ANDY KENNEDY

ALMA MATER: UAB '91

EXPERIENCE: 4TH SEASON at UAB

Andy Kennedy was named the seventh head coach of the UAB men's basketball program, Director of Athletics Mark Ingram announced on March 20, 2020.

Kennedy, who enters his fourth year with the program in 2023-24, returned to his alma mater where he is the second leading scorer in program history. A two-time SEC Coach of the Year and winningest coach in the University of Mississippi history, Kennedy coached at Ole Miss from 2006-2018, before spending two years as a commentator for ESPN and the SEC Network.

On July 21, 2023, Kennedy signed a six-year contract extension which goes through the 2028-29 season.

Kennedy, in his third season at the helm in Birmingham, led UAB to a program-record 29 wins marking the Blazers' third-straight season of 20+ wins. He is one of just five active head coaches with 20+ wins in 13 of their first 16 seasons, joining John Calipari, Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, and Thad Matta on the distinguished list.

During the 2022-23 season Kennedy led the Blazers to a 3-0 record against SEC competition with wins over Georgia, South Carolina and Vanderbilt. The Blazers reached the NIT Championship game for the first time in program history.

In his second season back in Birmingham, Kennedy led UAB to a then program-record 27 victories and the Blazers' 16th NCAA Tournament appearance, punching his alma mater's ticket to the Big Dance with an 82-73 victory over Louisiana Tech in the Conference USA Tournament Championship Game. UAB's 16th NCAA Tournament appearance also marked Kennedy's third NCAA Tournament appearance as a head coach, taking Ole Miss to the Big Dance in both 2013 and 2015.

Kennedy's Blazers secured their sixth conference tournament title in Frisco on March 12, 2022, marking their second conference tournament championship victory outside of Birmingham in program history. UAB also captured its fifth Conference USA Championship in program history, winning three regular season titles and two postseason titles.

With 27 wins in his second season at UAB, Kennedy surpassed 300 career victories in 2021-22, earning win No. 300 with an 87-59 victory over UTSA on Jan. 1, 2022.

Kennedy's 49 wins in his first two seasons as UAB's head coach are the most in program history, surpassing Mike Anderson's previous record of 43. His 39-11 record through his first 50 games at UAB is also a UAB men's basketball coaching record.

As a team, the Blazers finished with their highest final NET Ranking (No. 46) in program history and won 17 games over conference opponents for the first time in UAB men's basketball's 44-year history. UAB finished first in Conference USA in scoring offense (80.31), scoring margin (+13.57), field-goal percentage (.468), 3-point field-goal percentage (.377), rebounding margin (+4.49), total steals (9.60), turnover margin (-4.26) and offensive rebounding percentage (.337). Nationally, the Blazers ranked fourth in total steals (336), sixth in scoring margin (13.6), sixth in scoring offense (80.3), seventh in steals per game (9.6) and 10th in turnover margin (4.3).

The Blazers led Conference USA in scoring offense for the first time in program history and averaged more than 80 points per game for the first time since 1991, which was Kennedy's senior year as a player at UAB when he led Conference USA with 21.8 points per game (UAB single-season record).

Individually, UAB had multiple all-conference honorees for the first time since 2015-16. Transfer guard Jordan Walker highlighted the group of UAB honorees, taking home C-USA Player of The Year, C-USA Newcomer of the Year, C-USA Tournament MVP, First Team All-Conference USA and First Team NABC District 11 honors in his first season as a Blazer. Walker not only became UAB's third conference Player of the Year in March 2022, but he also joined UAB legend Oliver Robinson as the only two Blazers to earn conference Player of the Year and conference tournament MVP honors in the same season.



Quan Jackson earned Third Team All-Conference USA honors and All-Defensive Team accolades, while KJ Buffen earned All-Conference USA Honorable Mention accolades. Michael Ertel was named to the Conference USA All-Academic Team, which was UAB's first honoree since 2016. Jackson, Ertel and Walker also earned spots on the Conference USA All-Tournament Team.

