► The Records: The San Diego State women's basketball team returns to San Diego for its first of six straight home games during the month of December, as the Aztecs play host to Cal State Fullerton Sunday at 2 p.m. SDSU is coming off a 80-70 victory at Cal Poly on Thursday night, improving to 5-1 on the season, its best start to a campaign since the 1995-96 squad also was 5-1. Cal State Fullerton, meanwhile, lost to USC on Friday night, 104-77, and is 1-4 overall.

► SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 252-189 in 15 seasons, while she is 171-124 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.

► Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Maryalyce Jeremiah: Jeremiah is in her 12th season at Cal State Fullerton and her 28th campaign overall. Her record with the Titans is 157-170 and her career mark is 420-315.

► Cal State Fullerton Series History: Cal State Fullerton and San Diego State meet for the 26th time and the 18th occasion in San Diego. The Aztecs, who lead the series 18-17, have won each of the last five meetings and are 12-5 all time at home (Last: San Diego St. def. Cal State Fullerton, on Dec. 18, 2004, 69-43, in San Diego, Calif.).

Aztec Basketball Begins Month-Long Homestand Sunday Versus Cal State Fullerton

Facing its second Big West school in the last four days, the Aztec women's basketball team returns home Sunday, for a 2 p.m. contest against Cal State Fullerton at Cox Arena. SDSU is beginning a month-long, six-game homestand after defeating Cal Poly on Thursday night in San Luis Obispo, 80-70, to improve to 5-1 overall. Four of the Aztecs five victories have come away from home, while the team's 5-1 start is its best since the 1995-96 squad also was 5-1.

San Diego State and Cal State Fullerton meet for 26th time overall, but the first occasion since the 2004 campaign. The Aztecs own a five-game win streak, outscoring the Titans, 391-235, during that span.

SDSU Comes From Behind In 80-70 Win At Cal Poly

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Cal Poly 42-27 in the second half to rally from a nine-point deficit, as the Aztecs improved to 5-1 overall with an 80-70 victory over the Mustangs Thursday at Mott Gym. SDSU owned a 20-12 advantage on the offensive glass and made eight three-pointers for its

seventh consecutive win over Cal Poly, which dropped to 3-4 in 2007-08.

Aztec point guard Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) scored 14 of her team-high 21 points in the second half, matching the best offensive output of her Du Jo Q. career. Davis converted 11 of her 12 free-throw attempts and added four rebounds and four steals. Three other Mo Lip C. Eve SDSU players finished in double-figure points, including freshman center **Paris Johnson** (17 points), sophomore Cla TE/ guard **Jené Morris** (11 pts.) and freshman forward Allison Duffy (10 pts.).

The Aztecs shot 39.7 percent from the field for the second game in a row, but countered with 26 secondchance points and recorded a season-best 88 percent performance (22-for-25) at the stripe. SDSU matched its best start since 1995-96 with five wins in its first six outings following its final non-conference road game of 2007-08.

After Cal Poly scored the first bucket to begin the night, the Aztecs reeled off six straight points to jump ahead 6-2. The Mustangs ended the run with a pair of free throws, but SDSU scored four more on back-to-back baskets by Johnson. Cal Poly put together its own offensive string, recording eight straight points to take a 12-10 advantage.

The schools traded leads four more times, before Cal Poly jumped ahead for the rest of the half, going up by as many as nine at 39-30, before heading into the locker room up five, 43-38. The Mustangs ended the half shoot-

ing 58.3 percent from the field and made 13 of their 14 free-throws (92.9 percent).

After Cal Poly once again opened the half with the first two points, SDSU responded with a triple by Davis, followed by two straight lay ups from Johnson to tie the game at 45-45.

Trailing by one, the Aztecs nailed back-to-back three-pointers to gain their first lead since early in the first half at 53-49. SDSU would go up by six on two occasions, before running out to the largest advantage of the night by either side at 67-57, following two Davis free throws.

