- ▶ San Diego State returns to San Diego for the home opener in season 87, the 41st at the Division I level under the direction of its 17th head coach **Brady Hoke** on Saturday, Sept. 12, 2009, at Southern Utah.
- ▶ **Hoke** was named San Diego State's head football coach on Dec. 16, 2008, becoming the 17th person to hold that position in school history. Last season, in his sixth at Ball State, he guided the Cardinals to a 12-1 record and a second consecutive bowl game appearance. He finished sixth last season in balloting for AP Coach of the Year, trailing Nick Saban (Alabama), Mike Leach (Texas Tech), Kyle Whittingham (Utah), Paul Johnson (Georgia Tech) and Joe Paterno (Penn State). - ▶ The Aztecs are 59-23-4 all-time in **home openers**, but just 3-6 in home lidlifters this decade. Meanwhile, SDSU head coaches are 10-4-2 in their first games at Qualcomm Stadium, with each of the last two head coaches suffering a loss in their first home game. - ▶ San Diego State is looking to even its' record at 1-1. **A victory Saturday** would give the Aztecs their earliest win in a campaign since opening the 2004 season with a 1-1 record. SDSU is looking to win just its second home opener in the last five seasons. [See *San Diego State's 87th Home Opener*, Page 5]
- ▶ San Diego State's **defense** is ranked higher right now in 14 of 15 statistical categories when compared to the 2008 season. The Aztec defense was impressive Saturday, particularly in the second half when they allowed 120 total yards of offense. San Diego State ranks fourth nationally in tackles for loss and is in the top 20 of three other defensive statistical categories. [See *Defense Makes Big Strides*, Page 6]
- ▶ The Aztec **offense** also showed promise on Saturday, scoring touchdowns on its first two drives against a Pac-10 foe. By scoring on its initial drive of the game, San Diego State snapped a streak of 15 consecutive games without scoring a touchdown on its first possession. [See *Offense Has Bright Spots*, Page 6]
- ▶ Junior wide receiver **Vincent Brown** reached a pair of milestones on Saturday, becoming the 24th Aztec receiver with 100 career catches. He also passed the 1,000-yard plateau in the same game. - ▶ Fifteen student-athletes made their San Diego State **playing debut** on Saturday, including four true freshmen - Walter Kazee, Leon McFadden, Anthony Miller and Khalid Stevens. Both McFadden and Miller started the game for the Aztecs. [See *Aztec-Bruin Postgame Notes*, Page 7]
- ▶ San Diego State's **first four opponents** in the 2009 season all were victorious in their opening game of the season. Collectively, the group is 9-2. [See *2009 Schedule*, Page 3]
- ▶ San Diego State junior center Trask Iosefa made his 25th consecutive start last Saturday for the Aztecs. Up for the Rimington Trophy for the nation's best center, he and his offensive lineman have gone four consecutive games without allowing a sack. LAST TIME OUT

SAN DIEGO STATE-UCLA RECAP

The San Diego State football team scored on its first two possessions, but was unable to find the end zone the rest of the way, as the Aztecs dropped a 33-14 decision to host UCLA at the Rose Bowl in Brady Hoke's first game as head coach.

SDSU got on the board quickly, putting together an impressive 14-play, 69-yard drive that ended with a four-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Lindley to full back/tight end Matthew Kawulok to put the visitors ahead, 7-0.

After UCLA responded with a 49-yard Kai Forbath field goal, the Aztecs once again found the end zone as Lindley unloaded a career-long 78-yard touchdown strike to Vincent Brown on a third-down play from his own 22-yard line.

San Diego State did not have much time to celebrate as Bruin Terrence Austin returned the ensuing kickoff 47 yards to the Aztec 12-yard line. UCLA scored on the very next play to cut its deficit to 14-10.

Following a punt by both sides, the Aztecs tried a flea-flicker on their first offensive play of the second quarter, but Lindley's throw was intercepted by Rahim Moore at the UCLA 43-yard line and returned all the way to the SDSU 35.