Overall, UAB ranked inside the Top 55 in NET the entire season, reaching its highest NET ranking in program history (No. 28) on Dec. 13. UAB was the only team in Conference USA with two NET Quadrant I victories during the regular season. The Blazers also reached their highest KenPom ranking in program history (No. 36) on Feb. 9.

In his first season at the helm of his alma mater, Kennedy recorded 22 victories, which was the most for a coach at a new program in 2020-21. He recorded his 20th win in 26 games, the fastest in his head coaching career. The Blazers had 13 Conference USA wins, which was most in the league.

The 2020-21 Blazers were the first squad in program history to begin the season 7-0. The record-setting sixth victory came on Dec. 12 when UAB defeated ETSU 65-61 on the road. The Blazers had one of its best conference starts since the formation of C-USA in 1995-96 as they started off 9-1 for only the second time in league history.

As a team, the Blazers had their highest KenPom ranking to finish the regular season since 2010-11 and highest NET rating in program history (48 on 1/15/21). UAB received votes in AP Poll for the first time since March 7, 2016 and in the Coaches Poll since November 21, 2017.

Individually, Tavin Lovan was named to NABC District 11 Second Team as well as the Conference USA Second Team. Quan Jackson and Trey Jemison were named to the C-USA All-Defensive Team, which was the first time in program history UAB had two members of the All-Defensive Team.

The Blazers' defense was one of the best in the nation. UAB was fourth in the country in scoring defense (60.3 ppg) and turnover margin (5.4).

Kennedy experienced unprecedented success with the Rebels during his tenure in Oxford, securing a school record 245 career victories. Ole Miss captured the SEC Tournament title in 2013 with a 27-9 record, and Kennedy led the Rebels to two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2013 and 2015. Kennedy's teams advanced in both tournament appearances, knocking off fifth-seeded Wisconsin 57-46 in 2013 before rallying from a 17-point halftime deficit in 2015 to defeat BYU 94-90 in the First Four in 2015.

The former Ole Miss coach won SEC Coach of the Year honors twice during his tenure (2007 and 2013). Kennedy also captured two SEC West Division titles and led the Rebels to eight postseason appearances and 11 postseason wins during his time in Oxford. He coached 16 players who earned All-SEC honors as the head coach of the Rebels.

In 12 seasons at Ole Miss, Kennedy guided the Rebels to 20 or more wins nine times and ranks top 20 in SEC history for career wins.

Kennedy's first head coaching duties were at Cincinnati for the 2006 season. Named interim head coach on August 26, 2005, Kennedy took over the reins from his mentor Bob Huggins who resigned two days earlier.

In a season where the Big East Conference was stacked from top to bottom, Kennedy led the Bearcats a 13-2 start with road wins over Vanderbilt, Marquette, Dayton and LSU, who made the Final Four. While playing only eight scholarship players, Cincinnati cracked the AP Top-25 ranking, and Kennedy was named Mid-Season National Coach of the Year by CBS Sportsline.

The winning continued when Big East Conference play began. The Bearcats stunned Jim Boeheim's Syracuse Orangemen in the Carrier Dome 82-65, knocked off Rick Pitino's Louisville Cardinals 74-68 and upset 14th-ranked West Virginia 78-75 led by John Beilein.

In his only year as UC's head coach, Kennedy had led the Bearcats to a 21-13 record, defeated 12 foes ranked in the top 100 of the RPI and played a schedule rated fifth toughest in college hoops. The New York Post labeled him the Big East Coach of the Year.

Prior to Cincinnati, Kennedy was an assistant coach at UAB from 1996 to 2001.

Kennedy played at UAB from 1988-91 and holds multiple school records. In just three seasons, he scored 1,787 points - the second most in school history - and also holds the school record for career 3-point field goals made (318) and attempted (728), 3-point field goal percentage (.437), free throw percentage (.872) and highest single-season scoring average (21.8 ppg in 1990-91).

Additionally, he holds UAB's record for most points scored by a sophomore (603) and by a senior (676), most career 20+ point games (43), most career 30+ point games (7).

