San Diego State returns home this weekend as it plays host to Air Force and Wyoming in a pair of Mountain West Conference games. The Aztecs, who are looking for their first MWC win, will face the Falcons on Friday, Oct. 17, at 1:30 p.m. PT before tangling with the Cowgirls two days later at 2 p.m. PT.

SERIES HISTORY VS. AIR FORCE

San Diego State leads in its all-time series with Air Force by a 10-1-1 count. Last year, the Aztecs defeated the Falcons, 2-0, in Colorado Springs, Colo. SDSU has won six of the last seven meetings against AFA, with its last loss coming in 2001.

SCOUTING THE FALCONS

Air Force (3-10-0 overall; 0-3-0 MWC) is looking to snap a four-match losing streak after falling to TCU (3-1) and New Mexico (1-0) last weekend.

On the season, the Falcons are led by freshman Bridgett Murphy who has compiled six goals on a team-leading 51 shot attempts. Senior Rony Yadlin has also provided offensive support for the Academy with four tallies and an assist.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State fell to 0-3 in the Mountain West Conference with a pair of losses at Utah and Brigham Young last week.

On Thursday evening (Oct. 9), the Utes jumped out to an early 1-0 lead, scoring at the 2:21 mark. The Aztecs responded in the 76th minute when sophomore Cat Walker tallied her teamleading fifth goal of the season, but Utah came right back to tie the game just 2:47 later. The home team then went on to score two more goals within a five minute span to claim the 4-1 victory.

Sophomore goalkeeper Aubree Southwick racked up a season-high nine saves, including two stops on a pair of penalty shots, before she suffered an injury and was taken out of the game with 12:11 left in regulation.

Two days later, SDSU hung tough with conference-leading BYU, but eventually fell, 2-0. The Cougars dominated the first half, out shooting the Aztecs, 10-2. The Scarlet and Black started to put pressure on BYU in the second period, but was unable to get on the board. Senior goalie Christi Yount totaled five saves in her first start of the season.

THE COACHES

After spending three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen enters his second season as the Aztecs' head coach. In 2007, Friesen led SDSU to a 4-2-1 Mountain West Conference record, marking its most league wins since the 2000 campaign.

Nat Gonzalez, who spent three seasons as the associate head coach at Southern California and was the head men's soccer coach at UC Riverside prior to his stint at USC, is in his second year on The Mesa. Gonzalez was a four-year goal-keeper at UCLA from 1988-91 and was a member of the Bruins' 1990 national championship squad.

Jayme Hardwick enters her first season as a member of the SDSU women's soccer coaching staff. Hardwick was a four-year letterwinner as a midfielder at Purdue from 2002-05.

2008 CAPTAINS

This season, the Aztec women's soccer team has a trio of captains in junior defender Millie Allen, senior forward Alicia Piz and sophomore midfielder Cat Walker.

Allen, a 2007 all-MWC second-team selection, appeared in every game last season. The Thornton, Colo., native scored her first career goal against Cal Poly (Sept. 14) and added the gamewinner in the Aztecs' 1-0 upset over Arizona on

Sept. 30. Allen has earned the starting nod in 56 career contests.

Piz is coming off a solid 2007 campaign in which she started 16 of the Aztecs' 20 games and ranked third on the team with 21 shots. The SDSU scholar-athlete was also third on the squad with five points (1 goal, 3 assists).

Walker, meanwhile, was named a co-captain last year but suffered a season-ending injury in an exhibition game. As a freshman in 2006, the Folsom, Calif., native started 17 of the 19 contests she appeared in and tied for second on the team with three goals scored.

RECORD WATCH

San Diego State returns its top goalkeeper from a year ago in sophomore Aubree Southwick. The Danville, Calif., native started 20 games in 2007, playing in all but 82 minutes during the season. Southwick wasted no time in etching her name in the SDSU record books, racking up a single-season leading 106 saves.

On the career charts, Southwick is second with 13 shutouts and ranks fifth among SDSU's all-time leaders with 159 career saves.

WALKER BACK ON TRACK

After missing the entire 2007 season due to injury, Cat Walker has returned to her old ways, recording a team-leading five goals. She had a three-match scoring streak from Aug. 31-Sept. 7, before finding the back of the net again vs. SJSU and at Utah. Walker also ranks first on the squad in points (11) and shot attempts (27).

VANDEVANTER SHINES

Junior forward Heather Vandevanter has been an offensive threat for the Aztecs as she ranks second on the squad with three goals, while tying for the team lead with three assists. The Alamo, Calif., native found her way into the scoring column in back-to-back games at CS Fullerton and vs. San Jose State and recorded an assist in both games at the Villanova Classic (Sept. 5-7). Vandevanter is currently second on the team with nine points.