The Aztecs defense held strong, however, as defensive end B.J. Williams recovered a Kevin Prince fumble at the SDSU 11-yard line.

The Bruins would once again take advantage of good field position, finally taking the lead at 16-14 on a 29-yard touchdown run by Derrick Coleman with 5:33 remaining until halftime. UCLA tacked on another TD before heading into the locker room up, 23-14.

After the break, the Aztec offense struggled to find its rhythm, as the team was forced to punt on its first three drives of the second half.

Now trailing 26-14 following another UCLA field goal, SDSU looked to be in good shape for a breakthrough as senior linebacker Luke Laolagi intercepted a Prince pass and returned it to the Bruin 23-yard line.

After a five-yard gain on first down and two consecutive incomplete passes, Hoke sent on the Aztec field-goal unit for a 35-yard try, but the kick was blocked and UCLA Alterraun Verner scooped up the loose ball and rumbled 70 yards for the touchdown and the 33-14 advantage.

Neither team was stellar in the final quarter, combining for three interceptions, as UCLA won its 21st game in the two schools' 22 all-time meetings.

Aztec wideout Vincent Brown caught five passes for 139 yards and a touchdown to become the 24th player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard mark in career receiving yards. Lindley completed 18 of his 45 pass attempts for 238 yards and two TDs, but also threw three interceptions, including one each on the team's final two possessions of the game.

Defensively, the Aztecs broke in their new 3-3-5 scheme by holding the Bruins to 359 yards of total offense with five UCLA drives starting in SDSU territory.

Prince completed 18 of his 29 passes for 176 yards and a TD, while wideout Taylor Embree had six catches for 97 yards to lead the Bruins.

AZTEC-BRUIN POSTGAME NOTES

- ▶ SDSU has now scored a touchdown in 27 straight games.
- ▶ San Diego State's **11-point lead in the first half** was its largest advantage in the 19 all-time Division I era meetings between the Bruins and Aztecs. San Diego State had a seven-point advantage in the Sept. 16, 1989 contest that UCLA went on to win, 28-25.
- ▶ SDSU's 14 **first-quarter points** are the most it has scored in the first quarter of a game since recording 17 vs. TCU on Nov. 24, 2007 ... The 14 points are more than the Aztecs have scored vs. the Bruins in six of the last seven meetings.
- ▶ SDSU had eight players make their **first career starts Saturday**, including a pair of true freshmen. Of the eight first-time starters, four were doing so in their first career games. The players making their first career starts included: LT Tommie Draheim, LG Mike Matamua, WR DeMarco Sampson, RB Anthony Miller, LB Miles Burris, CB Leon McFadden, Warrior Dey Juan Hemmings and Warrior Brandon Davis.
- ▶ In all, the Aztecs had 15 players log minutes in their **first career outing**, including four true freshmen. The players making their first career appearances in the Red & Black were Vincent Camarda, Doug Deakin, Tommie Draheim, Walter Kazee, Mike Matamua, Leon McFadden, Anthony Miller, Josh O'Brien, Larry Parker, Bryan Shields, D.J. Shields, Khalid Stevens, Jake Tauanuu, Frederick Trujillo and Josh Wade.
- ▶ **VINCENT BROWN:** Needing just 20 yards to surpass the 1,000-yard career receiving mark entering the night, Aztec junior Vincent Brown reached the milestone with his five catches for 139 yards. Brown also recorded his 100th career reception, becoming the 24th player in SDSU history to accomplish that. His career numbers now stand at 100 receptions for 1,119 yards in 25 games. Brown also collected his third, 100-yard career receiving game and his second in the last two outings. Brown capped 2008 with eight catches for 119 yards in the Aztecs' season-ending win over UNLV. His 139 yards against UCLA are his second-most, trailing his 183-yard effort vs. Idaho in 2007.
- ▶ In addition, Brown recorded his career-long reception on the 78-yard touchdown score from Ryan Lindley, beating his previous long of 62 yards against Portland State in 2007. The 78-yard hook up was the Aztecs' longest completed pass since the 97-yarder by Chaz Schilens from Kevin O'Connell against TCU, Nov. 24, 2007.

