## San Diego State Hits Road For the First Time in 2008; Travels Three-Time Zones for Nationally-Televised Game at Notre Dame on Saturday

San Diego State (0-1; 0-0 MWC) at Notre Dame (0-0)

Following a heartbreaking loss in its season opener, San Diego State (0-1) hits the road for the first of two away games, starting with college football power Notre Dame (0-0) on Saturday.

Game time is set for 3:30 p.m. ET (12:30 p.m. PT) and the contest will be televised nationally in high definition on NBC. The contest can also be heard locally on AM-600 KOGO.

Last Saturday, the Aztecs rallied from a nine-point, second-half deficit to Cal Poly, only to lose on a field goal on the final play of the game, 29-27.

The Aztecs, who had five players make first time starts and 12 players see action for the first time in their college careers, took their first lead of the game on a Brandon Sullivan five-yard run with 6:51 to play in the fourth quarter. The two-point conversion failed, giving SDSU a 27-26 lead.

After the teams exchanged possession, Cal Poly drove 63 yards in nine plays and got a 21-yard field goal as time expired for the victory.

Ryan Lindley, who became just the second freshman Aztec QB to start a season-opening game, was 27-of-45 for 352 yards and three TDs. He set school records in all five categories for a freshman in a starting debut.

Sophomore tailback Brandon Sullivan, who caught 18 passes all of last season, tallied a team-high nine for 64 yards and one touchdown through the air. He also rushed for a team-best 43 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries.

Sophomore defensive end B.J. Williams posted a career-high nine tackles, including eight solo stops.

Junior defensive tackle Jonathan Soto added eight tackles, including two tackles for loss. The SDSU defensive line combined for 30 tackles and three sacks in the contest.

Lombardi and Butkus Award watch list member Russell Allen had five solo tackles, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a PBU.

The kicking game, which also features first-year personnel, performed well in the opener. True freshman punter Brian Stahovich averaged 39.5 yards on four punts and had two boots downed at the opponent five-yard line. Junior place-kicker Lane Yoshida, who has dazzled with his 50-plus yard field goals during practice, connected on his three PAT attempts in his first game.

San Diego State is searching for another strong performance against a midwestern football giant. Since 2003, the Aztecs have traveled back to middle America to face a nationally-prominent program four times.


Although unable to come away with a victory in those contests, SDSU has put quite a scare into Ohio State (twice), Michigan and Wisconsin.

Next week the Aztecs will once again be on the road, traveling to San Jose State for a contest against the Spartans. San Diego State goes 28 days between its' home opener (Aug. 30) and the next home game against Idaho on Sept. 27.

Ryan Lindley became just the second freshman in Aztec history to start a season-opening game at quarterback. Lindley completed 27 of his 45 pass attempts for 352 yards and three TDs. Through games of Aug. 30, Lindley ranked seventh nationally in total passing yards and tied for 13th in total offense.

■ **Note of the Week I:**  
San Diego State may have played well enough to win on Saturday, but history has shown us how difficult it is to overcome a -4 turnover margin. Since 1969 when SDSU went Division I, the Aztecs are 3-26-2 when owning a -4 turnover margin or higher. The last time the Aztecs won a game with that big of a turnover disadvantage was Oct. 28, 1989, when despite a -4 disadvantage in the category, San Diego State won at UTEP, 34-31.

■ **Note of the Week II:**  
Plenty of young players saw the field for SDSU last week. Of the 48 players that saw action in the game against Cal Poly, just 12 came from the senior class. The breakdown by class was: 12 seniors, 16 juniors, 13 sophomores, three redshirt freshmen, four true freshmen.

## Last Game: Aztecs Overcome 9-Point Deficit Only to Lose on Game's Final Play

Cal Poly 29, San Diego State 27 | Aug. 30, 2008 | Qualcomm Stadium | San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** – Despite overcoming a nine-point deficit in the second half, San Diego State's five turnovers proved to be too costly as the Aztecs fell to Cal Poly, 29-27, at Qualcomm Stadium.

SDSU took its first lead of the game at 27-26 in the fourth quarter and held the one-point advantage until the Mustangs converted a 21-yard field goal with the clock winding down, dashing the Scarlet and Black's hopes of securing a season-opening win for the first time since 2004.

