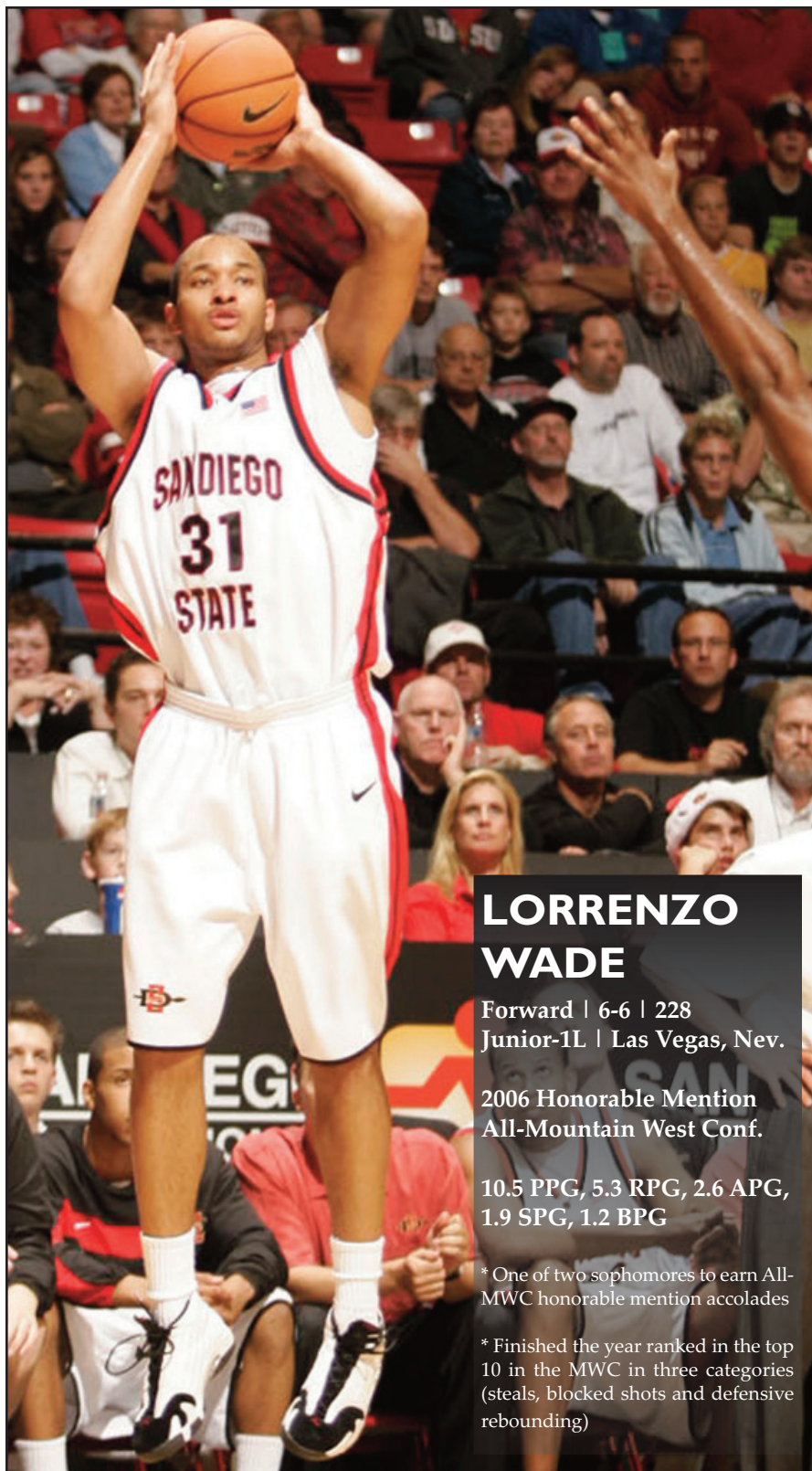

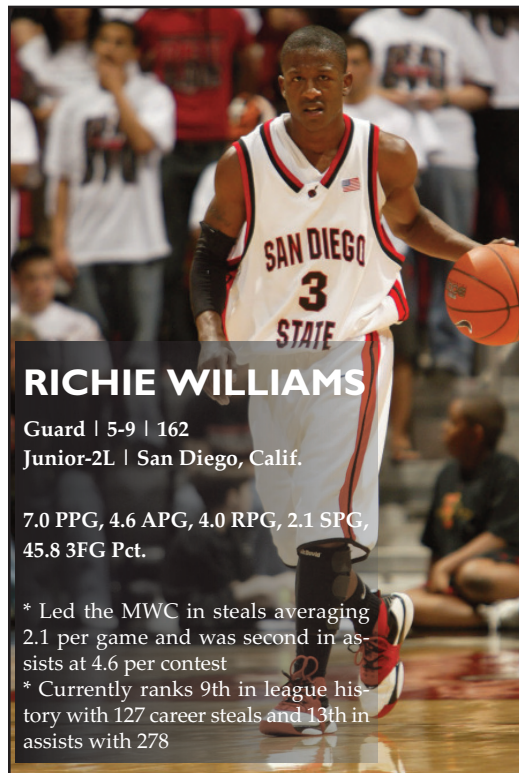

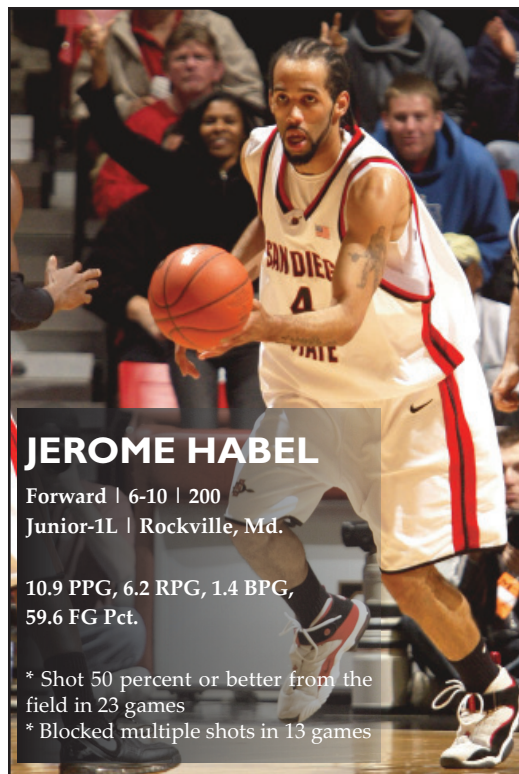

2007-08 Preseason Notes

San Diego State returns three starters, seven players who started at least one game a year ago, five players who have started at least 18 games in their career.

The Aztecs return seven of their top nine scorers off last season's team.

Return players that accounted for 62 percent of all starts in 2006-07.

Returning players have started 185 career games.

All 10 players on the roster with previous Division I experience have played on teams that have won at least 20 games and advanced to postseason play.

Steve Fisher has coached a team that returned at least three starters off a team he coached 11 times in his career. Those 11 squads have gone to postseason play 10 times, including seven trips to the NCAA Tournament, and have averaged 21.7 wins.

2007-08 SAN DIEGO STATE MEN'S BASKETBALL SUMMER PROSPECTUS

San Diego State Men's Basketball Looks to Build Off Recent Success With Three Starters Returning in 2007-08

Coming off consecutive postseason appearances and invitations to postseason play four out of the last six years, the San Diego State men's basketball team looks to continue its recent success in 2007-08 behind the strength of its three returning starters and under the direction of ninth-year head coach Steve Fisher.

The Aztecs have won more than 22 games in each of the last two seasons and again return a pair of all-conference performers in Lorenzo Wade and Jerome Habel. Couple that with the fact that Fisher has guided his teams to the postseason 10 of the last 11 seasons in which he has returned at least three starters from the year before and welcomes back seven of his top nine scorers from last season, the outlook for the '07-08 team is bright.

Below are some reasons for optimism heading into the fall:

► **Lorenzo Wade:** Entered the MWC as one of the league's top newcomers and immediately made his presence known... Earned honorable mention all-league honors with Habel after he ranked in the top 10 in steals (4th), blocked shots (9th) and defensive rebounds (10th)... Not only was Wade a top-notch defender, he also made things happen on the offensive side as evidenced by his No. 14 ranking in assists (2.58) as a small forward.