Cal Poly made it interesting by getting to within six at 67-61 with just over three minutes left, but SDSU got four straight points from Duffy and made 7-of-8 free-throws in the final 1:28 to secure the 80-70 win.

Other Cal Poly Notes

The Aztecs nine-point deficit was their largest to overcome in a victory this season. SDSU trailed by seven in the second-half at Nevada ... SDSU had at least four players reach double-figures in points in the same game for the second time this year (5 vs. St. Mary's) ... The Aztecs won its final non-conference road game for the second year in a row.

On The Glass

The Aztecs have owned an advantage in the rebounding column in four games so far this season, including a 39-31 edge against Cal Poly on Thursday night. For the season, the team is +3.6 in rebouding margin and has posted 20 or more boards on the offensive glass twice. San Diego State outrebounded its opponent only eight times in 28 outings in 2006-07.

At The Line

San Diego State made 22 of its 25 shots from the charity line at Cal Poly for a season-best 88.0 free-throw percentage. The 22 made free throws are the Aztecs most in a game since also making 22 versus Cal State Northridge on Dec. 6, 2003. The percentage is the team's highest since recording a 93.8 mark (15-for-16) against USD on Nov. 22, 2005.

Individually, sophomore Quenese Davis made 11 of her 12 free throws, the most makes and attempts since she was 11-for-16 from the line in a win over Utah last season.

Winning ... The Second Half

The Aztecs have won the scoring battle in the second half in each of their six contest thus far. SDSU is outscoring its opponents, 226-165, in the second 20-minute period. In 2006-07, San Diego State was 9-1 when scoring more points in the second half, with the lone exception being against BYU in late January.

Offensive Outburst

In a stark contrast from a year ago when the Aztecs averaged just 56.1 points per game and shot only 37

The Aztecs have scored 60 or more points in all six contests, reaching the 80-point barrier on three occasions, while they have shot above 40 percent from the field in all but two outing, barely missing in the wins over Cal Poly and Jackson State (39.7 percent).

Below are a few notes about the Aztecs' offensive number so far this season:

SDSU's 86 points and 34-point margin of victory versus Southern Utah are its most in a game since beating Utah Valley State, 91-45, on Feb.

10, 2005. The Aztecs have recorded two games with more than 80 points for the first time since 2001-02. when the team had 89 points against Radford and 83 versus Air Force.

SDSU has shot above 40 percent from the field in four of six games thus far. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. The last time San Diego State shot over 40 percent from the field in four straight games was in 2001, when the Aztecs opened the campaign with five straight performances.

San Diego State has scored 60 or more points in six consecutive games for the first time since also posting a six-game stint in 1998 from Jan. 15-Feb. 1.

The Aztecs have scored 40 or more points in a half five times this season after only reaching the barrier twice a vear ago.

SDSU leads the league in assists with 16.83 per outing, including a conference-best 26 helpers versus Southern Utah, its most in a game since it had 28 on Feb. 1, 1997 vs. San Jose State.

What The W's Mean

▶ SDSU is 5-1, the team's best start since also opening the 1995-96 campaign with a 5-1 mark. ► SDSU claimed its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2002, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, 59-54. The Aztecs had dropped their previous seven outings in neutral site games.

The Aztecs have won three road games, its most in a season since the 2003-04 squad won four times in opponent's arenas.

SDSU won its season-opener for the first time 2002, and claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three years.

► The Aztecs are 4-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 3-1 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's, Southern Utah and Cal Poly a year ago.

► The Aztecs are 11-2 in their last 13 games against non-conference opponents with the lone losses coming last week versus Indiana State and in the championship game of the 2006 Surf 'N Slam tournament against No. 17/16 George Washington.

Steals And Turnovers

Through its first six games, SDSU has forced a combined 171 turnovers and logged 98 steals. The Aztecs lead the Mountain West Conference in both turnover margin (+6.2) and steals per game (16.3), while the team's 23 steals versus Southern Utah and 18 steals against Nevada remain the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. Individually, Jené Morris (1st), Quenese Davis (1st), Allison Duffy (4th) and **Tamika Lipford** (7th) are all in the top 10 in the league in steals per game.

