A staple on the Aztec receiving corps, who played in 44 career contests, starting 26 times ... Big-play receiver with six of his 15 receptions in 2005 going for more than 20 yards ... Caught at least one pass in each of his final 26 games and had four or more in 18 of his final 24 outings ... Also called upon to return punts in 2007 ... Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark at ASU and had 1,893 in his career.

2007: Started all 12 contests ... Second-team all-Mountain West Conference ... Phil Steele's 2007 All-Mountain West Conference first team ... First team all-MWC by CollegeFootballNews.com ...