► **Richie Williams:** Williams returns as one of the Aztecs' three starters... He was one of three players to see action in all 33 games for the Aztecs a year ago and he led the Mountain West Conference in steals and was second in assists... He has started 64 games for San Diego State entering his junior campaign... He connected on 45.8 percent of his three-point field goal attempts last season.

► **Jerome Habel:** Habel returns to Montezuma Mesa after having been named an honorable mention all-Mountain West Conference pick in his first year in the league... He ended the year ranked third in conference in field goal percentage (.596), sixth in rebounding (6.2) and blocked shots (1.41), 10th in offensive rebounds (2.28) and 11th in defensive rebounds (3.97)... Habel enters his final season as the team's returning leader in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots.

► **Ryan Amoroso:** After sitting out the 2006-07 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules, the former Marquette Golden Eagle will be eligible for the upcoming year. Amoroso joins the Aztecs having played on a pair of Marquette teams that advanced to postseason play the two year's the Burnsville, Minn., native attended the Wisconsin school. For his career, the junior has played in 57 games and recorded nine double-figure scoring games and collected more than 10 rebounds three times. His best game of his career came against South Carolina where he put up 30 points and 12 rebounds during the 2005-06 season.

What's Back

San Diego State head coach Steve Fisher welcomes back three starters off a team that finished with a 22-11 overall record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Headlining the group is the Aztecs' pair of all-MWC honorable mention selections in Lorenzo Wade and Jerome Habel and returning two-year starter Richie Williams. Besides the returning starting trio, SDSU brings back junior Kyle Spain and adds Marquette transfer Ryan Amoroso to the mix. In all, the Aztecs return seven of their top nine scorers, four of their five leading rebounders and two of their top three assist men from the 2006-07 squad.