- ▶ **RYAN LINDLEY:** Aztec sophomore Ryan Lindley started his 12th career game at quarterback. He completed 18 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns. With his effort, Lindley moved from 18th to 17th in SDSU career passing yards with 2,891, jumping over Rod Dowhower. In the first quarter, Lindley notched his career long pass on the 78-yard touchdown to Vincent Brown. Lindley's previous longest pass was a 51-yarder vs. Idaho in 2008.
- ▶ **Dey Juan Hemmings** led the Aztec defense with a career-best seven tackles.
- ▶ The SDSU defense compiled 12 tackles for loss with three of them being sacks.
- ▶ SDSU defensive end **B.J. Williams** recorded his third career fumble recovery in the second quarter. He recovered a pair a year ago as a sophomore.
- ▶ Sophomore defensive back **Brandon Davis** logged his first career forced fumble.
- ▶ Aztec defensive back **Nick Sandford** notched his first career sack in the first half.
- ▶ SDSU true freshman **Leon McFadden** was credited with the block on UCLA's first-half extra-point attempt. The Aztecs had one blocked kick a year ago on an extra-point attempt.
- ▶ SDSU linebacker **Luke Laolagi** logged his second career interception in the third quarter. Laolagi's first career pick came in the 2008 finale against UNLV, giving him two INTs in his last two outings.
- ▶ SDSU defensive back **Vincent Camarda** recorded his first career interception in his first career game in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ Senior tight end/fullback **Matt Kawulok** scored his first career touchdown in the first quarter on a four-yard pass play.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

SAN DIEGO STATE-SOUTHERN UTAH

- ▶ This is the first meeting between San Diego State and Southern Utah on the gridiron.
- ▶ This marks just the second opponent from the five-team Great West Conference that San Diego State has ever played. The Aztecs have faced Great West Conference-member Cal Poly on 24 occasions.
- ▶ This is the first of three teams from the state of Utah that San Diego State will face this season. The Aztecs will play host to the Beehive State's Brigham Young on Oct. 17 before traveling to Salt Lake City for an encounter with Utah on Nov. 21.

AZTEC-THUNDERBIRD CONNECTIONS

- ▶ Southern Utah University head coach, Ed Lamb, was the special teams coordinator, recruiting coordinator and defensive backs coach for two seasons at the University of San Diego. During that time Lamb helped guide the University of San Diego to three consecutive Pioneer League championships.
- ▶ Lamb's special teams unit ranked first or second in the Pioneer League in every statistical category and the defense finished up the 2006 season ranked fourth in the nation.
- ▶ SUU assistant head coach Al Pupunu played seven seasons with the San Diego Chargers. He was a member of their 1994 Super Bowl team. In addition, Pupunu was also selected as the Offensive Player of the Game for his performance in the Chargers' 17-14 over the Pittsburgh Steelers in the AFC Championship game.
- ▶ SUU defensive assistant Ronnie Pentz is a 2008 graduate of the University of San Diego. This is his first year on staff at SUU. As an undergraduate, Pentz played football for the Toreros, racking up 80 tackles and 4.5 sacks. He also earned first-team All-American honors in addition to being a two-time first-team all-Pioneer league selection.
- ▶ Both SUU secondary coach Demario Warren and SDSU wide receiver Brandon Kohn are from Fairfield, Calif., and lettered in football at Fairfield High.
- ▶ Other player connections can be found in the right column.

