No. 30 SDSU Men's Soccer Heads to Bay Area For Pac-10 Games at No. 10 California, Stanford

The San Diego State men's soccer team wraps up its three-game road trip this week in the Bay Area against California and Stanford. The Aztecs (7-3-1, 1-2-0 Pac-10), who are ranked No. 30 by *College Soccer News*, No. 33 by *Top Drawer Soccer* and receiving votes in two other polls, will meet the Bears (7-1-2, 3-0-0 Pac-10) at 4 p.m. PT Friday and the Cardinal (5-6-0, 1-2-0 Pac-10) at 2:30 p.m. PT Sunday. Cal is ranked as high as No. 10 by NSCAA/HendrickCars.com, while Stanford began the season at No. 13 in the same poll.

Noting the Aztecs

* San Diego State is off to a 7-3-1 (.682) start, its best since the 2005 season, when it started 7-1-3 (.773). The Aztecs went onto finish 2005 with a 9-4-6 record, earning their first trip to the NCAA Tournament in 16 years. The .682 winning percentage is tied for the 30th-best record in the country.

* SDSU began its season with a seven-game (6-0-1) unbeaten streak, outscoring the opposition, 15-4. The seven-match unbeaten streak was the program's longest since an eight-game undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the eighth-longest in program history.

* A week after being ranked in all five national polls for the first time since 2005, San Diego State is still around in the national scene. The Aztecs are ranked No. 30 by *College Soccer News* and No. 33 by *Top Drawer Soccer*, and are receiving votes by both NSCAA/HendrickCars.com and *Soccer America*.

* SDSU is fifth in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com Far West Region poll. Last week, San Diego State was fourth and two weeks ago it was third, the highest in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure. The Aztecs are surrounded by the Pac-10 as California is second, UCLA is third and Washington is ninth.

* SDSU has already bettered its win total (seven) from each of its past two seasons (6-6-6 in 2009, 6-9-3 in 2008).

* San Diego State is 5-0-1 in tournament games in 2010.

* The Aztecs are scoring 1.91 goals per game, which is tied for the 29th-most in the nation and second in the Pac-10.

* SDSU is outscoring its opponents, 21-12, this season. The +9 scoring margin ranks second in the Pac-10.

* Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) leads the team in points (16), goals (6), penalty kick goals (3), shots (40), shots on goal (17), and is tied for first with two game-winning goals. Among the national leaders, Reza ranks in a tie for 32nd with 1.45 points per game and in a tie for 38th (and leads the league) with 0.55 goals per game. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS), meanwhile, is 11th in the country with 0.64 assists per game.

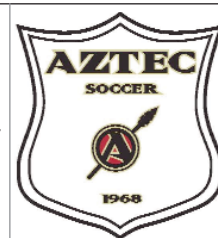
* Reza has started 47 consecutive matches.

A Glance at the Bears

California is off to an impressive 7-1-2 start, including a perfect 3-0-0 record in Pac-10 play. The Bears, who are ranked 10th by NSCAA/HendrickCars.com, 11th by *Soccer America* and *Top Drawer Soccer*, 13th by *Soccer Times* and 15th by *College Soccer News*, have outscored their opponents, 23-7, this season, including a 12-1 advantage in league play. Cal brings a seven-match unbeaten streak into Friday's game.

Davis Paul leads the Pac-10 with 1.50 points per game on five goals and five assists. John Fitzpatrick has added 12 points on five goals and two assists. David Bingham leads all league keepers in goals against average (0.65), save percentage (.883), saves (53) and saves per game (5.30).

SDSU leads the all-time series, 17-12-2, including a 7-2-1 mark in Pac-10 play. What's even more impressive is that Cal has been ranked in all 10 of the matches in the Aztecs' Pac-10 era, while San Diego State has not. When the Bears are No. 10 or better, SDSU owns a 4-1-1 record since 2005.

Scouting the Cardinal

Stanford began the season ranked No. 13 by NSCAA/HendrickCars.com, but lost its first four games and is now 5-6-0 (1-2-0 Pac-10). The three points in league play has the Cardinal tied with the Aztecs, Oregon State and Washington for third place, three points behind co-leaders California and UCLA.

