No. 11/10 San Diego State Closes Three-Game Homestand Saturday Night Against Big West Favorite UC Santa Barbara

No. 11/10 San Diego State, winners of 11 straight to open the 2010-11 campaign and preseason Mountain West Conference favorites, concludes its three-game homestand Saturday night against Big West preseason favorite, UC Santa Barbara (5-3), inside Viejas Arena.

The 91st meeting between the long-time foes is set for 7 p.m. PT at SDSU's on-campus arena. There is no television coverage for the game, but the contest can be heard on radio in Southern California on AM 600 KOGO with Ted Leitner calling the action.

SDSU is enjoying its best start to a season in 90 seasons of basketball and is currently riding the second-longest winning streak (11) in school history. The Aztecs moved to 11-0 Monday night after defeating another Big West member, Cal Poly, 51-45, just hours after they broke into the top 10 of the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top-25 Poll. The Aztecs struggled offensively, scoring just 16 points in the first half and finished 0-for-18 from beyond the arc. San Diego State, however, was locked in defensively as it held Cal Poly to 15 first-half points and 29.2-percent shooting for the game. The Scarlet and Black also finished with a plus-13 advantage in the rebounding category.

Senior Malcolm Thomas led the way with 18 points, 15 rebounds and five blocked shots for Aztecs, who were without sophomore starters Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley due to flu-like symptoms. With Thomas' performance, the San Diego native became the third Division I player this season to enjoy a game with at least 15 points, 15 rebounds and five blocked shots, according to ESPN.com. Sophomore James Rahon, meanwhile, added 14 points in his first career SDSU start. The Thomas and Rahon duo accounted for 13 of San Diego State's 16 field goals and 32 of the team's 51 points. Not to be forgotten, senior captain D.J. Gay knocked down eight straight free throws in the final 38 seconds to put the game away for the Aztecs. He finished with 10 points.

The Gauchos arrive on Montezuma Mesa as one of the hottest teams on the West Coast having won three straight, including two in a row on the road, and four of their last five overall. On Wednesday, UC Santa Barbara went into Las Vegas and the Thomas & Mack Center and defeated No. 22 UNLV, 68-62. James Nunnally led the way for the Gauchos with 23 points and seven rebounds. Fellow preseason all-Big West selection and reigning conference player of the year Orlando Johnson, meanwhile, added 12 points and 15 boards. Nunnally and Johnson lead the team in scoring and rebounding as both average more than 20 points and six rebounds per game.

Saturday's showdown with the surging Gauchos marks the third straight season in which the schools have met. The Aztecs have had the upper hand recently winning five straight in the series and 15 of the last 18.

Aztecs Rolling

- ▶ San Diego State is 11-0 for the first time in school history. This is the 90th season of Aztec Basketball.
- ▶ The 11-game winning streak matches the second-longest winning streak (1936-37) in 90-year history of the program. It is the longest of the Division I era and longest since 1955-56. The longest winning streak in school history is 13 games, accomplished in 1955-56.
- ▶ San Diego State, as of Thursday, owns the third-longest active winning streak (11) in the nation behind Duke (20) and Cleveland State.
- ▶ The Aztecs, as of Thursday, are the only 11-0 team in the nation and trail only Cleveland State (12-0) for most wins in Division I.
- ▶ A win on Saturday, would extend head coach Steve Fisher's longest winning streak to open a season of his storied career. In terms of his longest winning streak in general, Fisher has guided a team to an 11- and 12-game winning streak, both of which occurred in 1992-93 while at Michigan.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 20 consecutive games against non-ranked opponents at any site.
- ▶ The Aztecs have won 14 straight vs. non-conference opposition, which is the best mark in school history. The school record does not account for postseason games.
- ▶ As of Thursday, the 11th-ranked Aztecs, No. 7 in the Sagarin ratings, were one of just 12 teams to have not suffered a loss this year. The other 11 include fellow MWC school No. 16 BYU, No. 1 Duke, No. 2 Ohio State, No. 3 Kansas, No. 4 Connecticut, No. 5 Syracuse, No. 9 Baylor, UCF, Cincinnati, Cleveland State and Northwestern (all rankings are from the Dec. 13 AP poll).