GENERAL NOTES

SAN DIEGO STATE'S 87th HOME OPENER

- The Aztecs are in their 87th season of football, the 41st at the Division I level and the first under head coach Brady Hoke. Saturday will mark the 87th home opener in school history, with the Aztecs putting a 59-23-4 record in such games on the line.
- ▶ Despite the impressive overall record in home openers, San Diego State is just 3-6 in its home debut this decade. The Aztecs are 1-3 in their last four home openers.
 - ▶ San Diego State won 17 consecutive home openers from 1963-79. The streak was broken in a 31-7 loss to 12th-ranked Missouri on Sept. 27, 1980.
 - ▶ San Diego State's largest crowd for a home opener occurred in on Sept. 4, 2004, when the Aztecs defeated Idaho State, 38-21, in front of 57,216. That is the second largest home crowd in San Diego State history.
 - ▶ Aztec coaches making their home debut are a collective 10-4-2. Each of the last two head coaches - Tom Craft and Chuck Long suffered losses in their first Qualcomm visit. The last time an Aztec head coach was victorious leading the Red and Black out of the tunnel in Mission Valley in their first visit was Ted Tollner, who defeated California, 33-9, in 1995.

DEFENSE MAKES BIG STRIDES IN GAME ONE

San Diego State showed remarkable improvement in its first game of the Brady Hoke era. The Aztecs defense, which ended the 2008 campaign ranked 118 in rushing defense, 113th in scoring defense and 113th in total defense, looked much improved Saturday against UCLA.

The Bruins tallied 33 points; however, much of the damage was done on special teams (touchdown scored on a blocked field goal attempt returned for a touchdown, a kickoff return gave the Bruins the ball on the SDSU 12-yard line and UCLA also had an eight-yard drive for a field goal). UCLA scored 33 points on drives totaling 190 yards of total offense (an average of 35 yards per scoring drive).

Other impressive numbers from the Aztec defense in the first game:

- ▶ The San Diego State defense was flat-out impressive in the second half, limiting UCLA to 10 points (scored on two drives totaling eight yards), and allowing a total of 120 yards of total offense. After intermission, the Bruins rushed 22 times for a mere 45 yards and did not do much better through the air, going 8-for-15 for 75 yards with two interceptions.
- ▶ San Diego State recorded three sacks in the game against the Pac-10 foe. In 12 games last season, the Aztecs recorded 13 total sacks.
- ▶ San Diego State posted 12 tackles for loss, the most for San Diego State since posting 15 tackles for loss against Wyoming on Nov. 3, 2007. In all, the Aztec defense held UCLA to no yards or a loss on 24 of the Bruins 69 offensive plays on Saturday. The Aztecs rank fourth nationally in tackles for loss.
- ▶ The Aztecs forced three turnovers on Saturday, including a pair of interceptions. The total could have easily been larger as San Diego State enticed UCLA to put the ball on the ground three times, although UCLA was able to recover two of those fumbles. Last season the Aztecs ranked 85th nationally forcing 19 turnovers. After one week, SDSU ranks 12th nationally.
- ▶ San Diego State's national rankings in the 14 defensive statistics the NCAA keeps for both this season and last season are listed to the right. UCLA did not attempt a fourth down conversion meaning SDSU is not ranked in that statistic. Of the other 13 categories, SDSU is ranked higher in 12 categories with passing defense (which is based on passing yards allowed) being the only one category with a worse ranking (falling from 68 to 70). It is worth noting that passing efficiency defense, a better gauge of overall performance against the pass, improved from 112 to 67 after game one. SDSU did not rank among the top 50 programs in any of the 14 categories last season. Right now, SDSU is ranked in the top 20 of four categories and is 30 or better in six categories.

OFFENSE HAS BRIGHT SPOTS

San Diego State's offense had its bright spots in the opening game as well. The Aztecs scored touchdowns on its first two possessions and despite struggling with the ground game, San Diego State still compiled nearly 300 yards of total offense (277 to be exact) against one of the better defensive units on the west coast.