In his first collegiate start, Aztec redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley racked up an impressive 352 passing yards and three touchdowns, but it was Cal Poly who held a lopsided advantage in rushing yards (263-27) and won the battle in total offense (483-379).

On Cal Poly's second drive of the game, SDSU senior linebacker Russell Allen forced a fumble and also recovered it at the Aztec 3-yard line, but three plays later, sophomore running back Brandon Sullivan was tackled in the end zone for a safety, giving the Mustangs a 2-0 lead.

Cal Poly gained momentum from there, going up 9-0 on a 22-yd touchdown pass from Jonathan Dally to Ramses Barden with 3:07 left in the first quarter. Barden finished the evening with a game-high 161 yards on seven catches.

San Diego State was able to get on the board and cut its deficit to two at the 5:41 mark in the second quarter on a 16-yard TD reception by Sullivan, but the Mustangs would eventually tack on one more score before the end of the half to take a 16-7 lead.

The Aztecs came out of the break on fire, putting together a 7-play, 66-yard drive that ate up 2:12 on the clock and ended with a 30-yard touchdown catch by Roberto Wallace.

After Cal Poly got back on the board, SDSU closed out the third frame with a 23-yard TD pass from Lindley to Vincent Brown, and the Aztecs trailed by just two points (23-21) heading into the final 15 minutes of action.

The Mustangs opened the fourth quarter with a field goal, but the Aztecs would eventually take their first lead of the game on Sullivan's 5-yard touchdown run with 6:51 on the clock. Unable to convert an extra two-point attempt, SDSU held a narrow 27-26 advantage. After a successful defensive effort on Cal Poly's subsequent drive, the Scarlet and Black took control of the ball with 4:24 left to play, but were unable to maintain possession, allowing the Mustangs to start their final drive at the 3:39 mark. Cal Poly took advantage of the opportunity, using up the clock to set up Andrew Gardner's game-winning field goal.

Lindley finished the evening 27-for-45, while Brown led the way on the receiving end with 98 yards and a touchdown on seven catches. Sullivan also had a strong showing with two touchdowns, a team-leading 43 yards on the ground and nine catches for 64 yards.

## Postgame Notes

- ▶ **THE SERIES/OPENERS:** San Diego State fell to 13-11 all-time against Cal Poly and 7-6 in games played in San Diego ... The Aztecs dropped to 44-37-5 all-time in season-openers ... Each of the last two games have been decided by two points on a field goal in the final minutes.
- ▶ **THE WRITE UP ON RYAN:** Ryan Lindley became just the second Aztec freshman to start at quarterback in a season-opening game, joining Todd Santos (1984). Lindley is the fifth freshman in school history overall to start at QB. His first career touchdown toss as an Aztec came in the second quarter when he completed 5-of-7 for 76 yards on the drive that ended in a 16-yard TD toss to Brandon Sullivan. Lindley ended the game 27-for-45 for 352 yards with three TDs, all highs by an SDSU freshman quarterback in his first career start.
- ▶ **SULLIVAN SUPERLATIVES:** Sophomore running back Brandon Sullivan logged his first career touchdown reception in the second quarter on a 16-yard pass from Ryan Lindley. Sullivan had a career-high nine receptions on the night, beating his previous best of six a year ago at UNLV. Sullivan also set a career-best for most carries with 15 (prev. 11 at AF in 2007), and posted his first career multi-TD game.
- ▶ **ALL ABOUT ALLEN:** Senior linebacker Russell Allen, who is up for both the Butkus and Lombardi Awards, forced his first career fumble in the first quarter and also managed to recover the ball (the second of his career).
- ▶ **ON THE DEFENSIVE:** Sophomore B.J. Williams and junior Jonathan Soto each tallied career highs in tackles to lead the Aztecs with nine and eight respectively. Cornerbacks Aaron Moore and Vonnie Holmes each had three pass breakups apiece - both career bests.
- ▶ **PENALTIES NOT A PLENTY:** SDSU was flagged for just two penalties - all in the fourth quarter - for just 10 yards. A year ago, the Aztecs were penalized an average of 50.2 yards per contest.
- ▶ **AZTEC FIRSTS:** Players logging their first career starts tonight include: quarterback Ryan Lindley, offensive guard Ikaika Aken-Moleta, fullback Tyler Campbell, defensive end Tony DeMartinis and defensive tackle Ernie Lawson. In addition, junior Peter Nelson also made his first career start on the offensive side of the ball at left tackle, after posting two previous career starts at defensive tackle. Senior Lance Louis, whose eight previous starts were at tight end, was the Aztecs' starter at right tackle.