SDSU's 23 steals versus Southern Utah are the team's most since also posting 23 versus Long Island

University on Dec. 27, 1996. The total is second all-time in the MWC since the league began, trailing only Colorado State's 24-steal effort in 2001 against Sacramento State.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times and forced 20 or more turnovers on 11 occasions. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

Return Of The Three

After beginning the season only 4-for-12 from three-point land in their first two games, the Aztecs have made 24 triples in their last four outings, including a season-best eight versus Southern Utah and Cal Poly. SDSU has attempted 20 or more three-pointers on two occasions against Southern Utah and Indiana State, a mark the team failed to reach all of last season. The 24 three-point attempts against the Sycamores are the Aztecs' most since trying 25 versus Colorado State in Feb. 2006.

SDSU senior **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** had one three against Cal Poly, moving her into seventh place alone in school career history with 66. Eveland is also sixth in career three-point attempts with 217.

Young Guns

San Diego State has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in its first six games of 2007-08. The Aztecs' starting lineup in its season opener with Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five.

This year's group has just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as Shanna Demus played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles. The Aztecs' four newcomers, **Coco Davis** (Sacramento, Calif.), Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris, have combined for 53 percent of the team's scoring and 47 percent of its rebounding.

Another Block Party?

After leading the Mountain West Conference in blocks per game in both overall and league-only outings in 2006-07, San Diego State looks like it is well on its way to doing the same again this season. In the opening six games, the Aztecs has 34 total blocks by eight different players, ranking first in the league with 5.67 per outing.

True freshman Paris Johnson has provided the bulk of the work with 14 to her credit, including five at Nevada, which tied for eighth in school single-game history.

San Diego State ranked 35th nationally with 4.6 blocks per game a year ago. The team's 129 blocks were the program's most since tallying 159 in 1994-95.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Cal State Fullerton will mean:

- ▶SDSU is 6-1 to start a year for the first time since the 1992-93 team was also 6-1.
- SDSU stays perfect at home in 2007-08, and wins its sixth straight over the Titans.
 - ► The Aztecs are 2-1 against teams they did not face last season.

Cal State Fullerton Tid-Bits

Cal State Fullerton is 1-4 on the year with its lone victory coming over San Jose State, 80-68, on Nov. 17 ... The Titans, who average 72.4 points per outing, are led by Toni Thomas, who averages 22.8 points a contest ... Thomas has score 1,028 career points and is also her team's leading rebounder this season (7.6/g) ... Lauren Chow is the only other Titan to average in double-figures and is also tops on her team in assists ... CSF is being beaten on the boards, posting a -15.6 rebounding margin ... Fullerton's losses have come against Utah Valley State, USF, UTEP and most recently versus USC.

The concourse outside Cox Arena will open at 12:30 p.m., with interactive games and a chance to enter a drawing for prizes.

Following its contest with the Titans, the Aztec women's basketball team will be on hand to sign autographs. Free autograph books and team posters will be available both before and after the game.

Aztecs Ink Four In Front Court

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of four prep standouts to National Letters of Intent. Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.), Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.), Lindsay Leo (San Jose, Calif.) and Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.) will join the Aztecs in 2008.

man for the upcoming season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 17, at the conference's annual media day in Littleton, Colo. As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed to finish seventh for the third year in a row in the MWC preseason poll. SDSU, which ended up seventh during the 2006-07 regular season, earned 93 points from the panel. Wyoming was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the first time in MWC history after winning the WNIT championship a year ago, receiving 24 of 30 first-place votes and 203 total points.

Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

Pair Added To Aztec Coaching Staff

SDSU head coach Beth Burns added a pair to her staff this past summer. Heidi VanDerveer, who has over 20 years of experience on both the collegiate and professional levels, was named associate head coach on Aug. 29. VanDerveer comes to San Diego State from the Seattle Storm, where she recently completed her second season as an assistant coach. Tara Morrison joined the staff as the team's head manager after two seasons as an assistant coach at Binghamton University in New York and four at the University of Maine.