- ▶ In 63 offensive snaps Saturday, San Diego State did not put the ball on the ground once. Last season, San Diego State had five fumbles in its final three games and had 17 fumbles (14 lost) for the season.
- ▶ In 45 pass attempts, the San Diego State offensive line did not yield a sack. Although the Aztecs allowed 21 sacks last season, the San Diego State offensive line has now gone four consecutive games without allowing a sack. The Aztecs have attempted 188 passes since they last suffered a sack, at Wyoming on Nov. 1, 2008.
- ▶ San Diego State scored on its first offensive possession of the game for the first time in more than a year. The previous time the Aztecs scored seven points on their first series of the game was at UNLV on Nov. 10, 2007. San Diego State had gone 15 consecutive games without scoring a touchdown on its opening drive. It is just the second time in the last 20 games that SDSU has accomplished the trick.
- ▶ Without question no one was happy about the offensive production on the ground of 39 yards on 18 carries. But it is worth noting that the 39 rushing yards is more than the Aztecs had on four occasions in 2008. The average rush of 2.17 yards is higher than the Aztecs' average in five of 12 games a year ago.
- ▶ Again rushing overall was not what the Aztecs wanted, but six of the 18 rushes on Saturday went for five or more yards.

SPECIAL TEAM MOMENTS

They certainly were not the highlight for San Diego State on Saturday, but nonetheless, the special teams had several bright moments.

- ▶ True freshman Leon McFaden recorded a block on a UCLA extra point attempt. The one block matches San Diego State's entire team total from last season and he joins Andrew Preston as the only active Aztecs to record a block.
- ▶ The San Diego State defense limited UCLA's punt return team to 25 yards on eight Aztec punts. Junior gunner Dey Juam Hemmings recorded a pair of special teams tackles.
- ▶ Aztec sophomore punter Brian Stahovich enjoyed a nice opening day, averaging 44.8 yards on eight punts. He had a net average of 39.1, which could have been better as the Aztec coverage looked to be set to down a punt inside the one-yard line before it squirting into the endzone.

VINCENT BROWN REACHES MILESTONES

Junior wide receiver Vincent Brown reached a pair of milestones on Saturday. A native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Brown was the leading receiver in Saturday's game at UCLA, hauling in five catches for 139 yards and a touchdown.

With that performance, Brown became the 24th Aztecs receiver to post 100 career receptions. He also passed the 1,000 career receiving yards. His career numbers now stand at 100 receptions for 1,119 yards in 25 games.

- ▶ Saturday marked the third 100-yard receiving performance for Brown, who now ranks 28th in school history in the category. J.R. Tolver is the school's leader in the category with 13 100-yard receiving days.
- ▶ Coupled with his 119-yard performance in the season finale last year, Brown now has two straight 100-yard receiving games. Only 17 times in school history has an Aztec player posted at least three consecutive 100-yard receiving games. The last Aztec to accomplish it was Chaz Schilens in 2007.

NEW GUY IN TOWN

San Diego State named Brady Hoke the school's 17th head coach on Dec. 16, 2008. He will look to get his home tenure off on a successful start on Saturday at Qualcomm. San Diego State head coaches have accumulated a 10-4-2 record in their first game at the helm.

LINDLEY ON MANNING WATCH LIST

San Diego State sophomore Ryan Lindley was named to the preseason watch list for the Manning Award on Aug. 17, presented by the Allstate Sugar Bowl to the nation's top collegiate quarterback. Lindley, who set the school and Mountain West Conference records last season for passing yards by a freshman, is one of 38 quarterbacks on the list and one of just six sophomores.

A native of Alpine, Calif., he earned team offensive most valuable player honors last season as a redshirt freshman. Lindley started 10 games, completing 242-of-427 passes for a 56.7 completion percentage with 16 touchdowns and 2,653 yards. He ended the season ranked 24th nationally in passing average, including second among freshmen, and 42nd in total offense (fourth among freshmen). He also had the seventh-best passing efficiency among all freshmen at 117.01. He also became just the second freshman in school history to start a season-opening game for the Aztecs, joining two-time All-American and the school's all-time career passing leader, Todd Santos.

