Mike Friesen, the winningest head coach in program history, enters his 15th season leading the women's soccer program at San Diego State.

Friesen has been the architect of the most successful run in SDSU women's soccer history. In 14 seasons, he has guided the Aztecs to 11 Mountain West championships (five tournament and six regular season) and five NCAA tournament appearances. In the team's eight appearances in the Mountain West tournament, from 2012 through 2020, Friesen's Aztecs reached the league's championship match eight times. Along the way, he became San Diego State's all-time leader in victories (158; 158-94-33) and winning percentage (.612) and is currently the only Aztec head coach with a career winning percentage above .600. At the conference level, Friesen owns the most Mountain West wins of any coach in league history (88; 88-27-13) and is the league's active leader in career victories.

During his tenure, SDSU players have garnered one All-American, 21 all-region honors, three Mountain West Offensive Players of the Year, three Mountain West Defensive Players of the Year, five Mountain West Freshmen/Newcomer of the Year and 66 All-Mountain West selections. SDSU student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom as well, with 119 earning Mountain West all-academic honors. Personally, he has twice been named MW Coach of the Year, in 2013 & 2013, and the 2012 NSCAA West Region Coach of the Year.

In the summer of 2017, Friesen was listed among the nation's top Division I women's soccer head coaches by All White Kit's CoachRank 2017. Friesen checked in at No. 14 out of 236 head coaches on the list. All White Kit's CoachRank is a data-driven, objective system of measuring coach performance over a long period of time (3+ years or more at one school). The ranking includes multiple factors such as overall performance, conference tournament effort and NCAA tournament results. Data used for the ranking goes as far back as 2009.

Under Friesen's guidance, the program, which focuses on the process, has made strides into becoming a rising power not only in the West, but nationally. Leading up to and during the 2012 campaign, a major focus for the team was the "process" in becoming great and being a champion. Friesen and his staff's philosophy proved fruitful for the squad as they quickly became one of the top teams in country.

The 2012 campaign was a direct result of the "process" and just a small step in the right direction as SDSU enjoyed the finest season in school history after the Aztecs captured the Mountain West regular-season and tournament titles, advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first-time ever, shared the best record nationally at 21-2-1, and finished the year ranked seventh nationally after rising to as high as third.

Team success breeds individual awards and 2012 was no exception. Friesen helped senior Megan Jurado become San Diego State's first All-American since 1998, and that was after the forward was named MW Offensive Player of the Year. In addition, Haley Palmer was the MW Defensive Player of the Year, and Friesen garnered conference coach-of-the-year honors. Palmer would go on to earn the award in 2013, as well.

From 2013-14, SDSU dominated the Mountain West, winning both the regular-season and tournament crowns. Its three-year sweep of the titles made them just the third MW team to accomplish the feat in league history.

In 2015, the winning continued as SDSU compiled a 15-4-1 record and ended the season on 12-game unbeaten streak, which included 11 straight wins, en route to the MW regular-season title. The Aztecs made history with their fourth straight outright regular-season

crown, becoming the first school in Mountain West history to accomplish the feat.

A season later, San Diego State produced a 10-3-4 campaign, and the Aztecs reached the Mountain West title game for a fifth straight year. SDSU's sixth consecutive season of at least ten wins, from 2012-to-2017, gave the program 84 wins, which are the most over any six-year stretch in school history.

The 2017 club played one of the toughest non-conference schedules, but rebounded down the stretch, winning four consecutive games to earn a No. 2 seed in the MW Championship where it posted a pair of shutouts en route to the title. As a result, SDSU returned to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2014.

Friesen, who was named head coach in 2007, worked for two seasons to establish a culture that ultimately produced a 2009 Mountain West tournament crown. The league championship was the school's first since 1999, and SDSU posted its first NCAA tournament win since 1998. Friesen's Aztecs went on a 16-game unbeaten run, including winning their final eight to propel them into the second round of the 2009 NCAA tourney. During its magical run, SDSU went unbeaten in Mountain West play (5-0-2) for the first time in school history and won the school's first MW tournament title. Friesen ultimately earned his first MW Coach-of-the-Year Award for helping SDSU become the sixth-most improved team in NCAA Division I and post the second-best win improvement nationally (+9).

Eight- and ten-win campaigns followed the 2009 squad before SDSU's current run of success that has featured 110 victories over the last nine seasons (12.2 wins per year).

Friesen was an assistant coach under former SDSU head coach Dr. Mike Giuliano. In their first season in 2004, SDSU posted 12 shutouts, the second most in school history, and allowed just 18 goals in 21 games, the program's fewest since the 1990 squad gave up 12 goals in 13 games. The effort culminated in the Aztecs' first appearance in the MW championship game since 1999.