Last Year's Team Milestones

SDSU finished as the 11th most-improved team in Division I, going from 3 to 12 victories in 2006-07.

► The Aztecs posted the biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons in league history, claiming five Mountain West Conference victories after going winless in 2005-06.

SDSU's 12 wins are the program's most since 2000-01 ... The team's 11 victories at home are the most since 1996-97 ... The five conference victories are the most since 2000-01 ... The Aztecs' six-game win streak is the team's longest since 2000-01 ... Its seven non-conference wins are its most since 2001-01.

SDSU led the Mountain West Conference in blocks in both overall and conference only contests, ranking 35th nationally.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 2005. In just two short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007, and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 252-189, while her mark school record stands at 171-124 over 10 seasons. Burns recently earned her 250th career victory with the team's win vs. Southern Utah.

2007-08 San Diego State Women's Basketball

San Diego St. 67, Nevada 61

RENO, Nev. - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris , who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

MORAGA, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had five players score in double-figures in a 83-60 victory over Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. SDSU is now 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 season, while the Gaels fell to 2-2.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point arc.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay added 10 points off the bench.

SDSU started out the game on an 11-2 run on a layup by Davis with 17:46 remaining in the first half. Saint Mary's made a late run and got to within nine with 3:24 left, but an 11-4 run, capped by a LaSandra Dixon layup late in the first half, gave the Aztecs the 46-29 lead at the break.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half, as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign.

Saint Mary's was led by Jontelle Smith, who scored 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting, while Louella Tomlinson had 11 points and four blocks.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center Paris Johnson, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward Shanna Demus recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward Allison Duffy contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore Jené Morris led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4 0 run with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

Southern Utah's Anne Westwood had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Erin Heuett contributed 11 points and four assists in the losing effort.

Indiana St. 75, San Diego St., 68 Game 4 = Nov. 23 = Gersten Pavilion = Los Angeles, Calif.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 19-point second-half deficit to just four, but was unable to complete the comeback as the Aztecs dropped their first game of season to Indiana State, 75-68, at Gersten Pavilion. SDSU fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Sycamores improved to 3-0 following the first game of the LMU Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament.

Aztec freshman Paris Johnson had a career-high 27 points and 13 rebounds for her first career double-double. Johnson's 27 points are the most by an SDSU player since Michelle Strawberry had 29 in the 2005-06 season-opener. Sophomore Jené Morris was the only other Aztec in double-figures with 11 points, including a pair of three-pointers, to go with her three steals.

SDSU had four of its five starters foul out by the end of the game, including point guard Quenese Davis, who was limited to just four points in 20 minutes, but still managed to contribute four steals and four assists.

The Sycamores got off to an early lead, making six of their first seven shots from the field including a 3-for-3 effort from beyond the arc to jump ahead by eight at 15-7 heading into the first timeout. The Aztecs rallied to get back to within three at 15-12 on a triple by Demus at the 14:51 mark and trailed by four with 12:38 remaining in the first half. Indiana State, however, went on a 10-0 run, hitting two more three pointers to go up 28-18.

ISU boasted its largest lead at the break, heading into the locker room up by 18 at 45-27, after shooting 55.2 percent from the field and making 7-of-8 three-point attempts.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start in the second half, scoring four straight points on a pair of lay ups by Johnson and limiting the Sycamores to just six points in the first six minutes of play. SDSU was able to make a further dent into its deficit with the help of a 9-0 run to get to within 10 at 54-44.

After the two sides traded trips to the free-throw line, San Diego State continued to stalemate the Indiana State offense, going on another 3-0 run to get to within seven at 56-49.

