The Aztecs (6-9-3), who finished conference play with a 2-4-1 record, earned the No. 6 seed and will square off against third-seeded TCU (13-3-2, 4-2-1 MWC) at noon. The other game will feature fourth-seeded New Mexico and fifth-seeded UNLV. Brigham Young and Utah earned the first and second seeds, respectively.

SERIES HISTORY VS. TCU

SCOUTING THE HORNED FROGS

TCU (13-3-2; 4-2-1 MWC) is coming off its 2-1 victory over San Diego State on Friday. The Frogs came away with the win, despite being outshot, 18-14, and outcornered, 12-4. Nikki Wilbur and Lizzy Karoly each scored for TCU, while Kelsey Walters made eight saves in 90 minutes.

The Horned Frogs lead the league in shots per game (21.44), goals per game (2.44), assists per game (2.28), fewest goals allowed per game (0.78), points per game (7.17) and goals against average (0.74).

Individually, Jordan Calhoun leads the MWC in points (30) and goals (14), while Karoly is third (26 and 10) in both categories. Walters ranks second in the conference with a 0.77 goals against average.

Dan Abdalla is in his fourth year at the helm of the Horned Frogs' women's soccer program. Abdalla, who is just the second head coach in the team's 19 years of existence, has posted a 33-33-6 record while at TCU.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State surrendered two second half goals in a 2-1 loss to TCU Friday afternoon. With the loss, the Aztecs finished the regular season at 6-9-3 and 2-4-1 in Mountain West Conference

Heather Vandevanter scored for SDSU off an assist from Cat Walker. Nikki Wilbur and Lizzy Karoly each scored for TCU.

SDSU went into the halftime intermission with a 9-8 advantage in shots, including a decisive 6-1 lead in shots on goal. San Diego State also owned a 6-2 corner kick advantage.

It was TCU, however, which took over the momentum in the second half with a pair of goals five minutes apart. The two chances were all the Horned Frogs would have, as the Aztecs controlled possession the rest of the way.

For the game, SDSU outshot the Horned Frogs, 18-14, including a 9-4 lead in shots on net. The Aztecs also had a season-high 12 corner kicks to TCU's four.

Vandevanter and Gordon each had five shots to pace the Aztec offense, while Walker chipped in with three attempts.

Christi Yount made two saves for San Diego State. On the other side, Kelsey Walters was counted on to make eight stops.

The game was the final home match for five Aztec seniors, including Tiphanie Elliott, Alicia Piz, Jillian Riker, Leann Sgobba and Yount.

SDSU AND THE MWC TOURNAMENT

San Diego State is 6-7-2 all-time in MWC tournament games. In the tournament, the Aztecs are 2-0 against Air Force, 2-0-1 versus New Mexico, 1-2 against UNLV, 1-3 versus Brigham Young and 0-2-1 against Utah. SDSU has never played TCU or Wyoming in the MWC tourney.

San Diego State arguably had its best run in 2005, when, as the No. 3 seed, it advanced to the MWC championship game before tying Utah, 0-0. However, the Utes advanced to the NCAA tournament after edging the Aztecs in penalty kicks. SDSU had beaten New Mexico and Air Force, both by 2-0 scores, to reach the final

San Diego State's last win in an MWC tournament game came in 2005, when it downed Brigham Young, 2-0, in Las Vegas before falling to host UNLV in a semifinal contest.

WALKER, YOUNT NAMED MWC POW

Sophomore midfielder Cat Walker and senior goalkeeper Christi Yount were named the Mountain West Conference women's soccer offensive and defensive players of the week, respectively, on Monday, Oct. 20.

Walker scored three goals and added an assist for seven points against Air Force and Wyoming. The Folsom, Calif., native became the first Aztec to record a hat trick since Kim Castellanos accomplished the feat in 2000.

Yount, meanwhile, anchored an Aztec defense that did not allow any goals over the weekend. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native notched her first two shutouts of the 2008 campaign in just her second and third starts of the year.

THE COACHES

After spending three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen enters his second season as the Aztecs' head coach. In 2007, Friesen led SDSU to a 4-2-1 Mountain West Conference record, marking its most league wins since the 2000 campaign.

Nat Gonzalez, who spent three seasons as the associate head coach at Southern California and was the head men's soccer coach at UC Riverside prior to his stint at USC, is in his second year on The Mesa. Gonzalez was a four-year goalkeeper at UCLA from 1988-91 and was a member of the Bruins' 1990 national championship squad.

Jayme Hardwick enters her first season as a member of the SDSU women's soccer coaching staff. Hardwick was a four-year letterwinner as a midfielder at Purdue from 2002-05.

2008 CAPTAINS

This season, the Aztec women's soccer team has a trio of captains in junior defender Millie Allen, senior forward Alicia Piz and sophomore midfielder Cat Walker.

Allen, a 2007 all-MWC second-team selection, appeared in every game last season. The Thornton, Colo., native scored her first career goal against Cal Poly (Sept. 14) and added the game-winner in the Aztecs' 1-0 upset over Arizona on Sept. 30. Allen has earned the starting nod in 58 career con-

Piz is coming off a solid 2007 campaign in which she started 16 of the Aztecs' 20 games and ranked third on the team with 21 shots. The SDSU scholar-athlete was also third on the squad with five points (1 goal, 3 assists).

Walker, meanwhile, was named a co-captain last year but suffered a season-ending injury in an exhibition game. As a freshman in 2006, the Folsom, Calif., native started 17 of the 19 contests she appeared in and tied for second on the team with three goals scored.