## Good First Impression

Redshirt freshman Ryan Lindley made quite a first impression in his first college appearance last Saturday. Lindley made the second freshman in SDSU history to start a season-opening game at the position, was just the fifth freshman to start a game at quarterback and the 45th player to earn a start as a signal-caller in the school's Division I history. Against Cal Poly, he was 27-of-45, for 352 yards and had two interceptions and three touchdowns.

He set records for a freshman starter in an inaugural start in completions, attempts, yardage and touchdowns.

Lindley joined Todd Santos as the only Aztec freshman quarterback to start a season-opening game. Although, like Lindley, Santos lost his 1984 opener at Air Force (16-34), the current quarterback can take some solace in knowing Santos went on to start 45 games for SDSU and earned honorable mention All-America honors as a junior and third-team All-America honors as a senior.

Other notable items from Lindley's first career game and start:

- ▶ Went 5-for-5 for 77 yards in the fourth-quarter drive that gave San Diego State its first lead of the game, 27-26
- ▶ He showed remarkable improvement as the game went on (see chart to the right), surviving a 3-for-9 for 11 yards and one interception (21.38 passing efficiency rating) start through the early stages of the second quarter to go 24-36, for 341 yards and three touchdowns (168.18 passing efficiency rating) over the final two and half quarters of the game.
- ▶ Both interceptions were first touched by an Aztec receiver.
- ▶ Currently has gone 16 straight attempts without an interception. His career long streak is 24.
- ▶ All three of his touchdown passes have come on first down.
- ▶ Led San Diego State to two touchdowns in two red zone appearances.
- ▶ Lindley was unable to avoid becoming the ninth straight SDSU quarterback to lose in his first college start.

## Negative Margin

You can always find numbers to point to when you lose a game. One that Aztec faithful point to is a turnover margin of -4 (five giveaways, one takeaway) on Saturday against the Mustangs.

How difficult does that make it to win? Saturday marked the 41st time in the Division I era that the Aztecs have had a turnover margin of -4 or worse and SDSU is 3-26-2 in those games. The last time San Diego State overcame at least a -4 turnover margin to win a game was Oct. 28, 1989, when the Aztecs defeated UTEP, 34-31.

The five turnovers were unusual for a Chuck Long coached team. It was the most giveaways by an SDSU team since committing five turnovers against Utah on Sept. 23, 2006. The five turnovers equal the total number of turnovers the Aztecs had in the final four games in 2007 combined.

## I'm Tired

Cal Poly owned a 16:00 time of possession advantage in Saturday's game. That marked the 13th-largest discrepancy in that stat since it commonly began being kept back in the early 1980s.

San Diego State is 1-16-1 in the 18 games in which it has had at least a 10:20 disadvantage in the stat.

## A Comeback Is A Comeback

San Diego State overcame a nine-point second-half deficit to take a lead on Saturday against Cal Poly. Although the Aztecs, were unable to hang on for the victory, it did mark the third largest comeback in a season-opening game in the Division I era (since 1969).

It marked just the third time in the DI era that SDSU has overcome a deficit of more than a touchdown in a season-opening game. Rallying in the opening contest of the season has been a positive for SDSU, as the Aztecs posted an 8-4 record and advanced to the Holiday Bowl in 1986 and went 5-5-1 in 1992.

## Youth Moment

San Diego State utilized 48 players in the season opener against Cal Poly on Saturday, with only 12 of those players in the senior class. The breakdown by class was 12 seniors, 16 juniors, 13 sophomores and seven freshmen (three redshirts and four true freshmen).

The four true freshmen to see the field in the opener were Aaron Brewer, Jerome Long, Josh Wade and Brian Stahovich.

## Heading East

San Diego State owns a 1-7 record in the Division I era in games played in the Eastern time zone. Before one gets too critical of the record, it is worth noting that five of the games came against nationally-ranked teams and that four of those teams were ranked among the top nine at the time of the game.