The backcourt was left with a huge void with Brandon Heath graduated last year, but Williams enters his third season having started 64 games and is the team's and conference's leading returner in assists and steals. The junior from San Diego also finished the year ranked sixth in assist-to-turnover ratio and will come into '07-08 as the MWC's second-best player in the category.

Joining Williams in the backcourt is the experienced Matt Thomas. Thomas, when healthy, is a solid point guard who can give opposing teams fits with his size, strength and speed. The Riverside, Calif., native has played in 59 career games, but only saw action in two games last year due to a lingering back problem.

The frontline is an area where the Aztecs produce the most experience, especially with Wade, Habel and Spain as the cornerstones. Wade returns to his spot in the lineup where he played in all 33 games, making 24 starts, and averaged 10.5 points and 5.3 rebounds in his first year as an Aztec. The junior's size and length was a major factor in San Diego State's success last year and the team will be looking forward to him returning as the player that finished the season ranked 4th in steals, 9th in blocked shots, 10th in defensive rebounds and 14th in assists.

Habel enters his senior campaign as the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder at 10.9 and 6.2, respectively. The Rockville, Md., native is also coming off a season where he shot a team-leading 59.6 percent from the field and blocked a team-best 41 shots.

The third of the triumvirate is Spain who has played in 59 career games to along with 43 starts. The junior is a high-energy player who can knock down the outside shot as well as mix it up inside. Spain will be a good compliment to a frontline corps that uses its size and quickness to outplay its opposition.

Besides the aforementioned trio, the Aztecs have a well-seasoned group waiting in the wings in Chris Lamb, Jer'Vaughn Johnson and Jon Pastorek. The three combined to play a total of 75 games last year with Johnson seeing action in 31 of them. Johnson, a sophomore, provides a big, physical body in the low post and is not afraid to mix it up with anyone, while classmate Pastorek gives defenses a different look with his savvy perimeter play. Lamb, the most proven of the three, has put on extra muscle over the past year and is a reliable player who can play in a starting or reserve role.

Perhaps the most intriguing player in the frontcourt is Amoroso, who enters his first year on Montezuma Mesa having played two seasons at ultra-successful Marquette. As a Golden Eagle, the forward from Burnsville, Minn., played on a team that advanced to the NIT and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, while averaging 5.8 points and 3.8 rebounds for his career. His two-year averages are not eye-popping, but there were a handful of ball-games where he put up double figures in points and rebounds, including his 30-point, 12-rebound performance vs. South Carolina when he was a sophomore. Expect him to compete for one of the three starting frontcourt jobs once practice begins in October.

Almost Perfect

On 11 occasions Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a team he coached the year before and on 10 of those occasions, he has led that squad to the postseason (seven NCAA Tournaments and three postseason NITs). Specifically, when Fisher welcomes back three starters off a squad he coached the previous season, he has guided his teams to one NCAA Tournament and one NIT appearance. The only year Fisher did take a team with three or more starters returning was during the 2004-05 season when they brought back three regulars and finished the year at 11-18 overall. It should be noted that two of the three starters that season were sophomores (Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter).

Seasoned Veterans

Despite losing seasoned veterans Brandon Heath and Mohamed Abukar to graduation, San Diego State is set to return a group that is more experienced this year than the one a year ago. The 2007-08 edition of the Aztecs have played a combined 443 career Division I college basketball games and made 185 starts. This year's totals trump the figures going into 2006-07 when that group played a combined 325 games and made 182 starts.

Not So NEWcomers

Even though they are classified as "newcomers," Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis are anything but that. The pair make up for 40 percent of the team's newcomers, but it is their experience prior to arriving on Montezuma Mesa that would dispute their classification.

Amoroso played in 57 games, while making eight starts in his two-year stint at Marquette. During his time there, the Golden Eagles went 39-23 and advanced to the 2005 National Invitation Tournament and the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Davis, meanwhile, played in 24 games his freshman season at UTEP and was a part of a Miner team that 27-8 and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. And although he redshirted the following season, Davis was a part of a UTEP squad that ended the season at 21-10 and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

When compared to last year's five newcomers, only Lorenzo Wade had prior Division I college experience. Wade saw action in 35 games at Louisville as a freshman and helped lead the Cardinals to a 33-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Final Four.

Experience Counts

With only two seniors on the roster some may think the Aztecs are young. Although there is some truth to that, the players San Diego State has returning are definitely battle tested. The eight returners, along with the additions of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis, have all been a part of winning teams that have won at least 20 games and squads that have advanced to postseason play. Of the 10 to advance to the postseason, eight have been to an NCAA Tournament and nine have been on teams to win at least one game in the postseason. Last year, SDSU only had eight players who had tasted the post-season and were part of 20-win ballclubs. Of the eight, only Lorenzo Wade experienced winning a postseason game.