- UAB set a program record with 29 wins, reaching the NIT Championship game for the first time in program history.
- The Blazers won 25+ games in consecutive seasons for only the second time ever, dating back to when Gene Bartow led the Blazers to 25 wins in 1984-85 and 1985-86.
- The Blazers posted their most wins in Bartow Arena in a single season in program history with 17.
- The Blazers led its conference in scoring for the second-straight season.
- Andy Kennedy surpassed 300-career victories, earning career win No. 300 with an 87-59 victory in Bartow Arena over UTSA
- Kennedy's 39-11 record through his first 50 games at UAB is a UAB men's basketball coaching record
- Kennedy's 78 wins in his first three seasons at UAB are the most in program history, surpassing Mike Anderson's previous record of 65.
- UAB is tied for fifth in the country with 78 wins over the last three seasons.
- Kennedy is the only UAB head coach to start both his three seasons with an 8-2 record or better
- The Blazers went 3-0 against SEC opponents in 2022-23, beating Georgia, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.
- UAB had five different players score at least 20 points in a game last season.
- The Blazers tied their own record of 276 three-point field goals in a season, while attempting the most in program history (778).
- Five different players recorded double-doubles during the season (Buffen, T. Brewer, Davis, Gaines, Jemison).
- The Blazers finished second nationally in rebounding with 40.9 rebounds per game.
- Jordan Walker became the fastest player in program history to reach 1,000 points as a Blazer (47 games).
- Walker finished fifth in the country in points per game (22.3, a school record) while scoring 20+ points in 22 of his 33 appearances.
- "Jelly" scored 32 points in the Conference USA Tournament semifinal against North Texas, his 10th 30-point game at UAB, a school record.
- Trey Jemison grabbed the most rebounds in a single season by a UAB player with 329.
- Eric Gaines was on SportsCenter's Top Ten place twice.
- Four Blazers earned a spot on the All-Conference USA teams - Jordan Walker (first team), Trey Jemison (second team), KJ Buffen (honorable mention) and Eric Gaines (honorable mention).
- Trey Jemison led the UAB roster in blocks with a career-high 67 rejections, earning himself a spot on the Conference USA All-Defensive team.
- Jordan Walker was named to numerous watchlists, including the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Watchlist, the Preseason Naismith Trophy Watchlist, the Preseason Wooden Award Watchlist and the Preseason Bob Cousy Award Watchlist.
- He also was name first to the NABC All-District first team and was invited to the 2023 NABC Reese's Division I All-Star Game.
- KJ Buffen recorded a seven steals vs. UTEP which is tied for fifth in program history for a single game (12/29/22).



UAB TAKES ON SAN DIEGO STATE IN FIRST ROUND OF NCAA TOURNAMENT

UAB men's basketball will face San Diego State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Friday. Tipoff is set for 12:45 p.m. CT.

SERIES HISTORY

The Blazers won the only meeting between the two programs during the 1989-90 season when UAB head coach Andy Kennedy was a player. Kennedy scored 27 points in the win.

LAST TIME OUT

The Blazers captured the American Conference Tournament title on Sunday with an 85-69 win over Temple. Alejandro Vasquez scored a career high 29 points while Eric Gaines added 15 points, six rebounds, nine assists, five steals and three blocks.

ALL-CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

Yaxel Lendeborg was named the MVP of the American Conference Tournament after recording double-doubles in all three games while Eric Gaines and Alejandro Vasquez were named to the All-Championship team. Lendeborg averaged 15.0 points, 13.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.3 blocks per game in the tournament.

LENDEBORG NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR, FIRST TEAM ALL-AAC

After a standout debut season in Birmingham, forward Yaxel Lendeborg was named AAC Defensive Player of the Year and First Team All-Conference. Lendeborg is UAB's first Conference Defensive Player of the Year since William Lee in 2016-17 and he joins Squeaky Johnson and Cameron Moore as the only Blazers to earn first team All-Conference and Defensive Player of the Year honors in the same season.

IN ELITE COMPANY

Andy Kennedy is just one of five active head coaches with 20+ wins in 14 of their first 17 seasons. The four other coaches on the list include John Calipari, Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, and Thad Matta.

