC freshman of the year, all-MWC, all-Southwest Region) and Johan Carlsson (all-Southwest Region). Donovan himself was named the Eaton Golf Pride Division I Coach of the Year for the southwest region given out annually by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

In 2006-07, SDSU secured three team tournament titles and reached the NCAA Regionals for the team's ninth straight appearance. Aaron Goldberg had one the program's finest campaigns, finishing with a scoring average of 70.71, while recording seven top-five finishes and capturing medalist honors at the District 7 Fall Shootout on his way to being named an honorable mention PING All-America honors, the program's first such honor since

The 2005-06 season was equally impressive as Donovan guided SDSU to three team tournament victories and its eighth consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Three Aztec golfers - seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen and sophomore David Palm - all claimed individual titles during the season, while Scott and Goldberg garnered all-Mountain West Conference accolades.

Donovan was a four-year competitor for the SDSU golf Michael Letzig, New Mexico squad from 1997- 2001. His most successful season came as a junior when he posted five top-30 finishes.