Playing With a Full Deck

San Diego State advanced to their second straight postseason tournament last year despite playing with only 11 full scholarships, two below the maximum. It can be argued that the Aztecs were really only playing with 10 scholarship players since Matt Thomas missed all but two games in 2006-07 with a back injury. This season all of that will change as SDSU heads into fall with a roster that includes the maximum 13 scholarship players.

San Diego State

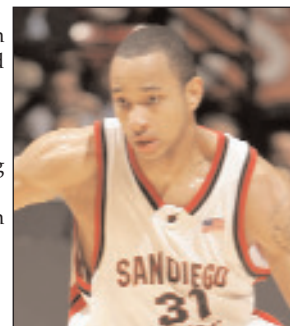
- ▶ San Diego State returns three starters and eight letterwinners off a squad which...
 - Went 22-11, earned their second consecutive postseason tournament and advanced to the second round of the NIT.
 - Won a postseason tournament contest for the second time in the school's Division I history and the second time in five seasons.
 - Won 22+ games for the second straight season, reaching the 20-win plateau for the third time during Steve Fisher's tenure and the fifth time in SDSU's DI history.
 - Won 10 Mountain West Conference games marking just the second time an SDSU squad has posted double-figure wins in MWC play.
 - Beat Missouri State (No. 36), in addition to Air Force (No. 30), UNLV (No. 10) and Brigham Young (No. 18), representing four of the top seven wins in school history based on final RPI rankings since 1993-94.
 - Posted the third-most victories (22) in the school's Division I history.
- ▶ San Diego State returns Lorenzo Wade and Jerome Habel, both who earned all-MWC honorable mention accolades.
- ▶ The Aztecs also return point guard Richie Williams, the league's top returning player in assists and steals and the MWC's second-leader returner in assist-to-turnover ratio. He is also a two-year starter at the position for the Aztecs.
- ▶ San Diego State returns three starters off last season's squad. Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a team he has coached 11 times, advancing to the NCAA tournament on seven occasions and earning a berth in the NIT three times. Those 11 teams have also posted an average of 21.7 victories.
- ▶ San Diego State returns seven players from last year's team that has started a Division I basketball game over the course of their career. Overall, SDSU will have nine players on this season's squad with DI starting experience with the addition of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis.
- ▶ The Aztecs will have 443 career Division I college basketball games and 185 starts to their credit when the season tips off. Last year's group when into 2006-07 with only 325 games (182 starts) of experience.
- ▶ San Diego State welcomes five new players to this season's team, including Ryan Amoroso, a 6-8 forward. Amoroso, who will be a junior this season, played in 57 games in two seasons at Marquette, where it advanced to the postseason twice. He logged 10 or more minutes 47 times and scored a career-best 30 points and grabbed a career-high tying 12 rebounds vs. South Carolina in 2005-06.

Lorenzo Wade

Junior, Forward, 6-6, 228, Las Vegas, Nev. (Hargrave (Va.) Military Academy)

- ▶ 10.5 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 2.6 apg, 1.9 spg, 1.2 bpg, 47.2 FG Pct., 70.7 FT Pct., 31.4 mpg
- ▶ Named all-Mountain West Conference honorable mention in 2006-07.
- ▶ Ranked fourth in the MWC in steals, ninth in blocked shots, 10 in defensive rebounds, 13th in minutes played and 14th in assists. ... Led the league in steals in conference games only and fifth in defensive rebounds, seventh in rebounding and blocked shots, tied for ninth in assists and 15th in offensive rebounds.
- ▶ Returns as the Aztecs returning leader in points scored and second in scoring average and rebounding.
- ▶ Posted his first two double-doubles of his career in league play (vs. New Mexico and at UNLV).
- ▶ Started the final 20 games of the season and 24 overall. San Diego State posted a record of 16-8 with him in the starting lineup.
- ▶ Had the third-most efficiency points on the team (453), but the most in MWC play (226). Also ranked second on the team in hockey +/- rating at +132.
- ▶ Shot 53.9 percent from two-point range last year.
- ▶ Scored in double figures 19 times in 2006-07 and was one of three players to see action in all 33 games.



Richie Williams

Junior, Guard, 5-9, 162, San Diego, Calif. (Steele Canyon High)

- ▶ 7.0 ppg, 4.0 rpg, 4.6 apg, 2.1 spg, 44.2 FG Pct., 45.8 3FG Pct., 74.6 FT Pct., 34.0 mpg
- ▶ Returns as the team's and conference's leader in assists, steals and assist-to-turnover ratio.
- ▶ Ranked first in the MWC in steals, second in assists and sixth in assist-to-turnover ratio and minutes played. ... In conference games only, he ranked second in steals and assist-to-turnover ratio and fifth in assists.
- ▶ Played in all 33 games, making 32 starts, in his second year as San Diego State's point guard.
- ▶ Averaged 34.0 minutes, the second-most on the team behind Brandon Heath last season.
- ▶ The team finished the 2006-07 season with a 15-3 record when he dished out at least five assists in a game.
- ▶ Averaged a career-best 4.0 rebounds as a sophomore after averaging only 2.6 as a freshman.