Lindley is one of three MWC quarterbacks on the Manning Award Watch List along with TCU senior Andy Dalton and Brigham Young senior Max Hall. He is the first-ever Aztec named to the Manning Award Watch List.

The Manning Award was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. Ten finalists will be determined by a selected panel of national media covering college football, as well as each of the Mannings. That list will be released on Monday, Nov. 30. The winner will be announced on Thursday, Jan. 14.

IOSEFA UP FOR RIMINGTON TROPHY

San Diego State junior Trask Iosefa was one of just 43 players named to the 2009 Fall Watch List for the Rimington Trophy, which is given out annually to the nation's top collegiate center. Iosefa was also tabbed to the award's spring watch list that was announced this past May by the Boomer Esiason Foundation.

A two-year starter, Iosefa has played and started in each of the last 24 games over the past two seasons. He is SDSU's most experienced offensive lineman entering the 2009 campaign, with his 24 starts ranking first among all Aztec offensive players and tying for the most on the team.

Iosefa came to San Diego State in the spring of 2006, before redshirting later that season. He was a first-team all-state selection and all-region pick by PrepStar Magazine while playing at Punahou High School.

The junior is one of three centers from the Mountain West Conference tabbed for this year's Fall Watch List and is the first Aztec since Jasper Harvey (2004-05) to be nominated for the award.

The Rimington Trophy committee bases the award on the four All-America teams chosen by the American Football Coaches Association, Walter Camp Foundation, the Sporting News and

SENIOR DUO TABBED 2009 CAPTAINS

San Diego State first-year head coach Brady Hoke announced the football team captains for the upcoming 2009 season. Senior tight end Tony DeMartinis and senior linebacker Jerry Milling were selected in a vote by their teammates at the conclusion of fall camp.

Milling enters his senior campaign as an impact player on defense. The Palmdale, Calif., native has appeared in 18 games for SDSU, starting two, but has been limited by injury the last two seasons. Milling recorded 28 tackles, one fumble recovery and a pass breakup in just four games last year. The linebacker has tallied double-digit stops in each of his career starts with 11 against Notre Dame and 10 at San Jose State. Milling has also made strides in the classroom, receiving a President's Award for Most Improved Scholastic Achievement in 2008.

DeMartinis has been a jack-of-all-trades for the Aztecs, playing both offense and defense during his time on campus. The Sun Valley, Calif., native has played in 23 games for SDSU, mainly on the defensive side of the ball. DeMartinis recorded four tackles in his redshirt freshman season and 10 tackles his sophomore campaign. In 2008, DeMartinis was the starter at defensive end in the team's opener with Cal Poly, recording his first career sack before his season was cut short due to a knee injury.

During 2009 spring camp, DeMartinis practiced exclusively at the tight end position. He is currently pursuing his master's degree in homeland security after obtaining his bachelor's degree in business this past spring.

BROWN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MWC

The San Diego State football team was picked to finish eighth in the Mountain West Conference preseason poll of MWC media members and junior wide receiver Vincent Brown became the first Aztec offensive player selected to the all-conference preseason team since 2005, the league announced at its annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev., on July 21.

The Aztecs, who return 17 starters and 46 letterwinners from last season, received 53 points. TCU (207 points) was selected to win the conference title, followed by Brigham Young (190) and defending conference champion Utah (179). All three teams received first-place votes. Air Force (130) was tabbed for fourth place, followed by UNLV (108), Colorado State (107), New Mexico (60), San Diego State and Wyoming (46).

The Aztecs hope that eighth place will continue to be good trend. Last season, Colorado State was selected to finish eighth in the preseason poll, but went on to finish 7-6 and posted a victory in the New Mexico Bowl. That marked the second time in the last five seasons that the preseason poll's eighth-place team posted a winning season and advanced to a bowl game. In 2004, Wyoming went 7-5 and won the Las Vegas Bowl after being plucked for eighth.