ISU countered with a 5-0 outburst of its own and was leading by 14 points as late as 66-52. A three-pointer by Morris sparked the Aztec rally again, as SDSU closed to within just four with 26 seconds left in the game. The Sycamores closed out the win by making three of their four free throws to claim the 75-68 victory.

San Diego State owned the advantage on the boards (40-36), in the steals department (13-6) and in the turnover column (23-19), but the Sycamores made eight three-pointers and converted 23 of their 35 trips to the charity line.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy recorded her second career double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team past Jackson State, 63-44, in the consolation game of the Loyola Marymount/Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament in Los Angeles. The Aztecs, who outscored the Lady Tigers (1-3), 30-18, in the second half, improved to 4-1 with the victory.

Duffy was 6-for-16 from the field and made 3-of-4 free-throw attempts. She added a career-high seven steals and two blocks in 36 minutes.

Sophomore Jené Morris added 15 points, 12 coming in the second half, and four rebounds. She was 6-of-7 from the floor and 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 13 points and a game-high five assists, while freshman Paris Johnson, who was named to the all-tournament team, had seven points and eight rebounds.

San Diego State led by as many as 14 in the first half when Morris connected on a 3-point attempt with 5:21 remaining. Jackson State, however, went on a 7-0 run over the next 3:55 before Duffy's jumper at the buzzer gave the Aztecs a 33-26 halftime lead.

The Lady Tigers got within three points at 33-30, 1:42 into the second half on an Erica Trahan jumper, but San Diego State responded with a 21-6 run over the next 11:21, capped by a Morris jumper with 6:57 remaining to put the Aztecs up 18 at 54-36. SDSU outscored Jackson State, 7-0, over the final 2:57 as San Diego State claimed the 63-44 victory.

The Aztecs held the Lady Tigers to just 29.3 percent shooting (17-for-58) for the game and owned a 45-39 rebounding edge.

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Cal Poly 42-27 in the second half to rally from a nine-point deficit, as the Aztecs improved to 5-1 overall with an 80-70 victory over the Mustangs Thursday at Mott Gym. SDSU owned a 20-12 advantage on the offensive glass and made eight three-pointers for its seventh consecutive win over Cal Poly, which dropped to 3-4 in 2007-08.

Aztec point guard Quenese Davis scored 14 of her team-high 21 points in the second half, matching the best offensive output of her career. Davis converted 11 of her 12 free-throw attempts and added four rebounds and four steals. Three other SDSU players finished in double-figure points, including freshman center Paris Johnson (17 points), sophomore guard Jené Morris (11 pts.) and freshman forward Allison Duffy (10 pts.).

The Aztecs shot 39.7 percent from the field for the second game in a row, but countered with 26 second-chance points and recorded a season-best 88 percent performance (22-for-25) at the stripe. SDSU matched its best start since 1995-96 with five wins in its first six outings following its final non-conference road game of 2007-08.

After Cal Poly scored the first bucket to begin the night, the Aztecs reeled off six straight points to jump ahead 6-2. The Mustangs ended the run with a pair of free throws, but SDSU scored four more on back-to-back baskets by Johnson. Cal Poly put together its own offensive string, recording eight straight points to take a 12-10 advantage.

The schools traded leads four more times, before Cal Poly jumped ahead for the rest of the half, going up by as many as nine at 39-30, before heading into the locker room up five, 43-38. The Mustangs ended the half shooting 58.3 percent from the field and made 13 of their 14 free-throws (92.9 percent).

After Cal Poly once again opened the half with the first two points, SDSU responded with a triple by Davis, followed by two straight lay ups from Johnson to tie the game at 45-45.

Trailing by one, the Aztecs nailed back-to-back three-pointers to gain their first lead since early in the first half at 53-49. SDSU would go up by six on two occasions, before running out to the largest advantage of the night by either side at 67-57, following two Davis free throws.

Cal Poly made it interesting by getting to within six at 67-61 with just over three minutes left, but SDSU got four straight points from Allison Duffy and made 7-of-8 free-throws in the final 1:28 to secure the 80-70 win.