Jerome Habel

Senior, Forward, 6-10, 200, Rockville, Md. (Walt Whitman (Md. High/San Bernardino Valley (Calif.) College)

- ▶ 10.5 ppg, 6.2 rpg, 1.4 bpg, 0.8 apg, 59.6 FG Pct., 29.4 mpg
- ▶ Earned honorable mention all-Mountain West Conference honors.
- ▶ Returns as the team leader in scoring average, rebounding, field goal percentage and blocked shots.
- ▶ Finished the season ranked third in the MWC in field goal percentage, sixth in rebounding and blocked shots, 10th in offensive rebounds and 11th in defensive rebounds. ... In conference games only, Habel ranked fourth in field goal percentage, tied for seventh in blocked shots, 13th in rebounding and offensive rebounds, tied for 14th in defensive rebounds and 20th in scoring.
- ▶ Reached double figures in 16 of the 29 games he played in and had 10 or more rebounds on four different occasions.
- ▶ Recorded his first two double-doubles of his Aztec career in games played at New Mexico and at Missouri State, both Aztec wins.
- ▶ In conference games only, he ranked No. 3 in free throw percentage (.857), No. 4 in field goal percentage (.537), No. 9 in scoring (15.2), No. 12 in offensive rebounding (1.81), t-No. 16 in blocked shots (0.50) and No. 17 in rebounding (4.6).
- ▶ Shot at least 50 percent from the field in 23 games in 2006-07.
- ▶ Blocked multiple shots 13 times, including a career-best four at New Mexico.

Kyle Spain

Junior, Forward, 6-5, 229, Newark, Calif. (Newark Memorial High)

- ▶ 6.6 ppg, 4.6 rpg, 0.9 apg, 1.1 spg, 39.8 FG Pct., 72.3 FT Pct., 23.7 mpg.
- ▶ Is tied with Matt Thomas for most career games played (59), but is second to only Richie Williams in career starts with 43.
- ▶ Coming off a down year, but still played in 31 games, making 18 starts, and had similar numbers when compared to his freshman season in three-point field goals, free throws, assists, steals and blocked shots. His totals in three-point field goals and blocked shots were actually higher this past season than in his freshman campaign.
- ▶ The Aztecs were 5-0 last year and 16-2 in his career when he scores at least 10 points in a game.
- ▶ Finished the season ranked 15th in the MWC in offensive rebounds, but improved in conference games only by finishing in 12th place by season's end.
- ▶ Helped SDSU to a 14-2 record at home by shooting 48.3 percent from the field and 80.5 percent from the charity stripe en route to averaging 9.1 points and 4.9 rebounds.



Ryan Amoroso

*** MWC Newcomer of the Year Candidate ***

Junior, Forward, 6-8, 272, Burnsville, Minn. (Burnsville High/Marquette Univ.)

- ▶ Spent all of last season practicing with San Diego State and could make the same type of impact that Louisville transfer Lorenzo Wade made last season.
- ▶ Played in 31 games his freshman season on a team that went 19-12 and advanced to the postseason NIT. That year, he averaged 6.0 points and 3.6 rebounds in 15.2 minutes. As a sophomore, he played in 26 games and helped his team to a 20-11 record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That season he averaged 5.6 points and 4.0 rebounds in 15.0 minutes.
- ▶ He has career numbers of 5.8 points and 3.8 rebounds in 57 career games, while receiving the starting nod eight times.
- ▶ Has the ability to be one of the top players in the country as evidenced by his 30-point, 12-rebound performance vs. South Carolina in 2005-06. ... Also had 16 points and 12 boards his freshman season at Memphis.
- ▶ Possesses the ability to play in the low post, but has the range to shoot the three-pointer.



STEVE FISHER Q&A

On last year's success:

What we have done is raised expectations. Not only for ourselves but for everybody that is involved, supports, or follows our program. Our goal was to win the league. A lofty goal that we were not able to accomplish. But 22 wins, with back to back 20-plus win seasons is significant, and going to the NIT, with our second post-season victory in our history. When we won at Missouri State, being one of just a couple of teams to win on the road in the NIT, was significant. So we feel good about what we did but we have goals that are still out there that we want to reach for.

On the state of the program:

What our goal has been is to develop a program. A program is one that does have expectations every year to get to postseason play, to win a conference championship, and to win a conference tournament championship. I think we have arrived at that level where now we have a program where we feel we are capable and the perception is that we are capable of accomplishing those goals. That wasn't the case five years ago. The first time we made the NCAA Tournament (2002), people were saying that we made it a little too early, and maybe we got a little bit lucky, even though we were the best team in the league the last seven or eight games and deserved it. Of course you need to make sure you sustain it, and now I think we have proven that we can sustain a program.