Home Sweet Home

- ▶ San Diego State's 10-game home winning streak is tied for the 18th longest in the nation with UC Santa Barbara as of Thursday.
- ▶ SDSU has won a program-record 20 straight home dates vs. non-conference foes. The Aztecs are 5-0 this season at home in the early going.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 22 consecutive home games against teams from outside the AP Top 25.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has compiled a 73-10 record (.879) at home and has lost only three times on Montezuma Mesa the last two seasons.
- ▶ The Aztecs have won 10 straight at Viejas Arena by an average of 16.4 points (164 points total).
- ▶ During its school-record 20-game non-conference home winning streak, San Diego State has won by an average of 19.5 points (389 points total).

It's Worth Noting...

- ▶ With six straight road/neutral wins under its belt, SDSU has matched the school record. The 2010-11 squad shares the road/neutral winning streak record with the 1967-68 and 1984-85 teams.
- ▶ The Aztecs have shot better than their opponent in every game this season. In fact, San Diego State has shot 50 percent or better from the field in seven times this year. For the season, SDSU is shooting 49.9 percent from the floor, which ranks second in the MWC.
- ▶ SDSU has been outrebounded just once in 2010-11, which was at California. Only Saint Mary's pulled even in the category, tying the Aztecs with 35 rebounds.
- ▶ San Diego State, which had never been ranked coming into this season, is enjoying its highest ranking of the sea-

son, coming in at No. 11 in the AP and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll.

► The NCAA released updated national stats on Monday, Dec. 13, and the Aztecs ranked eighth in field-goal percentage (51.1). Individually, Kawhi Leonard ranked fourth in double-doubles with seven and 31st in rebounding (9.9). Billy White, meanwhile, entered last week ranked 13th in field-goal percentage (63.1).

San Diego State-UCSB Series History

► The teams are meeting for the 91st time overall with the Aztecs owning a 56-34 series advantage. With 90 previous meetings, the Gauchos represent the Aztecs second-most common opponent, trailing only Fresno State (102 meetings). The 56 victories against UC Santa Barbara are the most Aztec wins against any opponent (two ahead of Fresno State).

► The Aztecs have won five straight vs. the Gauchos. SDSU's last loss in the series was on Nov. 19, 2004, and the game was the third of three straight overtime contests with UCSB.

► San Diego State owns a 32-14 series advantage in San Diego and claimed a 68-51 decision in UCSB's most recent visit to Viejas Arena on Dec. 20, 2008.

► The Aztecs have won the last two meetings at Viejas Arena and eight of the last nine in San Diego.

► San Diego State has won 15 of the last 18 games between the teams. Fisher has led the Aztecs to a 7-2 record vs. the Gauchos.

► Although the teams have met 90 previous times, UCSB and San Diego State have played just 13 times since 1978, including the last three seasons.

► The series has been one full of streaks, with the Aztecs claiming 13 straight wins over the Gauchos from Feb. 9, 1934 to Feb. 17, 1940, the second-longest win streak against any opponent in SDSU history. UCSB countered with a 13-game series win streak from Jan. 16, 1960 until Jan. 13, 1972, the second-longest series losing streak in Aztec history.

Thomas Turning the Corner at the Line

Entering the season, Malcolm Thomas was a 55.1-percent free-throw shooter and had never enjoyed a season above 53 percent from the charity stripe.

That may be coming to an end this season.

Thomas is shooting 61.2 percent from the line this year and is 16 for his last 21 (76.2 percent), which comes after a sub-par start where he made just 13 of his first 28 attempts (46.4 percent).

Gay, White Climbing School Wins Chart

Seniors D.J. Gay and Billy White are soaring up the school's all-time victories list (since 1975-76). Gay has played in 82 San Diego State wins, which ranks second, while White has participated in 79 (fourth place). Richie Williams, who manned the point guard spot prior to Gay taking over last season, is the school-record holder with 85 wins to his credit.