Brown was one of 12 players selected to the preseason all-conference offensive team. A native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Brown has played in all 24 games and started 18 consecutive contests since arriving on campus. Last season, Brown led the team with 64 catches for 631 yards receiving. He is 20 yards short of 1,000 yards for his career and needs just five catches to become the 24th player in school history with 100 catches.

Brown becomes the first Aztec offensive player named to the preseason all-conference team since Lynell Hamilton earned the distinction prior to the 2005 campaign. Last year, linebacker Russell Allen earned preseason all-conference accolades en route to posting a 107-tackle season.

THE AZTEC WEIGHT LOSS PLAN

One of the early goals by the new coaching staff was to change the body composition of the team. One of Brady Hoke's early hires was Aaron Wellman as the football strength and conditioning coach. Wellman, who has 14 years of experience at the Division I level, and worked in the same capacity with Hoke at Ball State from 2004-08, quickly went to work and the results were nothing short of amazing.

Of the 14 offensive linemen that were weighed on Feb. 2, the first weight in under the new staff and July 27, lost a combined 294 pounds or an average of 21 pounds per player. Five players - Nike Embernate, Alec Johnson, Erik Quinones, Tom Rische and Emilio Rivera - lost 29 or more pounds in the process.

GAME 1

at UCLA

Sept. 5 • The Rose Bowl (55,761)

SAN DIEGO – San Diego State scored on its first two possessions, but was unable to find the end zone the rest of the way, as the Aztecs dropped a 33-14 decision to host UCLA at the Rose Bowl in Brady Hoke's first game as head coach.

SDSU got on the board quickly, putting together an impressive 14-play, 69-yard drive that ended with a four-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Lindley to full back/tight end Matthew Kawulok to put the visitors ahead 7-0.

After UCLA responded with a 49-yard Kai Forbath field goal, the Aztecs once again found the end zone as Lindley unloaded a career-long 78-yard touchdown strike to Vincent Brown on a third-down play from his own 22-yard line.

San Diego State did not have much time to celebrate, as Bruin Terrence Austin returned the ensuing kickoff 47 yards to the Aztec 12-yard line. UCLA scored on the very next play to cut its deficit to 14-10.

Following a punt by both sides, the Aztecs tried a flea-flicker on their first offensive play of the second quarter, but Lindley's throw was intercepted by Rahim Moore at the UCLA 43-yard line and returned all the way to the SDSU 35.

The Aztecs defense held strong, however, as defensive end B.J. Williams recovered a Kevin Prince fumble at the SDSU 11-yard line.

The Bruins would once again take advantage of good field position, finally taking the lead at 16-14 on a 29-yard touchdown run by Derrick Coleman with 5:33 remaining until halftime. UCLA tacked on another TD before heading into the locker room up, 23-14.

After the break, the Aztec offense struggled to find its rhythm, as the team was forced to punt on its first three drives of the second half.

Now trailing 26-14 following another UCLA field goal, SDSU looked to be in good shape for a breakthrough, as senior linebacker Luke Laolagi intercepted a Prince pass and returned it to the Bruin 23-yard line.

After a 5-yard gain on first down and two consecutive incompletions, Hoke sent on the field-goal unit for a 35-yard try, but the kick was blocked and Alterraun Verner scooped up the ball and went 70 yards for the TD and the 33-14 advantage.

Neither team was stellar in the final quarter, combining for three interceptions, as UCLA won its 21st game in the two schools' 22 all-time meetings.

Aztec wideout Vincent Brown caught five passes for 139 yards and a touchdown to become the 24th player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard mark in career receiving yards. Lindley completed 18 of his 45 pass attempts for 238 yards and two TDs, but also threw three interceptions, including on each of the team's final possessions of the game.

Defensively, the Aztecs broke in their new 3-3-5 scheme by holding the Bruins to 359 yards of total offense with five UCLA drives starting in SDSU territory.

Prince completed 18 of his 29 passes for 176 yards and a TD, while wideout Taylor Embree had six catches for 97 yards to lead the Bruins.