YAX SEASON

Yaxel Lendeborg has been a dominant force in his debut season at UAB. He earned AAC Player of the Week honors after putting up 24 points and grabbing 15 rebounds in a win over UNC Asheville and followed up that performance with 23 points, 15 rebounds and seven blocks at UTSA. Lendeborg put up yet another impressive double-double with 23 points, 16 boards and four assists against No. 19 Memphis. He posted an eye-popping 17 points and 21 rebounds in a win over No. 20 Florida Atlantic before earning AAC Player of the Week honors for the second time. His 21 boards are the second-most by a Blazer in program history. Lendeborg's 363 rebounds this season are the most by a Blazer in a single season and the most by a player in the American Conference in a single season. The 6'9" forward is averaging 13.9 points, 10.7 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game and he is one of 15 players in college basketball averaging a double-double this season.

MOST WINS OVER FOUR SEASONS

With the Blazers' win over East Carolina on January 20, 2024, Andy Kennedy earned his 90th win at UAB, which is the most by a UAB coach over his first four seasons. Mike Anderson previously held the record with 89 wins from 2002-06. Additionally, Kennedy's tenure marks the most wins over any four year period at UAB, surpassing 1983-87 under Gene Bartow. Kennedy reached 100 wins in Birmingham faster than any coach in program history, doing so in only 136 games.

THREE TOP 10 JUCO PLAYERS JOIN THE BLAZERS

Andy Kennedy took a different approach to this year's signing class than many schools around the country, adding four players from the junior college ranks. However, three of UAB's four JUCO signees ranked in the top 10 of JUCORecruiting.com's class of 2023 rankings. Christian Coleman, a 6'9" forward, was listed at the No. 2 spot nationally while 6'4" guard Alejandro Vasquez and 6'9" forward Yaxel Lendeborg were ranked at No. 6 and No. 9, respectively. The Blazers also added Marquis Hargrove from Arizona Western.

STEPPING UP

Highlight-reel plays marked Eric Gaines' first season in Birmingham with two SportsCenter Top Ten appearances and numerous high-flying dunks. After averaging 11.5 points and 4.3 assists per game, Gaines has played an even larger role this year as the only returning player to average double-digit points per game last season. Gaines has upped his scoring numbers while maintaining his defensive prowess this season for UAB, averaging 12.2 points, 3.9 rebounds, 5.4 assists and 2.4 steals per game. He scored 17 points and dished out 10 assists in a win over Temple, his third 10-assist outing of the year. Gaines is No. 30 in the nation with 5.5 assists per game and No. 9 in the nation with 2.4 steals per game.

VETERAN PRESENCE

Javian Davis enters his final year of eligibility in 2023-24 and is primed to play a big role on this year's UAB team. Davis averaged 6.1 points and 4.0 rebounds per game last season while splitting time with Trey Jemison. Davis opened the 2023-24 season with a career performance against Bradley, scoring 20 points, grabbing 15 rebounds and securing four steals while shooting 8-for-9 from the field. Davis has set a career high in points twice this season against Middle Tennessee with 21 and Montevallo with 22.

SMOOTH LIKE "BUTTA"

Efrem "Butta" Johnson averaged 3.5 points and 1.3 rebounds per game last year while shooting 37.8 percent from beyond the arc and has taken on a



much larger role in year two. Johnson scored 17 points against Clemson early this season while adding three rebounds and three assists. Johnson stepped up once again in the clutch against UTSA, scoring the final 10 points, including the game-winner with two seconds to go. "Butta" put up 15 points and dished out a career high six assists in a win over Tulane before matching his career high of 18 against North Texas. Johnson scored a career high 21 points against top-seeded South Florida to help the Blazers reach the conference championship game.