A Tale of Two Halves

San Diego State has been a second-half team this season thus far, outscoring its opponents, 450-320. In the first half alone, the Aztecs own just a 372-337 scoring advantage. Below is a comparison of SDSU's production in each half.

Cutting Down the Turnovers

After committing 81 turnovers in the first six games of the season, San Diego State has cut down on its total considerably the last five games where it has just 43 miscues. In the first half dozen outings, the Aztecs averaged 13.5 turnovers compared to only 8.6 in games 7-11. Prior to turning the ball over 14 times against Cal Poly on Dec. 13, SDSU had not committed 10 turnovers or more in a game since Nov. 26 vs. San Diego Christian.

Milestone Win at California

Below are some tidbits on San Diego State's win at California.

► San Diego State snapped a 19-game road losing streak playing at teams from Power-6 conferences, dating back to an 82-70 overtime win at Northwestern on Dec. 3, 1996.

► The Aztecs snapped a 20-game road losing streak to Pac-10 teams, dating back to a 49-47 victory over at Oregon on Dec. 11, 1982.

► SDSU is now 6-51 lifetime at Pac-10 opponents and the victory snapped a 20-game losing streak in road matchups against the league. The Aztecs' five previous Pac-10 road wins occurred on Jan. 4, 1941 (California), Dec. 22, 1953 (Arizona State), Dec. 9, 1971 (Arizona), Jan. 7, 1978 (Arizona State) and, Dec. 11, 1982 (Oregon).

► San Diego State snapped a two-game losing streak at California and won for the first time in Berkeley, since a 29-28 victory on Jan. 4, 1941.

► SDSU snapped California's 21-game homecourt win streak against non-conference opponents. Overall, Cal entered the game 19-1 in its last 20 home games. The decision was the first non-conference loss at home for the Golden Bears since Dec. 22, 2007, when California fell at home to Utah.

Thomas Becomes Third Aztec to be Named MWC Player of the Week

Malcolm Thomas was named MWC Player of the Week on Dec. 7. The award is the first of his career.

In a 69-55 win over Saint Mary's, Thomas was instrumental in limiting Saint Mary's to 55 points, which was more than 35 points less than what SMC was averaging coming into the game. The senior blocked a career-high-tying six shots and was a part of an Aztec defense that finished with a season-high 10 blocks. The six blocked shots matched his own record for the most in a single in Steve Fisher's 12-year tenure at SDSU and was the second-highest figure in school single-game history. The preseason all-MWC pick also added 12 points on 5-of-8 shooting, six rebounds, one assist and a steal in 28 minutes of action.

Against the Missouri Valley Conference favorites, Wichita State, Thomas welcomed the Shockers to the block party and denied another four attempts (SDSU had five blocks for the game), giving him 10 blocks for the week. Thomas chipped in another 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting, five rebounds, one assist and one steal in 29 minutes.

For the week, Thomas averaged 12.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 5.0 blocks, 2.0 steals, 1.0 assists and a field-goal percentage of 66.7 percent (10-of-15).

White Joins 1,000-Point Club

Billy White became the 25th player in school history and the 17th since 1970-71 (Division I era) to score 1,000 points for his San Diego State career on Dec. 1, 2010. The four-year starter needed seven points vs. Saint Mary's to hit the 1,000 mark and finished with nine on the night. He was awarded with a game ball in a pregame ceremony prior to the Wichita State game on Dec. 4.

Spark Off the Bench

Sophomore newcomer James Rahon has provided a huge spark off the bench this season. The San Diego native is averaging 9.2 points, which ranks fifth on the team, and is shooting 52.1 percent from the field, including a team-best 45.5 percent from three-point distance (min. 10 att.).

This season, Rahon has reached double figures in scoring five times (eight points or more seven times), has shot 50 percent or better from the field five times and has connected on multiple three-pointers on five occasions. He is also averaging 23.2 minutes, the sixth most on the team.

Leonard Named MWC Player of the Week for Second Straight Week

Kawhi Leonard was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Nov. 22. In the first two weeks of the season, the sophomore earned the MWC weekly honor both times.