On life without Brandon Heath and Mohamed Abukar:

What we have going into this season is what makes you a little bit nervous. The uncertainty of who is going to immerge or step up and assume the leadership role and the scoring roles. You knew you could write down 35-40 pts between Brandon and Mohammed every game. Now, who are going to be the people that will step up? Will it be a couple? Will it now be by committee or a team? The nice thing is that I am confident that we have the capacity and capability, with the guys we have returning and with the newcomers, to have people to do that. I am little nervous, but I am very excited to see who is going to rise up. The first people to come to mind would first be Lorenzo Wade. He would be the first guy. I am anxious to see what Richie Williams will do in terms of being a little bit more of a scorer. Those are the first two to come to mind. So it will be interesting to see. The nice thing is, as I said before, I know we have got people who can do it.

On Lorenzo Wade:

Lorenzo got so much hype going into his sophomore season that it would have been impossible for him to measure up to what he had been built up to be. He's a terrific athlete and he's becoming a better basketball player every day. I have said it before and I will say it again that he is our best athlete. He's got size, strength and intelligence to be a premier player in this league. That will be his expectation. He's been here once now, and where maybe a year ago he deferred a little bit to Brandon (Heath) and to Mohamed (Abukar), now others might be deferring to him. He will have the opportunity to take a huge step forward with his game and his importance to our ball club this year. So I am very excited about what Lorenzo will bring to this team.

On Richie Williams:

I will be more demanding and less forgiving of him this season. Richie is, at times, a high risk player, and he got increasingly better at his decision making. What I expect from him is a significantly greater performance, and fewer of the mistakes that occurred because of lack of experience. He has what is hard to teach; great speed and quickness. Now he's starting to manage how to change gears. He's no longer in fifth gear all the time and he's aware that he needs to do that. That is one thing I know he will do better at. Number two, he has worked very hard at making open jump shots from 15-20 feet. I think you will see marked improvement there. So Richie is going to be an absolute critical piece of what we do, and I think he and Lorenzo going in, just by the nature of personality and previous performance, will be looked upon to be key leaders of this team.

On Jerome Habel:

I think with Jerome, he found out that there is a huge difference between major college basketball and junior college basketball. He had a measure of inconsistency last year that I think was somewhat related to that. Strength is an issue, he needs to get stronger, as well as consistency. I think, given the fact that he has been in the program a year, both of those will be enhanced. It won't be his first trip to Laramie, and various places. So I think that will be very beneficial to him. He has the ability to do things that don't show up in the box score. He changes shots, alters shots, blocks shots that look like they will be easy baskets, and he does things in addition to 11-8, or whatever his numbers were, that win for him.

On Kyle Spain:

This is also a great opportunity for Kyle. In some measure he was a victim of being such a tough competitor, that he played when he was hurt. He had nagging injuries, not season ending or game benching, but injuries that affected performance. I think they wore on his confidence. Kyle needs to get back to that bravado where he walks out thinking he is the best player on the floor and not have it be a false bravado, or cockiness, but a confidence in who he is. He's a very strong, explosive player that needs to reconnect on his jump shot and continue to work in developing his game. He will be very important in the future.

On Ryan Amoroso:

Ryan is the wild card right now. We are going to need him. He gives us a big strong body that can bang with the big power players in our league and he has the athleticism, footwork, basketball skills, and ability to step out to be a hard card. So we are very hopeful that the year in transition when he sat out, will give him a leg up on a first year player in our program. Yet, I know, just like Lorenzo, it is never as easy as you the player or the general public think its going to be to have that consistency. I think you will see some splashes of greatness, but we need consistency from Ryan and he will have ample opportunity to solidify one of those power positions for us this year.

On Kelvin Davis:

Kelvin is a basketball player. He knows how to play. He will bring some diversity where he played at the Division I level prior to going to a premier junior college in CSI. He knows how to play and he is a scorer and he is someone that will come in and have great opportunity to be in the major playing rotation. That is what he will look for and what I will look for and expect out of him.

On the freshmen:

I like all three of them. Tim Shelton has strength and good basketball knowledge. He knows how to play. Maybe with our lack of inside players he will have an opportunity to play early in his career. He's capable, and he will be an undersize, inside player, and I think he is capable of being a hard guard. He can shoot it from the outside, he's a good passer, and he's a very tough competitor. I think he is going to have a chance to fight for significant playing time. D.J. Gay is a scoring point guard. He needs strength to compensate for his lack of size, and yet he does what everybody wants; he puts the ball in the basket. He can score the basketball. That will give him opportunities. So we are anxious to get him into the program. Until you get them here you never know for sure, but we are anxious to see what he can deliver. Billy White is extremely athletic. I would categorize him as an undersize inside player and a very big perimeter player. I am hoping that he has the versatility to do both depending on who we would play. So we really like our three freshman coming in and I think that in time all three of them will be major contributors. I would say that at least one will be a significant contributor as a freshman.

