SDSU Football Adds Two More on Signing Day

Aztecs now at 22 for signing class

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State football head coach Brady Hoke has announced that Josh Hunter (Temecula, Calif./Mater Dei High) and Hassan Mahasin (Daly City, Calif./Serra High) have signed National Letters of Intent. Along with the 14 signees the first two days of early signing period in December and six FBS transfers in January, the Aztec signing class is now at 22.

Hunter was a four-year letter winner at powerhouse Mater Dei High School, helping the Monarchs to two CIF open championships, two state titles and three league championships over his career. Mater Dei HS went 43-2 (.956) over his four seasons, including undefeated seasons in 2021 (12-0) and 2020 (5-0). A safety, Hunter was a two-time Trinity League defensive MVP and three-time all-league selection, recording 148 tackles (115 solo) for his career, including eight interceptions, 22 pass breakups, two fumble recoveries and a blocked punt.

Mahasin, meanwhile, starred at Serra High School in San Mateo, California, where he was the 2020 Bay Area Player of the Year. Mahasin had 23 catches for 418 yards (18.2 avg.) and seven touchdowns in four games in 2021 before suffering a season-ending injury. He also added 61 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries (15.3 avg.). Mahasin is ranked as the 22nd-best "athlete" in the 2022 class by 247sports and the 32nd-top recruit overall in the state of California.

The Aztecs' signing class now has 13 offensive players and nine on defense.

San Diego State finished the season ranked 25th in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll. It is the third time in program history that the Aztecs (12-2) made the final AP Top 25 poll, joining the 1977 squad (16th) and the 2016 team (25th).

Playing in its 99th season of football, SDSU finished with a school-record 12 victories, becoming one of just 10 programs nationally with at least 12 victories this year. Only four teams had more wins than the Aztecs, including national champion Georgia, and CFP teams Alabama and Cincinnati.

SDSU played five teams who reached double-digit victories on the season, securing wins over Pac-12 Champion/Rose Bowl participant Utah (10-4), UTSA (12-2) and Air Force (10-3). San Diego State, which was ranked in every CFP poll in 2021, played all 14 of its games away from its own market, including eight "home games" two hours from campus at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, California.

SDSU kicks off its 100th season of football on Saturday, Sept. 3 against Arizona, hosting its first game at Bashor Field at Snapdragon Stadium.

Was a first-team all-West Catholic Athletic League selection and team captain ... In the spring season (was moved back from the fall because of COVID), the Padres went 5-0 and captured the WCAL title, as there was no playoffs or all-league awards ... Also played baseball in 2018 and 2019 ... Is a three-star recruit by 247 sports and ESPN, and a two-star recruit by ESPN ... Owns a 247sports composite rating of 82.54 ... Received a scout grade of 84 by 247sports and 74 by ESPN ... Picked San Diego State over offers from Arizona, Nevada, Tulane, Idaho, Idaho State, Southern Utah and Portland State ... Has three years of collegiate eligibility remaining ... Comes to The Mesa following two seasons at Oklahoma State ... Played in a pair of games last year as a redshirt freshman against Kansas (Oct. 30) and Notre Dame (Jan. 1) in the Playstation Fiesta Bowl ... Redshirted his first season with the Cowboys in 2020 ... Played his high school ball at Notre Dame Prep, logging snaps on both sides of the ball ... Helped the Saints to a 37-4 record in his three seasons ... As a senior in 2019, he anchored an offensive line that helped Notre Dame Prep rush for 3,249 yards and 57 touchdowns, while passing for 1,763 yards and 17 touchdowns ... Also logged 18 tackles on the defensive side of the ball with 12 solo stops ... Made Arizona Republic's all-Arizona team ... Was a consensus three-star recruit out of high school by 247sports, Rivals and ESPN ... Received a scout grade of 85 by 247sports and 75 by ESPN ... 247Sports ranked him as the No. 25 offensive guard in the nation and the No. 13 player out of Arizona ... Braxton Burmeister

Quarterback 6-1, 205 La Jolla, Calif. (La Jolla Country Day/Virginia Tech)