Prior to coming to San Diego State, Friesen spent five years working with the UC Santa Barbara women's program. His responsibilities with the Gauchos included coaching the team's offense, recruiting, community outreach and academics.

Upon arriving in Santa Barbara, Friesen helped turn the Gaucho program around, going from a 7-29-2 mark and just 27 goals the two seasons prior to his arrival, to a 24-11-6 mark in 2002-03, tallying 105 scores. Friesen also was integral in signing and developing three straight Big West Conference offensive players of the year.

As a student-athlete, Friesen was an offensive standout at Point Loma Nazarene (1988-89) and Sonoma State (1993-94). He played two years for the Sea Lions before transferring to SSU, where he was a member of an NCAA Division II quarterfinalist squad in 1993. Friesen was also the second-leading scorer in the Northern California Athletic Conference as a senior.

Friesen completed his degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in biomechanics in 1996, before continuing his soccer playing career with the North Bay Breakers of the USISL. For the next several seasons, he played for Juventus in the California Premier Soccer Alliance before signing with the Greek Americans Soccer Club, based in San Francisco, which won two U.S. Open Cup championships in the 1990s.

Chassion Griggs enters his fifth season as a full-time assistant after being elevated from a volunteer assistant coach in March 2017. He previously served as a volunteer assistant coach under Mike Friesen for two seasons and works with the sides keepers.

Freshman keeper Alexa Madueno, under Griggs' tutelage, was a 2020 second-team All-Mountain West honoree and a member of the Mountain West All-Newcomer team in her initial collegiate campaign. She was on the field for every minute of the season and posted a 8-3-0 record, recorded three shutouts and had a 1.25 goals against average and a .714 save percentage. Madueno was the first true freshman keeper to start every game in a season for SDSU since Aubree Southwick in 2007 and is the third player, and only true freshman, to play every minute in a season for the Aztecs since Stephanie Pearson in 2003.

In 2019, he guided Brooke Lisowski to inclusion on the Mountain West All-Newcomer Team. The graduate transfer posted a 10-9-1 overall record but was 8-3-0 in conference play. She recorded five shutouts, four in league play, with a 1.72 goals against average.

As an official member of the coaching staff in 2017, Griggs helped the Aztecs win their first Mountain West tournament title since 2014, and return to the NCAA tournament for the first time in three years. Working with the keepers, Griggs mentored a group that posted eight shutouts and allowed one goal or less in 12 of SDSU's final 15 games. Starting keeper Gabby English blanked a pair of foes in the conference tournament to help lead the Aztecs to the title. She earned MW all-tournament recognition for her efforts.

In his two seasons (2014, 2016) as a volunteer assistant coach, the Aztecs posted a record of 25-12-6 (15-4-3 Mountain West), won an MW regular-season and tournament title, and advanced to the NCAA Championship. He tutored four-year letter-winning goalkeeper Melanie Vaughn, who ended up being a three-time all-MW tournament performer and an all-conference second-team goalkeeper her senior campaign.

Griggs brought to Montezuma Mesa six years of collegiate coaching experience from his time spent at Point Loma Nazarene and Cuyamaca College. As an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Sea Lions, he guided the PLNU men's team to its best finish in eight seasons and coached the goalkeeping unit to the 15th-best goals-against average in the nation. During his time with the women's team, he helped PLNU to a PacWest title and an NCAA appearance. Griggs also mentored a goalkeeping group that produced the second-best GAA nationally and the conference goalie of the year, who went on to earn NSCAA all-West Region accolades.

Prior to his time at Point Loma Nazarene, Griggs coached for two seasons at Cuyamaca College. During his stint the men's team in Rancho San Diego, the Coyotes posted back-to-back winning seasons and finished second in their league twice. Griggs also guided Cuyamaca's goalie to back-to-back conference goalkeeper-of-the-year awards.

Outside of the college ranks, Griggs was the director of goalkeeping and a head coach for the San Diego United club team, and a coach for the San Diego Surf Soccer Club.

Griggs is a 2009 graduate of SUM Bible College & Theological Seminary in El Dorado Hills, Calif., and received his Master's Degree from Liberty University in 2014.

Fifth Season
California Baptist '14

Cole Schmit enters his fifth season as an assistant coach at San Diego State.