HIGH ENERGY, HIGH IMPACT

Christian Coleman has made a major impact for the Blazers late in the season, putting together some of his best performances. Coleman had a career high with 19 points and seven rebounds in UAB's win over Temple. He followed that up with his first collegiate double-double in the Blazers' comeback win over SMU with 16 points and 10 rebounds. The junior forward is shooting .547 from the field and averaging 7.9 points and 4.6 rebounds this season. Over his last five games, Coleman is averaging 15.6 points and 6.4 rebounds while shooting .585 from the field.

MAKING AN IMPACT

Daniel Ortiz has begun to find his rhythm on the UAB roster. Ortiz hit a clutch go-ahead three with four seconds to go in regulation in the Blazers' win over Drake. Ortiz also surpassed the 1,000-point mark for his collegiate career in UAB's win over Montevallo. During the Blazers' game vs. Rice, Ortiz hit his 200th career three-point field goal. Against Wichita State in the AAC Tournament Ortiz went 4-for-7 from deep and scored 16 points.

PORTAL TALENT

The Blazers brought in four players from the transfer portal in the offseason. Barry Dunning Jr. transferred to UAB from Arkansas where he played in 16 games during his freshman season. Another newcomer, James White, also came over from an SEC program at Ole Miss. White averaged 4.0 points last season for the Rebels. Daniel Ortiz joined the Blazers from North Alabama where he led the Lions in scoring in back-to-back seasons, averaging 14.6 points per game over two years. The final transfer, Will Shaver, returned home to Birmingham after spending two seasons at North Carolina. Shaver was a member of the UNC team that made a run to the national championship game.

PROTECTING THE RIM

The Blazers have blocked 157 shots over 34 games this season, which ranks 37th in the nations. UAB is led by Yaxel Lendeborg with 72 rejections. Lendeborg's 72 blocks rank 28th in the nation and second in the American Conference. UAB blocked at least five shots in four straight games from Nov. 12-25, its longest such streak since the 2015-16 season. Ten different players have blocked at least one shot this season.

FAST PACED, HIGH POWERED OFFENSE

The Blazers were one of the highest scoring teams in the country yet again under Andy Kennedy. After finishing the 2021-22 season ranking sixth in

points per game nationally, UAB finished the 2022-23 season at No. 13 with 80.7 points per game. The Blazers were also No. 31 according to KenPom in adjusted tempo.

REPLACING 1,000 POINT SCORERS

After losing five 1,000-point scorers from last year's roster, two different Blazers have reached the 1,000-point mark this season.

• **Eric Gaines: 1,243**

• **Daniel Ortiz: 1,151**

AK's REVIVAL

Head coach Andy Kennedy often talks about re-establishing the "Bartow Standard" in Birmingham by competing for and winning championships year after year. AK has lived up to that standard. In 2021-22, the Blazers captured their first league tournament championship during his tenure and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2014-15. He then led the Blazers to a program-record 29 wins in 2022-23 and the school's first appearance in the NIT Championship game. In his fourth season at UAB and the school's first season as a member of the American Conference, Kennedy led the Blazers to an American Conference tournament title and their second NCAA Tournament berth in three seasons.

350 IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Andy Kennedy reached 350 career wins as a head coach on Sunday, December 17 against Montevallo. He is one of only 48 active head coaches to have 350 wins at the Division I level.

GET TO THE LINE

The Blazers are one of the best teams in the country at getting to the charity stripe. UAB is 11th in the nation in free throws made per game at 17.8 while ranking 12th nationally in free throw attempts per game with 23.8. UAB shoots free throws at a 74.6 percent clip which ranks 70th in the country.

CRASH THE BOARDS

The Blazers finished the 2022-23 season at No. 2 in the NCAA in rebounds per game at 40.9 and No. 5 in offensive rebounds per game at 13.5 and are once again a top-100 rebounding team. UAB is 55th nationally, grabbing 38.1 rebounds per game. The Blazers excel on the offensive glass, grabbing 12.9 offensive boards per game, which ranks 28th in the nation. Yaxel Lendeborg leads the Blazers in rebounding, grabbing 10.7 per game. He has grabbed 15 or more rebounds in nine games this season, including a 21-rebound game vs. Florida Atlantic which ranks second in program history. Lendeborg has 363 rebounds this season, which is the most in a single season in UAB history.