FIRSTS ALL AROUND

Sophomore Brooke Holliday, freshman Tiffany Hurst and junior Ali Lokanc all found the back of the net for the first time of the sesaon against Air Force, while Hurst, Lokanc and freshman Taylor Canatsey also added their first assists of the 2008 campaign.

Against Wyoming, senior Jillian Riker tallied her first goal of her three-plus year career and junior Millie Allen notched her first assist of the season as she set up Jessica Gordon on the game-winner.

WALKER BACK ON TRACK

After missing the entire 2007 season due to injury, Cat Walker has returned to her old ways, record-





Mike Friesen Head Coach Second Season/Fifth Overall at SDSU Sonoma State, 1996

After spending three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen enters his second season as the Aztecs' head coach.

Friesen, the fourth head coach in Aztec history, has played a significant role in bringing excitement back to San Diego State soccer. An offensive standout in his playing days at Point Loma Nazarene (1988-89) and Sonoma State (1993-94), Friesen has helped the Aztecs become one of the most potent offenses in the West Coast.

As an associate head coach at SDSU, the Aztecs netted 28 goals in 2005, the most for the program since 2002. In 2004, SDSU reached the Mountain West Conference championship game for the first time since 1999. The team's 3-1-2 conference record was also its best since that same 1999 season.

Friesen teamed with former Aztec head coach Dr. Mike Giuliano to bring an up-tempo-in-your-face style of defense, which was successful, as evident by the team's nine shutouts in 2004, second most in school history. The Aztecs allowed just 18 goals in 21 games that season, the program's fewest since the 1990 squad gave up 12 goals in 13 games.

Prior to coming to San Diego State, Friesen spent five years working with the UC Santa Barbara women's program.

Upon arriving in Santa Barbara, Friesen helped turn the Gaucho program around, going from a 7-29-2 mark and scoring just 27 goals the two seasons prior to his arrival, to a 24-11-6 mark in 2002-03, tallying 105 scores.

Friesen has a great deal of experience coaching at a variety of levels. Before his time at UCSB, he guided the under-19 Santa Rosa United Aftershocks to the 1999 girls' California State Cup championship. In 1997, he directed Ursuline High School in Santa Rosa, Calif., to the CIF North Coast Section championship game.

ing a team-leading nine goals and 21 points. She notched her first career hat trick in a 7-0 victory against Air Force on Oct. 17, while putting together a three-match scoring streak earlier in the year (Aug. 31-Sept. 7). Walker also ranks first on the squad in shots (40) and shots on goal (22).

GUARDING GORDON

Guarding junior forward Jessica Gordon has proved to be a tough task for opponents. After being limited to only five appearances in 2007 due to an injury, she has compiled a career-high five goals this season and notched her first multiple-scoring game with two tallies vs. Loyola (Sept. 7). Gordon is currently tied with Heather Vandevanter for second on the team with 12 points.

VANDEVANTER SHINES

Junior forward Heather Vandevanter has proven to be an offensive threat for the Aztecs as she leads the team with four assists, while ranking third on the squad in goals (4). The Alamo, Calif., native found her way into the scoring column in back-to-back games at CS Fullerton and vs. San Jose State and recorded an assist in both games at the Villanova Classic (Sept. 5-7). Her 12 points are tied with Jessica Gordon for second on the team.

MCQUEENY IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Freshman defender Megan McQueeny scored her first collegiate goal in a nationally televised game on The Mtn. vs. UNLV (Oct. 3). The Rohnert Park, Calif., native created her own shot at the top of the box and drilled a beauty into the upper left corner from 20 yards out.

AMMAN IN THE MIX

Freshman defender Gretel Amman has already been thrown into the mix in just her first year on The Mesa. The Santa Rosa, Calif., native has started every match this season and is tied for third on the team with two tallies and two assists. Her first collegiate score was the gametying goal vs. UC Riverside as the Aztecs went on to defeat the Highlanders, 3-1. Amman also found the back of the net vs. SJSU.

COUNT ONE FOR CANATSEY

Freshman forward Taylor Canatsey made her first collegiate goal one to remember. With the score knotted at one vs. Arizona State (Aug. 31), the Garden Grove, Calif., native headed in the game-winner on a corner kick play with 2:23 left in regulation. Canatsey also recorded her first assist in the Aztecs' 7-0 victory against Air Force.

RECORD WATCH

San Diego State returns its top goalkeeper from a year ago in sophomore Aubree Southwick. The Danville, Calif., native started 20 games in 2007, playing in all but 82 minutes during the season. Southwick wasted no time in etching her name in the SDSU record books, racking up a single-season leading 106 saves.

On the career charts, Southwick is second with 13 shutouts and ranks fifth among SDSU's all-time leaders with 159 career saves.

San Diego State was picked to finish in a tie for third place with Utah in the Mountain West Conference regular season standings. The Aztecs and Utes each received 36 points in the 2008 preseason coaches' poll, while Brigham Young was tabbed as the favorite with 49 points.

2007 POSTSEASON HONORS

Goalkeeper Aubree Southwick racked up the accolades last season, becoming the first player in Mountain West Conference history to earn two individual awards when she was tabbed the defensive player of the year and freshman of the year. The first-team all-MWC pick also garnered Soccer Buzz freshman All-America recognition.

Joining Southwick on the all-MWC first team was Jackie Ragudos, while Millie Allen and Jessica Girdner were both selected to the second team.