On how style of play may change this season:

It will change subtly. I think that even though we have been a dribble-drive team, I think we will probably do more attacking to the rim with our athletic guys on the wings and on the perimeter. If we are capable, one thing that I have never done a lot of but we will look at, is can we do a little more full court pressure or can we force the tempo with defensive pressure at the full court as opposed to the half court. So that's something I won't know until we really get into it; seeing if we are capable in competing and winning against the good teams in our league playing small.

On what needs to happen to have success this season:

I would say right now, we need to make sure we have a lineup on the floor that can rebound the ball and can defend interior. Going in, that's what I would say is my biggest concern. How will we do that and who will step up to do it? We have some pieces that we will be able to look at, but will they be able to do it. Like Chris Lamb, Jer'Vaughn Johnson and Jon Pastorek that bring some size and a measure of experience. We need to make sure we find the right combination that will give us the best chance to win our league. That will be what we are shooting for and experimenting with. I am the type of guy who likes to set up a lineup if we can get it, but with the team we have coming in, that might not be the case in non-conference play. We might be juggling the lineup to see who can do what and what combinations might go all the way up to conference play.

On the Mountain West Conference:

I think last year was the best year in the history of the league. Last year should have established some national credibility; with three teams ranked at one time during the season and with the teams that they beat. Air Force with good non-conference wins, UNLV getting in the NCAA Sweet 16 with a win over Wisconsin, and with Brigham Young having a great season all help advance the national perception of the league. I think it is all good, positive, healthy things that could be said about the Mountain West Conference. I think we are turning into a league that some of these schools think twice about whether or not they want to play us in non-conference league. I definitely know that they are thinking they don't want to play us in the NCAA Tournament. It's a very good basketball league and always has been and I think more people are saying that it is. Not only for what we have done in the past but for what we are doing right now.

On the coaching changes in the MWC:

It's hard. Change creates uncertainty. As a rule when you have one school turn over, or even two, I think the new guys are at a bit of a disadvantage because everybody else knows what one another does. That person is trying to figure out what everyone does. With five new coaches, we are all going to have to adjust. The new guys will come in, but there are five new guys. I think it levels it out a bit in terms of whether it is an advantage. I think it is going to put more of a premium on preseason scouting. To really find out, as opposed to saying, we have gone eight years against the same system and we know what they are going to do. Now they are going to have to figure out what we do and we are going to have to do the same thing with them. It will be different. It will be throwing away the old scouting reports. With eight years we have on some of these teams, you can either burn them or put them away in a file in case you play that coach some place else. Probably it will not be realized by the fans across the league. They will just see teams come in and see who is scoring, who is winning and who is losing. For coaches it will be a lot more time trying to find film from before they come to the schools they are at now in our league. Really getting every tape that they have and watching every tape that they have at non-conference games as you prepare to move into conference.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of practice in October that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002 and 2006 and the postseason NIT in 2003 and 2007. In addition, the Aztecs may have their deepest team in school history entering the 2007-08 campaign with three starters returning off a team that won 22 games and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

The future looks even brighter. The Aztecs return three starters to go along with another nationally-ranked recruiting class have SDSU fans looking forward to the 2007-08 campaign.

Assistant Head Coach
9th Season at SDSU
Minnesota '82

One of Steve Fisher's first moves as head coach at San Diego State was to hire Brian Dutcher as his top assistant. Dutcher, 47, was a regional scout for the Sacramento Kings before assuming the role of assistant head coach at SDSU.

Dutcher served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Steve Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native headed up UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship and a Big Ten tournament title (1998).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

His efforts at SDSU have quickly gained accolades as well. The first full-year recruiting effort by Steve Fisher, Brian Dutcher and Co., resulted in a class that was a consensus top-40 group. Their second effort resulted in a top-25 recruiting class without counting a pair of high-profile transfers. Five seasons ago, Dutcher helped the Aztecs attract SDSU's first McDonald's All-American. In 2004, Aztec freshmen Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter earned starting spots en route to earning all-league recognition and this season, once again, the Aztecs have a much talked about incoming class.

Dutcher is firmly entrenched as one of the nation's top recruiters after showing that his rapport is as strong with potential student-athletes on the West Coast as it was in the vaunted Big Ten Conference.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Minnesota head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.



Gregg Gottlieb
Assistant Coach
8th Season at SDSU
UCLA '95

Gregg Gottlieb begins his ninth season at San Diego State and his sixth as an assistant coach and the team's recruiting coordinator. Gottlieb is instrumental in player instruction, skill development and also assists in all areas of the program.

His numerous responsibilities include recruiting, on-court coaching and opponent scouting.

As recruiting coordinator, Gottlieb has played a major role in SDSU's nationally ranked recruiting classes each of the last four seasons. In addition to bringing in high-level recruits, he is also in charge of arranging unofficial, official and home visits.