Three of San Diego State's seven losses came by a margin of three points or less.

This marks the fifth visit to the Eastern time zone this decade for the Aztecs. A full list of results can be found to the right.

## Playing Well in Middle America

The Aztecs have proven to be a handful this decade for power teams from the Midwest. Saturday's game at Notre Dame marks SDSU's fifth contest against a BCS team from the Midwest in the past six years.

► In 2003, San Diego State traveled to Ohio State as 32-point underdogs in a game televised on ESPN+Plus. The Aztecs took the Buckeyes to the wire in front of 104,433 fans in Columbus, before eventually falling, 16-13. SDSU outgained No. 2 Ohio State, 216-196, and owned a 20-10 first down advantage. The Buckeyes would go on to finish the season 11-2 and defeated Kansas State, 35-28, in the Fiesta Bowl.

► The following year, the Aztecs traveled to the Big House for a ESPN televised game against No. 17 Michigan. SDSU put a scare into the Wolverines, taking a 21-17 lead at halftime before falling, 24-21, on a third quarter touchdown reception by Braylon Edwards. The Aztecs threw for 289 yards on Michigan, a team that would go on to finish 10-3 with a trip to the Rose Bowl.

► In 2005, San Diego State returned to Columbus and let the Buckeyes know it came to play by scoring on its first offensive play, an 80-yard pass from Kevin O'Connell to Brett Swain to give the team an early 6-0 lead. Ohio State, however, scored 27 unanswered and kept the Aztecs' offense in check the rest of the game in the 27-6 victory, which was broadcast on ABC. The Buckeyes went 10-2 on the season, culminating with a 34-20 win over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl.

► Finally in 2006, SDSU held Wisconsin scoreless through two quarters before eventually dropping a 14-0 decision to the host Badgers on ESPN+Plus. The Aztecs, playing without starting quarterback Kevin O'Connell and held Wisconsin to just 85 yards through the air in an admirable job by the defense. The Badgers had a terrific season, posting a 12-1 record, including a 24-10 victory over Auburn in the Capitol One Bowl at Citrus Bowl Stadium in January.

## Allen Tabbed For Butkus Lombardi Watch Lists

San Diego State senior linebacker Russell Allen was named to the 2008 Butkus Award Watch List for the second consecutive season and also was recently added to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List. Allen is one of 66 candidates up for the Butkus Award, which is presented to the nation's best collegiate linebacker, and is one of 113 players up for the Lombardi Award, given to the top down lineman.

Allen is just the second Aztec linebacker to be named to the Butkus Award Watch List on more than one occasion, while he is the third SDSU player named to the Lombardi Award Watch List.

The Butkus Award, which began in 1985, is named in honor of Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker Dick Butkus. The award will be presented by the Butkus Foundation at a ceremony on January 13, 2009. The Lombardi Award, in its 39th year, will be given out on Dec. 10 in Houston.

## A Six-Pack Of Captains

San Diego State head coach Chuck Long announced the Aztecs' team captains for the upcoming season on Aug. 23. Seniors Russell Allen (linebacker), Corey Boudreaux (defensive back), Tyler Campbell (fullback), Siaois Fifita (defensive line), Darren Mougey (wide receiver) and Mike Schmidt (offensive line) were selected by their teammates and introduced at SDSU's Family Day scrimmage at Qualcomm Stadium.

Allen enters his final season as the most decorated of all the returning Aztecs. Last year, Allen was the team's top tackler, making 119 stops, including 5.5 for a loss. The Oceanside, Calif., native earned all-Mountain West Conference honorable mention honors after leading the league in tackles per conference outing (10.6) and ranking 33rd in the nation in overall tackles per game (9.9). Allen was named to the Butkus Award Watch List for the second consecutive season in 2008 and was also a preseason all-MWC choice.

Boudreaux, an Orange, Calif., native, started all 12 games for the Aztecs at free safety in 2007, finishing fourth on the squad with 84 tackles. He was seventh in the MWC with eight passes defended and was second on the team with three interceptions.

An Austin, Texas, native, Campbell logged minutes in all 12 games for the second straight season in 2008. He scored two touchdowns on seven carries and also saw significant playing time on the special teams.