In his four seasons with the Aztecs, Schmit has helped guide SDSU to the program's tenth and 11th Mountain West championships and earned a spot in the NCAA tournament in 2017. While on Montezuma Mesa, 14 Aztecs earned All-Mountain West recognition, seven of which were first-team honors and includes a pair of first-team honors for midfielder Chloe Frisch. Frisch was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year in 2020 and, in addition, Anna Toohey (2020) and Laura Fuentes (2018) have garnered Mountain West Newcomer of the Year honors. Six student-athletes, Frisch and Mia Root (2017), Fuentes (2018), Rachele Elve (2019), and Toohey and keeper Alexa Madueno (2020) earned inclusion in on the league's All-Newcomer Team. He has guided four players to United Soccer Coaches All-Region distinction, Frisch and Fuentes (first and second teams in 2020, respectively) and Stacie Moran and Alyiah Utush (first and second teams in 2017, respectively). In the two Mountain West tournament's the Aztecs have participated in his time on The Mesa, seven players have earned All-Tournament Team selection. Eight times SDSU players have garnered the Mountain West Player of the Week Award.

Schmit arrived at San Diego State from Santa Barbara where he was a women's soccer assistant coach at Westmont College, which is an NAIA institution that competes in the Golden State Athletic Conference (GSAC). In two seasons, he helped the Warriors to a 32-8-4 record, a pair of league titles and two trips to the NAIA tournament.

In his first season on the Westmont campus, Schmit and the Warriors won the 2015 GSAC regular season and tournament championships en route to an NAIA quarterfinal appearance. One season later, Westmont advanced to the Round of 16. In addition to the team success, Schmit helped the Warriors collect two GSAC Player-of-the-Year awards, three All-America accolades and eight all-conference honors.

Prior to his time at Westmont, Schmit, who owns a USSF E License and an NSCAA Goalkeeping 1 Diploma, was a men's soccer volunteer assistant coach at Pacific in 2014. In his one season in Stockton, he helped the first-year program become what is now considered a contender in the West Coast Conference.

Schmit played collegiately at California Baptist where he helped the Lancers to a 58-21-4 record after scoring 10 goals and logging nine assists in 83 games (59 starts). In his time at CBU, the Lancers won the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Division I national championship in 2011 and 2012 and won the 2011 Pacific West Conference title. Individually, Schmit was an NSCAA/NCCAA Division I first-team All-American and an All-PacWest first-team midfielder in 2012. His success on the field translated in the classroom as he earned a spot on the All-PacWest academic team three times and was recognized as an NCCAA Scholar-Athlete.

Schmit graduated cum laude with a bachelor's degree in marketing from California Baptist in 2014.

Eddie Padilla started his tenure as a strength and conditioning coach in 2013-14 and works with a variety of programs.

Padilla earned a degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in fitness, nutrition and health from SDSU in 2010 and continued his education on Montezuma Mesa, earning a master's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in biomechanics in 2012.

Padilla began his coaching career in 2008, serving as an intern with the Aztec strength and conditioning coaches before spending one season as a graduate assistant with the department in 2011-12. After completing his master's degree, Padilla became a full-time staffer at SDSU as an assistant strength and conditioning coach before his promotion to assistant director of strength and conditioning in the summer of 2015.

A 2005 graduate of Mira Mesa High School in San Diego, Padilla is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association and is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).

Padilla is married to the former Brandi Jones, who is an assistant coach with the SDSU women's lacrosse team. The couple resides in San Diego with their two sons.

In 2021, Nick Pippin embarks on his second year as a member of the San Diego State athletic medicine staff. Originally, hired to be the athletic trainer for the university's club sports, he was thrust into the role of interim trainer for the women's soccer program last season. This year he is the full-time athletic trainer for both the Aztecs women's soccer and women's tennis programs.

The native of Bourbonnais, Ill., came to San Diego State following a four-year stint as an athletic trainer in the Sports Medicine Department at the Carle Foundation Hospital in Champaign, Ill. In addition to his responsibilities at Carle Foundation Hospital, which included serving as a physician extender and sports therapy clinician, he was head athletic trainer for Danville Area Community College's eight NJCAA sports.

Prior to his position at Carle Foundation Hospital, Pippin was an athletic trainer at Caterpillar Inc., in Decatur, Ill., for four years. In that time, he led the organization's Work Conditioning Program, as well as evaluated injuries and developed treatment programs for employees, and led the organization's physical wellness program.