Leonard averaged a team-best 20.3 points, 10.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.0 steals in a week where the Aztecs won at No. 11 Gonzaga and picked up neutral-site victories vs. Green Bay and IUPUI. The five-time MWC player of the week also shot 50.0 percent from the field and knocked down a team-best four three-pointers (4-8 3FG).

In the game at Gonzaga, Leonard went for 18 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, while adding a team-high three assists and two steals. Three days later in Oxford, Ohio, the sophomore led the Aztecs to a win over Green Bay by scoring a game-high 23 points on an efficient 7-of-9 shooting and a career-high nine free throws. Leonard also grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds and dished out two assists. Then to close the week, Leonard was back at it again, this time scoring a game-high 20 points, pulling down a game-high 10 rebounds, matching his season high with three assists and setting a new season best with three steals against IUPUI. Leonard also knocked down all four of his three-point attempts in the second half vs. the Jaguars to help SDSU to its second neutral-site victory in as many days.

The first time he won the award, Leonard helped San Diego State to a season-opening win at Long Beach State. Leonard scored a game-high 21 points and led all players with 12 rebounds. Leonard also completed his 29th consecutive starting assignment with three assists, one blocked shot and two steals.

After sharing the scoring lead with D.J. Gay in the first half with 13 points, Leonard went to work on the boards and nearly outrebounded the 49ers by himself in the second half. The sophomore collected 12 rebounds to Long Beach State's 16 and had 11 on the defensive end, which was equal to LBSU's second-half total.

Reliving the Gonzaga Win

Below are tidbits on the Aztecs' victory at No. 11 Gonzaga.

► The victory snapped a 33-game road losing streak to teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25.

► The win represented the highest-ranked team the Aztecs have ever defeated on the road.

► It was just the second road win over an AP Top 25 team in school history and the fourth road/neutral victory over a ranked opponent in school history.

► It was the fifth-highest ranked team the Aztecs have defeated in school history.

► San Diego State is 5-4 in its last nine games against teams ranked in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were 4-41 in their previous 45 games against nationally-ranked teams prior to this stretch.

► Snapped a nine-game losing streak to non-conference AP Top 25 teams, dating back to a Dec. 8, 2001 victory over 21st-ranked Fresno State.

► It was the first time SDSU has ever defeated a top-25 team in the month of November.

► It was San Diego State's 17th victory over an AP Top-25 team, with seven of those victories coming during the Steve Fisher era.

► With the victory, San Diego State snapped Gonzaga's 12-game homecourt winning streak dating back to last season.

► San Diego State handed Gonzaga its fifth-ever loss in the McCarthy Athletic Center, dropping the Zags to 77-5 all-time in the facility. The Aztecs became the first visiting team to win at the facility since Wake Forest came away with a victory on Dec. 5, 2009.

Leonard on Naismith Watch List

Kawhi Leonard added another honor to his long list of accolades as he was named to the Naismith preseason watch list on Nov. 16. The sophomore is one of 50 players representing 44 schools on the list. This comes several weeks after Leonard was named to the Wooden preseason top-50 list.

Iron Man

D.J. Gay is arguably one of the nation's iron men as he has played in every game since he has stepped foot on campus. The guard from Sun Valley, Calif., has seen action in all 114 games, while earning the starting nod 94 times. In each of his three seasons on campus, Gay has seen his minutes per game increase from 23.8 as a freshman to 26.7 as a sophomore to a team-best 34.6 minutes last year as a junior. This season, he is averaging 34.1 minutes. The senior has also started 45 straight games.

Double-Double Machine

Just a sophomore, Kawhi Leonard is currently in fourth place for most double-doubles in school history (since 1975-76 season) with 24 career doubles-doubles. Leonard's 17 double-doubles last year were a freshman school record, which was previously owned by Michael Cage when he had 10 in 1981, and were the fourth-most in a single season in program history. Another seven double-doubles this season would put him second all time, ahead of Marcus Slaughter's 30, but behind Cage's 61 career double-doubles.

