► **When & Where:** Mon., Dec. 29, 2003 vs. Tennessee-Martin at 8 p.m.; Tues., Dec. 30, 2003 at UAB (5 p.m.) or vs. Brown (3 p.m.), Bartow Arena (8,500), Birmingham, Ala. (All times CST)

► **Webcast/Live Stats/TV:** The games will be broadcast live on the internet at www.goaztecs.com with Dan Lawton calling the action.

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team looks to round out 2003 on a three-game winning streak by sweeping both games at the Lady Blazer Invitational, hosted by the University of Alabama-Birmingham. The Aztecs are coming off a 63-56 victory at Pac-10 Conference school Washington State on Dec. 22, before taking three days off for the holiday break.

SDSU's first opponent, Tennessee-Martin, enters Monday's game with a 2-5 record with its last game, an overtime win against Arkansas-Little Rock, coming over 10 days ago on Dec. 18. UAB, meanwhile, is on a two-game win streak and stands at 4-6 overall, while Brown is 2-5 in 2003-04.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 13-23.

► **Lady Blazer Invitational Opposing Coaches:** UT-Martin's head coaching tandem of Gary and Kim Van Atta are 96-111 in eight seasons with the Skyhawks. UAB's Jeannie Milling is 260-217 in 17 years and Brown's Jean Marie Burr has a 16-year record of 211-193.

► **Series History:** This will be the first all-time meeting between SDSU and all three schools.

SDSU Women's Basketball Looks To End Year On A Winning Note

San Diego State can finish out 2003 with a winning overall record and a 5-1 mark on the road by going undefeated at the Lady Blazer Invitational, Dec. 29-30, in Birmingham, Ala. The Aztecs will play both games against first-time opponents, starting with Tennessee-Martin on Monday at 8 p.m., and followed Tuesday by either a 3 p.m. game against Brown or a 5 p.m. match-up with tournament host University of Alabama-Birmingham.

The four-team tournament is SDSU's only non-conference tournament of the year and the furthest east the Aztecs have traveled since playing at Toledo on Dec. 28, 1998.

Aztecs Outlast Washington State

The San Diego State women's basketball team held on to beat Washington State 63-56 in a non-conference game at Friel Court. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 4-5 overall and 3-1 on the road, while the Cougars fell to 4-5 in 2003-04.

Aztec sophomore **Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.)** tallied her fifth double-double in the last six games, finishing with 15 points and a season-high 17 rebounds. Two other SDSU players finished in double-figure scoring including Washington native **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)**, who had 11 points before fouling out, and sophomore **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)**, who tallied a career-high 13 points.

Other WSU Notes

Washington State made just 11 field goals and shot only 21.2 percent from the field, both SDSU season opponent lows ... the 11 field goals and the 21.2 shooting percentage allowed are the lowest by an Aztec opponent since March 8, 1995, when New Mexico also shot just 11-for-52 from the field (21.2 percent) in a 57-39 SDSU win in the first round of the WAC tournament ... the victory over WSU is the Aztecs' first against a Pac-10 school since a 63-49 win against California on Dec. 22, 2000 .. it is the first win at a Pac-10 school since a 67-66 victory at USC on Dec. 6, 1995, a span of six games ... SDSU improves to 48-68 all-time against Pac-10 schools and owns a .500 record or better versus six of the nine Pac-10 members it has faced ... SDSU is 3-2 against teams which it did not play a year ago.... the seven points are SDSU's smallest margin of victory this year ... freshman Michelle Elliott and senior **Nicolette McCartney (Chicago, Ill.)** were back among the starting five after a one-game absence.

Going To The Line

Free-throw shooting became a key part of the game at Washington State on Monday. The two sides combined for a staggering 70 trips to the charity stripe, including 43 attempts in the second half, and 46 personal fouls.

The Cougars scored 31 of their 56 total points from the free-throw line, while Aztecs tallied 20 points at the stripe.

One For The Road

The young SDSU squad has proven to be a better team on the road thus far with three of its four wins coming in opponent's arenas. The three road victories already matches the Aztecs' win total away from Cox Arena in all of 2002-03, when they were 2-10 in away games and 1-1 in neutral site contests.

San Diego State was also 3-10 away from Cox Arena in 2001-02 and 5-11 in 2000-01.

Straw Steps Up

After sitting out all of last season, sophomore Michelle Strawberry continues to take advantage of her playing time, scoring in double-figures every time she as been among the Aztecs' starting five. In her first start versus SMU on Dec. 14, she put up a career high 10 points and pulled down seven rebounds, all in the second half. Strawberry matched her point total a game later with 10 against Oral Roberts and then tallied a new career best of 13 points in the win at Washington State.

Double-Doubles Keep Coming

With six double-doubles this season, including five in her last six outings, Aztec Ashlee Dunlap continues to rise up the conference ladder.

With her 16 career double-doubles, Dunlap is third in Mountain West Conference history as of Dec. 27. She passed former standouts Lauren Beckman (Utah) and Jennifer Leitner (BYU) who were tied for the No. 3 spot with 15 apiece, while she is one up on current UNLV junior Sherry McCracklin.

Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the conference record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23. A year ago, Dunlap also had six double-doubles through the first nine games, finishing the season with 10 to her credit.

More About A.D.

With her season-high 17 rebounds at Washington State Monday, Ashlee Dunlap has tallied double-figures in rebounding in each of the last six games and seven times overall this season. For her career, the sophomore has 18 double-figure rebounding performances in her 36 career games.

Seeing Double

SDSU freshman Michelle Elliott continues to be the team's most consistent threat on offense. Elliott has opened her career with double-figure scoring efforts in each of the eight games in which she had played, the only Aztec player to do so this season. She currently is tied for first among freshman in the Mountain West Conference in scoring average with a 13.8 mark.

Freshmen From Three

The Aztec freshman trio of Courtney Fritz, Jessica Huettl and Michelle Elliott continue to be the team's lone threats from beyond the arc. Fritz has been on fire as of late, making 13 three-pointers in her last four contests, after tallying only seven in her first five games. Fritz has hit a team-high 41.7 percent of her three-point opportunities (20-of-48) for the season.

Huettl and Elliott, meanwhile, have combined for 22 of the team's 23 other three-pointers, meaning that freshmen have made all but one of the Aztecs' 43 three's this season.

Tourney Time Tid-Bits

SDSU heads to the state of Alabama for the first time in its 28-year history ... the Aztecs will have now played games in 33 of the 50 states since the program's inception in 1976-77 ... UT-Martin, UAB and Brown are all first-time opponents for the Aztecs ... SDSU's only other scheduled first meeting on its 2003-04 schedule is against Texas Pan-American on Jan. 9 ... the Aztecs went 1-1 in their only non-conference tournament a year ago at Fresno State and have not gone undefeated in a non-conference tournament since 1993, when SDSU downed Memphis State and Princeton at the Santa Clara Diet Pepsi Shoot-Out ... UAB's arena is named after Gene Bartow, who served as SDSU's interim director of athletics in 2003 ... Bartow was the A.D. at UAB (1977-2000) and also was the Blazers' men's basketball coach from 1977-96.

Tenn.-Martin Tid-Bits

UT-Martin enters the game with a 2-5 record after going 13-16 and 9-7 in the Ohio Valley Conference a year ago ... the Skyhawks' two wins have come against Kentucky Wesleyan (84-71) and Arkansas Little-Rock (72-69 in OT) ... UTM has been led by Julie Young, who averages 14.1 points per game and 5.4 rebounds per game ... Jenny Lannom is the team's second-leading scorer (8.6 ppg.).

UAB Tid-Bits

Tournament host UAB will play Brown at 6 p.m. on Monday and will play in the 5 p.m. game the following day win or lose ... the Lady Blazers are 4-6 overall in 2003-04 with two straight victories against Florida Atlantic (95-73) and Belmont (74-68) ... UAB was 8-19 overall a year ago and 4-10 in Conference USA ... Lady Blazer Natasha Thomas averages a team-best 15.0 ppg. and 8.6 rebounds per game.

SDSU is 1-0 versus first-time opponents this season and 4-2 against teams it did not play a year ago.

►A pair of SDSU victories this week will mean: SDSU is 6-5 overall and 5-1 away from Cox Arena ... the Aztecs five wins on the road ties as the most since 2000-01 ... SDSU has gone unbeaten in a non-conference tournament for the first time since 1993 ... the Aztecs are 5-2 against teams which did not appear on last year's schedule and are 2-0 versus first time opponents in 2003-04.

In The MWC

Through games of Dec. 23, SDSU ranks in the top three among conference schools in three defensive categories, including field-goal defense (t2nd - .374), scoring defense (3rd - 57.0 ppg.) and three-point field goal defense (3rd - .280) Interestingly, the Aztecs were ranked fifth or below out of the MWC's eight teams in all three categories a year ago.

Individually this year, Ashlee Dunlap is the league's second-leading rebounder with her 10.9 rpg., while she is second in both defensive (6.89/g) and offensive (4.00/g) boards. Courtney Fritz is second in three-pointers per game (2.22) and senior Nicolette McCartney is second in the MWC in blocked shots per game with a 1.11 mark.

20-20

Already this year, three different Aztecs have been able to reach the 20-point mark four times. Freshman Courtney Fritz became the latest addition to the club, putting up 21 points against both San Diego and at Cal State Fullerton. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap and freshman Michelle Elliott contributed career highs of 23 and 20 points, respectively, against Nevada.

Dunlap and Elliott became the first Aztecs other than former standout Jamey Cox to reach the milestone since Atim Otii had 21 points against New Mexico at the MWC championships on March 7, 2001. SDSU also had two, 20-point scorers in one game for the first time since Cox and Claire Swinbank scored 24 and 20, respectively, against UNLV on Feb. 24, 2001.

Pick Six

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish sixth in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 7, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The voting panel consisted of the conference's eight head coaches and select media.

The Aztecs jumped one spot from each of the three previous polls, receiving 57 total points. SDSU, which finished seventh in the MWC a year ago, was accurately picked to place sixth in the inaugural poll in 1999-2000.