WELCOME TO THE 205

Once again, head coach Andy Kennedy's philosophy over the offseason was to target the transfer portal and hit it hard. The Blazers added nine new players over the offseason, including four Division I transfers and four JUCO transfers. From the portal, UAB added Barry Dunning Jr. (Arkansas), Daniel Ortiz (North



Alabama), James White (Ole Miss), and Will Shaver (North Carolina). The Blazers also added the top JUCO class in the country with Christian Coleman, Alejandro Vasquez, Yaxel Lendeborg and Marquis Hargrove. First-year guard KJ Satterfield was the only player to join the roster out of high school.

LENDEBORG'S JOURNEY TO UAB

Yaxel Lendeborg joined the Blazers after a standout JUCO career as a two-time NJCAA All-American. The Pennsauken, N.J. native only played 11 games of high school basketball but found his way on to the roster at Arizona Western. The 6'9" forward led NJCAA DI in rebounding in back-to-back seasons after averaging 17.2 points and 13.0 rebounds per game last year. Lendeborg was born in Puerto Rico and played with the Dominican Republic Select National Team.

WALMART TO DI BASKETBALL

When Christian Coleman graduated from high school, he was only 6'1" and had no college basketball offers at any level. After working at Walmart for two years and playing basketball in his free time, Coleman grew to be 6'9". He was eventually presented with the opportunity to play at LSU-Alexandria, an NAIA school, where he played for one season before transferring to South Plains College in Levelland, Texas, a junior college. The Winnsboro, La. native was ranked No. 2 in the JUCO Recruiting Top 100 for the 2023 class after averaging 16.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game.

BONNIE TO A BLAZER

Alejandro Vasquez began his career at St. Bonaventure, helping the Bonnies reach the NCAA Tournament during his freshman season while averaging 6.3 points per game. Vasquez played two seasons with the Bonnies before finding himself at Salt Lake Community College in Utah. He averaged 18.4 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game last year, earning first team NJCAA All-American honors. Vasquez has been a standout this season for UAB, averaging 10.7 points and 3.5 rebounds per game with four 20+ point performances including a 28-point outburst against Tulane. He closed the regular season with four straight games in double figures.

RECORD SETTER

Yaxel Lendeborg has now set program records for rebounds in a single season for UAB and the American Conference, double-doubles in a single season at UAB, and he ranks in the top ten in UAB history in single-season blocks with 72.

STACKING WINS

The Blazers strung together six-straight victories for the sixth time during Andy Kennedy's four-year tenure at UAB. Kennedy has 15 such streaks during his 17 year coaching career. His 13 straight wins to start the 2007-08 season at Ole Miss is tied for the best start in program history.

RANKED WINS

The Blazers have beaten two ranked opponents in the same season for the first time since the 2009-10 season. UAB downed No. 19 Memphis by a score of 97-88 before beating No. 20 Florida Atlantic, 76-73, in overtime.

SWEET HOME ALABAMA

The Blazers have five players on the 2023-24 roster from the state of Alabama. After retaining Efrem "Butta" Johnson, Tony Toney and Ryan Donohoo, UAB brought two transfers back to the state of Alabama via the portal in Barry Dunning Jr. and Will Shaver.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Throughout its history, the UAB men's basketball program has seen incredible success in Birmingham, holding a 446-111 record in Bartow Arena since the Blazers' on-campus home opened back in 1988. That success has continued with Andy Kennedy returning to his alma mater, as the fourth year UAB head coach holds a 60-11 record at home (Bartow and Legacy Arena) since taking over the program.

UAB TO THE AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Blazers have joined the American Conference for the 2023-24 season along with Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Rice, and UTSA.

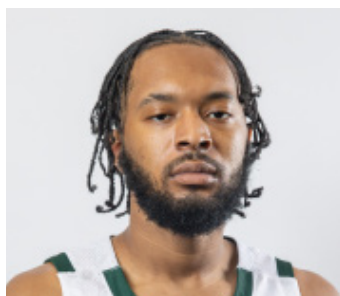