Fisher Picks Up Win No. 200

Steve Fisher inherited a team in 1999-2000 that won just four games the season before his arrival. Fast forward to now and seven postseason berths and six 20-win efforts later, he is one of two men's basketball coaches at San Diego State to have at least 200 victories after the Aztecs beat No. 11 Gonzaga. The 12th-year head coach owns a 209-149 record and that is with a 5-23 (0-14 MWC) record

in 1999-2000 under his belt. He is currently the second all-time winningest coach in SDSU history, behind only George Ziegenfuss' 316 victories from 1948-69.

Rahon Makes Splash in Debut

James Rahon made a splash in his first official game as an Aztec in the season opener at Long Beach State. The San Diego native came off the bench and finished with 14 points and four rebounds. A transfer from Santa Clara, Rahon connected on four three-pointers, including three straight on three consecutive possessions in the second half that helped SDSU expand its one-point lead to 10 with under seven minutes left in regulation.

Aztecs Ranked for First Time in School History

San Diego State started the 2010-11 campaign ranked 25th in the preseason Associated Press Top-25 poll. The Aztecs' preseason ranking marked the first time the program has been ranked in any of the two major polls (AP, Coaches) in school history.

Entering its 90th season and its 41st at the Division I level, SDSU received 158 votes to earn its No. 25 ranking.

According to collegepollarchive.com, San Diego State became the seventh school since 1974 to make its AP poll debut in the preseason rankings. The Aztecs join UNLV (1974), Charlotte (1977), UAB (1982), Cleveland State (1987), Rhode Island (1998) and Gonzaga (2000) as the only schools to have accomplished the feat.

This marked the first time since the 2000-01 season that a team has made its debut in the AP poll. That season, Gonzaga was coming off a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament and the Bulldogs went on to post a 26-7 record and advanced to the 2001 NCAA Sweet 16.

Aztecs First in Preseason MWC Media Poll

San Diego State was picked to win the Mountain West Conference in the league's preseason media poll. The Aztecs earned 261 points, including 21 of a possible 30 first-place votes. SDSU finished ahead of second-place BYU, which had 220 points and five first-place tallies.

The 261 points and 21 first-place votes are the most the Aztecs have earned in school history and the first-place prediction marks the third time the MWC media has made SDSU the preseason favorite. In 2005-06, the Aztecs were the favorite and wound up winning the regular-season and tournament championship. The other time, 2006-07, San Diego State finished in third place.

Leonard, Thomas Preseason All-MWC Picks

Forwards Kawhi Leonard and Malcolm Thomas were voted to the preseason all-MWC team by the conference media. The starting frontcourt enters 2010-11 as the nation's top returning rebounding duo after averaging

17.5 boards last season.

Leonard, who is on the preseason Wooden Award Top 50 List, is coming off a fantastic freshman campaign in which he was named MWC freshman of the year, Mountain West tournament most valuable player and became the first freshman in the history of the league to garner all-MWC first-team accolades. Leonard, who was the only freshman in Division I last year to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament while leading his team in scoring and rebounding, averaged 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds. The Riverside, Calif., native also set the freshman school record for double-doubles with 17, a figure that ranked 13th among all Division I student-athletes. Leonard is the only non-senior on the five-man preseason team.

Thomas, meanwhile, enters his senior season after averaging 10.9 points and 7.6 rebounds, while shooting 54.3 percent from the floor as a junior in 2009-10. Hailing from San Diego, the 6-9 Thomas earned all-MWC second-team honors a year ago and finished the season leading the team in blocked shots, while handing out the second-most assists on the team.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 12 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs routinely mentioned among the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2010-11 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa until 2012-13.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament, the 2007-09 NIT, including the NIT semifinals in 2009, and the 2010 NCAA Tournament. In addition, the Aztecs have one of their deepest teams ever, which will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three

trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last four seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to four additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances, including a school-record 26 wins and an NIT semifinal berth in 2009 and a MWC tourney crown and a spot in the NAAs in 2010, and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

LONG BEACH, Calif. - No. 25 San Diego State went on the road and defeated Long Beach State, 81-65, to open the 2010-11 season before a Walter Pyramid-record 5,143 fans.