Dominique Yahyavi leads Stanford offensively with 11 points on five goals and an assist. Hermann Award candidate and Lowe's Senior Class Award finalist Bobby Warshaw has chipped in with three goals. Jason Dodson has been the top goalkeeper for the Cardinal, going 4-4-0 with a 0.97 goals against average and three shutouts.

San Diego State leads the all-time series between the two schools, 10-4-5, and a 5-1-3 mark in SDSU's Pac-10 era (since 2005). The Aztecs are 5-3-2 in Palo Alto all-time and 2-2-1 since 2005. The two teams split the series last year, with each squad winning a 2-1 decision on the road on a golden goal in overtime.

At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 11th year as head coach at San Diego State and 14th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 42-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to the Pac-10 in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 44-34-24 (.549), including an 18-19-16 (.491) mark in the competitive Pac-10.

Over his 10 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, nine professional players, seven all-Far West selections and 50 all-conference picks.

SDSU Ranked 30th by College Soccer News

San Diego State is nationally ranked in two of the five polls and receiving votes in two others. It comes a week after the Aztecs are ranked in all five polls for the first time since Oct. 11, 2005 (only four polls, *Top Drawer Soccer* was unavailable).

SDSU is ranked 30th by *College Soccer News* and No. 33 by *Top Drawer Soccer*, and is receiving votes in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com and *Soccer Times* poll.

Two weeks ago, San Diego State was tied for 22nd, its highest in the NSCAA poll since Oct. 31, 2006.

The charts on the right show SDSU's appearances in the five national polls this season.

San Diego State and the RPI

The Aztecs are ranked No. 65 in the first RPI of the season, which was released Monday (Oct. 11). The rating, a mathematical formula that objectively compares results, strength of schedule and opponents' strength of schedule, is out of 204 Division I programs.

A year ago, SDSU was rated No. 56 in the initial RPI before skyrocketing to No. 11 two weeks later after the Pac-10 season got into full swing.

If the ratings stayed the same for the rest of the season (it changes each week), San Diego State would play five of its 19 games (26.3 percent) against the top 36 and seven (36.8 percent) of the top 60.

SDSU Held Scoreless For the First Time in 13 games

The San Diego State men's soccer team yielded a late goal in a 1-0 loss to No. 8 UCLA Saturday in Los Angeles. It was the first time the Aztecs were held scoreless since Nov. 6, 2009, breaking the team's 12-game scoring streak. It was the longest scoring streak by the program since a 13-match stretch from Oct. 19, 1990-Sept. 29, 1991. In fact, the 12 consecutive games with at least one goal is tied for the 10th-longest in the history of the program. Over the course of the 1986 and 1987 seasons, the Aztecs scored at least one goal in a school-record 46 consecutive games.

The chart on the right shows the longest scoring streaks in SDSU's history.

SDSU Among the National Leaders

The Aztecs are off to a 7-3-1 record, a .682 winning percentage that is tied for the 30th-best record in the nation (.750). The team is also scoring 1.91 goals per game, which ranks in a tie for 29th in the country.

Individually, sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) is 11th in the nation with 0.64 assists per game (seven total assists). Senior Raymundo Reza's (Denver, Colo.) 16 points on six goals and four assists, meanwhile, are also ranked among the national best. Reza is tied for 32nd in points per game (1.45), tied for 38th in goals per game (0.55) and tied for 89th with 0.36 assists per game. Redshirt senior goalkeeper Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.) is 78th in save percentage (.774), 79th in goals against average (1.067) and tied for 95th in saves per game (3.73).

Aztecs Know Shorthanded Soccer

San Diego State's Daniel Kohen was issued a red card two Sunday's ago in the team's 4-3, overtime victory over Washington. Despite playing a man down the final 19 minutes, 30 seconds, the Aztecs prevailed with a second minute overtime goal. Playing shorthanded soccer and doing it well is nothing new to SDSU.

Since 2006, the program has had nine red cards over eight matches. Over those eight games, San Diego State has played a combined 360:49 a man down and 12:02 two men down. While playing shorthanded in those games (more than four complete regulation matches), the Aztecs have outscored the opposition, 5-4. One of those four goals allowed was a penalty kick directly after a SDSU red card. What's even more impressive is San Diego State's 3-1-4 (.625) record while playing a man down.

