SARA HAYES' WINTER OFFENSIVE CLINICS



At the Aztec Softball facility, Coach Hayes' offensive clinics will present the highest level of offensive training techniques while teaching the fundamental form necessary to be successful against the best pitchers in the country. Clinics will be tailored to meet the needs of the individual athlete so all ages and levels of experience are welcome.

Clinic Format

Coach Hayes' File

A native of Rancho Santa Fe, CA, Hayes graduated in 1995 from the University of Notre Dame, where she was the MVP her junior and senior years and left the Irish holding all-time records in ten offensive categories and eight single-season school records. Immediately following graduation, Hayes joined DePaul University as an assistant coach for the Blue Demons. After five years, she helped the squad to a 265-101 (.742) record, four years ranked in the Top 15 for offense, four NCAA Regional appearances, the first two Women's College World Series appearances in school history, three Regional Coaching Staff honors, and was a member of the 1999 National Coaching Staff of the Year award.

Her leadership resulted in head coaching positions with the University of Northern Iowa and then Indiana University. Hayes served as head coach at Northern Iowa from 2001-02, where she logged a 58-59 record. In 2002, she led the Panthers to their first winning season since 1998, and coached a third baseman to the program's first All-America first team selection. As Indiana's head softball coach from 2003-04, she compiled a 51-62 overall record in her two years, including a 32-31 mark in 2004, the team's first winning campaign since 1996.

Hayes has been the University of the Pacific's top assistant for the past two years, helping head coach Brian Kolze and the Tigers to two more of their 11 consecutive winning seasons. Offensively, the Tigers finished both seasons on top in the Big West Conference in almost every offensive category.

Hayes joined the Aztec coaching staff this past August.