The Aztecs used three consecutive three-pointers from sophomore newcomer James Rahon with just over nine minutes to play in the second half to pull away from the 49ers.

San Diego State was nursing a 56-55 lead in a back-and-forth affair when Rahon caught fire. The guard knocked his first three-pointer with 9:01 left in regulation and his teammates found him on the next two trips and were rewarded with two more threes, the last of which gave the Aztecs a 65-55 cushion with 6:49 remaining.

Long Beach State tried to rally and used an 8-1 run after Rahon's third three-point field goal to cut the lead to four, but the nationally ranked Aztecs proved to be too much down the stretch and emerged with the decision.

In the first half, the 49ers raced to a 16-9 lead in the first seven minutes of the game. The Aztecs, however, hung around and eventually took an eight-point lead with 3:51 left before the half. Then in the final two minutes, LBSU closed the half on a 7-0 run and forced the Aztecs into three missed three-point field goals and a turnover as the frame ended in a 42-42 tie.

Kawhi Leonard led all players with 21 points and 12 rebounds, all of which came in the second half. In comparison, the 49ers only had 16 rebounds themselves in the second period. D.J. Gay added 20 points, while Rahon finished with 14 points off the bench. Malcolm Thomas ended with 10 boards and a career-high matching six assists.

SPOKANE, Wash. - No. 25 San Diego State used a career-high 30-point effort from Billy White and trailed for only a 14-second stretch early in the second half to defeat 11th/12th-ranked Gonzaga at the McCarthy Athletic Center.

The Aztecs became just the fifth team to defeat the Bulldogs in 82 games at "The Kennel." The victory snapped a 33-game road losing streak to teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 and marked the highest ranked team the Aztecs have defeated on the road.

San Diego State scored the first basket of the night and was able to keep the Zags at arm's length for much of the first half. The Aztec lead swelled to 10 with 6:20 remaining in the half, but the Bulldogs crept to within five, 42-37, at the halftime buzzer.

A 7-0 Gonzaga run to start the second half gave the Bulldogs a brief two-point lead, but D.J. Gay answered 11 seconds later with a three to help SDSU reclaim the lead.

Minutes later, White caught fire and scored 11 straight points in a 2 minute, 51 second span to keep GU in a seven-point hole with 9:40 left in regulation.

Gonzaga, led by Steven Gray's career-high 35 points, rallied to within one point at 77-76 with 23 seconds on the clock. Following two Kawhi Leonard free throws, Gray turned the ball over and the Zags fouled Chase Tapley, who missed the front end of a bonus situation. After securing the rebound, Gray had a chance to tie the game with a halfcourt shot, but the attempt was well short and the Aztecs emerged with the decision.

OXFORD, Ohio - No. 25 San Diego State overcame a slow start for a second straight game, used a suffocating defense in the second half and ultimately erased a seven-point deficit to defeat IUPUI, 61-46, in the Oxford Subregional of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic.

After trading baskets in the early stages of the second half, San Diego State used another big scoring run to push the lead to 20 points, 55-35, with 10 minutes to go in regulation. Saint Mary's would not go down easily, as four Rob Jones three-pointers helped cut the SDSU lead to nine with 3:12 left in the contest.

Despite the SMC rally, the Aztecs had an answer for each Gael run. Gay hit a pair of tough jump shots down the stretch to help preserve the win. SDSU prevailed behind three different scoring runs where they outscored the Gaels a combined 33-0.

Chase Tapley led the Aztecs with 14 points, while Malcolm Thomas added 12 points to go with six rebounds and a career-high six blocks. Billy White and James Rahon added nine points apiece. In all, eight different Aztecs scored at least five points.

The Gaels were led by 17 points from Jones and 15 from Matthew Dellavedova, who also added five rebounds and four assists.

The capacity crowd marked the ninth sellout in the history of Viejas Arena, and second against SMC. The first came during the quarterfinals of the 2009 NIT.

SAN DIEGO - Billy White enjoyed a near flawless evening and the No. 17/19 Aztecs defeated Wichita State, 83-69, in the second annual Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge in front of a sold-out crowd of 12,414 at Viejas Arena.