McQUEENY IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Freshman defender Megan McQueeny scored her first collegiate goal in a nationally televised game on The Mtn. vs. UNLV (Oct. 3). The Rohnert Park, Calif., native created her own shot at the top of the box and drilled a beauty into the upper left corner from 20 yards out.

AMMAN IN THE MIX

Freshman defender Gretel Amman has already been thrown into the mix in just her first year on The Mesa. The Santa Rosa, Calif., native has started every match this season and is tied for third on the team with two tallies. Her first collegiate score was the game-tying goal vs. UC River-

Mike Friesen Head Coach Second Season/Fifth Overall at SDSU Sonoma State, 1996

After spending three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen enters his second season as the Aztecs' head coach.

Friesen, the fourth head coach in Aztec history, has played a significant role in bringing excitement back to San Diego State soccer. An offensive standout in his playing days at Point Loma Nazarene (1988-89) and Sonoma State (1993-94), Friesen has helped the Aztecs become one of the most potent offenses in the West Coast.

As an associate head coach at SDSU, the Aztecs netted 28 goals in 2005, the most for the program since 2002. In 2004, SDSU reached the Mountain West Conference championship game for the first time since 1999. The team's 3-1-2 conference record was also its best since that same 1999 season.

Friesen teamed with former Aztec head coach Dr. Mike Giuliano to bring an up-tempo-in-your-face style of defense, which was successful, as evident by the team's nine shutouts in 2004, second most in school history. The Aztecs allowed just 18 goals in 21 games that season, the program's fewest since the 1990 squad gave up 12 goals in 13 games.

Prior to coming to San Diego State, Friesen spent five years working with the UC Santa Barbara women's program.

Upon arriving in Santa Barbara, Friesen helped turn the Gaucho program around, going from a 7-29-2 mark and scoring just 27 goals the two seasons prior to his arrival, to a 24-11-6 mark in 2002-03, tallying 105 scores.

Friesen has a great deal of experience coaching at a variety of levels. Before his time at UCSB, he guided the under-19 Santa Rosa United Aftershocks to the 1999 girls' California State Cup championship. In 1997, he directed Ursuline High School in Santa Rosa, Calif., to the CIF North Coast Section championship game.

side as the Aztecs went on to defeat the Highlanders, 3-1. Amman also found the back of the net vs. SJSU.

GUARDING GORDON

Guarding junior forward Jessica Gordon has proved to be a tough task for opponents. After being limited to only five appearances in 2007 due to an injury, she has compiled a career-high three goals this season, notching her first multiple-scoring game with two tallies vs. Loyola (Sept. 7). Gordon is currently third on the team with seven points.

COUNT ONE FOR CANATSEY

Freshman forward Taylor Canatsey made her first collegiate goal one to remember. With the score knotted at one vs. Arizona State (Aug. 31), the Garden Grove, Calif., native headed in the game-winner on a corner kick play with 2:23 left in regulation.

PIZ ON THE ATTACK

Senior forward Alicia Piz is second on the team with 23 shots this season. The Morrison, Colo., native has compiled two goals and an assist and tied her career-high with six attempts vs. Loyola (Sept. 7).

BACK FOR MORE

The Aztecs return 15 letterwinners and seven starters from a 2007 squad that posted a 9-8-3 mark and finished second in the MWC. SDSU had its best league record (4-2-1) since the 2000 campaign when the Scarlet and Black went 4-2.

Returning starters from last season include seniors Alicia Piz and Jillian Riker, juniors Millie Allen, Allie Crowson, Ali Lokanc and Heather Vandevanter, and sophomore All-American Aubree Southwick.

FRESH FACES

Several freshmen are making an immediate impact in their first year on The Mesa. Newcomer Gretel Amman (D) has earned the starting nod in all 14 games, while classmates Megan McQueeny (D) and Tiffany Hurst (MF) have cracked the starting lineup 13 and 12 times, respectively. Fellow freshmen Taylor Canatsey (F) and Jackie Spinner have also played key roles as reserves.

In all, the Aztecs welcome 11 newcomers in 2008. The remainder of the incoming class are sophomore transfer Michaela DeJesus (F), and freshmen Megan Allaire (GK), Allie Brown (MF), Julia Flores (D), Jaime Nelson and Christina Palomino (GK).

San Diego State was picked to finish in a tie for third place with Utah in the Mountain West Conference regular season standings. The Aztecs and Utes each received 36 points in the 2008 preseason coaches' poll, while Brigham Young was tabbed as the favorite with 49 points.

2007 POSTSEASON HONORS

Goalkeeper Aubree Southwick racked up the accolades last season, becoming the first player in Mountain West Conference history to earn two individual awards when she was tabbed the defensive player of the year and freshman of the year. The first-team all-MWC pick also garnered Soccer Buzz freshman All-America recognition.