A four-year member of the Millikin University football team, he graduated with cum laude honors in 2016 with a degree in athletic training, and earned his master's degree in applied exercise science from Ashland University in 2019. Pippin is a Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC), and a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

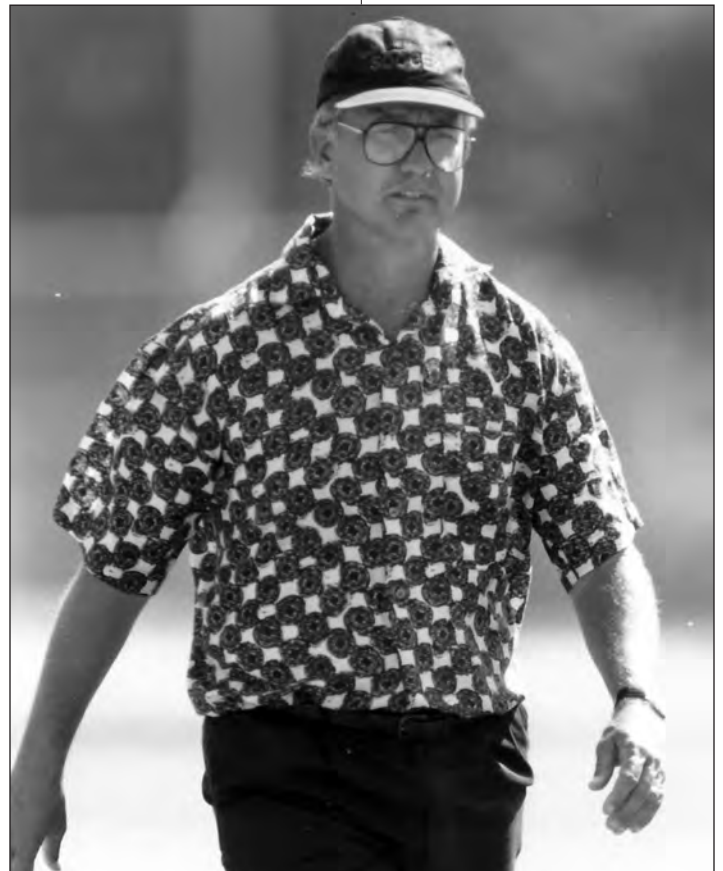

Chuck Clegg was the Aztecs' head coach in 1989, the program's inaugural season. He returned to coach the team from 1994-2003. His 122 career victories and .597 winning percentage (122-81-8) rank second in San Diego State women's soccer history.

Clegg was at the helm for the program's first conference championship, when SDSU went 13-5-3 and won the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) championship for the 1995 season. Three years later, in 1998, Clegg led San Diego State to its second WAC Championship and then to its first NCAA Tournament berth.

Following her senior campaign, she was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year and a first-team All-Mountain West performer after leading the league in shots & shots on goal. In addition, the 2020 United Soccer Coaches NCAA Division I Women's All-Pacific Region performer was tied for third in goals and shots on goals in the Mountain West. Nationally, she ranked in the top-25 in shots on goal (No. 21) and shots on goal per game (No. 23) and Top Drawer Soccer ranked her No. 79 among the top-100 women's soccer players in the nation.



Sarah Broacha (2017-20) was a starter in 70 of the 71 games in which she played for San Diego State. A center defender, she anchored the Aztecs back line, and in her four seasons on The Mesa totaled three goals and four assists. The final goal of her career, was scored with six seconds remaining regulation and was the equalizer which sent the SDSU and New Mexico to overtime in the 2020 Mountain West championship match.

Broacha was a first-team All-Mountain West performer in her senior season and a second-team honoree as a junior. She was as successful in the classroom as on the field, earning Mountain West Scholar-Athlete recognition twice (2019 & 2020), Academic All-Mountain West three times (2018, 2019 & 2020) and four Aztec Scholar-Athlete honors (2017, 2018, 2019 & 2020).

Lori LaCoursiere (1996-99) is simply the greatest offensive player San Diego State women's soccer has ever produced. Though she completed her eligibility 20 years ago, no one has come close to eclipsing her career records for goals (52), assists (44) and points (148).

In addition, she holds the program's single-season record for goals (18 in 1996) and appears on that list a total of three times. She is also the single-season leader in assists (14 in 1999) and points (46 in 1996) and her name appears in each of those categories four times.

LaCoursiere was an all-region honoree in each of her four seasons on The Mesa. In 1996 she was named a Freshman All-American, Soccer Buzz's Freshman All-Far West Region and the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) Freshman of the Year. She was a first-team all-conference performer in each of her four seasons (three times in the WAC & once in the MW), and garnered three Player of the Week awards from the WAC and on three occasions (twice in the WAC & once in the MW) was named to the conference all-tournament team.