Some of the players he has helped land at San Diego State straight out of high school include former all-MWC performer Marcus Slaughter, and current team members Brandon Heath, Kyle Spain and Richie Williams. Gottlieb has also landed high-profile transfers from other Division I programs such as all-MWC honoree Mohamed Abukar (Florida), Ryan Amoroso (Marquette) and Lorenzo Wade (Louisville).

Entering last year, Gottlieb was instrumental in the signing of Jerome Habel, one of the top junior college players in the nation. One publication rated Habel as the second-best junior college player in America.

When Gottlieb is not recruiting he is heavily involved with player development especially with the squad's younger players. One of his greatest accomplishments was the scoring increase of former Aztec Aerick Sanders. Gottlieb helped Sanders, who averaged 3.8 points his freshman season, average 16.1 by the end of his senior campaign.

Gottlieb became an assistant coach in the summer of 2002, when former assistant Jim Tomey left to take the head coaching reigns of San Diego State's women's program. Gottlieb had served as the program's director of operations since October of 1999.

Gottlieb was a standout performer at El Modena High School in Orange County and followed that up as a two-year letterman at Drake. After his playing career, he returned to California and earned his degree in history and picked up a minor in business at UCLA in 1995.

Gottlieb moved into the collegiate coaching ranks at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo. He was part of the staff that was responsible for one of college basketball's biggest turnarounds. The Mustangs' win total jumped from one in 1994-95 to 16 in 1995-96.

While at San Luis Obispo, Gottlieb completed work on his master's of business administration.

In July of 1997, Gottlieb became assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Cal State Sacramento. His first recruiting class in the Big Sky Conference ranked 43rd nationally.

After two years as an assistant coach at Cal State Sacramento, he joined the SDSU staff in 1999.

Gottlieb comes from a basketball family. His father, Bob, is a former college coach who worked under Hall of Famer Jack Hartman at Kansas State and under Eddie Sutton at Creighton. His father was also head coach at Jacksonville and Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

His brother, Doug, led the nation in assists while at Oklahoma State and currently is co-host of ESPN Radio's GameNight. His sister is the former marketing director for the Oakland Raiders.



Justin Hutson
Assistant Coach
2nd Season at SDSU
CS Bakersfield '94

Justin Hutson enters his second year at SDSU after serving as an assistant coach at Cal Poly the two previous seasons. The Mustangs went 10-19 in 2005-06, doubling their previous season's win total, and were tied with NCAA Tournament participant Pacific with 3:19 to play in the semifinal round of the Big West Conference tournament. He was responsible for recruiting the 2006 Big West Conference Freshman of the Year to San Luis Obispo and two of his Mustang recruits were named to the Big West all-freshman team.

"We are excited to add Justin to the San Diego State family," Fisher said at the time of his hiring. "He brings tremendous enthusiasm and passion for the game as well as the unique ability to communicate with student-athletes. He won a national championship as a player, had a very successful high school coaching career and recruited extremely well at Cal Poly the last two seasons. He has great contacts all over the West and is a wonderful addition to our staff."

Prior to arriving at Cal Poly, Hutson served as the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High where he led them to a CIF Central Section Championship and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California and his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. Before entering the high school ranks, he was an assistant coach at his alma mater, CS Bakersfield, for two seasons (1999-00).

"I am excited and very eager to work for a great coach and a great university," Hutson said. "I admire what Coach Fisher and his staff have been able to accomplish at San Diego State. I want to help this program continue to grow and I will work hard to accomplish that."

Last year, Hutson helped the Aztecs to a 22-11 record and a berth in the postseason National Invitation Tournament, where they advanced to the second round. On the recruiting side, he was instrumental in the signing of San Diego State's nationally-recognized incoming class, which includes Billy White, Tim Shelton, Kelvin Davis and D.J. Gay.

Hutson had a storied college career, winning two NCAA Division II championships at Cal State Bakersfield. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record during the 1994 season.

"The thing that really attracted me to this position was Coach Fisher and his experienced staff," Hutson said. "Everyone had good things to say about him and once you meet him you know why. He has a wealth of experience, has won a national championship and has done it the right way. The other thing that struck me is the commitment San Diego State has to winning. The resources this university has put into athletics, from personnel to facilities, is impressive."

A native of Bakersfield, Hutson earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1994 and teaching credential in 1995 from Cal State Bakersfield.

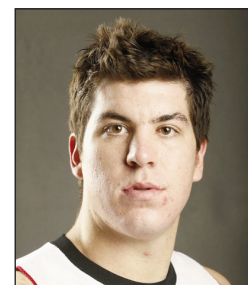

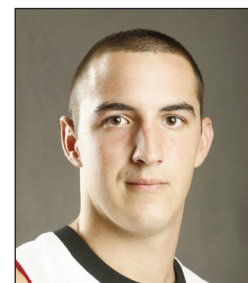

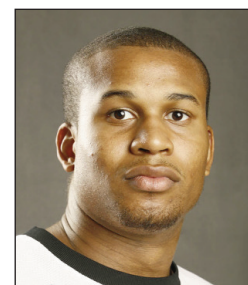