Has one year of collegiate eligibility remaining ... Brings Power 5 experience to San Diego State with stops at Oregon (2017-18) and Virginia Tech (2020-21) ... Has started 20 times and appeared in 29 games over his career ... Combined he has thrown for 3,020 yards with 19 touchdowns against 11 interceptions, completing 239 of his 426 attempts (56.1 pct.) ... Also has rushed for 834 yards and seven touchdowns on 234 attempts (3.6 avg.) ... Went 8-7 in his two years at Virginia Tech, completing 190 of his 339 passes (56.0 pct.) for 2,647 yards and 16 touchdowns against just five interceptions ... Also rushed for 690 yards and four touchdowns ... Was particularly effective last season where he was 142-for-255 (55.7 pct.) for 1,960 yards and 14 touchdowns with just four interceptions, while rushing 116 times for 508 yards (4.4 avg.) and two scores ... Most of his career highs came last year at Virginia Tech, including 254 yards and two touchdowns in a 26-17 win over Georgia Tech (Oct. 30), three touchdown passes on just 15 attempts (for 215 yards) in a 48-17 win over Duke (Nov. 13) and 115 rushing yards in a 29-24 win over Virginia (Nov. 27) ... Rushed for 238 yards over his final three games (79.3 avg.) ... Sat out the 2019 season at Virginia Tech because of NCAA transfer rules ... Played in four games as a sophomore at Oregon in 2018, completing 5 of 10 passes and rushing for 29 yards ... Made five starts and played in seven games as a true freshman in 2017, completing 44 of 77 passes (57.1 pct.) for 330 yards and two touchdowns (and six interceptions) ... Prepped at La Jolla Country Day in nearby La Jolla, where he was a

first-team Parade All-American and "Rising Star" following his senior season ... Also was named one of the top 100 recruits on the West Coast by the Tacoma News Tribune ... Set CIF San Diego Section career records in total yards (14,972), passing yards (11,512), passing touchdowns (127) and pass completions (853) in four varsity seasons ... Also was selected first-team All-CIF San Diego Section ... Threw for 4,461 yards and 53 touchdowns with just eight interceptions as a senior in 2016, while also rushing for 1,470 yards and 27 touchdowns ... Father, Dan, played linebacker at North Carolina from 1983-86 ... Picked Oregon out of the high school over offers from San Diego State, Florida, Utah, Washington, South Carolina, Arizona, California, Colorado, Oregon State, Boston College, Illinois and Indiana.

Prepped at Centennial High School in Corona, Calif. ... Played both sides of the ball ... Led the Huskies to the state semifinals before falling to eventual champion Mater Dei ... Centennial ended up finishing ranked third in the state, according to MaxPreps ... Team was 11-1 with an undefeated 5-0 record in league play ... Is a three-star recruit by 247sports and ESPN, and a two-star recruit by Rivals ... Owns a 247sports composite rating of 84.11 ... Received a scout grade of 85 from 247sports and 76 from ESPN ... Picked San Diego State over offers from Washington, Kansas, Utah State, Fresno State, Nevada and New Mexico.

Lompoc, Calif. (Lompoc High)

Earned four letters at Lompoc High School in Lompoc, Calif. ... Was an all-CIF selection, all-area MVP, all-league MVP and team MVP ... Was a team captain ... Rushed for 2,893 yards over his career on 309 attempts (9.4 avg.), while adding 36 catches for 468 yards (13.0 avg.) with a combined 53 touchdowns ... Broke Napoleon Kaufman's school record for most rushing touchdowns in a game when he had six and 305 yards against Arroyo Grande ... Also was a star track runner, specializing in the 100-meter dash with a personal record of 10.64 seconds, while competing in the long jump ... Was a three-star recruit by 247 sports and ESPN, and a two-star recruit by Rivals ... Owns a 247 sports composite rating of 84.32 ... Received a scout grade of 85 by 247sports and a 77 from ESPN ... Also was the team captain ... Was voted as the top quarterback in California by sblive ... According to MaxPreps, threw for 4,185 yards and 40 touchdowns over his high school career with just nine interceptions, completing 64.6 percent of his passes (234-for-362) ... Also ran for 789 yards and 15 touchdowns on 110 carries (7.2 avg.) ... LHS won the Angelus League each of his final two seasons ... Was a two-time first-team all-league selection (spring 2021 and fall 2021) and a second-team pick as a sophomore in 2019 ... Was LHS's offensive rookie of the year in 2019 ... Also competed on the basketball team and in track and field, specializing in the 100-meter dash ... A consensus three-star recruit by 247sports, Rivals and ESPN ... Owns a 247sports composite rating of 85.73 ... Earned a scout grade of 87 by 247sports and 77 by ESPN ... Comes to the Aztecs after starring at Serra High School in San Mateo, Calif. ... Was the 2020 Bay Area Player of the Year ... Played in four games last year before an injury

had him miss the rest of the season ... In four games, he caught 23 passes for 418 yards (18.2 avg.) and seven touchdowns, while adding 61 rushing yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries (15.3 avg.) (all stats according to MaxPreps) ... Averaged 128.7 receiving yards with six receiving touchdowns over his first three games before being injured with three additional rushing scores ...