Start Me Up

The Aztecs got off to a 6-1-1 start (.813), the program's best eight-game start to a season since 2005 when they were 6-0-2 (.875). The 6-1-1 start was tied for the eighth-longest in school history with five other teams. Four of the seven teams - 2005, 1982, 1981 and 1969 - with better eight-match starts made the NCAA tournament.

Unbeatable No More

SDSU recently had its seven-game unbeaten streak snapped with a 2-1 loss to Oregon State on Friday (Oct. 1). Over the seven matches, San Diego State outscored the opposition, 15-4.

The seven games without a loss was tied for the eighth-longest unbeaten in the history of the program. Four of the teams - 2005, 1989, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longer unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

The Young...

Coming into the season the big question was, "Who is going to replace the departed seven seniors?" Of those seven seniors (six who finished the season), three were drafted by Major League Soccer and five were named to the 2009 all-Pac-10 team (one first team selection, four honorable mention picks).

Eleven games into the season, 10 (of 16) newcomers have seen action with six earning a combined 40 starts. True freshmen Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) and Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Ind.) have started all 11 games, while redshirt freshman Robbie Freise (Canyon County, Calif.) has 10 starts to his credit. True freshman Sean Zaher (Las Vegas, Nev.) has six starts, while fellow true freshmen Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) and Brett Helm (Frisco, Texas) each started once. Zaher and graduate student Falke Werwer (Delft, Netherlands) each have a goal apiece, while redshirt freshman Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) has two assists to tie for third on the team. True freshmen Kody Duff (Roseville, Calif.) and Meuser have one assist apiece.

In the opener at Loyola Marymount on Sept. 1, four freshmen (all true) started. The four freshmen was the most in a season-opener in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure and five later started in the 4-3 overtime win against No. 23 Washington on Oct. 3. An amazing six started the second half at San Diego (Sept. 5) and at home versus Air Force (Sept. 10) (both wins).

...and the "Rustless"

Maybe a bit overlooked because of the 16 newcomers are the four Aztec seniors Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.). Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and Michael Rocha (Pasadena, Calif.). The four, however, have been rocks in the program since their arrival on The Mesa and this year is no different.

A 2007 honorable mention all-Pac-10 pick, Byrns returned from an injury-plagued 2008 season to start 16 of SDSU's 18 games a year ago, leading the league in saves per game (4.50). Over his career, San Diego State is 21-10-7 (.645) when he earns the start. This year, Byrns

is 7-3-1 with a 1.07 goals against average, a mark which ranks 79th in the nation.

An all-Pac-10 selection all three years (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2007-08), Diouf tied for third on the team in 2009 with nine points on three goals and three assists. Over his career, the tri-captain has five career game-winning goals (14 total). This year, Diouf has seven points on three goals and an assist.

A two-time all-conference honoree (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2008), Reza is a two-time team MVP after leading the squad in scoring each of the past two seasons. Reza had 16 points (six goals, four assists) last year after recording the top SDSU offensive season in a decade in 2008 (20 points - eight goals, four assists). The tri-captain already has 16 points (six goals, four assists) in 11 games in 2010. The 1.45 points per game ranks in a tie for 32nd in the country, while his 0.55 goals per game is tied for 38th.

Rocha, meanwhile, has come back strong after missing all of 2009 with a wrist injury. Rocha scored his first career goal on Sept. 12 in the team's 4-1 win over Oakland and added another on Sept. 24 vs. Houston Baptist. Rocha has seven career points on two goals and three helpers.

Reza Moves to No. 23 in Top Drawer Soccer's Upperclassmen Top 100

Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) is ranked No. 23 in the latest *Top Drawer Soccer* Upperclassmen Top 100 list, released Oct. 8. Reza improved 44 places from the initial release (Sept. 15). According to the website, the list, which will be updated weekly, "is meant to reflect overall quality of players. This means it is far more than a ranking of statistics. As soccer in many ways is not a statistical game, it is important to understand the qualities that players can bring to defense, attack, central midfield and wing play, along with goalkeeping. So many of the things that make players desirable to have on teams are not reflected in statistics."

Reza leads the team in points (16), goals (6), assists (4), shots (40), shots on goal (17), penalty kick goals (3) and game-winning goals (2, tied).

