UCLA Headed to NCAA Tournament at SDSU

Bruins to open national tournament against Iona on Friday, May 11

LOS ANGELES – No. 2-seed UCLA (21-3) has earned its eighth consecutive berth to the NCAA Tournament, where the Bruins will face No.7-seed Iona (24-11) in a first-round match on Friday, May 11. UCLA secured the conference's automatic bid to this season's NCAA Tournament by winning the MPSF Tournament at Stanford University the weekend of April 27-29.

Bruins in the NCAA Tournament

UCLA will make its 11th appearance in the 12-year history of the NCAA Championships. In the 18-year history of UCLA's program, the Bruins have won 11 national titles (seven NCAA) and have advanced to the national tournament in 17 seasons (including 2012). In 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, the Bruins have won seven NCAA Championships, compiling a 24-3 cumulative record. UCLA has gone 47-6 in 16 previous trips to the annual national tournament.

How We Got Here

UCLA earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament after having gone 21-3 and winning the MPSF Tournament title at Stanford (April 27-29). UCLA outlasted Stanford in overtime, 8-7, at the Cardinal's home pool on April 29 in the MPSF Tournament's title match. The Bruins finished in a tie for second place in the MPSF regular-season standings and secured the conference's No. 2 seed by virtue of a 6-5 regular-season victory in an MPSF meeting at USC on March 3.

MPSF Player of the Year

Senior goalkeeper Caitlin Dement has been named the 2012 MPSF Player of the Year, UCLA's first conference player of the year selection since 2008, when teammates Courtney Mathewson and Jillian Kraus earned Co-Player of the Year accolades. Dement ranks third among MPSF goalkeepers with a 5.22 goals against average and an average of 9.72 saves per game. She also was named MVP of the MPSF Tournament.

MPSF Coach of the Year

UCLA's Brandon Brooks captured MPSF Coach of the Year honors after having led the Bruins to their second MPSF Tournament title in his three seasons at the helm. A former standout goalkeeper on UCLA's men's water polo team, Brooks has compiled a 63-21 record in three seasons as head coach of the women's program. This marks the first time in which Brooks has secured MPSF Coach of the Year acclaim.

UCLA's Leading Scorer

Senior KK Clark leads UCLA with 51 goals through 24 matches. Clark, a talented utility player from Atherton, Calif., has scored at least one goal in 22 of the Bruins' 24 matches. She ranks fourth among MPSF field players with a 2.13 goals per game average. Clark has tallied 17 multiple-goal games and scored a seasonhigh five goals in a 10-6 victory at UC Irvine on April 14. In addition, Clark leads UCLA with 39 steals and 17 field blocks.

Key Contributors for the Bruins

Emily Greenwood has registered a team-leading 64 earned exclusions and ranks third on the team with 26 steals. Gisselle Naranjo has collected a team-high 33 assists and ranks second with 27 steals and 12 field blocks. Sarah Orozco ranks second on the club with 33 earned exclusions, having scored 20 goals on 50 attempts.

UCLA vs. the Tournament Field

Bruins vs. No. 7-seed Iona Gaels

UCLA has never faced Iona in women's water polo. The Gaels won their second consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship this season and will enter this year's NCAA Tournament field as the No. 7-seeded team. Iona clinched the conference's automatic berth with a 10-9 overtime victory over Wagner in the MAAC title match, overcoming an early 5-1 deficit in that game on April 29.

Bruins vs. No. 5-seed Loyola Marymount

The Bruins defeated Loyola Marymount in overtime, 7-6, at the Lions' Burns Aquatics Center on April 15 in both teams' only meeting of the season. UCLA has gone 3-1 in four NCAA Tournament meetings against Loyola Marymount, having dropped a 5-4 decision to the Lions in the first round in 2009. The Bruins have compiled an 18-1 all-time record against Loyola Marymount.

Bruins vs. No. 4-seed UC Irvine

UCLA earned a 10-6 win at UC Irvine earlier this season (April 14) at the Anteaters' home pool in Irvine, Calif. The Bruins and Anteaters have never faced each other in the NCAA Tournament. UCLA owns a lifetime 15-O record against UC Irvine in women's water polo. KK Clark scored a season-high five goals against UC Irvine in the Bruins' 10-6 win at Anteater Aquatics Complex on April 14.

Bruins vs. No. 3-seed USC

The Bruins have posted a 3-0 record against USC this season. Each of UCLA's victories against the Women of Troy have been by one goal. The Bruins earned an 8-7 victory in a semifinal match at the UCI Invitational (Feb. 26), one week before defeating USC, 6-5, at its home facility in an MPSF match (March 3). The Bruins edged USC, 4-3, in a semifinal at the MPSF Tournament last weekend. UCLA owns a 44-18 all-time record against USC in women's water polo. The Bruins defeated USC, 6-5, in the third-place match at last season's NCAA Tournament.

Bruins vs. No. 1-seed Stanford

UCLA and Stanford have split four games against each other this spring, with the Bruins most recently defeating the Cardinal in overtime, 8-7, in the MPSF Tournament title match. Stanford handed UCLA an 8-1 loss one week earlier (April 21) in both teams' final regular-season match at UCLA's Spieker Aquatics Center, UCLA last faced Stanford in the NCAA Tournament in 2009. The Bruins earned a 12-11 victory in the semifinal match that year, en route to capturing their fifth consecutive NCAA Championship. UCLA has registered a 30-32 alltime record against Stanford in women's water polo. Stanford is the only team in women's water polo to which UCLA has a losing record.