Fifita has been a key player over the past three seasons for SDSU, logging minutes in 35 career contests with 10 starts. Last season, the Van Nuys, Calif., native appeared in all 12 games with eight starts on the defensive line. He had a career-best 29 tackles, including six behind the line of scrimmage and three sacks.

A Scottsdale, Ariz., native, Mougey appeared in 10 games in 2008 as a wide receiver after being the No. 2 quarterback the previous two seasons. He made an immediate impact as the team's third-leading receiver with 32 catches for 368 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Schmidt, a San Diego native, started all 12 games last season after appearing in 11 in the 2006 campaign. He anchored a line which racked up 3,272 yards through the air and 1,247 yards on the ground.

## Ooh-Rah! Aztecs Open 2008 Fall Practice At Camp Pendleton

The San Diego State football team ventured up north to begin its 2008 fall camp in Oceanside, Calif., staying at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton from Aug. 4-7. The Aztecs logged two practices on Aug. 5 and 6 at the Semper Fit Fieldhouse on the base and took part in nightly leadership training programs. The team stayed overnight in a part of the base known as Area 62, sleeping in World War II era Quonset huts.

"This has been a great experience," said head coach Chuck Long after the second day of workouts. "Our guys have enjoyed being around the Marines and we hope vice versa. It has been a great eye-opening experience for our team."

## Three Aztecs Named To MWC Anniversary Team

Three former San Diego State players, defensive lineman Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (1999), linebacker Kirk Morrison (2001-04) and defensive back Will Demps (1999-2001), were named to the 25-member Mountain West Conference Football 10th Anniversary Team, as selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and online fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been a first team all-Mountain West selection at least once in their careers.

# vs. Cal Poly

**SAN DIEGO** – Despite overcoming a nine-point deficit in the second half, San Diego State's five turnovers proved to be too costly as the Aztecs fell to Cal Poly, 29-27, at Qualcomm Stadium.

SDSU took its first lead of the game at 27-26 in the fourth quarter and held the one-point advantage until the Mustangs converted a 21-yard field goal with the clock winding down, dashing the Scarlet and Black's hopes of securing a season-opening win for the first time since 2004.

In his first collegiate start, Aztec redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Lindley racked up an impressive 352 passing yards and three touchdowns, but it was Cal Poly who held a lopsided advantage in rushing yards (263-27) and won the battle in total offense (483-379).

On Cal Poly's second drive of the game, SDSU senior linebacker Russell Allen forced a fumble and also recovered it at the Aztec 3-yard line, but three plays later, sophomore running back Brandon Sullivan was tackled in the end zone for a safety, giving the Mustangs a 2-0 lead.

Cal Poly gained momentum from there, going up 9-0 on a 22-yd touchdown pass from Jonathan Dally to Ramses Barden with 3:07 left in the first quarter. Barden finished the evening with a game-high 161 yards on seven catches.

San Diego State was able to get on the board and cut its deficit to two at the 5:41 mark in the second quarter on a 16-yard TD reception by Sullivan, but the Mustangs would eventually tack on one more score before the end of the half to take a 16-7 lead.

The Aztecs came out of the break on fire, putting together a 7-play, 66-yard drive that ate up 2:12 on the clock and ended with a 30-yard touchdown catch by Roberto Wallace.

After Cal Poly got back on the board, SDSU closed out the third frame with a 23-yard TD pass from Lindley to Vincent Brown, and the Aztecs trailed by just two points (23-21) heading into the final 15 minutes of action.

The Mustangs opened the fourth quarter with a field goal, but the Aztecs would eventually take their first lead of the game on Sullivan's 5-yard touchdown run with 6:51 on the clock. Unable to convert an extra two-point attempt, SDSU held a narrow 27-26 advantage. After a successful defensive effort on Cal Poly's subsequent drive, the Scarlet and Black took control of the ball with 4:24 left to play, but were unable to maintain possession, allowing the Mustangs to start their final drive at the 3:39 mark. Cal Poly took advantage of the opportunity, using up the clock to set up Andrew Gardner's game-winning field goal.

Lindley finished the evening 27-for-45, while Brown led the way on the receiving end with 98 yards and a touchdown on seven catches. Sullivan also had a strong showing with two touchdowns, a team-leading 43 yards on the ground and nine catches for 64 yards.