Reza also improved from No. 6 to No. 3 in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Players to Watch Men's Top 20 list for the Pac-10. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) and senior Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), meanwhile, are 16th and 17th, respectively, on the Pac-10 list.

SDSU's Martin, Meuser Make College Freshmen Top 100

San Diego State's Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Calif.) and Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) are ranked the same in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Freshmen National Top 100 list, the website announced Oct. 8. Like the initial list (Sept. 22), Martin is rated No. 34, while Meuser is at No. 85 in the rankings.

The duo has played an important part in leading the Aztecs to a 7-3-1 record out of the gate, their best start to a season in five years. Both Martin and Meuser have started all 11 games, mostly playing in a backline that has surrendered just 12 goals in 2010.

Martin has played all 1,013 minutes for SDSU in the back, joining redshirt senior goalkeeper Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.) as the only players not to come off the field this season. Martin was named to the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central all-tournament team last month. Meuser, meanwhile, has logged an impressive 938 minutes this season, a mark that only trails Byrns and Martin. Meuser, who has mainly seen action in the back, but also some time in the midfield, has five shots on the year, including one on net, and an assist.

Byass Named One of 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On

San Diego State men's soccer forward Miles Byass (Highland, Calif./Redlands HS) recently has been picked by *College Soccer News* as one of the 100 Freshmen From Coast To Coast To Keep an Eye On during the 2010 season. Current Aztecs who have previously been named to the preseason list include redshirt junior Gemechu Abraham (Beaverton, Ore./Beaverton HS) and sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS).

Byass (6-0, 155) brings instant credibility to this year's class after playing for the United States Under-18 National Team for each of the past two years. A Parade All-American in 2009, Byass was ranked as the 16th-best recruit in the nation, according to *Top Drawer Soccer.com*. Byass scored 17 goals in 25 games for the U-18 Arsenal during the 2008-09 U.S. Academy season and participated in the USSF Academy 2008-09 West Conference U-17/U-18 Starting XI. A Highland, Calif., native, Byass scored 30 times for Redlands High School in the 2009-10 campaign, garnering player of the year honors for "High School Game Time" and the San Bernardino County Sun.

This season, Byass has appeared in six games (four are Aztec wins), with one start to his credit. Byass has 11 shots (three on net) in 250 minutes and has taken four corner kicks, the second most on the team.

SDSU's Justin Davies Featured on ESPN.com

San Diego State redshirt junior Justin Davies (San Diego/Brooks School (Mass.)) has been featured as the lead story on the "College Sports" section of the popular website ESPN.com. The article, written by Sheldon Shealer and entitled "O Brother," talks about Davies' new offensive role in the Aztec lineup.

After playing mainly in the back his first two seasons, Davies scored his first two career goals and assisted on another to help SDSU go 2-0 at the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament earlier this month. Davies had a career-high six shots and the game-winning goal in a 1-0 San Diego State win over Air Force on Sept. 10. Two days later, Davies equaled his high with six attempts, including a collegiate best five on net with the other shot hitting the post. He scored once and assisted on another as the Aztecs defeated Oakland, 4-1. For his efforts, he was named to the all-tournament team.

SDSU Men's Soccer's 2010 Recruiting Class Ranked No. 29 Nationally

San Diego State's 2010 men's soccer recruiting class has received a No. 29 national ranking from *College Soccer News*. It is the fourth year in a row that the Aztecs have had a top-30 recruiting class, and the fifth time in the last six seasons that they've been ranked in the top 40.

The 2010 recruiting class, consisting of 12 players, is the largest of head coach Lev Kirshner's 10-year tenure. Ten high school prospects and two college transfers will be asked to replace seven seniors, three of whom were Major League Soccer draft picks.

The individual accolades of Kirshner's class include an under-18 U.S. National Team starter, two U-17 and U-20 Canadian National Team members, a high school All-American, an adidas ESP participant, multiple starters on regional ODP teams and two top-100 nationally-ranked players.

The Aztecs are one of four Pac-10 squads to receive top-40 rankings. Perennial powerhouse UCLA picked up the top rated class, with California (No. 15) and Stanford (No. 31) also included. The Aztecs' No. 29 class ranked ahead of Big Ten schools Michigan State (No. 30) and Wisconsin (No. 35), as well as a pair of Big West squads in UC Irvine (No. 32) and Cal Poly (No. 38).