In 27 minutes, White scored a game-high 24 points on 10-of-12 shooting, four rebounds, two assists and two steals, and was a key figure in SDSU taking a commanding second-half lead.

San Diego State trailed 47-46 with just over 14 minutes remaining in regulation until White converted on a three-point play with 14:04 left. White's effort along with a stifling full-court press led to a 14-0 run in a matter of 71 seconds. White scored nine of the 14 and suddenly the Aztecs found themselves ahead, 60-47.

Down the stretch, the Shockers peppered SDSU with a healthy dose of three-pointers and shot their way back into game. Wichita State cut its deficit to nine with 8:15 to go, got to within eight at 75-67 as a result of a Graham Hatch three and eventually found itself down, 76-69, with 1:48 left in regulation. But as the Aztecs had done all game, they answered the call, this time in the form of a game-closing 7-0 run to continue their best start to a season in the 90-year history of the program.

Joining White in double figures was Kawhi Leonard (16 points, 12 rebounds, 5 assists), D.J. Gay (14 points, 6 assists) and Malcolm Thomas (12 points, 4 blocks).

David Kyles led Wichita State, which went 9-from-18 from beyond the arc, with 18 points (4-5 3FG).

BERKELEY, Calif. - No. 14/15 San Diego State turned a two-point game at halftime into a 20-point blowout and the Aztecs beat California on the road, 77-57.

The victory snapped a 20-game road losing streak to Pac-10 opponents and stopped a 19-game losing skid at Power-6 league schools. The decision also gave SDSU its first 9-0 start in 90 years of basketball.

San Diego State held the Golden Bears to a pair of free throws over a 9-minute, 18-second stretch before Harper Kamp scored to halt the Aztecs' 10-2 run. After Kamp's bucket, however, SDSU only led 22-18.

The Aztecs led, 28-20, with 2:26 left in the first period, but Cal closed the half on a 6-0 run to trail, 28-26, at intermission.

The Bears, in the second half, cut the SDSU lead to 43-42 with 13:39 remaining, but consecutive three-pointers by D.J. Gay gave the visitors a 49-42 advantage. Gay's two threes spurred a 15-2 run and gave San Diego State a 58-44 lead.

The Aztecs used a full-court press and a stifling defense in the halfcourt to force California into taking bad shots and to create turnovers, which led to easy buckets as SDSU's lead swelled to 21 before it settled for the 20-point win.

Kawhi Leonard led all players with 20 points and James Rahon scored 11 of his 15 in the first half. Gay, meanwhile, scored all of his 14 in the second half and Billy White added 10 points and four assists. Malcolm Thomas shared team-high honors with White as he finished with four assists as well.



SAN DIEGO - San Diego State, ranked No. 11 in the Associated Press poll and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll, held off a late Cal Poly run to escape with a 51-45 victory to keep its season-opening 11-game winning streak intact.

Prior to the game, SDSU found out sophomore starters Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley were unable to play due to flu-like symptoms. Taking their place in the lineup were sophomore James Rahon and freshman LaBradford Franklin.

Both teams were dreadful from the field in the first half. The Aztecs finished the half shooting 33.3 percent (7-for-21), including 0-of-9 from beyond the arc. SDSU, however, forced the Mustangs into a 5-for-27 shooting exhibition (18.5 percent) and took a 16-15 lead into the locker room.

The Aztecs found their rhythm in the second half and opened with a 13-2 run to jump out to a 29-17 lead. Cal Poly ended the streak with a three with just under 11 minutes to play to get within 29-20.

The Mustangs hung around and managed to make the contest a two-possession game multiple times in the last five minutes, but D.J. Gay made eight straight free throws in the final 38 seconds to secure the victory.

At the final horn, San Diego State limited Cal Poly to just 29.2 percent shooting and was plus-13 in the rebounding category.

Malcolm Thomas led the way for the Aztecs with 18 points, 15 rebounds and five blocks. Rahon, meanwhile, scored 14 points in his first career SDSU start. Between the pair, they accounted for 13 of San Diego State's 16 total field goals. Gay, who went 1-for-11 from the field, finished with 10 points.
